#### **DURATION OF THE PROGRAM/MAXIMUM DURATION**

The BBA LL.B. Program shall be of five years with ten semesters. A student will be required to complete the program within 5 years from the date of first registration in the first Semester

The student shall be required to undergo 5-6 weeks of Summer Internship at the end of the second year(IV<sup>th</sup> Semester), third year(VI<sup>th</sup> Semester) and 4<sup>th</sup> year (III<sup>th</sup> Semester) & submits its report in the V<sup>th</sup>, Fifth and Sixth Semester respectively.

An academic year consists of two semesters; Odd Semester (July-Dec) and Even Semester (Jan-June). Duration of each semester can increase or decrease. 15-18 weeks of academic works.

The examination for the I<sup>st</sup>, III<sup>rd</sup>, V<sup>th</sup>, VII<sup>th</sup>& IX<sup>th</sup> semesters shall ordinarily be held in the month of November/December and of the II<sup>nd</sup>,IV<sup>th</sup>, VIII<sup>th</sup> &X<sup>th</sup> semesters in the month of April/May or on such dates as may be fixed by the University.

#### **REGISTRATION AT THE START OF EVERY SEMESTER**

Every semester, students admitted to a program should register him/her for the next Semester. The student must also register for the elective courses, if any, (both discipline specific electives and open electives) that he/she wishes to take in that particular semester (especially in the final year/last 2 semesters).

## **PROMOTION FROM 1ST YEAR 2ND YEAR**

A student is eligible for promotion to next year, if he/she meets the below mentioned minimum CGPA Criteria (by combining odd and even semester).

- Forpromotionfrom1stYearto2ndyear,MinimumCGPAof 4.0
- Forpromotionfrom2ndYearto3rdyear,MinimumCGPAof 4.5

**Meaning:** If for a Student, if CGPA is 4.0 **(Minimum 40% marks are required to get promoted)** or more than 4.0 in 1<sup>st</sup>year having any number of subject backlog/ fail, he/she shall be promoted to next year. That it is his/her choice to clear his/her backlog is summer semester or with semester end examination as per ODD backlog with ODD semester and EVEN Backlog in EVEN Semester.

IfstudentCGPAislessthan4.0, having any number of backlog in the1<sup>st</sup>yearandCGPAisless than 4.5 in 2<sup>nd</sup>year, he/she must appear in summer semester to clear backlog papers.

For promotion to  $3^{rd}$ Year, students must have cleared all his/her papers of  $1^{st}$ year. Forpromotionto $4^{th}$ Year, student must have clear all his/herpapersof $2^{nd}$ year, for Promotion to  $5^{th}$ Year student must have cleared all his/her papers of  $3^{rd}$ year.

Studentcannotcarryinternalbacklogtonextyear,he/shemustclearhis/herinternal backlog before commencement of next year's session.

## **TEACHING PEDAGOGY**

We use a combination of pedagogical techniques in order to provide a holistic learning environmentwhichcanchallengelearnerswithdifferentabilities and also encourage critical inquiry and self-learning.

Ourfacultymembersnotonlykeepabreastoftherecentdevelopmentsandresearchintheir respective fields, but also regularly involve students in a research-based learning. This is reflected in the various publications and conferences that our faculty members contribute to. Further there is an emphasis on teaching students to apply their conceptual knowledge to legal issues and problems. Regular guest speaker sessions and seminars with eminent scholars across different sectors in India and outside. We Uses Court Room Exercises that emphasis on research, in depth analysis of precedents and oration so as to familiarize students with the court room atmosphere. All students compulsorily participate in Court Room Exercises as it also forms a part of the evaluation scheme of law subjects. These exercises are conducted by faculty members teaching the respective subjects and the factual problem which the students argue on deals with the particular area of law of that subject.

The University imparts instruction through lectures, seminars and tutorials. Study material is distributed for each course and forms the basis of class discussion and interactive learning so that students remain engaged. #### **CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT**

School of Law evaluates students' performance through continuous assessment by way of various projects and assignments as part of internal academic activities. Home Assignments and research activities makes learning process more interesting and indirectly helps them to prepare for external examination and Provision for Self-Learning.

The examination system of the University is designed to test systematically the student's progress in class, laboratory and field work through continuous evaluation in place of the usual make or mark 'performance in a single examination. Students are given periodical tests, short quizzes, home assignments, seminars, tutorials, term papers in addition to the examination at the end of each semester. The final result in each course is calculated on the basis of this continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination.

The Semester Pattern is designed with a continuous assessment system. Beside continuous assessment throughout the year through assignments, presentations & projects there are sessionll,II&endsemesterexamination. The continuous assessment made for a candidate in a particular semester shall be final. If any candidate fails to complete the continuous assessment, he/she shall be permitted to redo the same internal assessment

**Students can refer to the semester/year wise "Program Assignment chart**" to get a better idea on the format/style & number of assignments they need to take in a particular semester/year. The assignments are designed in such a way that helps in the holistic growth of the students along with creating confidence & bettering the communication skills.

#### **SUMMER INTERNSHIP**

RNB Global University has an elaborate internship program for law students the internship program has been made a part of the curriculum to achieve the object of imbibing practical knowledge on applicability of law and "learning law in action".

The purpose of **Summer Internship Program (SIP)** is to assist the students to understand the contemporary judicial system at various levels in various courts in India. The students shall be able to understand the actual court practices; court procedure and various institutions dealings ocial and legal work for the people. SIP for law students can be broadly classified into two categories & are designed in order to achieve the following objectives:

## For Advocate/Court Internships

- To learn the techniques of counseling the litigants coming to courts for legal issues:
- To understand the preparation of cases before filing the cases;
- Toprepareforthecasesofthelitigantsbeforepresentingthemselvesinacourt;
- To educate the witnesses the methods of presenting themselves before the courts;
- To learn the art of examination and Cross-examination of witnesses;
- Toprepareforargumentsbeforedifferentcourseseekingremedialjustice;
- To Learn The science of arguments for the cases; and
- To learn the technique of seeking full remedies different types of cases.

#### For Institution/Corporate Internships

- To learn the working of various NGOs ,Legal Firms, Banks,
- To learn the working Constitutional bodies like Houses of Parliament, Houses of State Legislature, offices of Secretaries of the Government and other Social Work Institutions:
- Tolearnthelegalrequirements and working procedures of various activities of banking institutions, insurance companies, financial institutions, industrial establishments, corporations dealing transport, building activities and scientific research institutions;
- To get knowledge of their contribution to the society and the nation; and
- To understand the usefulness of such institutions and interrelation of society, law, morality.

Internships are taken after the end of I V,VI,VIII semesters for a period of 4-5 weeks during summer vacations .It carries 5 credits for each such SIP. The student needs to submit this/he Internship Report and a Court Diary in the next semester via V,VII,IX semester

respectively and undergo a viva/seminar. For the ease of students' understanding, summer internship is evaluated for a total of 150 marks for Weekly Reports, Court Diary, Project Report, and Presentations & Viva Voce & later converted into grade & grade points as per the University Examination Policy.

Complete Document/guidelines are available for the help/assistance the students for SIP. **Students can refer to the BBA.LLB Summer Internship & Project Instructions & Assistance Document**" to get a better idea on the Formats, Style, Project reports, Marks break up & Scoring criteria, etc.

A Court Dairy has to be maintained by each student to record his activities at the Courts and institutions they are required to visit.

#### **Project Semester**

In order to give maximum industry Exposure, RNBGU as develop programme, wherein the law student have to spend an entire semester with an advocate or a law firm. This is to help the law student immensely & prepare them ready to the current law practices

Internship of X semester with 20 credits shall be only at various Courts. The student needs to submit his/her Internship Report and a Court Diary at the end of the semester and undergo a viva/seminar. Each student shall be evaluated for a total of 600 marks for Court Dairy, Project Report, and Presentations & Viva Voce & later convert editor grade & grade points as per the University Examination Policy.

This is to enable students to get a better perspective & understanding on benefiting the maximum from such dedicated & sincere efforts by RNB Global University for organizing such Summer Internship program for its students.

The complete SIP reporting & evaluation pattern is again a very unique & well-structured industry academia learning effort of RNBGU.

#### RESEARCH PROJECT DISSERTATION

The Law School is actively involved in conducting research activities both for the faculty and the students. The faculty members have been regularly participating in the Refresher Courses conducted by various universities. Our faculty members have been participating in seminars/workshops/ paper presentations /diploma courses to upgrade their subject knowledge. They have participated/presented papers in many seminars/conferences. The students have also been participating in various research activities conducted by various law schools/universities in India and abroad.

The University has been conducting Legal Writing &Research Methodology course work for the students. Experts from other universities have been actively involved in training the student's research publications. Our efforts in this conducting this course has been fruitful As many of our final year students have been successful in getting their paper published in leading magazines and journals.

The students have also been trained to present seminar papers by defending their synopsis of their dissertation topics before a panel of internal faculty members. This has been very helpful to the students those who have later on joined corporate law firms in their final placement. Currently, we have introduced a system of Viva for the fourth-year students to train them for their external viva in final year. This viva isn't just restricted to the projects submitted by them, but they are evaluated on their conceptual clarity about the subjects taught during semester. This will make the students confident in taking their end semester examination as well as facing panelists for viva in future.
