## INTERPRETATION & MEANING OF LOGO

RNB Global University logo comprises of a “Shield”. Globally “Shield” is used as a symbol by Universities & Educational Institutes to represent **Strength, Security & Safety**. The “Shield” gives a feeling of controlled environment & protection. The breaks in the outline of “Shield” show **flexibility & freedom**.

The three outer arcs represent the three elements of Nature viz: **Air, Water & Earth**. These three arcs are similar in size as well as equal at edges, giving equal importance to all these three elements. This symbolizes the equality which is practiced at RNB Global University by imparting education irrespective of Gender, Caste & Creed. **The circle represents the World. It also reflects “Globe for Knowledge”.**

The central icon, figure shows the joyous aspect of a Student’s Life, representing every single student who is part of this University. This symbol of rising, flying body is of a progressive student with stretched upward arms, showing empowerment, holding & conquering the entire world with all his knowledge. It represents the overall growth, development, confidence & exposure which the university shall be providing through quality education. This is increasing in nature, narrow at one end & broader at the other, representing the dynamism of overall growth & transformation in the life of a student.

The student within these wings represents their immersion in the pool of knowledge.

**The logo is composed of the initials RNB, the name of its founder Chancellor.** The Capital letters reflects the boldness & firmness. The other font represents simplicity which is easy to recall & place. **Educating Stars for Tomorrow in the logo represents the Vision of the University.** Providing each & every student the best of quality education, future opportunities, helping them to move ahead, make them a leader for tomorrow & to be World ready. The University strongly believes that each & every student of this University should shine brightly, like a Star. The Sky is Blue, The Ocean is Blue. The Blue colour in logo signifies the coolness & calmness of Nature. Colour blue represents education & learning solutions. 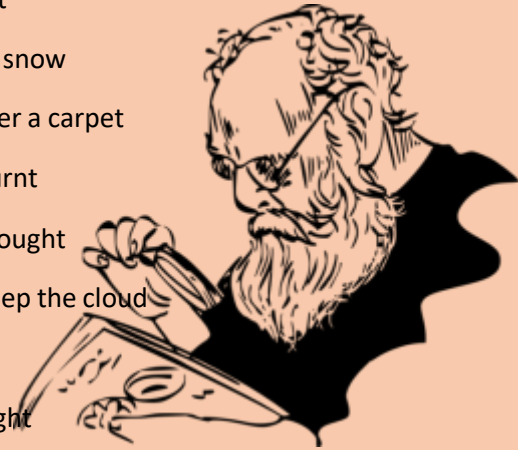
## Coffin of poems

 In the coffin of poems! (SAAKSHI SHARMA BBALL.B-VISem)

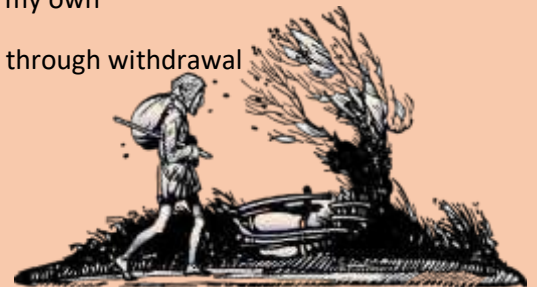


## BACK TO START

## DIVORCE IN MUSLIMS

Divorce under Muslim law is of two types-

- Extra Judicial Divorce
- Judicial Divorce

### EXTRA JUDICIAL DIVORCE IN ISLAM

The extra judicial divorce consists of following divisions:

**By husband:** Talaq, Ila, Zihar

**By wife:** Talaq-i-tafweez

**By mutual consent:** Khula, Mubarat



### TALAQ IN ISLAM

1. **Talaq-e-Ahsan:** It consists of a single pronouncement of divorce. It is irrevocable even after expiration of period of iddat.
2. **Talaq-e-Hasan:** When the husband repudiates his wife during a Tuhr (period of purity) in which he has not had carnal connection with her and he repeats the repudiation during the next two Tuhrs which makes the divorce final and irrevocable.
3. **Talaq-ul-Biddat:** Three pronouncements are made in a single breath. It becomes irrevocable as soon as it is pronounced. It is considered to be the worst form of divorce.
4. **Ila:** If a husband after having attained puberty, swears by god not to have sexual intercourse with his wife for a period of four months or for any unspecified period, he is said to make Ila.
5. **Zihar:** If husband compares his wife to his mother or to a female within prohibited degrees of relationship, the wife has right to avoid him until he performs punishment for his wrong done/sin.
6. **Khula:** Khula is separation by putting an end to the matrimonial bonds and rights. It is that right in which the wife agrees to give a certain amount of consideration to the husband for her release from the marriage ties.
7. **Mubarat:** Mubarat is the dissolution of marriage by mutual agreement. The offer may be made by any party, either husband or wife.
8. **Talaq-e-Tafweez:** A husband may delegate his power of talaq to his wife. An agreement is made before or after marriage providing that the wife is at liberty to take divorce from his husband provided that such power is not absolute and unconditional and that the conditions are reasonable and not opposed to law.

### LEGAL MAXIM

**Alibi** – At another place, elsewhere.

**Ante Litem Motam** – Before suit brought; before controversy instituted, or spoken before a lawsuit is brought.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Employing any child or permitting any child to work in contravention of the provisions relating to prohibition of employment of children in dangerous occupation is punishable with imprisonment from 3 month to 1 year with fine not less than Rs. 10,000 but which may be extend to Rs. 2,000 or with both.
