In addition to team awards, Symbiosis Law School, Nagpur was also recognized for excellence in written submissions, securing both Best Memorial (Petitioner) and Best Memorial (Respondent) awards, along with a cash prize of ₹5,000. The Best Mooter award was conferred upon a participant from School of Law, Christ (Deemed to be University), Bengaluru, while the Best Researcher award was presented to Nishant Suresh Patil from Shahaji Law College, Kolhapur.
