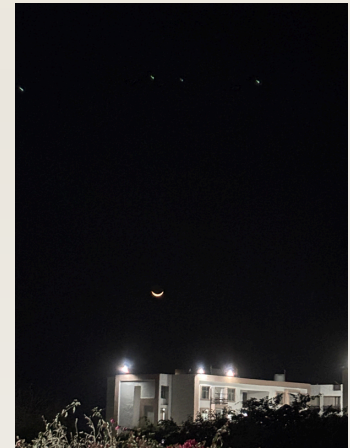
## January Facts
