So believe in "what is inside your heart"


Whether bright or dark

Believe "something is like this"


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THE PREVENTION OF CORRUPTION (AMENDMENT) ACT, 2018

The Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 is an important legislation to fight with the evil of corruption. It is an effective instrument to curb this evil. The success of movement against the evil of corruption depends upon the performance of this legislation. The amendment to the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 was necessitated from the obligation of India to review the existing provision of the Act so as to bring it in line with the United Nation Convention against Corruption (UNCAC). The Parliament on July 24th 2018 passed the Prevention of Corruption (Amendment) Bill, 2018 to enhance transparency and accountability of the government.

Some changes brought by the Amendment are as:

- i. **Punishment for bribe-taking**- Minimum punishment of 3 years and extendable up to 7 years with fine.
- ii. **Collusive bribe-givers criminalized**- The giving of bribe has now been made a direct offence on par with taking of bribe. At the same time, protection has been built-in against coercive bribery, as long as the victim comes forward within 7 days.
- iii. **Undue advantage** – The term now includes “anything other than legal remuneration”
- iv. **Gifts criminalized** – Gifts received for a mala-fide intention are now considered as an act of corruption
- v. **Corporate bribery criminalized**- Superiors will be held if employee/agent has bribed with their approval, for advancement of the organization’s interest.
- vi. **Immediate forfeiture**- Law enforcement empowered for immediate attachment and forfeiture of illegal property of a public servant, invoking provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act/
- vii. **Timely trial mandated**- The investigation and trial must be concluded within 2 years or maximum of 4 years

DID YOU KNOW!

As per **Section 294** of the Indian Penal Code, whoever behaves or says anything obscene in public shall be punished with imprisonment of a term which may extend to three months, with or without fine.

THE INDIAN PENAL CODE, 1860

The first draft of the Indian Penal Code was prepared by the First Law Commission, which was chaired by Thomas Babington Macaulay.

The code came into force on January 1st, 1860 after undergoing many revisions and amendments by Barnes Peacock who would go on to serve as the first Chief Justice of the Calcutta High Court.

The Indian Penal Code (IPC) is the main document which governs all criminal acts and the punishments they ought to be charged with.

The objective of enacting the IPC was to provide a general and exhaustive penal code for crime in India. However, there are several other penal statutes that govern various other offenses in addition to the IPC. In animal law, a notable such statute is the Prevention of Cruelty against Animals Act. In order to be held liable under the IPC, the accused must possess both mens rea (guilty mind) and actus reus (guilty act).

The IPC extends to the whole of India. Punishments under the IPC can be extended both to offenses committed within India as well as offences committed beyond, but which by law may be tried, within India. The provisions of IPC apply also to any offence committed by any citizen of India in any place without and beyond India and by any person on any ship or aircraft registered in India wherever it may be.

The code as of today has 511 sections and 23 chapters. The code covers almost all the offences that are highlighted in the society. Some of the offences which have been included under this code are the: offences of murder, rape, theft, dacoit, extortion, offences against the state, offences relating religion, offence relating to property, defamation, cruelty, kidnapping, offences for the armed forces, and so on so forth. Moreover, the code also provides certain general exceptions in it, which includes the provisions of when an individual will not be punished even if he has committed an offence.
