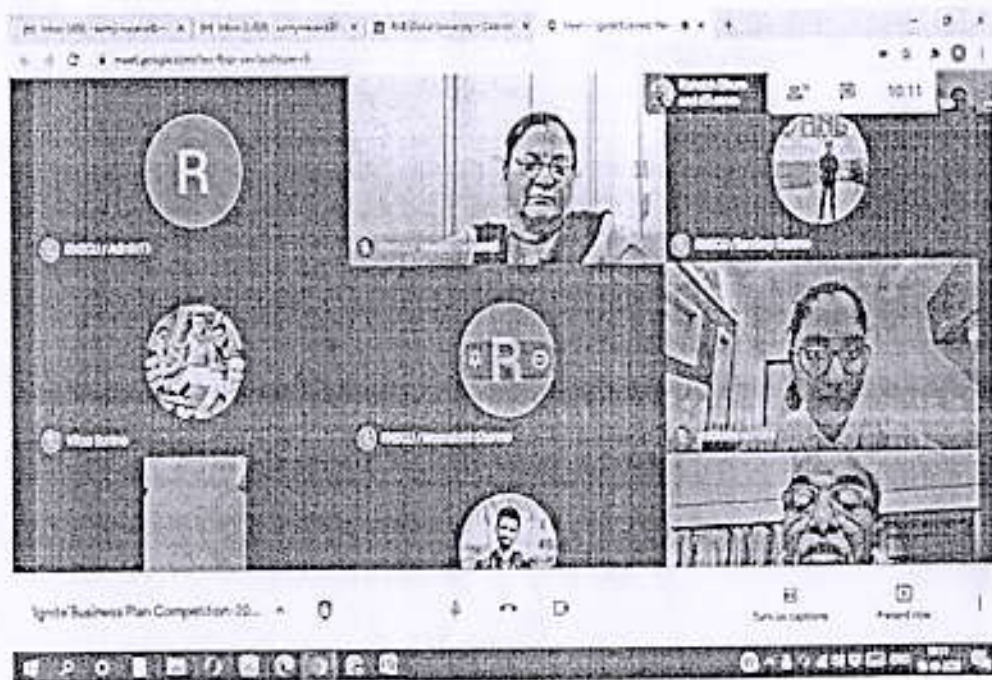

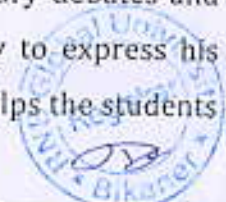

improve their public speaking but also develop their intellect; the students are expected to do their research work in order to frame logical arguments regarding the motion which also helps increase their ideas.

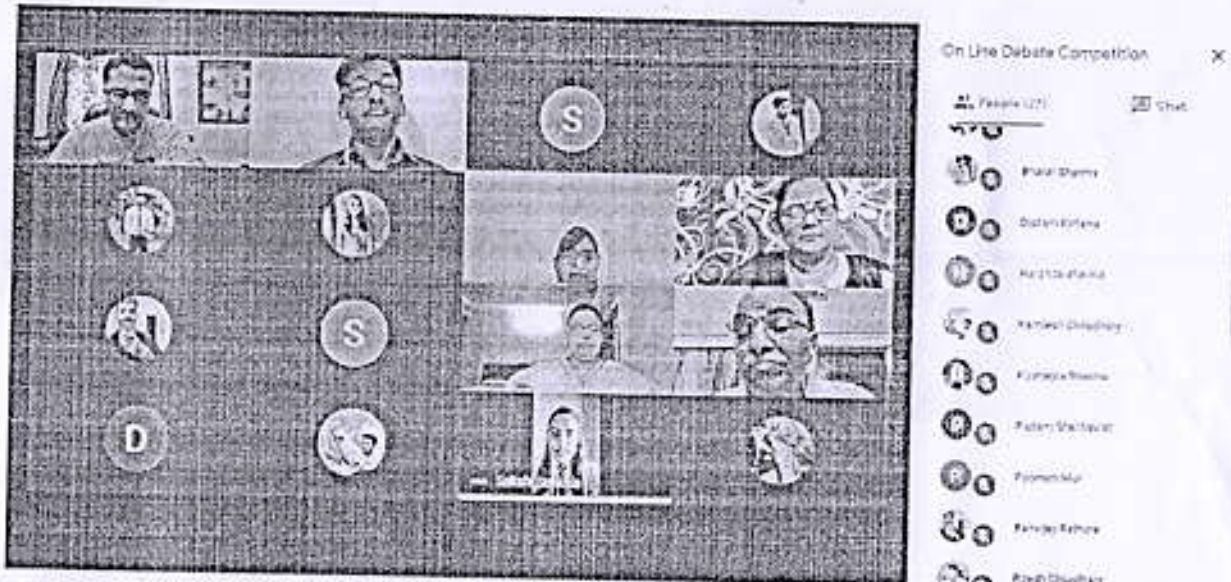

She also went on to explain how the students interested in taking on Spanish as a subject and then career can proceed and the opportunities that are there in the market , if anyone wants to make this his/her career.

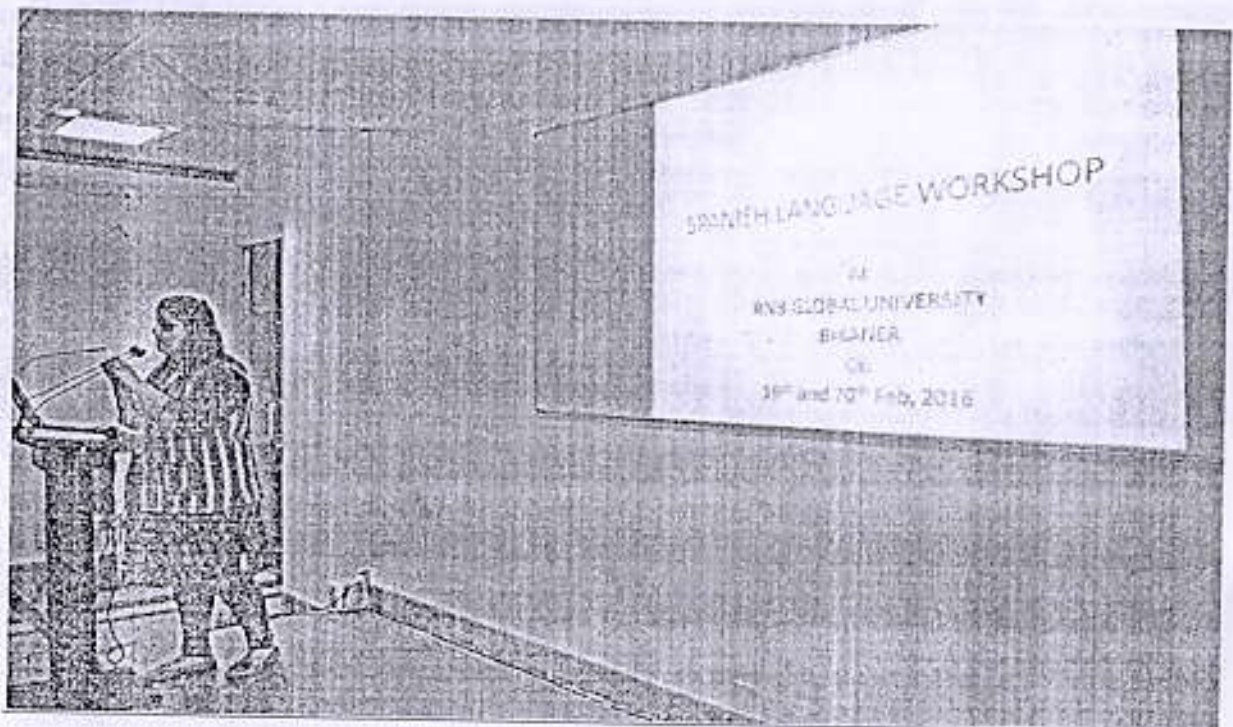

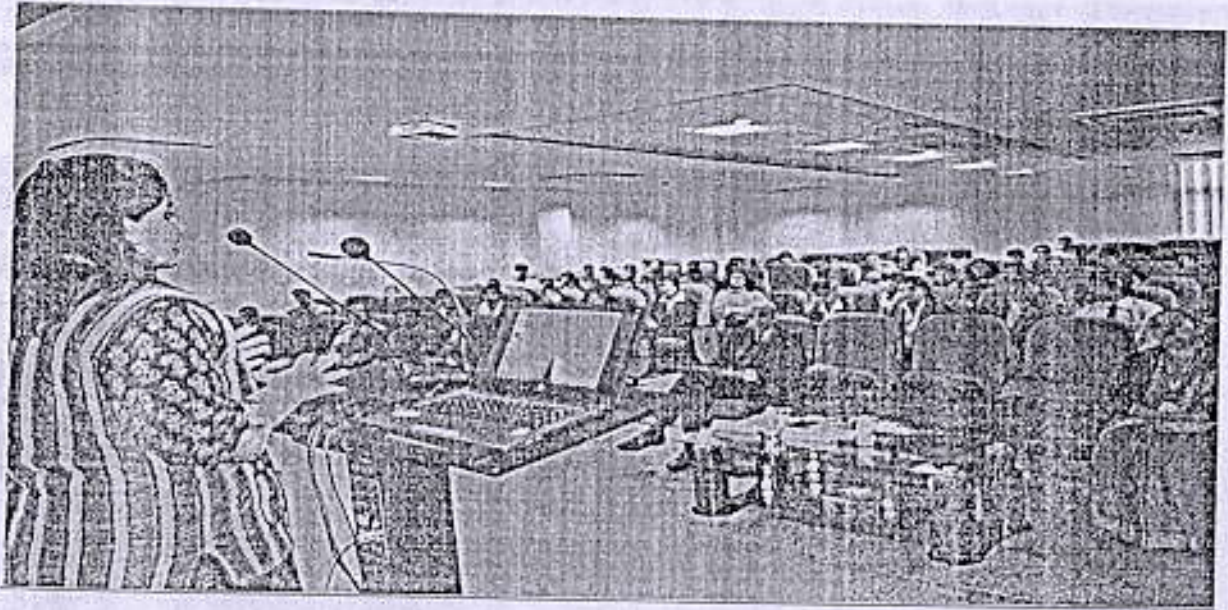
Towards the end it was then time for "Adieus" as all thanked her for her presence and her support in making yet another event at RNB a grand success.

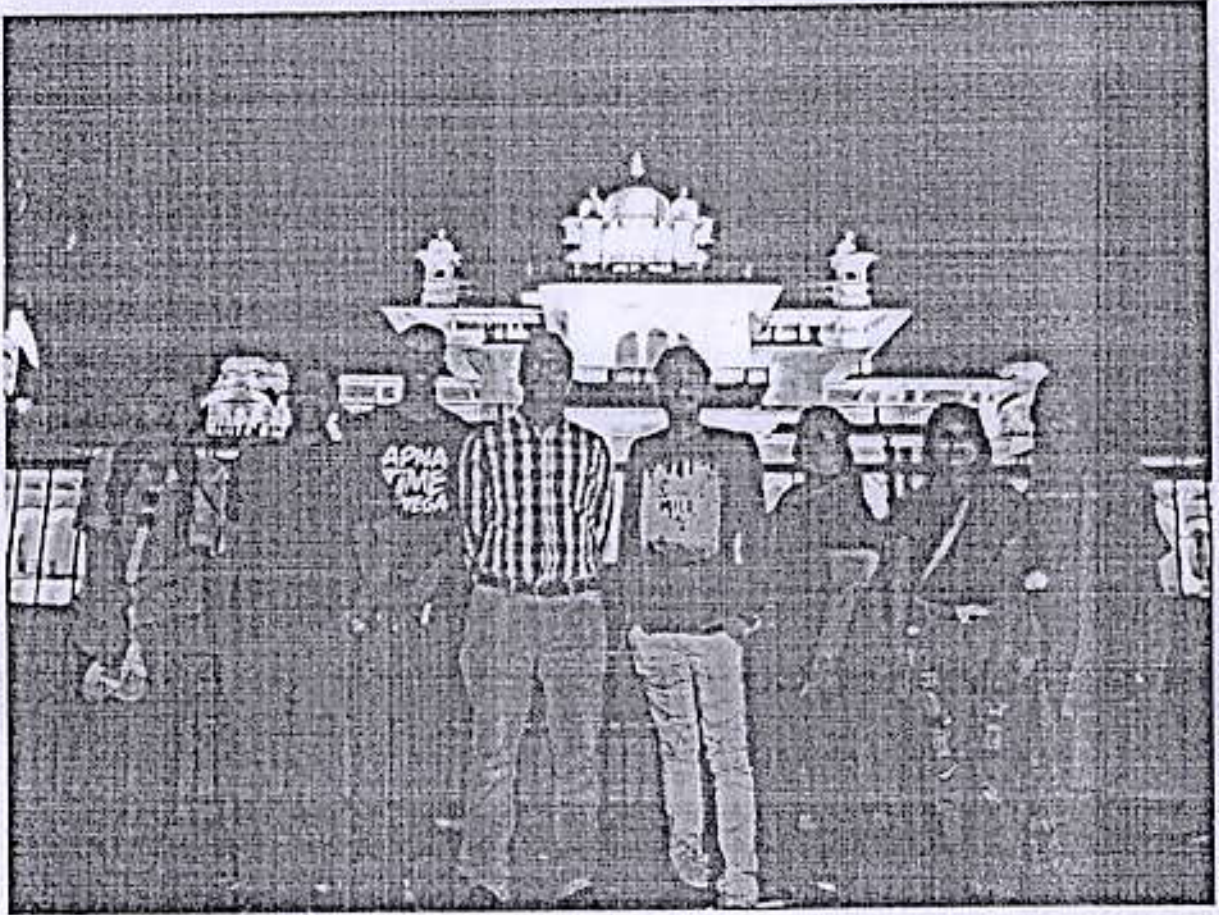

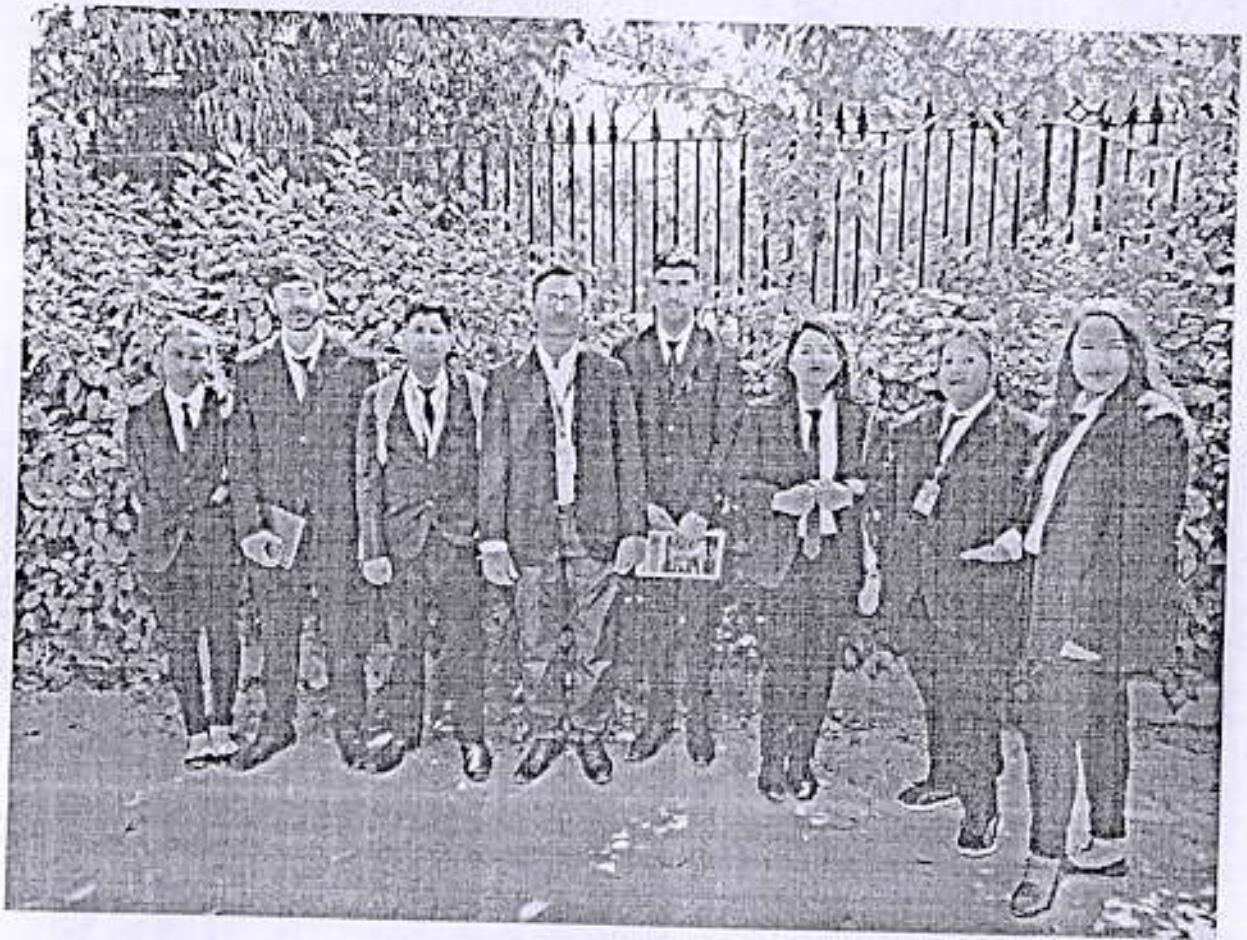














## हाईकोर्ट का अवलोकन किया

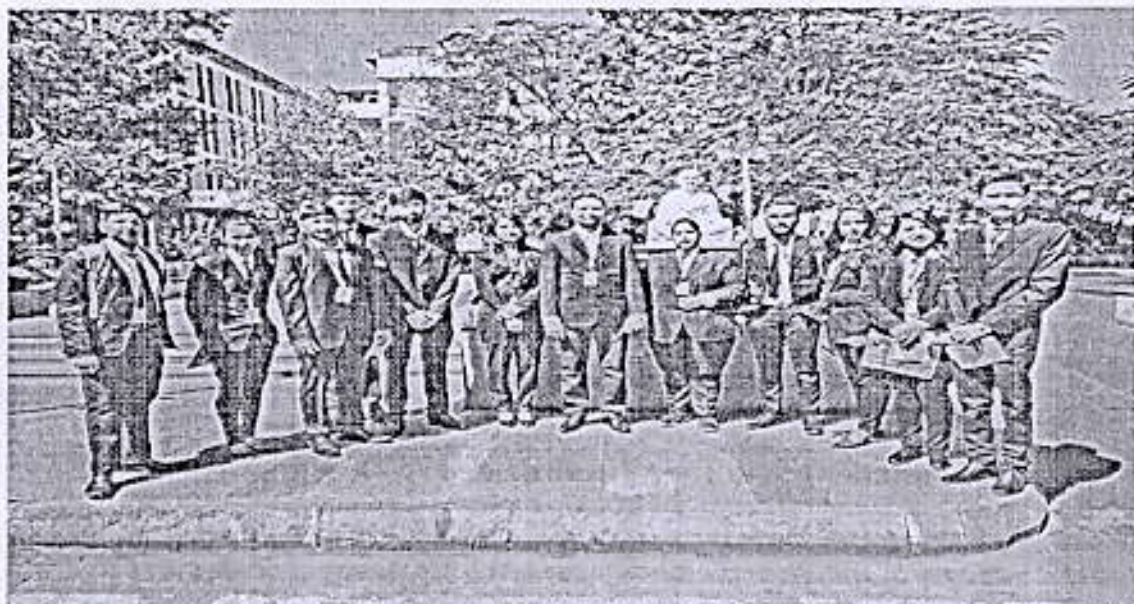

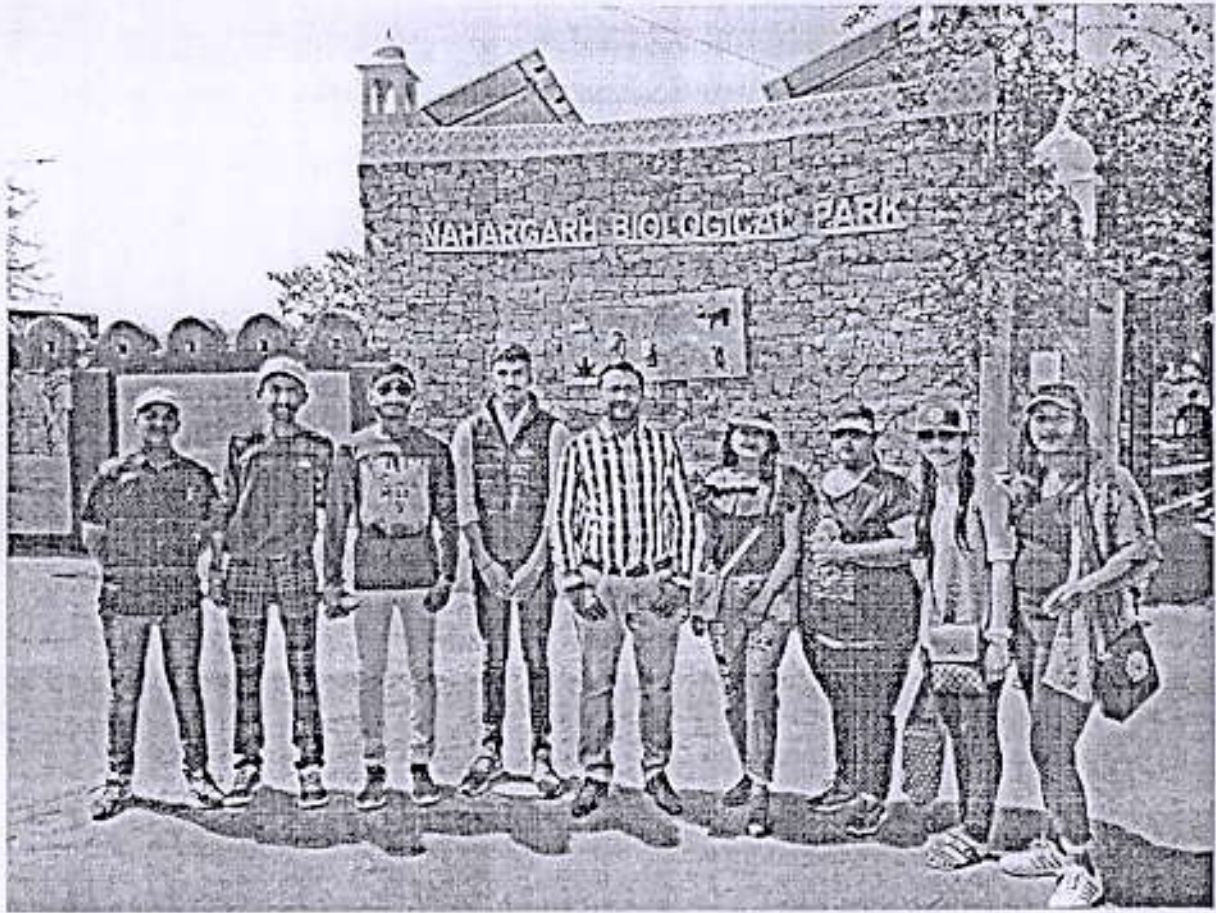
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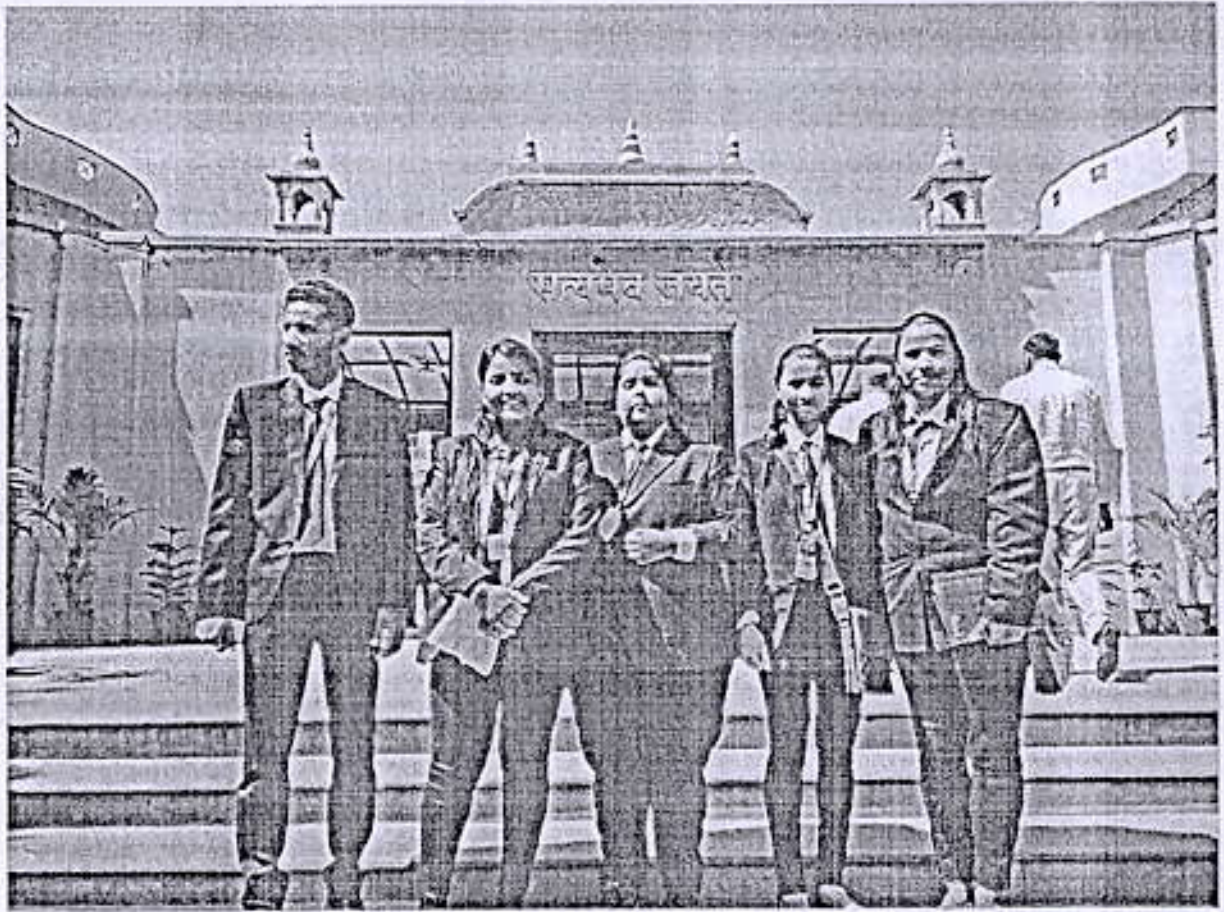

Through the workshop students especially girls practiced & learnt large number of self-defence stances & movements enabling them to protect themselves & others in need of time.





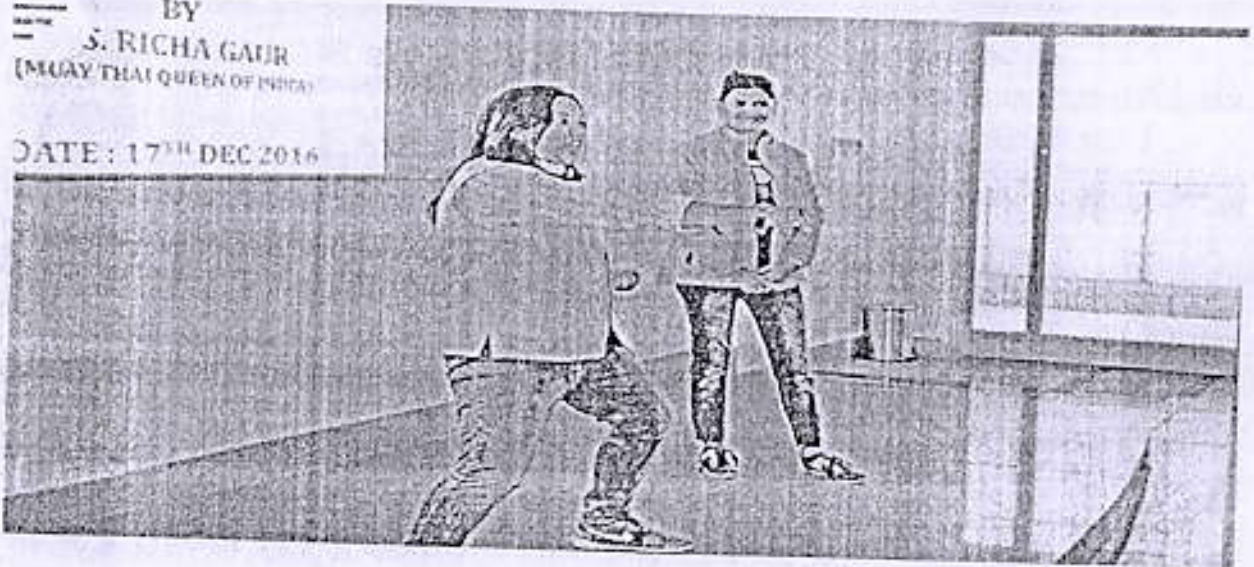

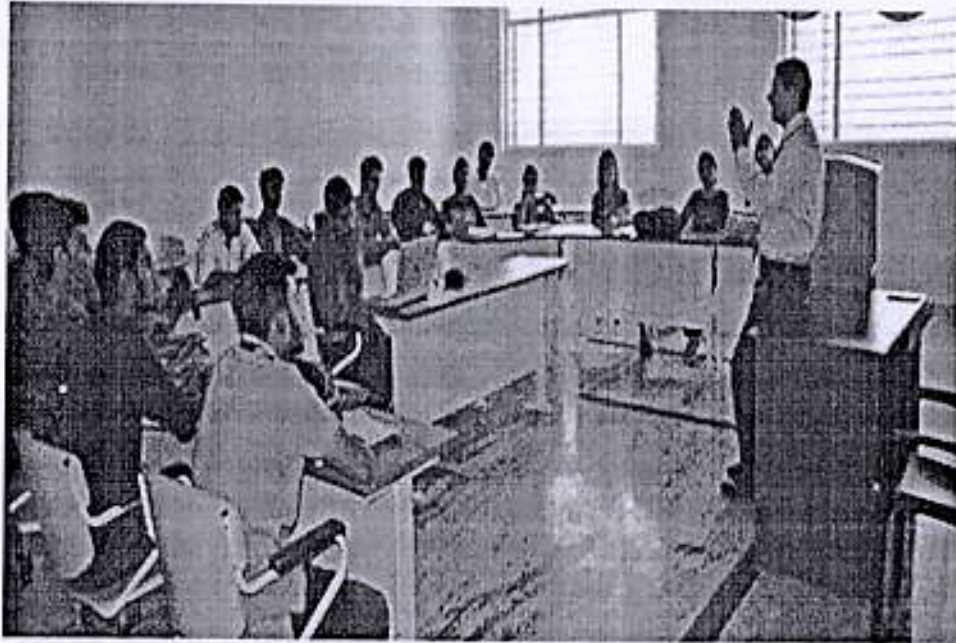

Business without any strategy to tackle the future changes in the government regulations & policies is always at huge risk for losses. Government reforms are one of the key elements in macroeconomic factors affecting a company severely.

GST has been always been in news since its establishment as is a very significant step in the field of indirect tax reforms in India. In general words, Goods and Services Tax (GST) are a proposed system of indirect taxation in India merging most of the existing taxes into a single system of taxation. It was introduced by The Constitution (One Hundred and First Amendment) Act 2016. By amalgamating a large number of Central and State taxes into a single tax, it would mitigate cascading or double taxation in a major way and pave the way for a common national market. From the consumer point of view, the biggest advantage would be in terms of a reduction in the overall tax burden on goods, which is currently estimated to be around 25%-30%.

In order to understand the details about the GST & its effect on the corporate world a guest Lecture on "Business Strategy in GST & Trading strategies" was organized at RNB Global University for Management Students of Master of Business Administration (MBA) on 3rd January 2016. The speaker of the guest lecture was Mr. Arvind Prem, GM-Accounts, Radico Khaitan Ltd., New Delhi who has more than 14 years of experience in Finance & Management.

During the interactive guest lectures, several questions related to GST and its effects on business were raised by the MBA students which were duly answered with business & trading strategy examples. At the end, students understood what and how GST would bring in significant changes in doing business in India. 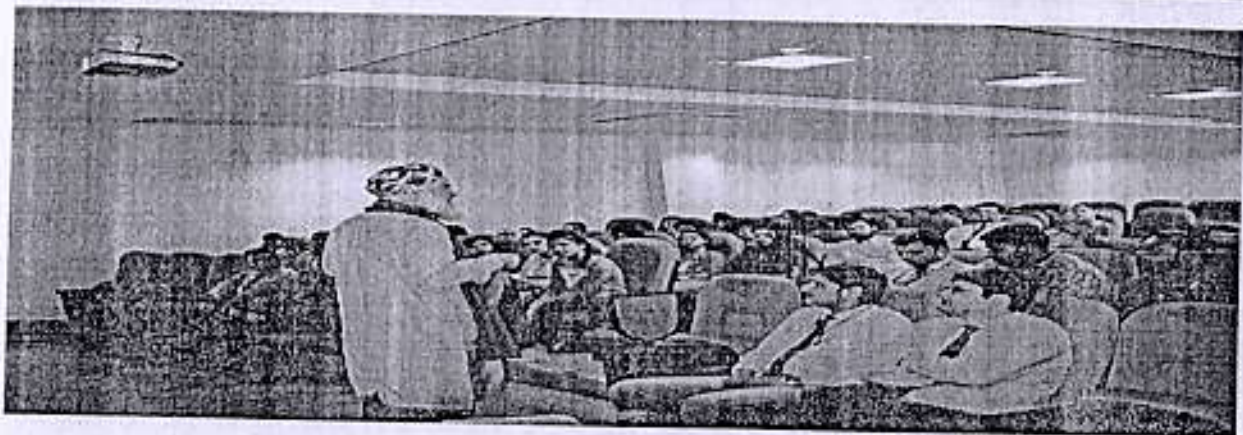

Role-play as a pedagogy has been used in a wide variety of contexts and content areas. Essentially, it is the practice of having students take on specific roles, usually ones in which they are not familiar and act them out in a case-based scenario for the purpose of learning course content or understanding "complex or ambiguous concepts". Thus role playing is also used as a teaching pedagogy at RNB Global University.

A Role Play Competition for the students of MBA and BBA named "Manager play" was conducted at the University campus. 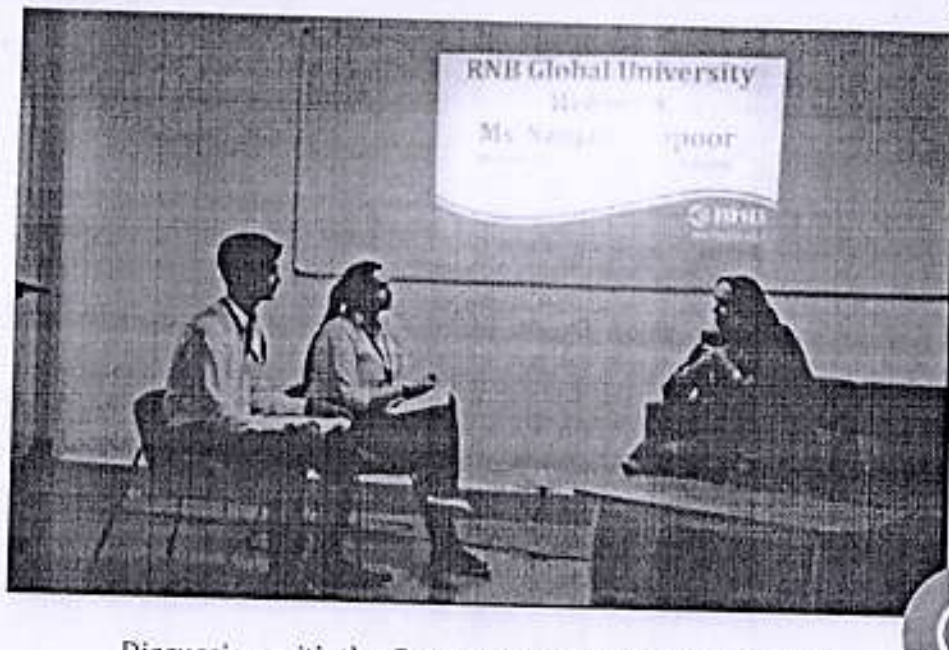

RNBian's had a chance to interact with National School of Drama alumnus, celebrated movie and theatre actor, Mr. Ashok Banthia when he visited the campus.

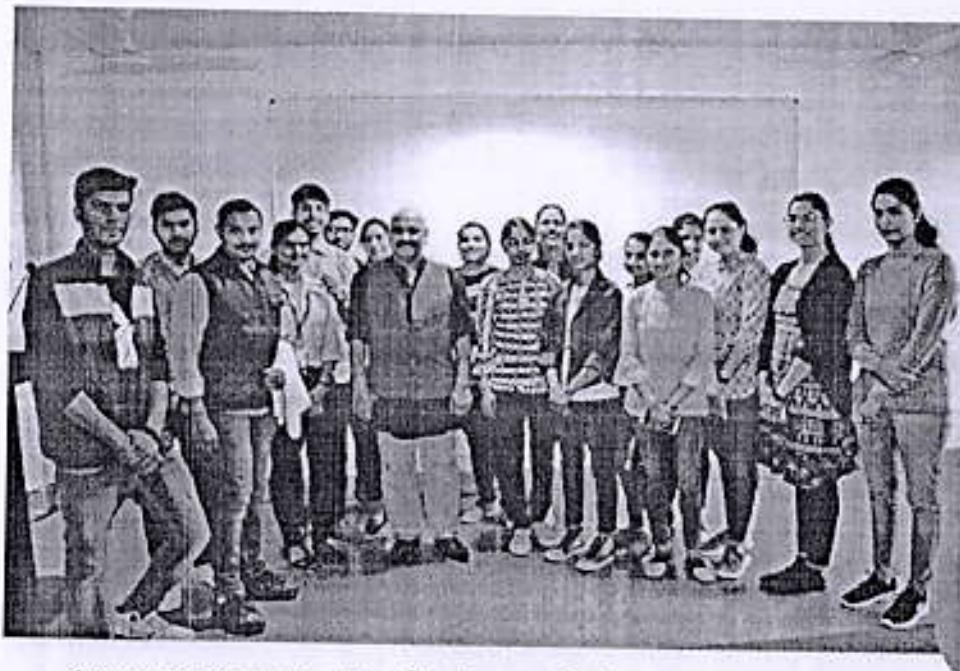

The learning's from Vedas, Upanishad, Epics like Mahabharata & Ramayana have highlighted the way in which a person should behave in ethical manner.


In his talk on Ethical Dilemma, the speaker discussed the teachings of Geeta. The gathering was astonished with the teachings of Lord Krishna.

Citing many examples from his personal life and also of various successful entrepreneurs, he said that students must chase their passion during the college/ University days but at the same time they must secure good marks because it is the degrees and certificates that reflect your achievements during the youth age. He explained various ways of learning as well as marketing his own image and the image of his new venture. He warned that during the service bondage with organization is necessary but more important thing is the personal development in terms of experience, pay package and image.

Many students raised questions and queries after the lecture was concluded. He pacified all the queries of students. His style of presentation was very pleasant and attractive. Speaking extempore he was center of eye balls for all the students, sometimes making them laugh by his comments.

Dr. Nitin Pathak was the coordinator of the special lecture while Dr. Chattar Singh presided over the interactive session. The lecture was concluded with the vote thanks. Students were very much satisfied with this interactive lecture.

- Whether the in-laws will be liable for the offence of criminal conspiracy?

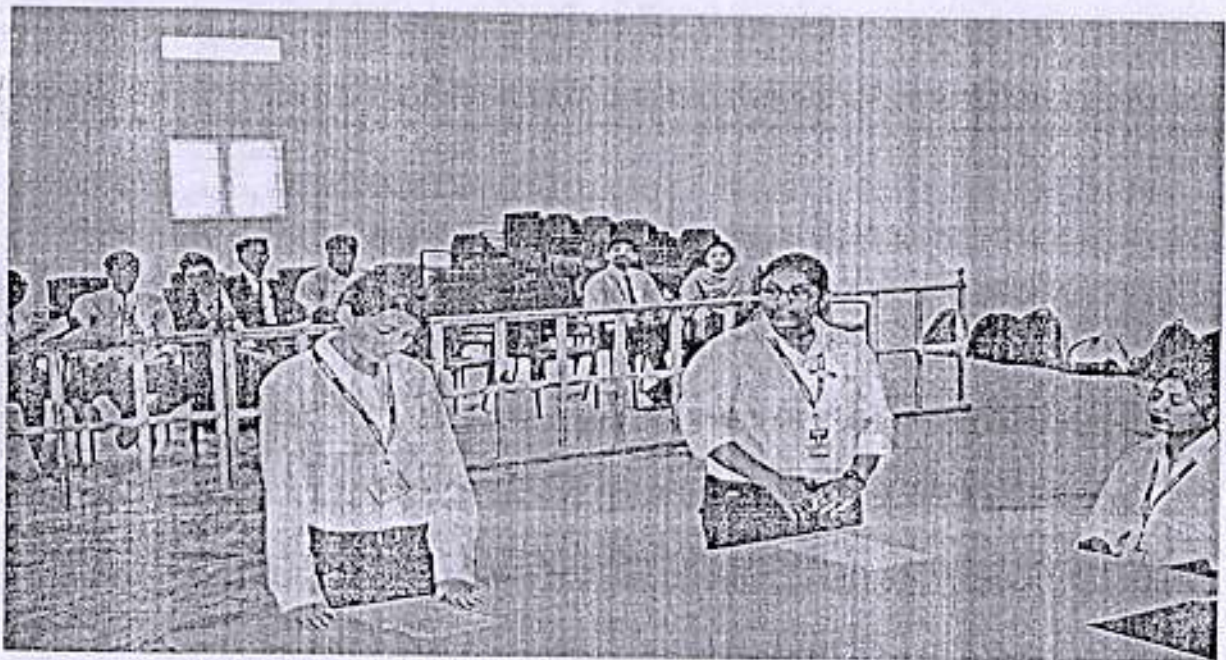
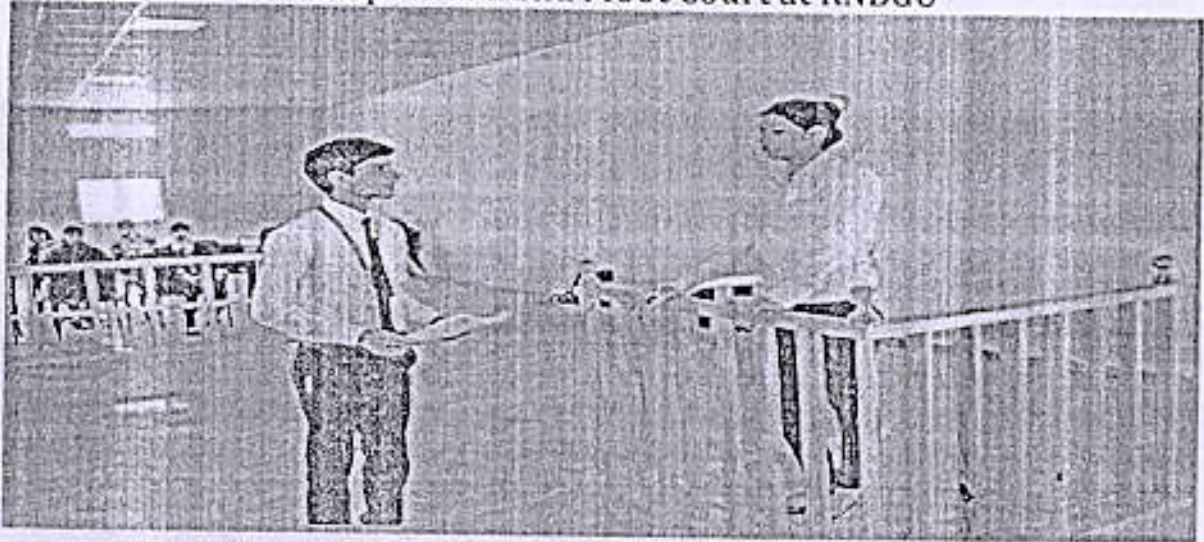

RNB Global University encourages their students for such mooting as this will boost their confidence and trained them for future. These types of mooting gives hand on experience to students and prepare them for their future goals.

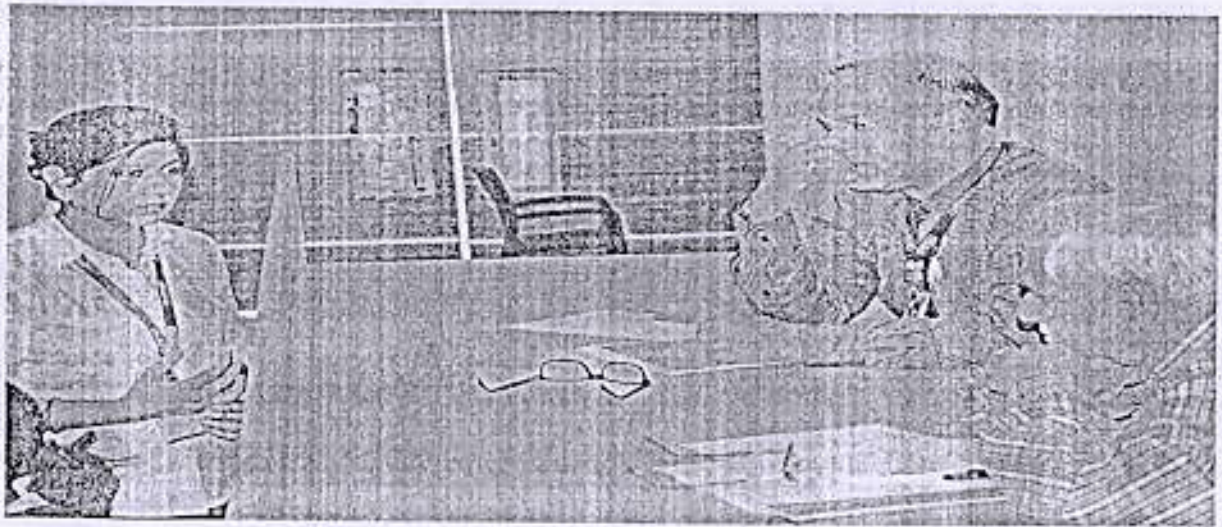
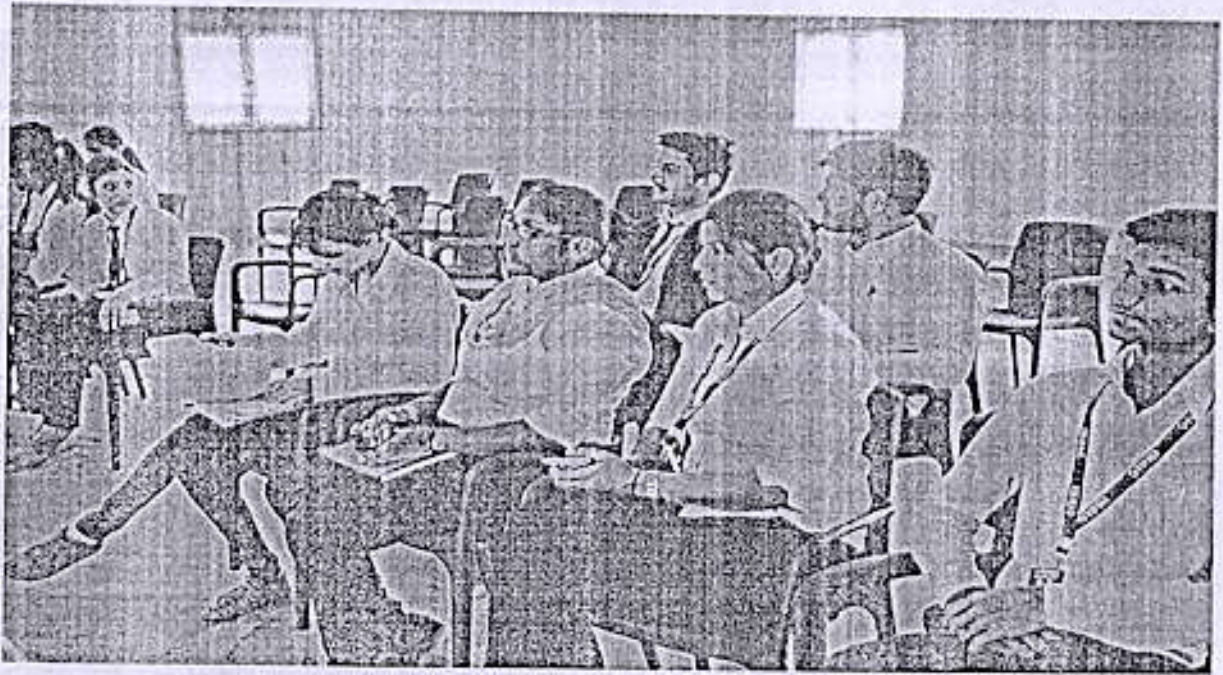

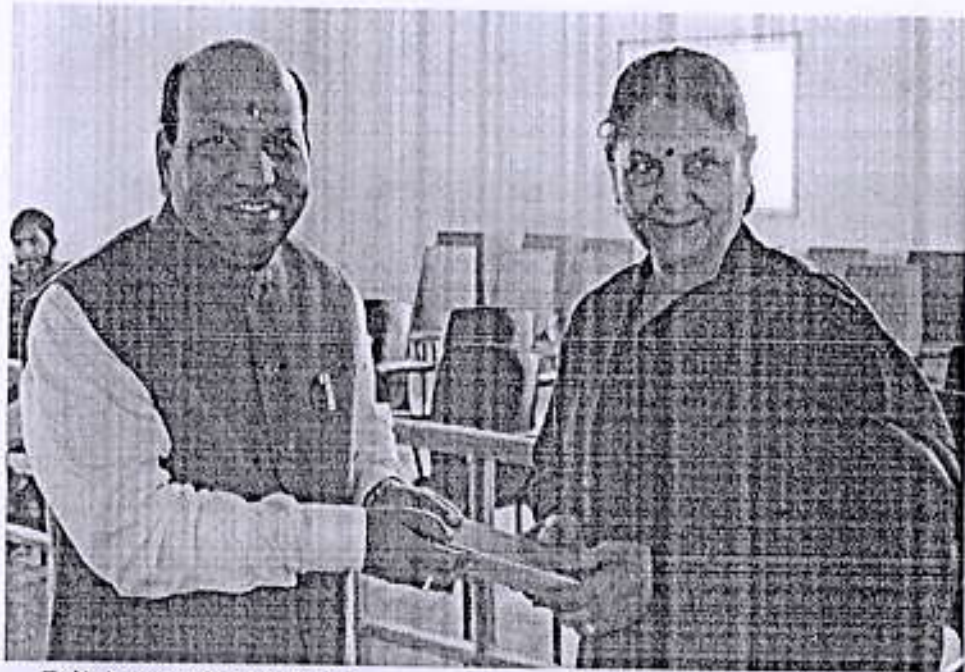

#### 3. Moot Proposition

#### Before the Supreme Court of Zambu Deep

#### State of Van Pradesh and others v. Union of Zambu Deep and others (Appeal against the orders of Zambu Deep National Green Tribunal)

1. The Union of Zambu Deep is a sovereign Democratic Federal Republic in Asia. It has all the laws similar to India. The State of Van Pradesh is one of the Unit States of the Union of Zambu Deep. It has a distinct status under its Constitution.
2. Various appeals have been filed challenging various orders passed by Zambu Deep National Green Tribunal (hereinafter referred as ZDNGT), wherein several directions were issued, measures to be taken to check and combat the unregulated coal mining in Tribal areas of State of Van Pradesh where coal mining resulted not only loss of lives but damaged the environment of the area. 30 coal labourers were trapped inside a coal mine at Ramgarh in the District of Krishan Nagar Hills and 15 of them died inside the coal mine. Serious complaints were made with regard to rat-hole mining operation going on in Teerth Hills in the State of Van Pradesh for last many years without being regulated by any law. In the course of rat-hole coal mining by flooding water several employees and workers have died. The ZDNGT admitted the application and took the view that illegal and unscientific mining neither can be held to be in the interest of people of the area, the people working in the mines nor in the interest of environment.
3. After hearing the applicant, the ZDNGT on 17.04.2014 passed an order directing the Chief Secretary of Van Pradesh, Director General of Police, State of Van Pradesh to ensure that illegal rat-hole mining is stopped forthwith throughout the State of Van Pradesh and any illegal transport of coal shall not take place until further orders passed by the Tribunal.
4. After the passing of the order dated 17.04.2014 various applications were filed before the Tribunal by different Associations and persons claiming interest in the subject matter of the application which were allowed.
5. The Tribunal noticed that there are documents on record to show that right from the year 2003, there has been serious air and water pollution in the mining areas of Van Pradesh which is injurious and has not only resulted in degradation of environment, particularly the streams and underground water, but has also seriously jeopardised the human health. It was further noticed that Transportation of coal in an illegal, unregulated, indiscriminate and unscientific manner has resulted in serious diseases to the people.
6. By order dated 09.06.2014 while permitting the transportation of the already extracted coal lying in open near the mining sites, the Tribunal constituted a Committee for supervising such transportation. Various other directions were issued to the Committee as well as to the State and its authorities. By a subsequent order dated 01.08.2014 the Tribunal noticed that the Committee earlier constituted by order dated 09.06.2014 has failed to perform the functions assigned to it, hence, a new Committee was constituted. The Tribunal from time to time issued following directions:

## Rules & Regulations

### I. Aims and Objective

The principal objective of the 3<sup>rd</sup> SETH JAGANNATH BAJAJ MEMORIAL RNBGU NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION is to provide a real-life experience cum training in doing cutting edge research and to give exposure to students pursuing the law course to the environment of the court system in India and enhance their advocacy skills by presenting ground breaking arguments.

### II. Date and Venue

The 3<sup>rd</sup> SETH JAGANNATH BAJAJ MEMORIAL RNBGU NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION will be held from 1<sup>st</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020 at RNB Global University, RNB Global City, Ganganagar Road, Bikaner, Rajasthan - 334601

### III. Dress Code

Inside the Court Room the participants shall be in Formal Attire:

**Girls:** White Salwar Kurta or Black Pant and White Shirt with Black Tie along with Black Shoes and Black Blazer

**Boys:** White Shirt, Black Trousers with Tie, Black Blazers and Black Shoes

#### A. Language

The language for the Moot Court Competition shall be English only.

#### B. Eligibility

Each law college / University in India shall be eligible to send one team of its regular students. The competition is open for bonafide students pursuing three-year LL.B. or five year integrated law course and they must carry their ID cards and all other necessary documents to justify their eligibility.

#### C. TEAM COMPOSITION

- a. Each team shall consist of a maximum 3 members out of which two members shall be speaker and one researcher. Teams shall specify such counsels with their orders and Researchers at the time of registration and this cannot be changed later during the time of competition.
- b. Each team shall be provided with a team code by draw of lots followed by exchange of memorials.
- c. Team should not disclose their identity of the institutions in course of proceedings of court room. Such disclosure would lead to disqualification.



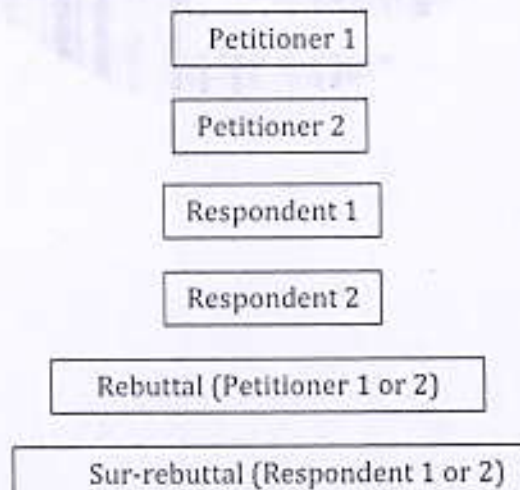

## D. ROUNDS

- a. The Rounds will be held in three stages, that is Preliminary, Semi-Final and Final.
- b. The side to be represented (petitioner/respondent) shall be decided by draw of lots at different Stages during the competition.
- c. Orientation and draw of lots will be on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2020.
- d. On 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2020 at 10 AM there will be the inauguration followed by the preliminary rounds.
- e. Top 4 teams will qualify to the semi- finals which will be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2020.
- f. The qualification to the knockout stage (Semi- Finals) will be based on the win points. In case of tie, teams with the highest aggregate of scores in the preliminaries (Inclusive of Memorial) will qualify to the Semi- Finals.
- g. The Semi Final will be a knock-out round which will be evaluated only on the basis of oral arguments.
- h. The Final will be held on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020.

### Oral Rounds

- a. In each oral round a team will be represented by two speakers who will present arguments. The researcher will not participate in the argument but will be seated along with the speaker during argument.
- b. Passing of any notes (oral or written) to the speaker by researcher is permitted to the minimal extent. However, for doing so the Court mannerism must be followed. Otherwise, there will be negative marking for the same.
- c. The order of the pleadings in each Round at all levels of the Competition shall be:



### Preliminary Round

- a. Each team will get Thirty (30) minutes to present their case including rebuttals and Sur-rebuttals. *The time excludes questioning by judges.*

- b. The division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to maximum of 18 Minutes per speaker. The division of time must be informed to the court officers/ clerks before the beginning of rounds.
- c. Oral rounds need not to be confined to the issue presented in the memorial.
- d. The Team member delivering rebuttal or sur-rebuttal must be one of the two team members who argued during the team's main argument, the team need not indicate prior to rebuttal or sur- rebuttal which of its two eligible members will offer rebuttal or sur- rebuttal.
- e. A team's oral pleadings shall not in any way be limited to the scope of the team's memorial. The scope of the Petitioner's rebuttal shall be limited to responding to the Respondent's primary oral pleadings, and the scope of the Respondent's sur-rebuttal shall be limited to responding to the Petitioner's rebuttal. If the Petitioner waives the rebuttal, there shall be no sur-rebuttal. No legal issues which were not addressed in the primary pleadings may be raised in the rebuttal or sur-rebuttal.

### Semi- Final Round

- a. Each team will get Forty-five (45) minutes to present their case including rebuttals and sur-rebuttals. *The time excludes questioning by judges.*
- b. The division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to maximum of 25 Minutes per speaker. The division of time must be informed to the court officers/ clerks before the beginning of rounds.

Rest of the rules for this round will be same as of the preliminary round.

### Final Round

- a. Each team will get Forty-five (45) minutes to present their case including rebuttals and sur-rebuttals. *The time excludes questioning by judges.*
- b. The division of time is at the discretion of the team members, subject to maximum of 25 Minutes per speaker. The division of time must be informed to the court officers/ clerks before the beginning of rounds.
- c. Oral round need not to be confined to the issue presented in the memorial.
- d. Rest of the rules for this round will be same as of the semi- final round.

## E. REGISTRATION

### 1. Registration Fee-

- i. Rs. 4000 (Rupees Four thousand only): With accommodation in single room, during the period of competition, food, pick up & drop from airport/Railway station /Bus stand, and any other facility provided by the university, to its discretion.
- ii. Rs. 1500 (Rupees one thousand five hundred only): without accommodation.

- No subsequent change in the team composition shall be permitted unless any unavoidable circumstance demand so.
- We have planned to entertain a maximum of 16 teams only. In case the number of participating teams falls lesser than 8, the Moot Court Competition may not be held, and in such an event, the registration fee of all the registered teams will be returned. Decision in this regard is the sole prerogative of the Organizing Committee.

### F. CODE OF CONDUCT

- Each team will be designated a team code after the registration.
- Teams shall not disclose their identity or name of their institution or city etc.
- Such disclosure shall invite penalties including disqualification. The decision for the same shall be at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- All participants are expected to maintain the decorum in the Court during the competition and are expected to conduct themselves in a manner befitting the legal profession.

### G. MEMORIALS

- Each team must prepare memorials from both the sides to the case.
- Once the memorials have been submitted, no revision, supplements or addition will be allowed.
- Soft copy of the memorials from both the sides must be sent through the email to [MCCRNB@RNBGLOBAL.EDU.IN](mailto:MCCRNB@RNBGLOBAL.EDU.IN), latest by 25 January, 2020.
- Each team shall submit six (6) hard copies of the Memorials, and one copy on CD shall be submitted to the Organizing Committee, of the RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY, Bikaner, Rajasthan latest by 27<sup>th</sup> January , 2020.

5. Late submission of memorial will attract (-1) point penalty for each delay for each memorial.
6. Memorials must be submitted on typed A 4 size paper with 1.5 space in 11-point Times new Roman, printed on one side and must contain:

  - Table of Contents
  - Index of Authorities
  - Statement of Jurisdiction
  - Statement of Facts (2 page only and submission of argumentative statement of facts will attract penalty)
  - Statement of issues
  - Summary of Arguments
  - Arguments Advanced (15 Page)
  - Prayer
  - The argument must not exceed fifteen (15) pages.
7. Memorials should be in **Spiral/Hard binding only**. Use of **cellophane/ plastic sheets** will not be allowed.
8. Page numbering should be at the bottom middle of each page.
9. Sides must be mentioned in the memorial in the header.
10. Paper Cover must be placed on brief with relevant information.
11. The memorial from petitioner's side must be having blue colored cover page and Red in case of respondents. All hard copies of memorials have to be printed in A4 size paper.
12. The cover page must state the following
  - Name of the Court
  - Name and year of the Competition
  - Cause Title
  - Identify Brief (i.e. "Memorial for the Appropriate Side of the Case)

#### H. CITATION FORMAT

1. The Memorials shall use *Standard Indian Legal Citation*, for formatting of all cited authorities. Speaking Footnotes or endnotes are not allowed.

## I. DISQUALIFICATION AND PENALTIES

### a. Cheating, Intimidation and Misconduct

1. Cheating or using of unfair means of any kind is strictly prohibited and if found to be indulged in, shall result in disqualification of the team.
2. Intimidation in any form is prohibited, and if found to be indulged in, shall result in disqualification of the entire team.
3. Misconduct, whether behavioral or otherwise, is not allowed, and if found to be indulged in, shall result in disqualification of the entire team.

### b. Court Manners (Oral Arguments)

1. Any form of communication found to be between the Bar table and any person other than those on the Bench is prohibited, and if indulged in, will result in a penalty point.
2. Submission of any written material other than the memorials, compendium and any other documents related to the proposition in hand to the Bench prior to, during or after the oral arguments, is not allowed, and if found to be indulged, in will result in a penalty point.
3. Failure to deliver an oral argument shall be considered to be a disqualification.

### c. Scouting

1. Speakers, a reserve or persons affiliated with the team, will not be permitted to observe the arguments in any court room in which the team is not one of the contesting teams whilst the team is still in the competition. Scouting by any team will result in disqualification.
2. Any team can file written complaint with the Organizing Committee, regarding a case of scouting and this committee's decision will be final and binding.
3. The researcher will be seated with the speakers at the time of arguments and shall not attend the court session of other teams participating in the competition.

## J. MARKING CRITERIA

### *Oral Round (For Mooters)*

The judges would assign marks to each individual speaker out of Hundred (100) marks. The team score would be the average of the total marks for oral presentations of the 2 speakers out of Hundred (100) marks. The following shall be the Marking Criterion and the Marks allocated to each category

**Learning Outcomes:**

1. A moot court competition simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyses a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.
2. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.
3. The procedure imitates that followed in real courts: the judge enters, the mooters and the judge bow to each other, the clerk announces the matter, the mooters give their appearances and are then called on in turn to present their submissions, the judge asks questions of the mooters, the court adjourns, and the judge then returns to deliver a brief judgment and some feedback.
4. Mooting is not the same as public speaking or debating, although it shares some common elements with these activities. It is a specialized application of the art of persuasive advocacy. It has been part of the process of training lawyers for centuries and plays an important role in legal education.
5. Student become aware about the mooting techniques, memorial formation methods and art of argument before court.

## Introduction

### **Working Session 1: Decoding the Moot Proposition**

At the Morning of 23.01.2020, the session was conducted by Mr. Anant having worked at Sharda Amarchand Mangaldas and Mr. Rachnendra practising litigation, for enhancing the mootng capability of the students. Soon after the Inaugural session, the first Working session on “Decoding the moot proposition” began. First, they discussed about the extracting the material facts where we were told to read the moot problem, mark new words along with name of statutes and new concepts. Then we were told to analyse the applicable statutes in moot proposition which helped us to identify the law applicable in moot proposition.

### **Working Session 2: Examining sections of memorials**

The session started primarily with examining the sections of memorials i.e. which sections are applicable to the moot proposition. Then we discussed about framing the issues and sub issues where we were guided to identify the material and immaterial facts. Lastly, they guided us as how to prepare the statement of jurisdiction where they gave us the MANTRA (Formula) i.e. ILAC (Issues Law Argument Conclusion)

### **Working Session 3: Preparing the Memorial Structure**

This session started by them giving an overview of preparing the memorial structure where we were told that “Research is the most important part of any moot preparation. Research never ends, not even on the day of the moot. However, the formatting of your memorial is also very important, and many people tend to forget that which is why their memorial score is the reason for low team ranks”.

### **Working Session 4: Discussion on 3rd Seth Jagan Nath Bajaj National Moot Competition-**

We discussed about the moot proposition which our university is organizing, we got to know about the basics of drafting, specific word usage, hierarchy of authorities etc. It was very helpful to us as it made our work easier and which could save a lot of time while preparing a proposition as they’ve told us various shortcuts along with couple of strategies which would make our moot proposition presentable.

### **Day 2: 24th January 2020**

**Working session 1: Preparing the Memorial Structure** 1st session of day 2 started with understanding the basic formatting tools for memorial making for e.g. Appropriate heading, fonts, header/ footer, alignment, line and paragraph spacing, border, margins etc. Further we were guided as how to prepare complete memorial outline as earlier, we were unaware of these things, therefore, it helped us a lot in preparing memorials. We were guided as how to use MS word shortcuts for e.g. (Enter+ Ctrl+ Enter) for adding new page etc.

**Working session 2: Drafting and finalizing the memorials:** The session started with learning the basics of memorial drafting where they guided us about the drafting styles and strategies, specific



word usage, consistent drafting, capitalization, using of ILAC, etc. Then they discussed the IRAC method of drafting and they told us that IRAC is used after your facts section, in the discussion section or your memo, or the argument section of your brief.

**Working session 3: Checks and touch ups** This session started with discussing about drafting prayer and arguments synopsis, where they guided us about how the prayer must be short and precise which shall consist of all the relaxations which the party wants from the Hon'ble Court. Then they guided us through the final formatting checks and touch ups i.e. How to correct the citations, how to highlight your headings. Further, he guided us about how to generate the index and table of authorities with the use of MS word.

**Working session 4: Bonus Tips** In this session they've discussed about how to set the timeline for a moot i.e. within the prescribed time period within the guidelines. Then they guided us about how to manage the memorials within the page limits, they told us that how not to exaggerate things and how to write point-to-point. Further, they taught us how to make one's memorial appealing i.e. using of proper lines and spacings and how to decorate your memorial if needed. At last they solved our queries regarding the training program.

### About the Proceeding of Open House Session

The session started with the welcome and felicitation of guests. After the brief introduction of guest's session started by Prof Ranbir Singh. He put some light on the importance of research work in the field of study of law and career. For a law student it is very important to understand the application of research in the profession of advocacy and the other career related to the law, Prof. Ranbir Singh said. He called students for starting the research work from the beginning of first semester. He explained the difference between ordinary and extraordinary and for success in present time we must do some extra work to become extraordinary. He motivated the students to be academically sound, technically competent and socially responsible.

He told that legal education means acquiring knowledge and skills of the subjects of law to become legal professionals as well as it means teaching law as one of the academic disciplines for the practice of law and to become member of the profession. Prof Ranbir Singh expressed his view that law includes both professional and liberal education i.e. acquiring professional skills as well as aiming at value-oriented, socio-cultural education. He stressed that a lawyer is the product of such education, who is boon for the society as he works for the benefit and welfare of the society by claiming justice on behalf of his client in the court of law and legal education works not only as an instrument of social control but also as instrument of social change which is imperative to create cultured law abiding citizens, who are inculcated with the concept of human rights and values which is the essential medium of the change.

Adding in his statement Prof Ranbir Singh told that legal education and its importance to establish rule of law in society to impart justice does not receive serious priority though one can easily study history of modern times which shows that lawyers are social engineers who gave leadership to nations. For example, most of our freedom fighters such as Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Rajaji, etc. were lawyers and were not doctors, engineers and not people from other fields. It is due to the reason that they interact with society at large and have knowledge of law that how one should find loopholes in law and apply it to do good for society by safeguarding their rights from arbitral powers. It is due to the continuous efforts of lawyers only that we enjoy our basic fundamental rights which cannot be abridge by government or any other authority and these are the basic rights a person must receive in order to have freedom in his life and any law or rule which infringes the fundamental rights is made ultra-virus as to secure justice. Legal education not only provide justice but create awareness among individuals of their rights, duties, values, ethics and morals i.e. it create consciousness through law and religion among society that what is right and wrong and in which direction a person needs to head by following rule of law.

He also stated that today in India there are 12 National Law Universities and other includes private and state universities imparting legal education under the supervision of BCI and Every work in the field of legal education is done in consonance with the provisions of BCI with its



approval and BCI is responsible to lay down rules and to promote legal education in India. All the universities imparting legal education are affiliated from BCI and students seeking enrollment as advocates require to qualify All India Bar Examination conducted by BCI which is a compulsory exam to enroll as advocates in our country.

After the address of Prof Ranbir Singh another important guest of the open house session Prof K P S Mahalwar focused on the aims of legal education in India. He confirms that legal profession has always been considered as a noble profession as lawyers are the center pillars of the society who help the common man to know his rights and claim them legally. We need legal education to fulfil the needs of the society and country as well because lawyers are the persons who interpret the law and deals directly with the entire society. Modern legal education in India was started by the British and its principal aim was to acquaint Indians with rules of law which would help them in the administration of the country.

#### Interactive session with students of school of Law-

After these two important speeches students asked many questions related to career in law, ways to get success in law field, secrets of success of various national law universities in India, exaggerated fines in new motor vehicle act, reasons for delay in Justice in India etc, which was suitably answered by the guests.

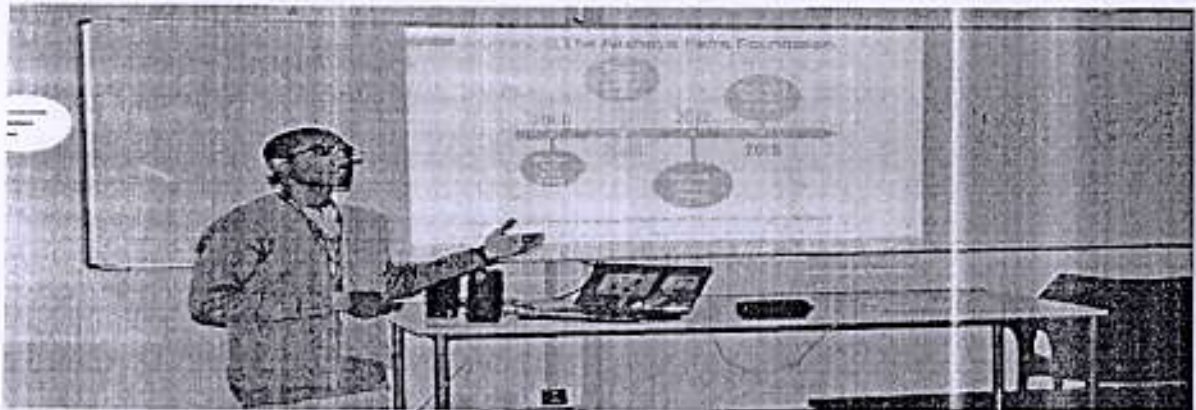


The session was highly beneficial for the students while facing upcoming social change. Students were motivated regarding good habits, how to train mind. The session ended with an activity of sound meditation.

One of the students of B.Sc. V Mr. Rahul Katariya delivered lecture on COMETs and beautifully explained the movement of comets around the sun. When they are near the Sun and active, comets have several distinct parts as listed:

- nucleus: relatively solid and stable, mostly ice and gas with a small amount of dust and other solids;
- coma: dense cloud of water, carbon dioxide and other neutral gases sublimed from the nucleus;
- hydrogen cloud: huge (millions of km in diameter) but very sparse envelope of neutral hydrogen;



- dust tail: up to 10 million km long composed of smoke-sized dust particles driven off the nucleus by escaping gases; this is the most prominent part of a comet to the unaided eye;
- ion tail: as much as several hundred million km long composed of plasma and laced with rays and streamers caused by interactions with the solar win.

### About the workshop:

Big Data is a term used for a collection of data sets that are large and complex, which is difficult to store and process using available database management tools or traditional data processing applications. The challenge includes capturing, curating, storing, searching, sharing, transferring, analyzing and visualization of this data.

The three different formats of big data are:

1. *Structured*: Organised data format with a fixed schema. Ex: RDBMS
2. *Semi-Structured*: Partially organized data which does not have a fixed format. Ex: XML, JSON
3. *Unstructured*: Unorganized data with an unknown schema. Ex: Audio, video files, etc.

Hadoop is an open-source software framework used for storing and processing Big Data in a distributed manner on large clusters of commodity hardware. Hadoop is licensed under the Apache v2 license. Hadoop was developed, based on the paper written by Google on the MapReduce system and it applies concepts of functional programming. Hadoop is written in the Java programming language and ranks among the highest-level Apache projects.

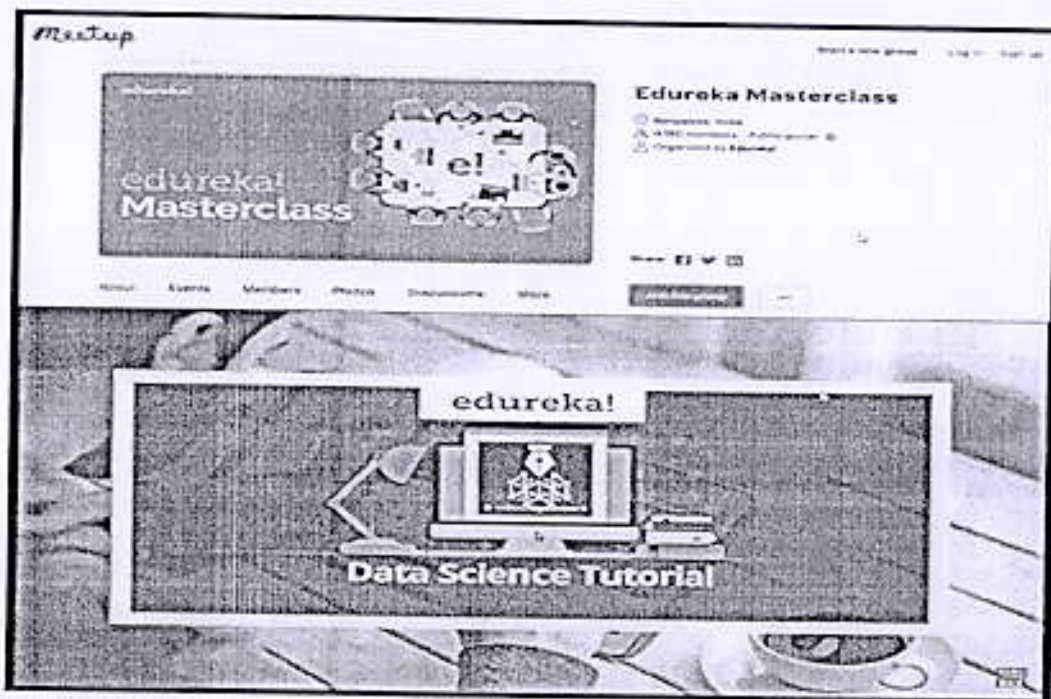
### Valedictory Session



### **Objectives of Seminar:**

To create research interest among students and to better understand the scope of biotechnology for agriculture, industrial and medicinal fields.

### **Inaugural Session:**

The event started on time that is; at 12 Noon. All the Guests and audience were welcomed by Ms. Surbhi Sharma, B Sc IV Sem Biotechnology. She briefed the audience about the vision of RNB Global University. Then Inaugural Speech was given by Prof. Karkara, who welcomed the Guest Speakers and explained about the role of biotechnology during the pandemic of Covid 19. Then Ms Simran Bothra and Ms Pooja from BSc VI Sem Biotech introduced our Resource persons very nicely. Ms Pratibha Shaurya from BSc Agri VI Sem briefed about the program layout and topics going to be covered in technical sessions by respective resource persons.

### **Technical Sessions:**

Technical session 1 by Prof. Absar Ahamad, Director, Nanotechnology Centre, AMU was very interesting and informative as he gave a crisp talk from the basics about his research in endophytic fungi and utilizing it for nanoparticle synthesis. He explained in detail the applications of these nanoparticles in various fields like; single step conversion of sea water into potable water, to dissolve cholesterol in arteries, to kill cancer cells in situ etc.

Second technical talk was from Prof. Shruti Mathur, Amity, Jaipur who explained the importance of microbes in our everyday life. From probiotics to biofuels, how microbes can contribute to sustainable innovations was excellently presented by Prof. Mathur.

Third technical session was by Dr. Deepak Rajpurohit from MPUAT, Udaipur. He gave a talk on pyramiding of genes for bacterial blight resistance and semi dwarfing by using SSR and ISSR markers in basmati rice. It was brilliantly delivered. A pure technical talk, he had made it so simple as to undergraduate level, made it interesting to the students. Dr. Rajpurohit during discussion gave informative career advice to the students too.

Students asked their queries to the speakers, which they satisfied. After the interactive session, Dr. Noble Kurian gave concluding remarks. He summarized the all three lectures brilliantly in a short and crisp script. ### Resource Persons:

**Prof. Absar Ahmad** has made pioneering and key contributions to the fields of bio-nano-science and technology which have received high international acclaim amongst peers. Most notably, his entire volume of work has been developed and done in India. His work is noteworthy for its content of innovation and discovery based on imagination, keen observation and application. It has an underlying theme of imaginative implementation of environmentally friendly, green chemistry, room temperature biological and bioinspired methods to emerging areas of modern science with multidisciplinary applicability. In particular, his works on bioinspired synthesis of metal, semiconductor and oxide nanosystems using fungal and plant extract media and related studies on elucidation and control of the biomolecular processes and mechanisms are highly cited. His recent works on anticancer drug extraction from endophytic fungi, and their immobilization of nanosystems for drug delivery applications are expected to have significant impact on the emerging field of nanomedicine. He has co-authored many papers in high impact journals and has obtained a number of national and international patents. Prof. Absar has been conferred with several prestigious awards which include the DBT-Tata Innovation fellowship, VASVIK Industrial Award, Materials Research Society of India (MRSI) Medal, CSIR-National Chemical Laboratory: Scientist of the Year, etc. He has 110 Research Papers published with Total Citations above 24,500 with h-Index: 52

**Dr. Shruti Mathur** has an Experience of 29 yrs in the field of Biotechnology. She has been actively engaged in research and teaching at MS University, Baroda Gujarat, then IIS University Jaipur as Head of Dept. of Biotechnology and at Amity University for the last 09 years. Her research interest is in microbial bioremediation of heavy metals. She co-authored 03 books. One text book on Techniques in Biology and 02 books on Water. She earned various awards and achievements in her career including, YOUNG SCIENTIST AWARD, Summer Research Fellowship of Indian Academy of Sciences-INSANA-SASI, Bangalore, Received award from Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot for record sales of book written 'Dharti par Paani' published by Rajasthan Hindi Granth Academy. August 2019. She has filed and granted One Patent for biosurfactant production.

**Dr. Deepak Rajpurohit** has an experience of about 20 years in research and teaching. He did his Ph. D from IIT Roorkee. He has a brilliant academic background. As he cleared several national level fellowship exams and pre Ph.D entrance of many reputed Institutes. His research field is molecular biology and has handled many research projects and developed many protocols. 


