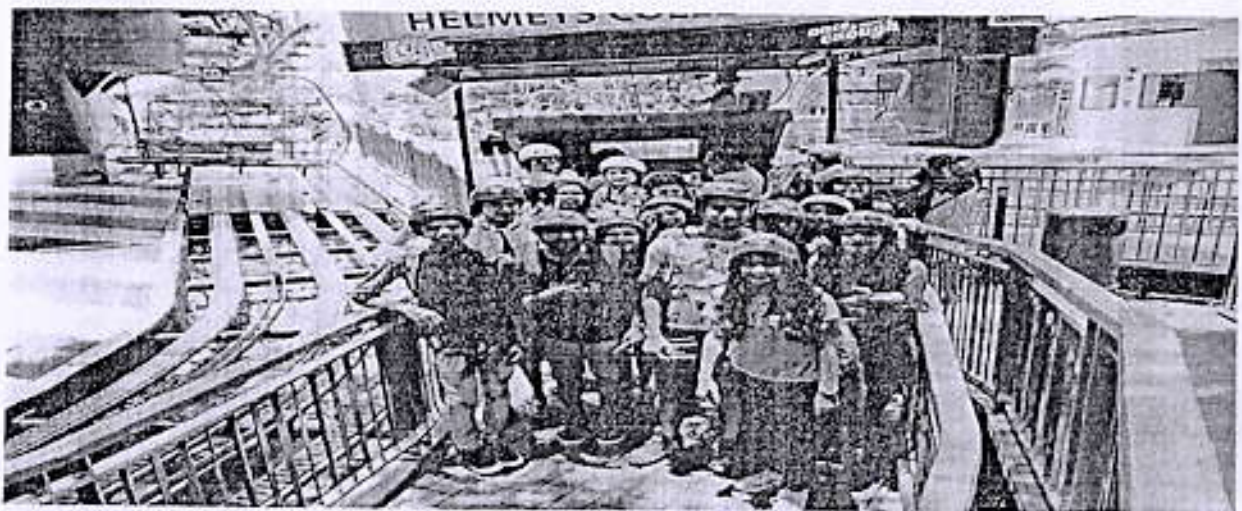
Such industrial visits really enhance value-added learning for the students. It is an important module of the programme, and more are planned to other countries to expose the students to other industries.

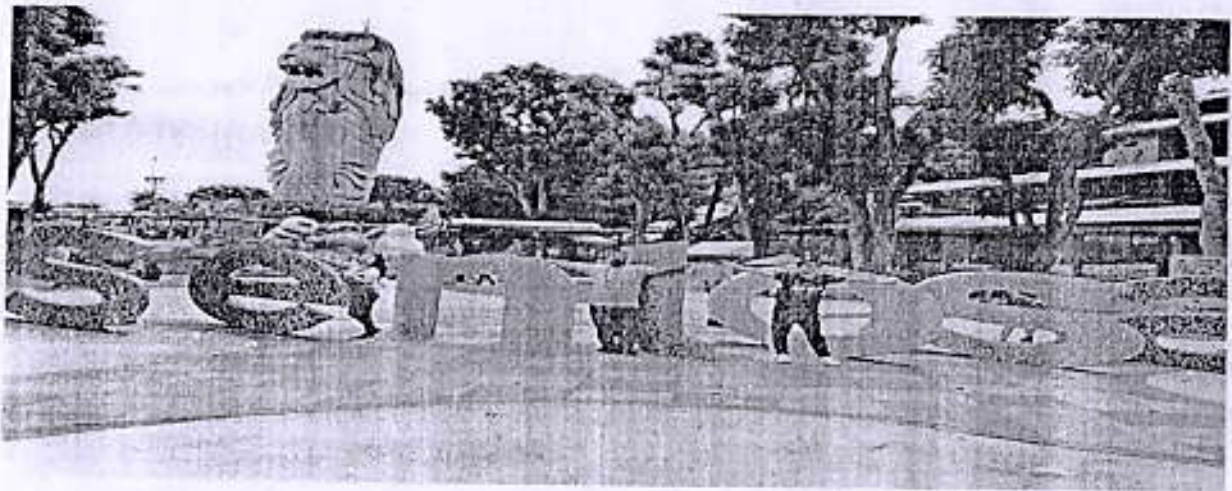
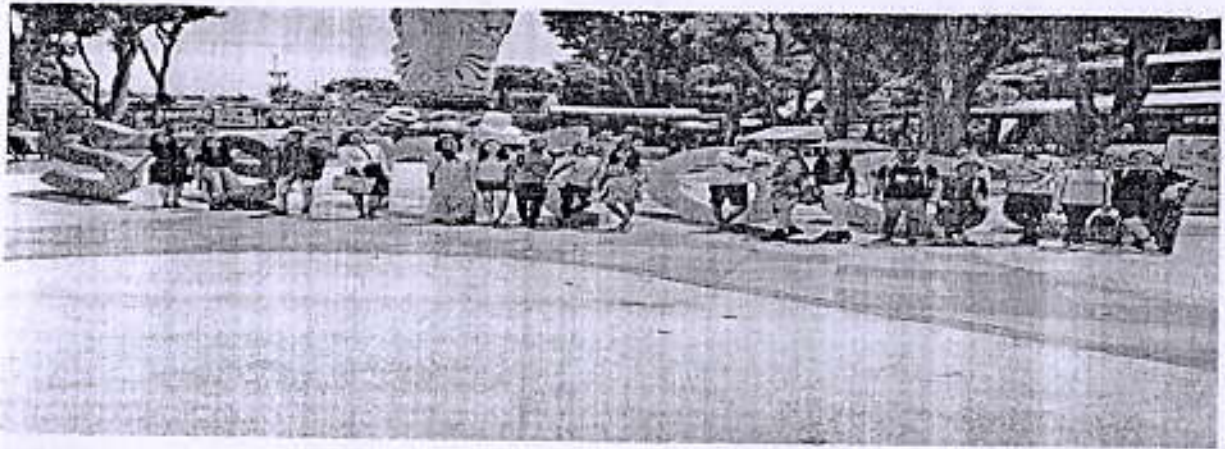



Educational Visit to CSIR Labs

School of Basic and Applied Sciences, RNBGU organized an educational visit to CSIR Laboratory, New Delhi on 27th September 2016. The visit was organized for the students of SOBAS with an aim to give first-hand knowledge of laboratory's work and its significance. During the visit at National Physics Laboratory we learnt that it is established for applying important physics principles on the instruments, which are used in industries for manufacturing various goods. All instruments were highly advanced and huge in size. The main aim of the laboratory is to strengthen and advance physics based research for the overall development of science and technology in our country.



There were divisions of labs in which particular measurement or calibrations are done. First we went to the division in which length is measured. The standard unit of length meter is realized by employing a stabilized Helium-Neon laser as a source of a light.

Thereafter we visited some other divisions of lab in which applications for torque and hardness are applied. There was also a division in which hydraulic mechanics is used. The IST i.e. Indian Standard Time is also controlled here. Some models were also displayed which were based on the phenomenon of frequency and reflection. Next we went to the Biosensor lab where we learnt that by giving different intensity of light in an infrared region one can detect various parts of the DNA. Finally, we saw a documentary based on how NPL works on different principles of physics to improve the tools of the industries.

The importance of this laboratory is to oversee the specific areas of physics, which are aligned to the needs of the nation and aimed towards the advancement of the field. Such labs support national and other industries in their developmental tasks by precision measurements, calibration, and development of devices and processes related to physics. In conclusion this tour turned out to be a real learning experience for the students.

Court number 5 was benched by Honourable Justice Nirwaljeet Kaur to decide a case based on appointment of Special Teachers in state of Rajasthan. The students went through all the journals (criminal and civil matters), publications, articles and law books.

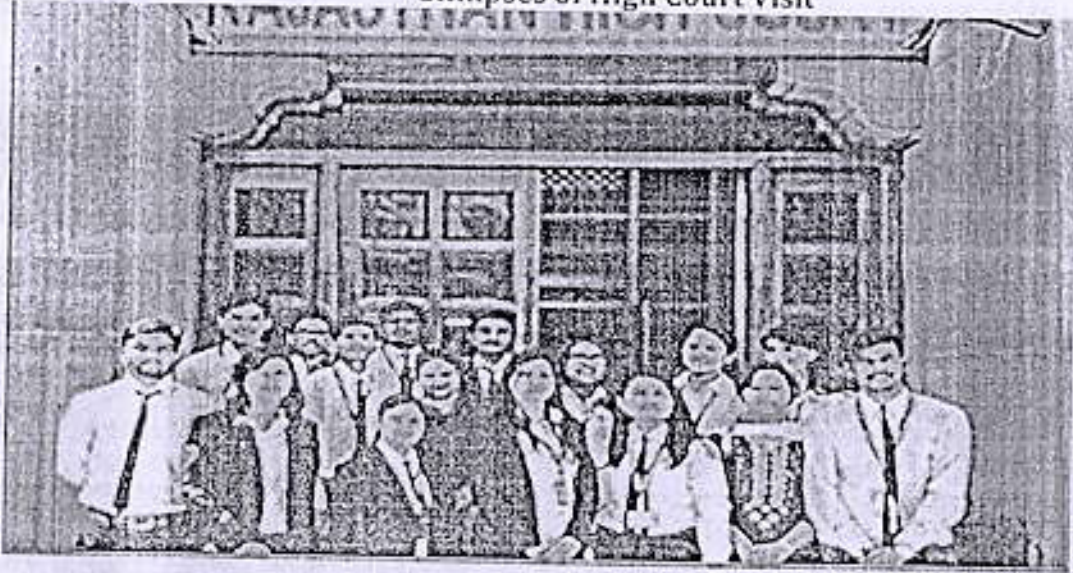

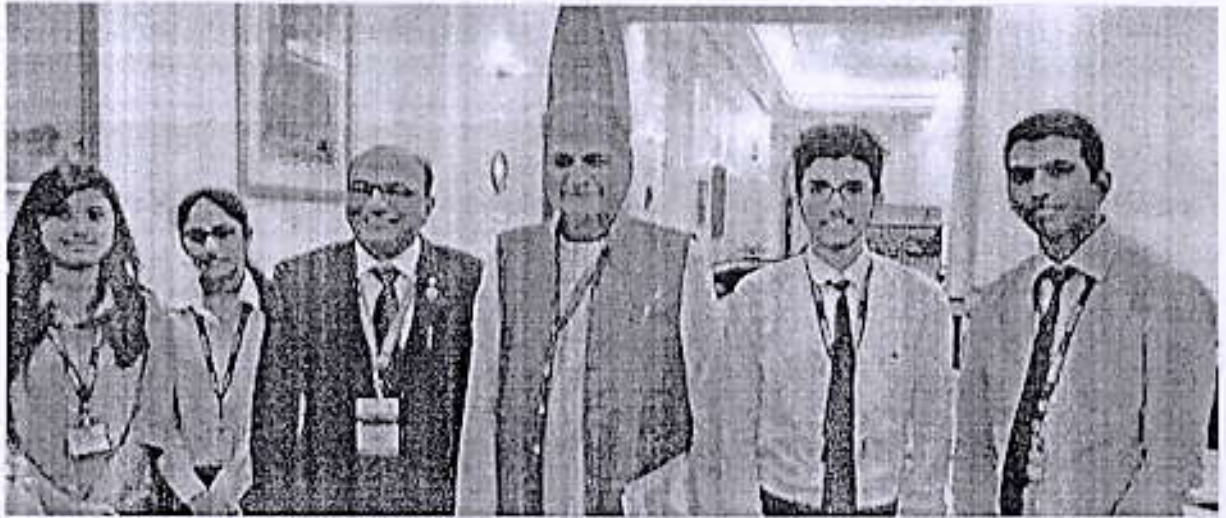

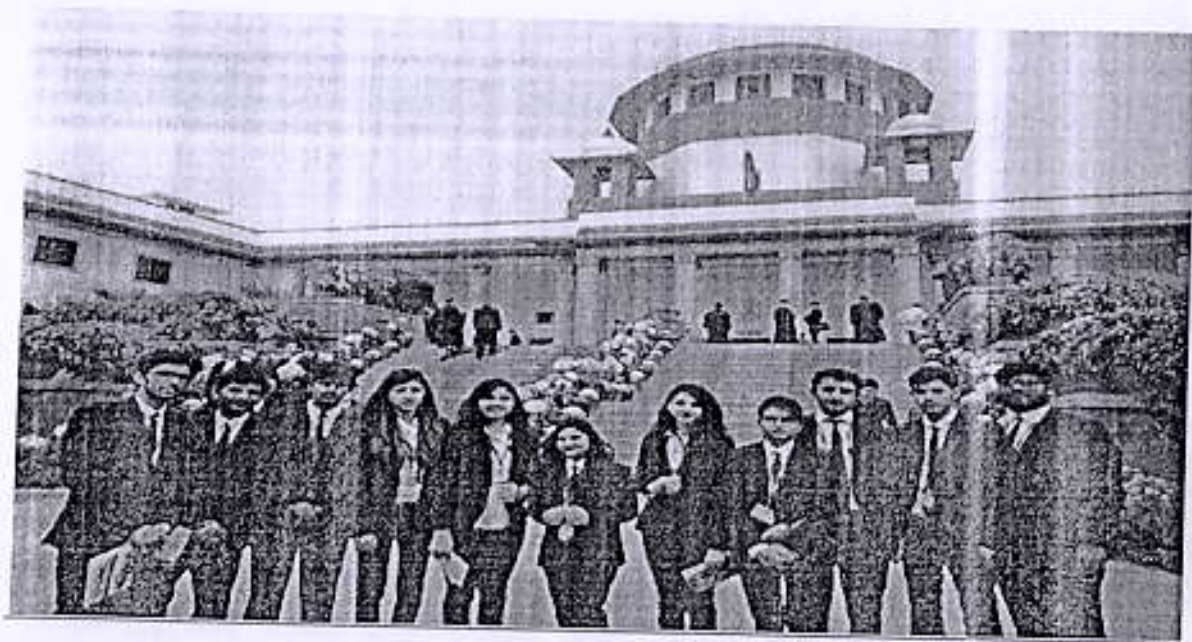

Report on Industrial visit to Adani Group (Mundra, Gujrat)
From 22nd October to 26th October

This industrial visit (22nd October to 26th October) was organized for the students of MBA-I and MBA-III along with the students of BBA-V and B.com-V. Total 39 students including 19 girl's students and 20 Boys students went on this visit along with two faculty members, Dr. Amit Upadhyay and Ms. Vasudha Sharma.

The detail report of the industrial visit is as follows-

Day- 1 (22nd October)

On the fine morning of 22nd October at 9.30 A.M, journey started from Bikaner to Ahmadabad. In the morning of 23rd October (01.00 A.M) we reached at Ahmadabad. Throughout the journey the students were very enthusiastic about the Industrial Visit. As most of the students were aware about Adani Group. They were carrying a lot of food items, throughout the journey they were playing various games with each other.

Day-2 (23rd October)

After reaching Ahmadabad, we all checked into pre booked hotel at 1.15 A.M. After all the students checked in, both the faculty members have also checked into their respective rooms. At around 3.45 A.M, both the faculty members have announced that the students should get ready to take their breakfast at 4.30 A.M in Hotel itself. After the breakfast at sharp 05.00 A.M, We all boarded in the VOLVO provided by Adani Group. The Journey was around 360 K.M from Ahmadabad to Adani Port. In the journey they stopped two times for tea and breakfast (Tea and Breakfast was sponsored by Adani Group). We reached at our destination at sharp 01.15 P.M (same time that was mentioned in the itinerary shared by them).

They allowed the students to fresh up and take rest for 15 minutes, at sharp 1.30 P.M, they have provided us the lunch, after having lunch we moved to visit Adani Port and Adani Wilmar Ltd.

3.00 P.M Visit to Adani Port and Adani Wilmar Limited

First we reached at Adani Port, at Adani port the spokesperson has described about the working of the port, including the process of loading and unloading of the containers from the ship, how they have prepared the Port (the place where we all were standing was actually 5 K.M inside the Arabian Sea).



An infrastructural marvel, the mega port at Mundra is major economic gateway that caters to the land locked northern hinterland of India with multimodal connectivity.

Mundra Port is a deep draft, all-weather port that is today the largest commercial port of India with a high degree of mechanisation. In fact, it is the only port in the country with handling and storage facilities for crude oil, containers, dry bulk, break bulk, automobiles and liquid cargo. Mundra can berth the largest post panamax vessel and can handle four million TEUs or Twenty feet Equivalent Unit.

After the visit of Adani port we moved to visit the Adani Wilmar Limited. At adani wilmar students came to know that Adani Wilmar Limited (AWL) is a joint venture incorporated in January 1999 between Adani Group- The leaders in private infrastructure and Wilmar International Limited – Singapore. Its business activities include oil palm cultivation, oilseed crushing, edible oil refining, sugar milling and refining, specialty fat, oleo chemical, biodiesel and fertilizer manufacturing and grain processing.

6.30 P.M video on Adani Group

After reaching at around 6.00 P.M at shanti vihar they have delivered a lecture on various CSR activities done by the Adani Group. They have also gifted a T shirt and a Cap to our students.

7.00 P.M Shantinath Mahadev Aarti

At 7.00 P.M there was an Aarti in the temple situated in the premises of Shanti Vihar.

8.00 Dinner

Students had dinner.

9.00 Cultural Programme

At 9.00 P.M there was a cultural Programme of two Universities (Ganpath University Ahmadabad students have also participated in this event).

Our students have really done a great job, the officials of Adani group were so happy. To show their respect they have tied the turban to the head of CSR Activity. According to them this kind of cultural programme they have not seen before at shanti vihar.

10.30 P.M

At 10.30 P.M, all the students went to sleep as they have to wake up in the morning at 5.30 A.M.

Day 3, 24th October

6.30 A.M

There was a Programme on Art of Living and Yoga (Laughing).

8.00 A.M

We have taken the Breakfast.



9.00 A.M

At 9.00 A.M, we all moved to visit Adani West Port. West port is basically for importing the coal. The Mundra Port's West Basin terminal, Asia's largest coal import facility, the current handling capacity of west port is 60 MMT of coal per annum. The port is connected with the high speed conveyer belt to supply the coal to Adani power. They also have ware house to store the coal to supply it to local customers.

10.30 A.M

At Adani power they have showcased the entire plant with the help of miniature (because of safety reasons). They mainly supply the electricity to Gujrat and Haryana (Mahendragarh). First they convert the AC into DC and after that they send it to Haryana to reduce Line Loss.

12.00 P.M

At 12.00 P.M we reached at Shanti Vihar, Students has lunch at 12.15.

1.15 P.M

Students along with faculty members moved to Ahmadabad by the Volvo Bus Provided by Adani Group.

At 11 P.M we reached Ahmadabad. We checked into the KumKum Bhawan for night stay and dinner.

Day 4 25th October

We wake up in the morning, after that we have visited Sabarmati Ashram, River front and one Mall for the shopping. We started our journey in evening and reached Bikaner Next Day 26th October healthy and safely.

Introduction and need of court visit- Continuous education and learning by practical activities in School of law, RNB global University, Bikaner is an unending process. After successful conduction of one day training workshop on Rights of Women in collaboration with National Human Right Commission and Mock Parliament, school of law arranged a visit of High court of Rajasthan, Jaipur Bench for the students of second semester. Twelve students of BA-LL.B. & BBA-LL.B. II semester from School of Law, RNB Global University visited the Hon'ble High Court on 7,8 & 9 March, 2019.

Detail proceeding of court visit- The students were accompanied by Mr. Ashok Prem, assistant professor at the School of Law. The visit was permitted by the Deputy Registrar of the High Court of Rajasthan, Jaipur Bench. On the gate no 4 all students and faculty member have been issued gate passes by the High Court authorities. The day started with a brief note given to the students about the High court and various court rooms by Mr. Ashok Prem. He guided all the students and dictated the procedure of hearing of the High Court Bench. He explained about Single bench, Division bench & full bench. The Rajasthan High Court is the High Court of the state of Rajasthan. It was established on 21 June 1949 under the Rajasthan High Court Ordinance, 1949. The seat of the court is at Jodhpur. The court has a sanctioned judge strength of 50. It is situated on Bhagwandas Road, Ashok Nagar, Jaipur. The bench is having jurisdiction in respect of the cases arising in the districts of Ajmer, Alwar, Bharatpur, Dhaulpur, Kota, Bundi, Jhalawar, Baran, Jaipur, Jhunjhunun, Sawaimadhopur, Karauli, Sikar, Tonk and Dausa. Under the "the High Court of Rajasthan (Establishment of a Permanent Bench at Jaipur) Order, 1976" a discretion is also given to the Chief Justice to order that any case or class of cases arising in any district within the jurisdiction of Jaipur Bench shall be heard at Jodhpur. In the Jaipur Bench of High Court total three double benches and 12 single benches are working as per the roster issued by the chief justice of rajasthan on 11.02.2019. The students were divided in six groups and each group was allowed to visit separate court room. They visited court number 11,12,13,14,15 & 16 .in court room no 11 there was an argument between the lawyer and the Hon'ble Justices. The case was related to the merit list of Rajasthan Administration services examination. Then the students moved to court number 12 where criminal proceedings were going on regarding the bail of an accused person who was accused of committing murder. Further the group moved to Court number 13 where issues related to divorce were.

Other Activities involved-

After visiting various court rooms gaining immense insight in the world of litigation on second day the students accompanied by Adv. Aniket Vyas visited the Hon'ble High Court library. The visit came to an end in the evening with a thanks giving note to Advocate Aniket Vyas for enlightening the students about the original and appellate jurisdiction of High court.

The Revenue Board is the only court to dealing with revenue matters in Rajasthan. It was established on 12 August 1949. The seat of the Board is at Ajmer. It is situated on Todarmal Marg, Civil Lines, Ajmer, Rajasthan. The bench is having jurisdiction in respect of the cases arising in the all districts of Rajasthan i.e Ajmer, Alwar, Bikaner, Hanumangarh, Sriganganagr, Jodhpur, Jaisalmer Bharatpur, Dhaulpur, Kota, Bundi, Jhalawar, Baran, Jaipur, Jhunjhnun, Sawaimadhapur, Karauli, Sikar, Tonk and Dausa. In the Board students visited and hear the proceedings of one Double bench situated in court no. 2 and one single bench situated in court no 9. The students were divided in six groups and each group was allowed to visit separate court room. They visited court number 2,8,9.in court room no 9 there was an argument between the lawyer and the Hon'ble Justices. The case was related to the Panchyat and Tenancy Act. Then the students moved to court number 2 where clerk J.N Pareek and Advocate Ajay guided and told about brief fact of the running case of sohan lal v. Rajendra kataria.

After visiting various court rooms gaining immense insight in the world of revenue litigation on second day the students accompanied by Shreshth Bhatnagar visited the District and Sessions court Ajmer and other historical places. i.e Dargah Sharief, Adhai Din ka Jhonpda, Nareli Jain Temple, Pushkar and anasagar lake.

On third day students accompanied by Mr. Shreshth Bhatnagar visited to Chittorgarh. They visited District and Sessions Court of Chittorgarh and various historical and amusement places of Chittorgarh like vijay stambh, kirti stambh, Meera temple, Padmavati's palace, and fort.

Purpose of the Court Visit

The aim of the court visits are to get out of the classroom and into the courtroom to see how the law works in practice. The purpose of the visit was to understand the working of a court, the nature of duties of the judicial officers. The visit was to help the student in understanding the role of court in dispensing justice in any case, the role of prosecutors in a case, the way cases proceed in a court, the way judges, prosecutors and defence lawyers handle the case, the relationship of the prosecutors and the police. This gave us an opportunity to understand the actual need of co-ordination in the four pillars of the criminal justice system. The visit included an in-depth study of the day to day functioning of the criminal courts, at different levels and over a vast variety of cases. The aim was to evaluate the resources available and the distribution of power between the judges, the prosecution, and the defence council.

Introduction

The school of law in the academic year 2019-2020 has organized a visit to the apex court of the country i.e. the supreme court of India. This visit was aimed at making the student aware of the functioning of the highest body of justice. Grandeur of the Supreme Court along with a visit of the Supreme Court museum took the students to the earliest day of the court and its successful journey so far in its sacred task of dispensing justice.

Minutes of the Visit

Twelve students from School of Law, RNB Global University, Bikaner (Raj.), visited the Hon'ble Supreme Court, Delhi on 17th October, 2019. The students were accompanied by Ms. Swati Agrawal & Ms. Harshlata Sharma, Assistant Professors at the School of Law. The visit was permitted by Dr. G. S. Karkara, Dean, School of Law.

The day started with a brief note given to the students about the Court and court rooms by Advocate Mr. Amrendra Kumar, who is practicing Advocate at Supreme Court, Delhi. He guided all the students and dictated the Jurisdiction of the court. The student obtained valuable knowledge by Mr. Amrendra Kumar, He explained Court proceedings in detail and suggested students to read Bare Acts and attend regular class lectures. The students visited different Court Rooms and observed Court Proceedings. After visiting Different court room in Supreme Court of India student get a chance to visit judges library there. They saw huge collection of Judicial books, Acts there and also saw a PPT presentation on history of Supreme court by the library assistant.

After visiting judges library students headed towards the Advocates library. There they saw a felicitation programme. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Shripathi Ravindra Bhat was addressing senior advocates there. After finishing Supreme court visit students move forward towards the Supreme court Museum. In the Museum students overwhelmed by watching leading judgements Copy. Museum Divided into two sections, first section deals with the evolutions and development of Judiciary in India while the second deals with the Federal Court and the Supreme Court. Also on display in first section are, history of Indian legal system from British period, the Harappan seals and the head of a priest, Ashokan edict and Nalanda Copper plate of 9th Century A.D. In the second gallery



antique furniture, souvenirs, ceremonial costumes & wigs and files relating to landmark judgements delivered by Supreme Court are on display. The records of famous cases such as Mahatma Gandhi murder case and India Gandhi assassination case etc. are also on display.

The visit came to an end at 04:30 p.m. with a thanks giving note to Mr. Amrenda Kumar for enlightening the students with such facts which brought out the difference in the proceedings between the District Court and Hon'ble High Court as well as for explaining the difference in the jurisdiction between the District Court and High Court and Supreme Court. The difference between Article 32 and Article 226 of Indian Constitution was also well briefed to the student by them.

After the apex court visit students went to visit Akshardham temple "*Akshardham*" means the divine abode of God. Swaminarayan Akshardham at New Delhi is a Mandir - an abode of God, a Hindu house of worship, and a spiritual and cultural campus dedicated to devotion, learning and harmony. The complex was constructed in 2005. Each element of Akshardham echoes with spirituality, the Mandir, the Exhibitions and even the Gardens. The Akshardham mandir has over two hundred idols, representing many of the spiritual stalwarts over many millennia. A visit to Akshardham is a spiritually enriching experience to the students. Whether it is in realizing the power of prayer, in feeling the strength of non-violence, in being aware of the universal nature of Hinduism's ancient principles, or just in admiring the beauty of God's abode on Earth -- each element has a spiritual significance. In addition at the evening time students saw the light show in the temple.

Next day of tour students went to visit National Green Tribunal Delhi. There After entering in the tribunal students firstly got the opportunity to meet with Deputy Registrar of the aforesaid tribunal, Dr. Sukhda Pritam. She Address our students and tell them about the working of the tribunal. She permits students to visit the tribunal in the two group (group of 6) one by one and to sit in the court room for a hour. In the court room student saw the proceedings of the tribunal. How the lawyers proceed the case and how the judges asked questions. After watching the whole working of the tribunal students moved towards the Indian law institute. **Indian Law Institute (ILI)** was founded in 1956 primarily with the objective of promoting and conducting legal research. Hon'ble Chief Justice of India is the ex-officio President of the Institute. The Union Minister of Law & Justice is its Ex-officio Vice-President. The Attorney General for India, some Judges of the Supreme Courts and High Courts, Solicitor General of India, Chairman, Law Commission and University Grant Commission and other prominent lawyers and law professors etc. are the members of the Governing Council. students got opportunity by having a interactive session with a associate professor of ILI.

Associate Professor Mr. Anurag deep Address the students and tell them about the institute in detail. Students come to know about the seats of ILI, research methods admission process. Students asked questions to the professor and get the answers of their queries. He told them how they can become a good lawyers, what is the moral values, how they can go in research and how they can enhance their knowledge in law field. He also told them about the time management and hard work. After meeting with him students visit the library of the ILI. Their they get to know about the thesis and research work. They visit the whole ILI after finishing the library visit. Professor told them about the teaching process of the said institute.



After visiting the Institute students went to Gurudwara Bangla Shaheb. Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the most prominent Sikh gurudwara, or Sikh house of worship, in Delhi, India and known for its association with the eighth Sikh Guru, Guru Har Krishan, as well as the pool inside its complex, known as the "Sarovar." It was first built as a small shrine by Sikh General Sardar Bhagel Singh Dhaliwal in 1783, who supervised the construction of nine Sikh shrines in Delhi in the same year, during the reign of Mughal Emperor, Shah Alam II. This Gurudwara visit was to learn about the culture, traditions, discipline and people of Sikh religion. After visiting Gurudwara Bangla Sahib students went to India Gate. The centre of New Delhi stands the 42 m high India Gate, an "Arc-de-Triomphe" like archway in the middle of a crossroad. The memorial bears the names of more than 13,516 British and Indian soldiers killed in the Northwestern Frontier in the Afghan war of 1919. During nightfall, India Gate is dramatically floodlit while the fountains nearby make a lovely display with colored lights. India Gate stands at one end of Raj path, and the area surrounding it is generally referred to as 'India Gate'. The foundation stone of India Gate was laid by His Royal Highness, the Duke of Connaught in 1921 and it was designed by Edwin Lutyens. The monument was dedicated to the nation 10 years later by the then Viceroy, Lord Irwin. The students have come to know about history of India Gate, the symbol of peace. The structure at India Gate holds names of all freedom fighters that lost their lives saving India.

On the third day of the tour students accompanied with their professor went to visit the presidential house and parliament of India. The Rashtrapati Bhavan is the official residence of the President of India located at the Western end of Raj path in New Delhi, India. Rashtrapati Bhavan may refer to only the 340-room main building that has the president's official residence, including reception halls, guest rooms and offices, also called the mansion; it may also refer to the entire 130-hectare (320 acre) Presidential Estate that additionally includes huge presidential gardens (Mughal Gardens), large open spaces, residences of bodyguards and staff, stables, other offices and utilities within its perimeter walls. In terms of area, it is the largest residence of any head of state in the world. At the evening of the third day student visited some historical monuments of Delhi. Firstly they went to visit Qutub Minar and then Lotus Temple. The Qutub Minar is a brick minaret built in 1193 by Muslim conquerors of Delhi. At 240 feet (73 meters) high, it's also an impressive engineering feat—all the more notable for surviving for so many centuries. The origins of Qutub Minar are known, it's unclear whether the minaret was built as a victory tower or as a place for an Islamic muezzin to make the call to prayer. The minaret is surrounded by other mosques and structures, including the first mosque built in India, Quwwat-ul-Islam Mosque. The Lotus Temple is located in the village of Bahapur in Delhi, India. The architect was an Iranian, a Baha'i House of Worship that was dedicated in December 1986. Notable for its flowerlike shape, it has become a prominent attraction in the city. Like all Baha'i Houses of Worship, the Lotus Temple is open to all, regardless of religion or any other qualification. The building is composed of 27 free-standing marble-clad "petals" arranged in clusters of three to form nine sides, with nine doors opening onto a central hall into a central hall with a height of slightly over 34.27 meters and a capacity of 2,500 people. In the series at last student visited waste to wonder park. Waste to Wonder Park (The new seven wonder parks) is located in Rajiv Gandhi Smriti Van, near Sarai Kale Khan. All the models of this park will be fabricated with automobile scrap parts (Industrial Scrap). The sodium lights to illuminate models are too second hand used and repaired. The students have seen that how the wastage can be utilized, the park has



replicas of the seven wonders of world that too made of the waste materials around. This is a great initiative, to display how the wastage can be re-utilized, that too in such a beautiful & attractive way.

- At Swaraj Engines Ltd, students learn about the Kaizen process, TQM and Employee engagement activities being conducted at plant.
- At Cheema Boilers, student learn about the marketing and production process as how to generate the orders from the clients, the process of order budgeting, vendor dealing and the procurement of materials.
- It provides an opportunity for students to ask questions related to their area of interest.
- With regular industrial visits, the students are able to identify their prospective area of work like marketing, finance, Human Resource etc.
- This also gives students a platform to enhance their interpersonal skills.

- v. ARS and KVK- SKRAU-Bikaner

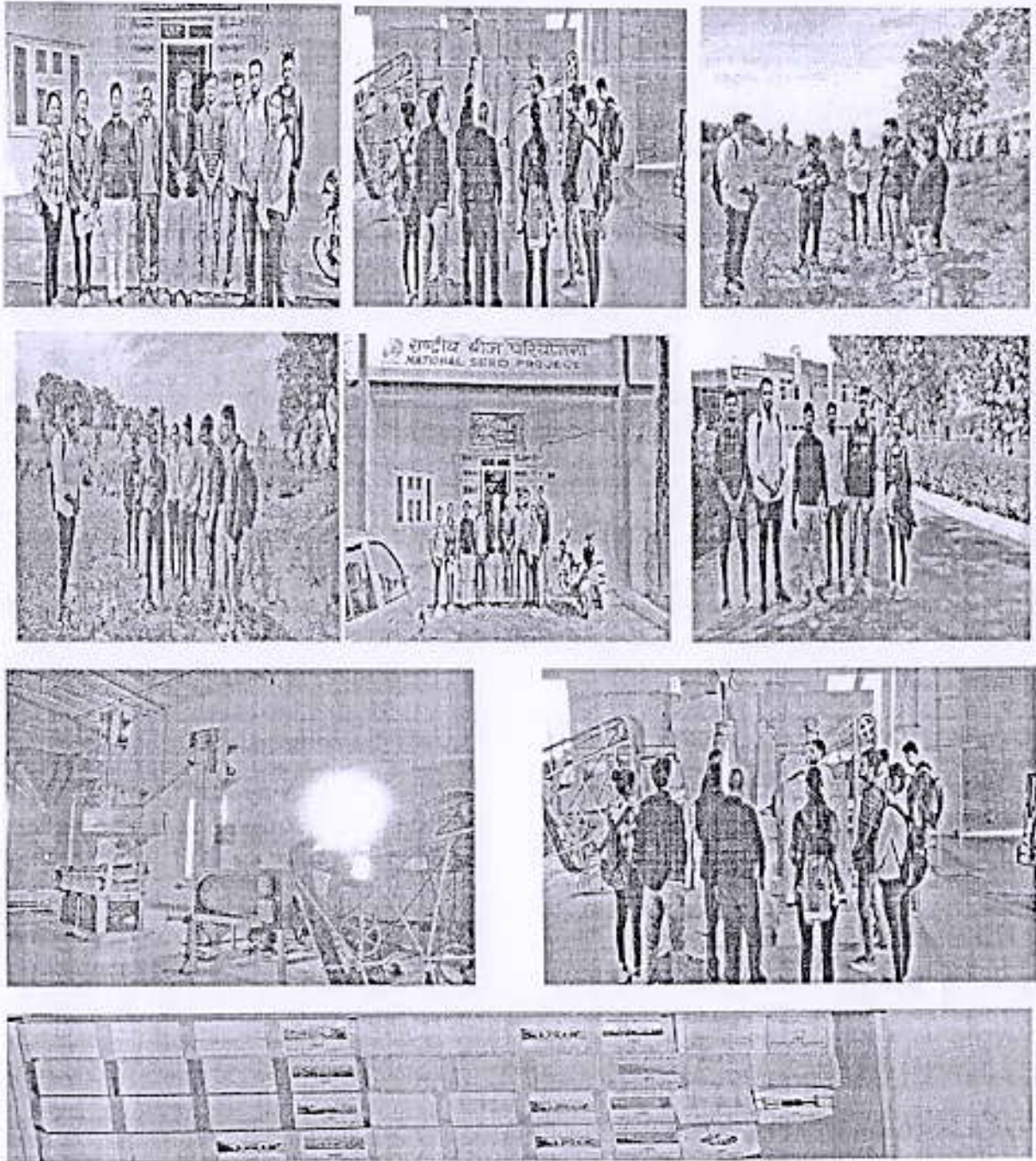




