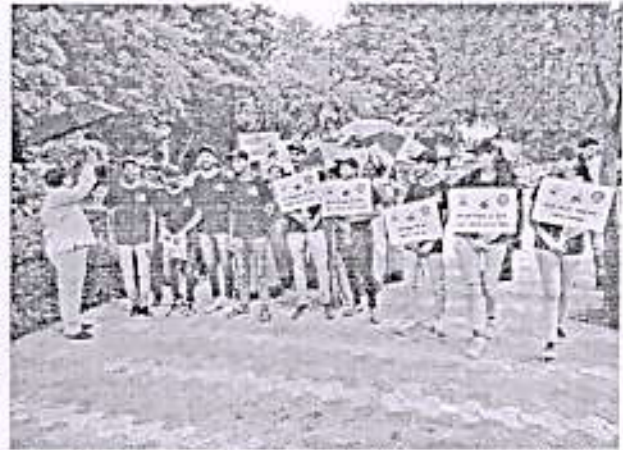

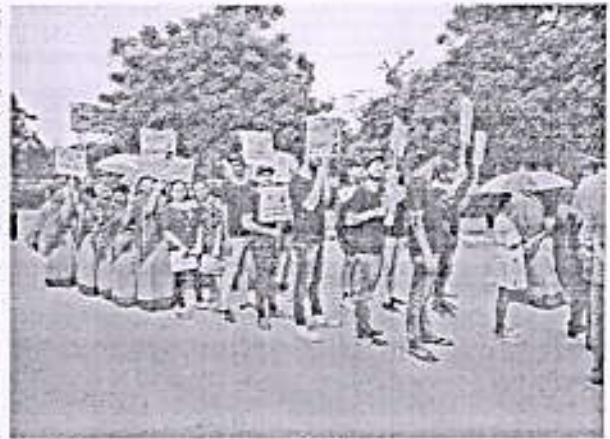

About the Proceeding of Open House Session

The session started with the welcome and felicitation of guests. After the brief introduction of guest's session started by Prof Ranbir Singh. He put some light on the importance of research work in the field of study of law and career. For a law student it is very important to understand the application of research in the profession of advocacy and the other career related to the law, Prof. Ranbir Singh said. He called students for starting the research work from the beginning of first semester. He explained the difference between ordinary and extraordinary and for success in present time we must do some extra work to become extraordinary. He motivated the students to be academically sound, technically competent and socially responsible.

He told that legal education means acquiring knowledge and skills of the subjects of law to become legal professionals as well as it means teaching law as one of the academic disciplines for the practice of law and to become member of the profession. Prof Ranbir Singh expressed his view that law includes both professional and liberal education i.e. acquiring professional skills as well as aiming at value-oriented, socio-cultural education. He stressed that a lawyer is the product of such education, who is boon for the society as he works for the benefit and welfare of the society by claiming justice on behalf of his client in the court of law and legal education works not only as an instrument of social control but also as instrument of social change which is imperative to create cultured law abiding citizens, who are inculcated with the concept of human rights and values which is the essential medium of the change.

Adding in his statement Prof Ranbir Singh told that legal education and its importance to establish rule of law in society to impart justice does not receive serious priority though one can easily study history of modern times which shows that lawyers are social engineers who gave leadership to nations. For example, most of our freedom fighters such as Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Rajaji, etc. were lawyers and were not doctors, engineers and not people from other fields. It is due to the reason that they interact with society at large and have knowledge of law that how one should find loopholes in law and apply it to do good for society by safeguarding their rights from arbitral powers. It is due to the continuous efforts of lawyers only that we enjoy our basic fundamental rights which cannot be abridge by government or any other authority and these are the basic rights a person must receive in order to have freedom in his life and any law or rule which infringes the fundamental rights is made ultra-virus as to secure justice. Legal education not only provide justice but create awareness among individuals of their rights, duties, values, ethics and morals i.e. it create consciousness through law and religion among society that what is right and wrong and in which direction a person needs to head by following rule of law.

He also stated that today in India there are 12 National Law Universities and other includes private and state universities imparting legal education under the supervision of BCI and Every work in the field of legal education is done in consonance with the provisions of BCI with its



approval and BCI is responsible to lay down rules and to promote legal education in India. All the universities imparting legal education are affiliated from BCI and students seeking enrollment as advocates require to qualify All India Bar Examination conducted by BCI which is a compulsory exam to enroll as advocates in our country.

After the address of Prof Ranbir Singh another important guest of the open house session Prof K P S Mahalwar focused on the aims of legal education in India. He confirms that legal profession has always been considered as a noble profession as lawyers are the center pillars of the society who help the common man to know his rights and claim them legally. We need legal education to fulfil the needs of the society and country as well because lawyers are the persons who interpret the law and deals directly with the entire society. Modern legal education in India was started by the British and its principal aim was to acquaint Indians with rules of law which would help them in the administration of the country.

Interactive session with students of school of Law-

After these two important speeches students asked many questions related to career in law, ways to get success in law field, secrets of success of various national law universities in India, exaggerated fines in new motor vehicle act, reasons for delay in Justice in India etc, which was suitably answered by the guests.

Before India gained independence in 1947, the study of Law was not taken as a very serious exercise. Consequently, when India gained independence, "Its legal profession and legal teaching were thus not able to play the role they ought, by Western standards, to have played.

1. Prof. (Dr.) Ranbir Singh Vice-Chancellor of national Law University, New Delhi

Prof. (Dr.) Ranbir Singh is the founder Vice-Chancellor of National Law University, Delhi established by the Delhi Government in 2008. In just a short span of 10 years he has steered NLU, Delhi which has been ranked as the 2nd best law school of India in the NIRF - 2018 rankings. It's the



acknowledgement of his administrative and leadership abilities that NLU, Delhi is now recognized not only in India but also at the international level.

With over two decades of experience in heading the law school he carries the aura of a visionary who as an outstanding statesmen and academician shown immense commitment and contribution towards changing the legal education landscape of the country. Prior to his stint in NLU, Delhi, he was the founder Vice-Chancellor of NALSAR, University of Law, established by the Andhra Pradesh Government and had been at its helm since its inception in 1998. Prof. Singh's acumen took NALSAR to great heights as a well-known premier institution for legal education and research in the country. He has been a Vice-Chancellor for over 20 years now.

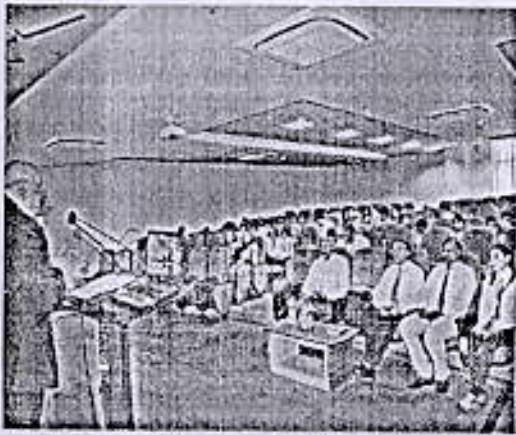
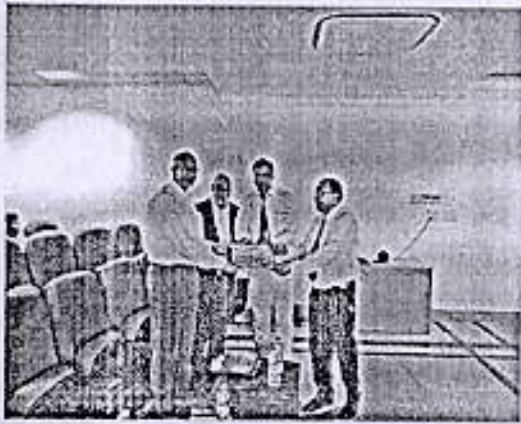
2. Prof.K.P.S. Mahalwar – Guest Chair of National Law University, New Delhi.

The Theater Play "Jana Natya Manch" (from Anurag Kala Kendra and Junoon's Theatre) visited our University for the session on 29th July 2019.

About the Group: Jana Natya Manch

Jana Natya Manch, established in 1973 by a group of Delhi's young theatre radicals including Safdar Hashmi, is India's best-known political street theatre group. The group has to its credit over 100 street, proscenium, and other performances, totalling over 8,000 performances. Its productions have been written and/or directed by a number of leading theatre artistes, including Habib Tanvir, Safdar Hashmi, Govind Deshpande, Anuradha Kapur, M.K. Raina, Kavita Nagpal, Abhishek Majumdar, Sudhanva Deshpande and Brijesh. Janam has performed in over 250 villages, towns and cities all over India, as well as performed, lectured and offered workshops in Palestine, South Africa, the UK and USA. Janam has neither sought, nor accepted, funding from government, corporates, NGOs or political parties. It is funded by its audiences, and Janam members volunteer their time gratis

The Group will present two Play (Girgit and Machine) and conduct an illustrated talk on street theatre In the Seminar Hall.

Synopsis: Machine

This is Janam's first street play, first performed in October 1978. It's a stark riveting critique of capitalism with lyrical, stylized dialogues that depict the exploitation of industrial labour.

Machine was written by Safdar Hashmi and Rakesh Saksena, and was finalised on the floor, where everyone present contributed. The machine, created very simply by human figures, is the symbolic representation of capitalism. The worker, the capitalist and the security officer are all parts of the machine; they are complementary parts of a system founded upon the exploitation of one by the other; their co-existence, then, is unequal.

Girgit is Safdar Hashmi's delightful adaptation of the classic Anton Chekhov story,

The Chameleon.

A bustling market. Vendors selling all kinds of things. A boy comes along. He wants everything. He eats up the goodies, But has no money. The vendors are angry.
