MATERIALS REQUIRED-

Spade, rotten farmyard manure, khurpi, seedlings to be transplanted and watering can.

PROCEDURE-

1. Select a plot, plough the land thoroughly with the help of a harrow or spade.
2. Sterilize the soil with the help of soil solarisation technique or with chemicals.
3. Prepare the seedbed by making it free of weeds, stumps, stones, pebbles, etc.
4. The soil of the nursery bed is thoroughly mixed with 5-10 kg per sq. m. of rotten farmyard manure.
5. Prepare seedbeds about 15 cm high from the ground level. The width is kept 1-1.5 m and the length 3-5 m.
6. A space of 30-40 cm is left between two beds in order to carry out cultural practices smoothly.
7. Prepare drainage channels to drain out excess water.
8. After making the raised nursery beds we have transplanted the seedlings of Tomato, Chilli, Brinjal and Cucurbits in the shade net house.
9. Water the seedlings using a watering can having a fine nozzle

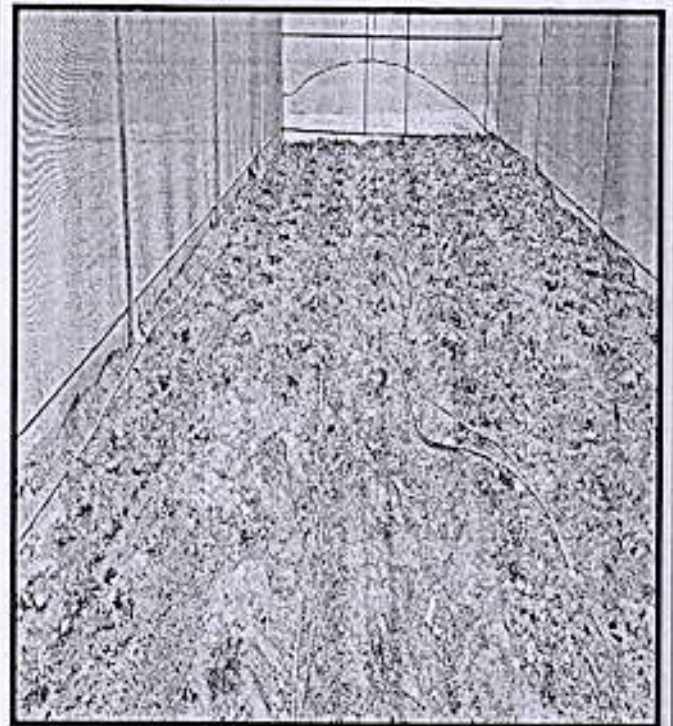
PRECAUTIONS DURING PLANTING-

- Healthy and uniform seedlings must be selected and planted late in the afternoon at recommended spacing, followed by watering.
- The seedlings must be treated with fungicides to avoid soil-borne infections.

Transplanting must not be carried out in dry, hot, sunny, windy and humid conditions.

VISIT TO NATIONAL LOK ADALAT

The students of RNB Global University visited the National Lok Adalat at Bikaner District Court on 11th December 2021. School of Law is continuously organizing various extracurricular activities like National Level Moot Court Competition, Mock United Session, Mock Parliament, seminars and conferences and visit to various Courts. These kinds of activities are necessary for the all over development of students. The purpose of the visit was to understand the working of a court, the nature of duties of the judicial officers. The visit was to help the student in understanding the role of the court in dispensing justice in any case, the way cases proceed in a court, the way judges, prosecutors and defence lawyers handle the case, the relationship of the prosecutors and the police.



National Level Lok Adalats are held for at regular intervals where on a single day Lok Adalats are held throughout the country, in all the courts right from the Supreme Court till the Taluk Levels wherein cases are disposed off in huge numbers. The Permanent Lok Adalat is composed of a chairperson (who is a serving or a retired District and Sessions Judge or a Judicial Officer higher in the rank) and two other persons (or members, performing judicial duties). It deals with cases relating to public utility services like transport, postal, telegraph and is formed as a pre-dispute platform and making conciliatory efforts between parties.

Introduction:

The students arrived nursery at 10:00 am on 11 November 2021 where they visited all the components of the nursery such as the medicinal plant beds, forest plant beds, and media for the sapling growth. The main learning of the visit was medicinal and shade tree seedling raising and their favorable conditions. Main medicinal crops from the Aloe vera, tulsi, lemongrass, ashwagandha, and among shade trees neem, babul, rohida were used for sapling raising was primary goal. Students learned the media preparation that is suitable for the medicinal and shade tree seedling growth. After the media preparation they filled the media into portraying and later the seed was sown. By doing this activity, students develop a clear understanding about the seedling raising of the medicinal and forest trees and came to know the benefits of seedling raising in the nursery some of them were like it prevents the seedlings from the pest and diseases in the Early-stage growth, it provides that only healthy seedlings were transplanted so that the Maximum benefits can be taken. This practice develops the understanding among the students regarding the seedling raising and its beneficial effects of medicinal plantation and forest plant to meet the nations demand of increasing total forest cover i.e 33% of total land area according to Indian forest act 1988 such practices must be followed.

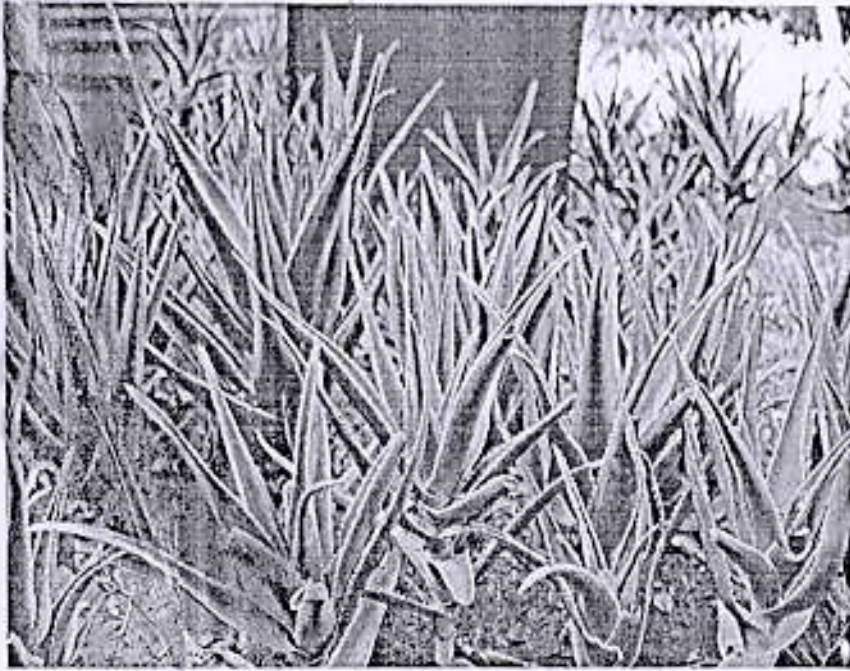
Outcomes:1. To understand the concept of medicinal and shade tree raising.

4. To protect the plants from various pests and diseases.

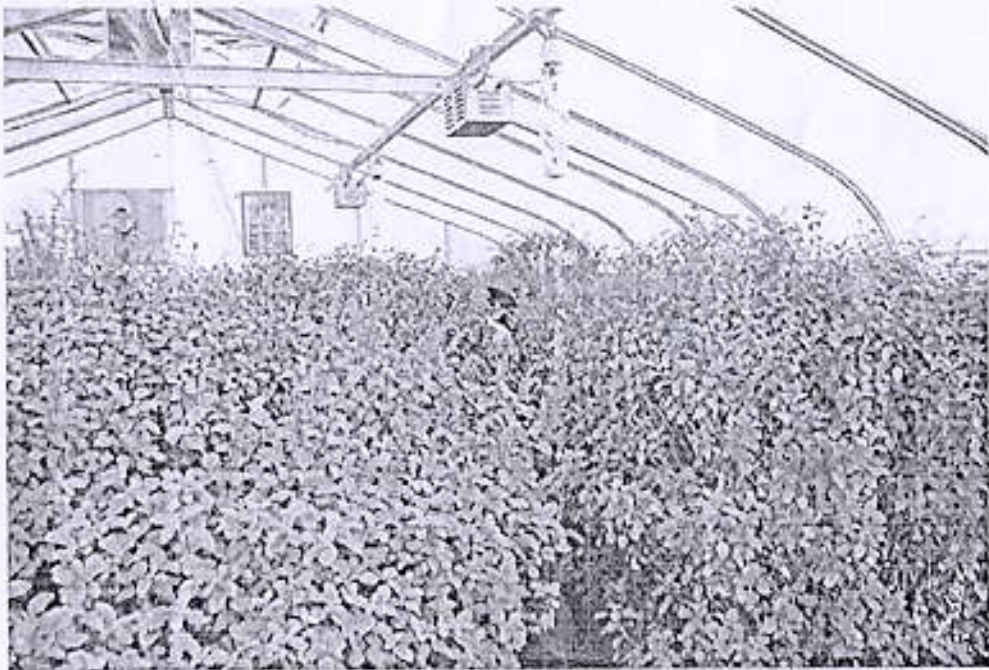

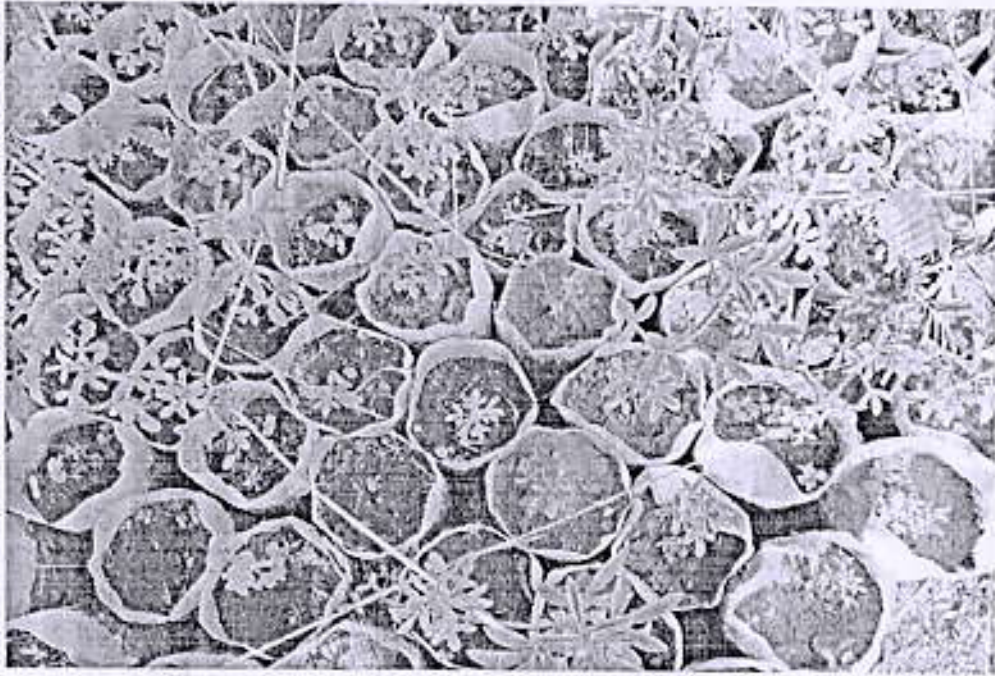

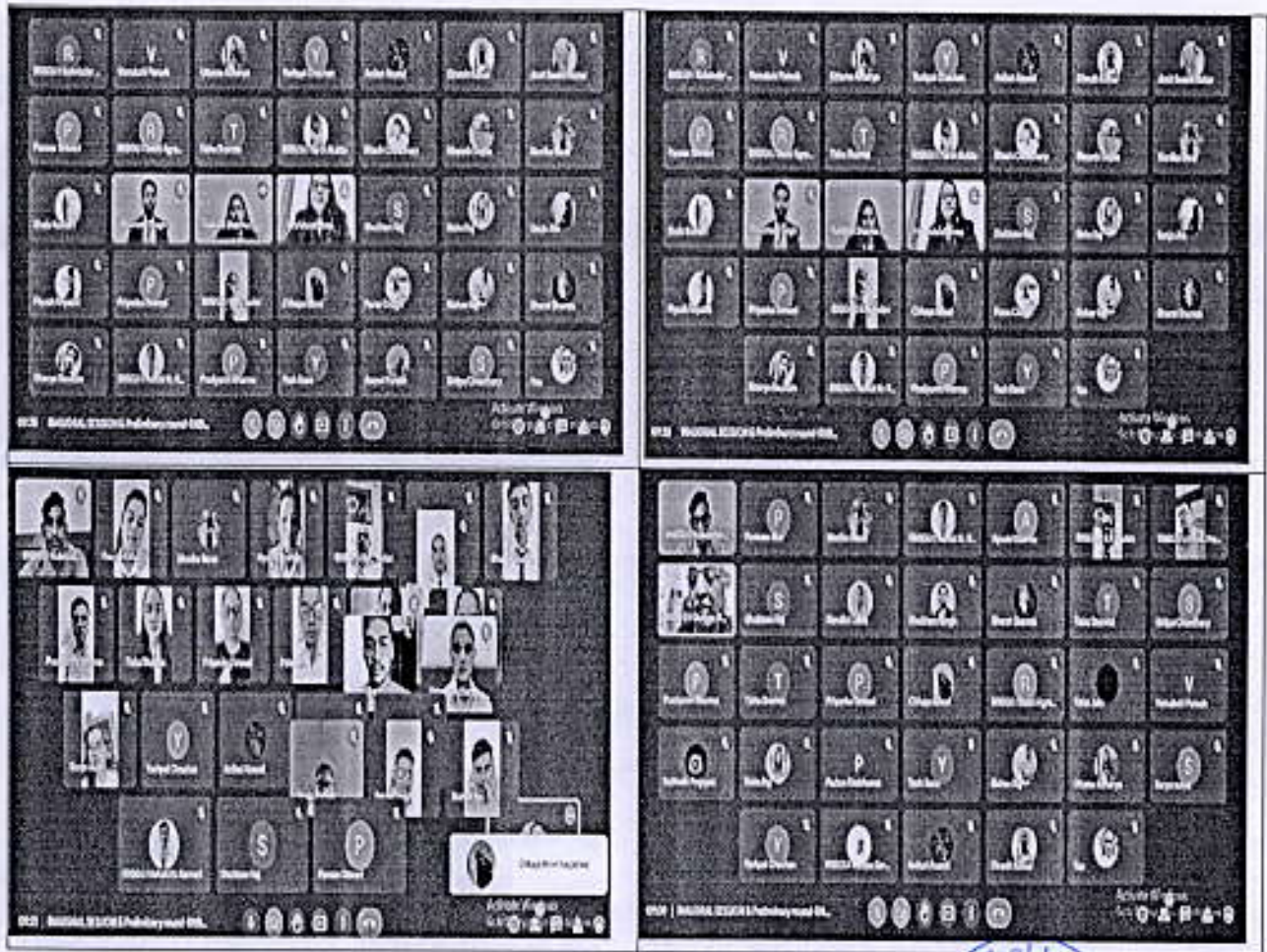
Learning Outcomes:

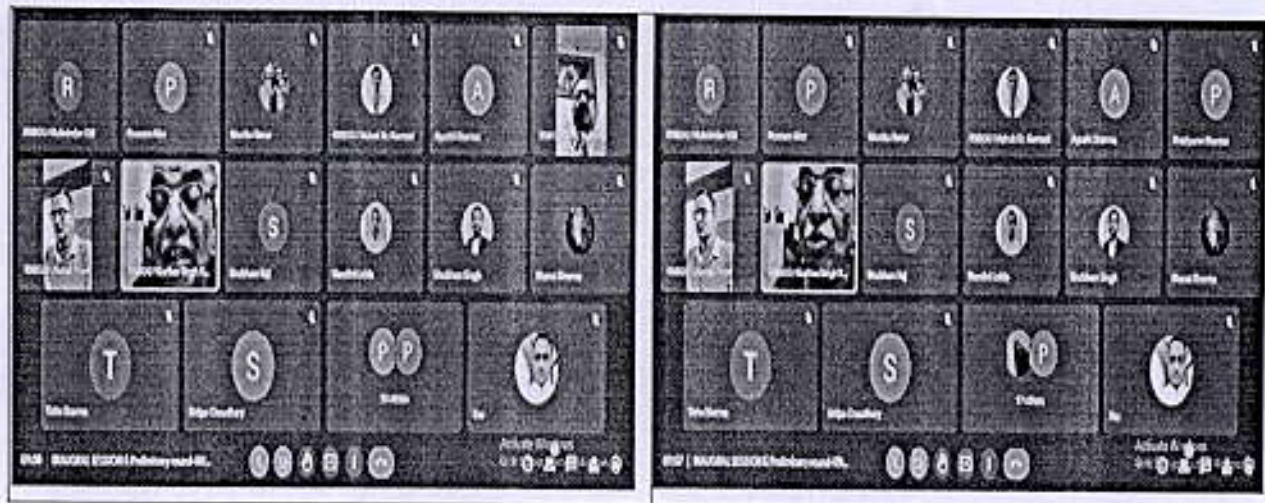
1. A moot court competition simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.
2. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.
3. The procedure imitates that followed in real courts: the judge enters, the mooters and the judge bow to each other, the clerk announces the matter, the mooters give their appearances and are then called on in turn to present their submissions, the judge asks questions of the mooters, the court adjourns, and the judge then returns to deliver a brief judgment and some feedback.
4. Mooting is not the same as public speaking or debating, although it shares some common elements with these activities. It is a specialized application of the art of persuasive advocacy. It has been part of the process of training lawyers for centuries and plays an important role in legal education.
5. Student become aware about the mooting techniques, memorial formation methods and art of argument before court.

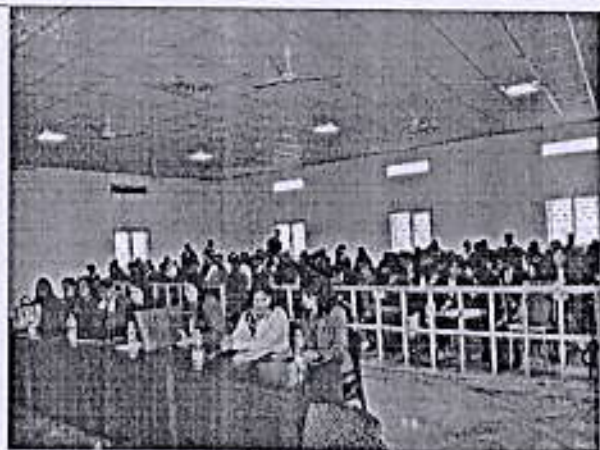
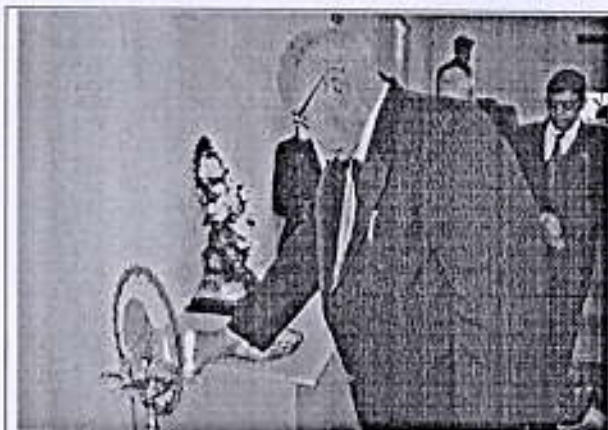
