Mr. Faisal Nafees, a young entrepreneur delivered a special lecture on entrepreneurship to the students of BBA-IV and B.Com-IV on 22 Feb, 2017 in Room No 107 of Academic Block of RNBGU. Students participated enthusiastically in the interactive session of the lecture which lasted for over one hour. Mr. Nafees delved deep on becoming an entrepreneur and the qualities and characteristics of an entrepreneur. He emphasized the need and importance of career orientation during the studentship in the University. Dividing the life into various faces, he said the span of a person from 20 years – 30 years is golden period for making his/her career without thinking of saving money after joining any job later. He said a comparatively small company, even with small pay package is better than a big company because in small company one can learn many things and multitasking whereas in big companies the scope is very less. Between 30 years – 40 years of age one should join good company and learn leadership qualities and after that one should go for his own enterprise. He viewed that starting a new business at this mature age is better than continuing in any service of whatever pay packages.

Citing many examples from his personal life and also of various successful entrepreneurs, he said that students must chase their passion during the college/ University days but at the same time they must secure good marks because it is the degrees and certificates that reflect your achievements during the youth age. He explained various ways of learning as well as marketing his own image and the image of his new venture. He warned that during the service bondage with organization is necessary but more important thing is the personal development in terms of experience, pay package and image.

Many students raised questions and queries after the lecture was concluded. He pacified all the queries of students. His style of presentation was very pleasant and attractive. Speaking extempore he was center of eye balls for all the students, sometimes making them laugh by his comments.

Introduction

A definition of the word "interview" was given before the session began. Additionally, Mr. Sharma covered the procedure for getting ready for an interview in great detail. He primarily focused on two aspects that candidates should keep in mind when preparing for interviews; that the interview is a two-way street (you are being evaluated by the interviewer, and they are being evaluated by the company), and that the interview is a two-way street (the interviewer evaluating you and you evaluating the organization). Participation in the interview should go beyond only responding to the questions.

He continued by discussing how to get ready for a pre-interview after that. He added that one must first have a thorough understanding of one's capabilities and priorities before conducting an interview. He advised students to go to an interview after doing comprehensive research on the job.
