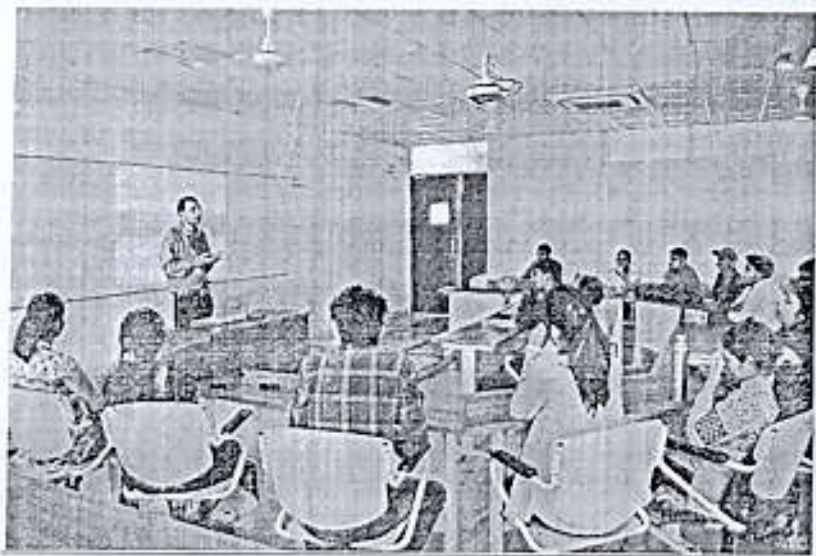

The Honourable High Court Visit was held on 06th Mar 2017 by fourteen students of School of Law, RNB Global University which was escorted by Ms. Deepali Sahoo and Ms. Khyati Jain, Assistant Prof's at the School of Law. The visit was permitted by the Registrar of the High Court Bench. The students were given brief note about the court and court rooms by Advocate Kaushal Gautam, who is practicing lawyer at High Court of Rajasthan. He guided all the students and dictated the Jurisdiction of the High Court Bench. He explained about Division bench which consist of 2 Judges and single bench consists of 1 Judge. The students visited court number 1, in which there was an argument between the lawyer and the Honourable Acting Chief Justice Dr. J. Puspendre Singh Bhati. The case was on PIL. Students moved to court number 4, benched for criminal proceedings about bail of the accused person who was filed with murder case. Court number 2 benched a Family court in which there was an issue of matrimonial matters and also a case based on mid-day meal scheme. Court number 5 was benched by Honourable Justice Nirwaljeet Kaur to decide a case based on appointment of Special Teachers in state of Rajasthan. After visiting several court rooms to get knowledge about the bench bar relationship, Adv Kaushal Gautam accompanied the students for the visit of Honourable High Court library. The students went through all the journals (criminal and civil matters), publications, articles and law books.

The visit came to an end in the evening with a thanks giving note to Advocate Kaushal Gautam for enlightening the students of such facts which brought out the difference in the proceedings between the District Court and Honourable High Court. The students also got to know the jurisdiction of the court and the type of cases that can be instituted in District Court Jurisdiction and Honourable High court jurisdiction. The difference between Article





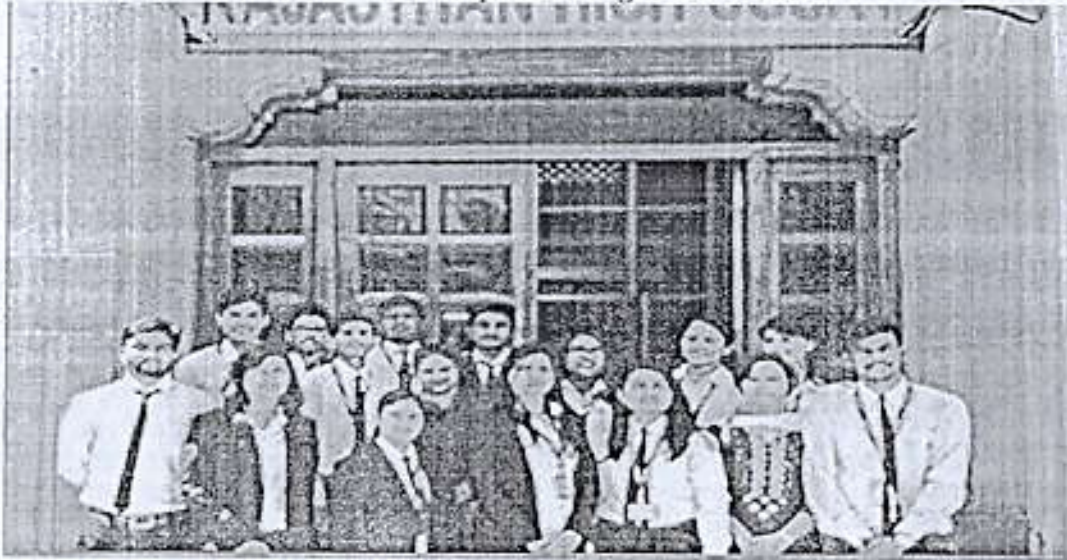
226 and Article 32 of Indian Constitution was well brief to the student by Advocate Kaushal Gautam too. This visit will help the students of School of Law to participate in Moot Courts by implementing the rules and regulations as implemented in the court. The visit also gave new ideas to formulate law, how to study the cases or precedents etc. The students were thankful to the management of the University for providing such an opportunity of real life learning to gain the practical knowledge through this visit thereby helping them to understand the different hierarchy of the courts.

### A Report on Entrepreneurship lecture - Mr. Faisal Nafees, AGM, Narendra Bhawan

Mr. Faisal Nafees, a young entrepreneur delivered a special lecture on entrepreneurship to the students of BBA-IV and B.Com-IV on 22 Feb, 2017 in Room No 107 of Academic Block of RNBGU. Students participated enthusiastically in the interactive session of the lecture which lasted for over one hour. Mr. Nafees delved deep on becoming an entrepreneur and the qualities and characteristics of an entrepreneur. He emphasized the need and importance of career orientation during the studentship in the University. Dividing the life into various faces, he said the span of a person from 20 years - 30 years is golden period for making his/her career without thinking of saving money after joining any job later. He said a comparatively small company, even with small pay package is better than a big company because in small company one can learn many things and multitasking whereas in big companies the scope is very less. Between 30 years - 40 years of age one should join good company and learn leadership qualities and after that one should go for his own enterprise. He viewed that starting a new business at this mature age is better than continuing in any service of whatever pay packages.

Citing many examples from his personal life and also of various successful entrepreneurs, he said that students must chase their passion during the college/ University days but at the same time they must secure good marks because it is the degrees and certificates that reflect your achievements during the youth age. He explained various ways of learning as well as marketing his own image and the image of his new venture. He warned that during the service bondage with organization is necessary but more important thing is the personal development in terms of experience, pay package and image.

Many students raised questions and queries after the lecture was concluded. He pacified all the queries of students. His style of presentation was very pleasant and attractive. Speaking extempore he was center of eye balls for all the students, sometimes making them laugh by his comments.

A guest lecture titled "Essentialism and Fungibility" was conducted on 21st February at the RNB Global University for the students of BBA and MBA. In the beginning by Ms. Khyati Jain Asst. Prof at RNB Global University introduced Mr. Pankaj Sarada to the audience.

This was followed by an interaction of Mr. Sarada with the students to know about their academic interests and career plans. He then began with the elaboration of the company Capital One. He briefed the students about his academic qualifications and background along with his professional experience of last fifteen years highlighting the practical experiences he acquired as he moved up the career ladder. He explained the concepts of Essentialism and Fungibility to the students quoting examples from his experience. Focusing further on essentialism and fungibility, Mr. Sarada discussed about the essential requirements for being an entrepreneur or a business professional and the flexibility required in performing a job. He quoted an example of Amazon which is the middle man for businesses and customers and what is the process for the delivery system as Amazon performs the operations as well. Heading towards the end of lecture he had an interactive session with the students for about 10 minutes where the discussion was open for the students to ask their queries and problem faced in their career path.

He also briefed about the importance of identifying the essentials and how you have to be flexible with the current dynamic environment these days. In this context he briefed students about various tech giants like facebook, Netflix, twitter, google etc and explained how Netflix came into existence. How the owners of the Netflix identified the problem from the various other movie, serials concerned sites like blockbuster. Students were so interactive throughout the session and took a keen interest in knowing the nitty gritty of entrepreneurship. The students were eager to know about how to make a beginning for a "Start up" as some of them are willing to become entrepreneurs. They also wanted to know how to achieve the heights and become big business tycoons like Mukesh Ambani. The students found the session to be very knowledgeable, inspiring and interactive which helped them to gain practical insights not only into the functioning of established corporates but also into the essentials of becoming big entrepreneurs.

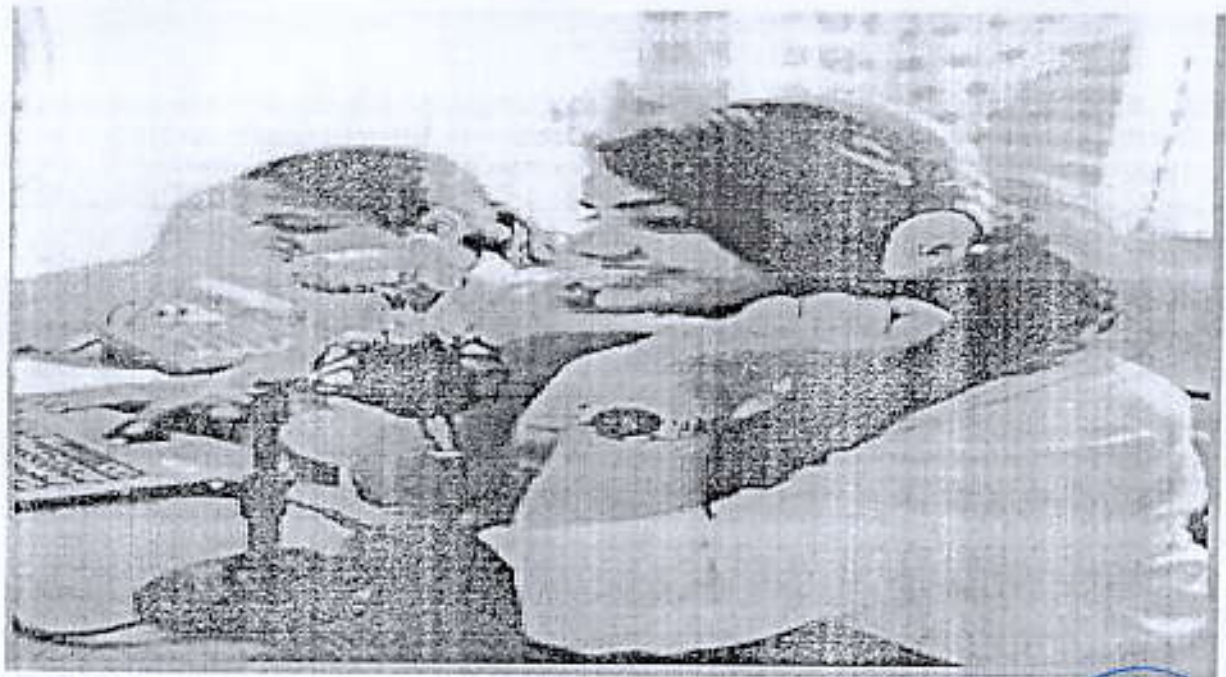

On 15 February, 2017 School of Law of RNB Global University conducted the 2nd Inter-departmental Moot Court Competition in the Campus Moot Court Hall. The case study dealt with Indian Penal Code 1860 and Indian Evidence Act 1872 comprising the sections 34, 120A, 304B, 300 and 113 A and B of Evidence Act. The case study was about "Bride Burning" in which students argued in varied way. The arguments between parties were containing proper evidence and proof to make a valid session. The issues for the arguments were:

- Whether Kusum, the victim had committed suicide or is it a case of homicide?
- Whether the in-laws of the victim demanded for dowry?
- Whether in-laws of the victim were having mensrea to cause death?
- Whether the in-laws will be liable for the offence of criminal conspiracy?

Each team has also submitted with proper memorial of the issues with argument. There were total 5 teams from RNBGU School of Law. The Judges for the said proceeding was Dr. Hans Raj Arora and Dr. Mahendra Gadholiya. There was interesting questioning round from judges to each participant. All the teams gave their best performances but according to the judgement given by the Judges the winning team was Yashpal/Arif Khan as Mooters and Komalata Bhargava as their researcher. The runner up team was Divya Tulsyani and team followed as third Mukund Rathore and team. RNB Global University encourages their students for such mootings as this will boost their confidence and trained them for future. These types of mootings gives hands on experience to students and prepare them for their future goals.

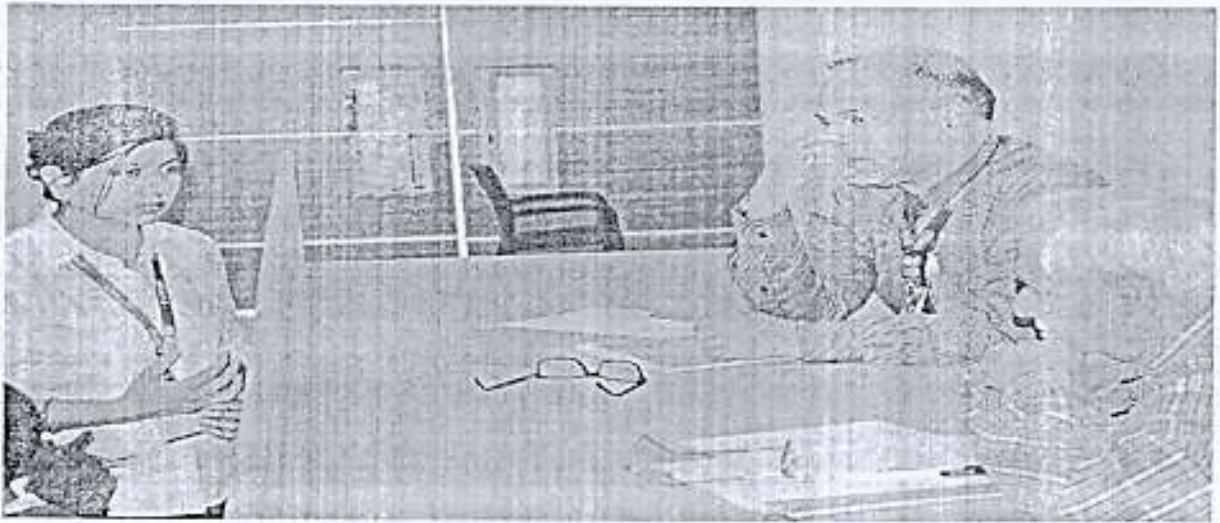

## A REPORT ON LIVE TELECAST OF BUDGET-2017 AT RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY;

Feb 01, 2017

On 1st Feb 2017 students of RNB Global University in Commerce and Law discipline watched the live telecast of Presentation of Union Budget in the Parliament - 2017 by the Hon'ble Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitely.

The prelude to this was a seminar on Pre Budgets held on 24th of January 2017. The session started with a speech of Mr. Rajiv Gupta (Assistant Professor, Finance) who highlighted the key points which students should concentrate specifically to understand the Budget-2017 well and connect them with their curriculum especially with subjects like Tax Economics. He discussed the reason for presenting the budget on 1st February instead of March this year.

This set the ground for expectation of students from the budget as they prepared themselves and listened attentively to the presentation of the budget. Students' enthusiasm for watching the speech was at a higher note since they were trying to evaluate the outcome of speech with their expectation as discussed earlier during pre-budget round table conference held on Tuesday, 24th January, 2017

Following key points were noted by students while listening to the Live Budget-2017

### A) General

- (i) Using space technology in a big way to plan MGNREGA works
- (ii) Effects of demonetisation not expected to spill over to next year and Demonetisation will help in transfer of resources from tax evaders to government
- (iii) Hope to resolve all issues regarding GST via consultations
- (iv) World Bank expects GDP growth rate at 7.6 percent in Financial Year 2018 and 7.8 percent in Financial Year 2019.
- (v) Committed to double farm income in 5 years.
- (vi) 100 percent electrification of villages to be completed by May 2018
- (vii) Two new AIIMS to be set up Jharkhand and Gujarat
- (viii) Income Tax rate cut to 5 % for individuals having income between Rs 2.5 lakh to Rs 5 lakh
- (ix) 15 % surcharge on income above Rs 1 cr to continue.
- (x) To create payment regulatory board at RBI

### B) Railways

- (i) 3,500 km railway lines to be commissioned in 2017-18 against 2,800 km in 2016-17.



- (ii) Merger of Railway Budget with Budget 2017 a historic step
- (iii) Railways to offer competitive ticket-booking facility; service charge withdrawn for tickets booked on IRCTC

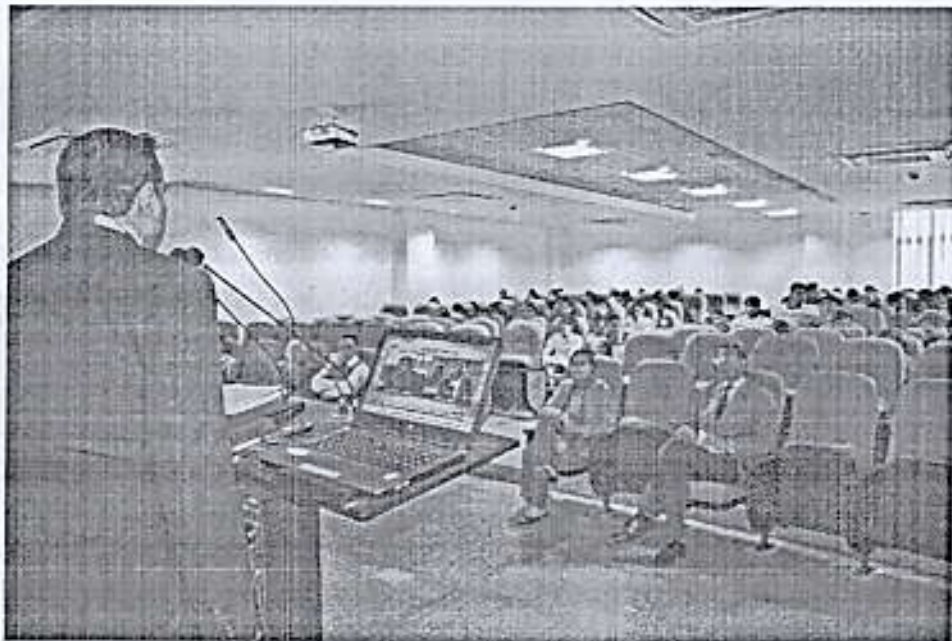
Expression, gesture of students made a spectacular environment and the faculty members present along with the students at the hall appreciated the healthy atmosphere created therein.

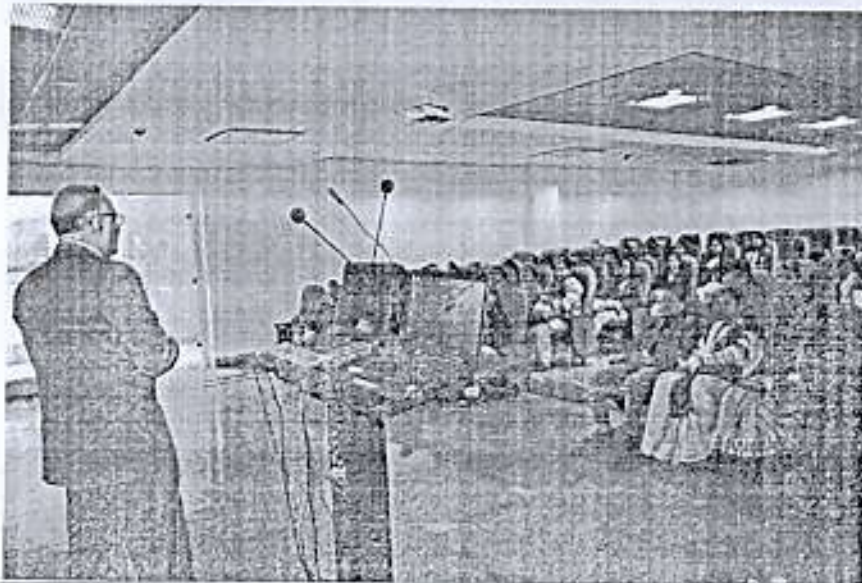

Business without any strategy to tackle the future changes in the government regulations & policies is always at huge risk for losses. Government reforms are one of the key elements in macroeconomic factors affecting a company severely.

GST has been always been in news since its establishment as is a very significant step in the field of indirect tax reforms in India. In general words, Goods and Services Tax (GST) are a proposed system of indirect taxation in India merging most of the existing taxes into a single system of taxation. It was introduced by The Constitution (One Hundred and First Amendment) Act 2016. By amalgamating a large number of Central and State taxes into a single tax, it would mitigate cascading or double taxation in a major way and pave the way for a common national market. From the consumer point of view, the biggest advantage would be in terms of a reduction in the overall tax burden on goods, which is currently estimated to be around 25%-30%.

In order to understand the details about the GST & its effect on the corporate world a guest Lecture on "Business Strategy in GST & Trading strategies" was organized at RNB Global University for Management Students of Master of Business Administration (MBA) on 3rd January 2016. The speaker of the guest lecture was Mr. Arvind Prem, GM-Accounts, Radico Khaitan Ltd., New Delhi who has more than 14 years of experience in Finance & Management.

During the interactive guest lectures, several questions related to GST and its effects on business were raised by the MBA students which were duly answered with business & trading strategy examples. At the end, students understood what and how GST would bring in significant changes in doing business in India. Advocacy for best practices, gearing up for changes in processes, training teams and developing IT systems for being GST compliant were also discussed as part of the guest lecture.

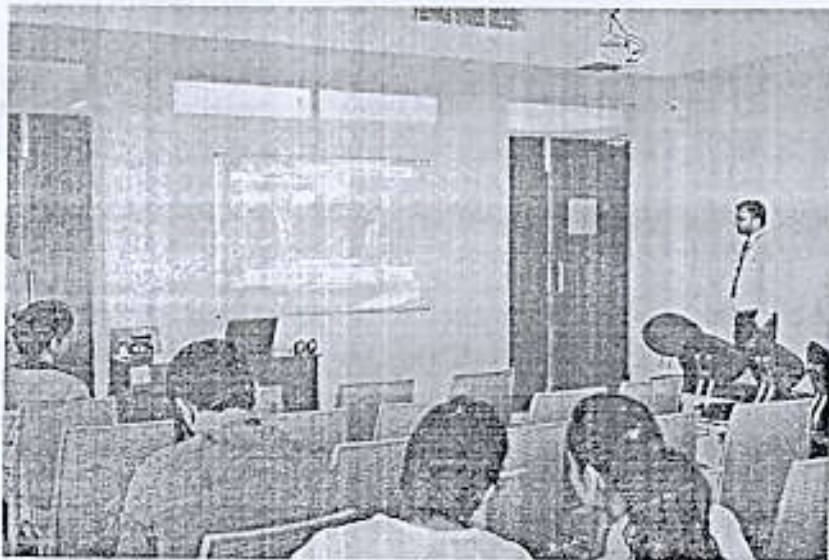

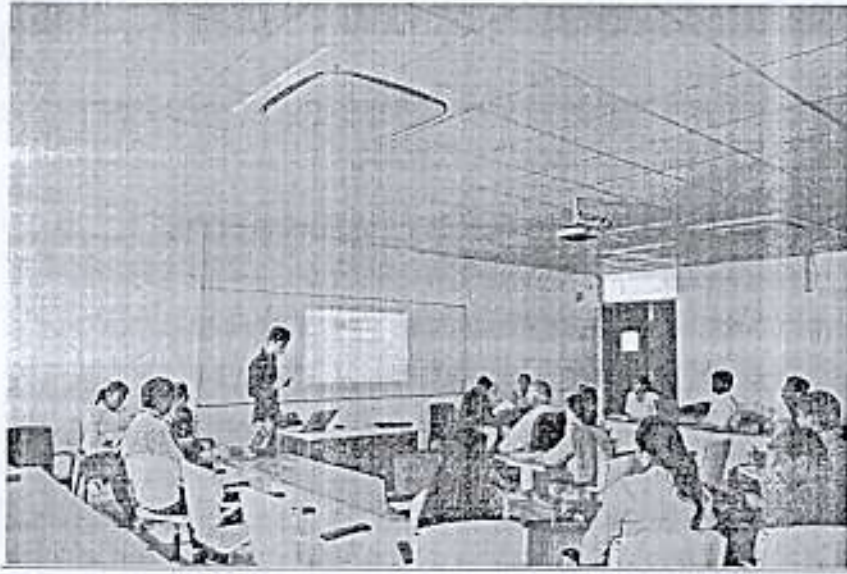
