Why did the university organize the visit to Child Court and Reformatory House?

School of Law is continuously organizing various extracurricular activities like national level Moot court Competition, Mock United Session, Mock Parliament, seminars and conferences and visit to various Courts. These kinds of activities are necessary for the all over development of students. Child Court and Reformatory House visit is also one of the most essential part for practical knowledge of the Law students.

About Child Court and Reformatory House

Juvenile Justice law in India deals with the 2 categories of children - Children in conflict with law & Children in need of care and protection. The trial of those children in conflict with law aged under 18yrs fall into a special judicial area. They are handled by Juvenile Justice Boards, or Juvenile courts, which provide care and guidance to the juvenile offenders during their hearing and detention. The purpose of a separate court is that its purpose is socio-legal rehabilitation and reformation not punishment. The Reformatory House is a secured housing facilities for juvenile offenders. The primary purpose is to keep juveniles who have committed crimes away from the public. In recent years, there has been a shift in away from a punitive purpose and towards the rehabilitation of offenders.

Objectives of Child Court and Reformatory House

This visit gave our students the opportunity to interact with the juveniles who have committed crimes or have been sent to the reformatory house for some other reasons. The students also got a chance to interact with the members of CWC i.e., the Child Welfare Committee who are the final authority to dispose of cases for the care, protection, treatment, development and rehabilitation of children in need of care & protection and to provide for their basic needs and protection of human rights. The committee enriched our students on how a *child friendly mechanism* is being used for dealing with children among various other things.

Some of the topics discussed during the 1st Session are as -


- The Motor Vehicles Act, 1988

INTRODUCTION

RNB Global University's Training and Placement Cell organized a Workshop on "Corporate and Business Etiquettes" on 17th Nov 21.

The session commenced with the introduction of the session by Poorva Vyas-Student-MBA-III semester.

The session started by elaborating that Business etiquette is a type of behavior that team members are expected to follow to uphold the company image and respect each other. While business culture has become more casual, it's still critical to practice common courtesy. In this workshop, it was explained what business etiquette is and some of the basic rules to familiarize with. Further in the session, it was stated that people in the business world have different expectations about eye contact, body language, dress code, and dining etiquette, just to name a few. While many companies have shifted to a more casual culture, understanding proper business etiquette can go a long way. Business etiquette may change from culture to culture, but when everyone understands and follows a particular set of standards, it can create a sense of unity. Business etiquette is sometimes unspoken, but more often than not, team members will agree upon the basic rules so everyone presents a united image. When team members follow business etiquette, it builds effective communication in the workplace.

The five important business courtesies were told to help the students to make a solid first impression and show respect for the team members. The points discussed were:

1. Be on time

Whether you're attending an interview or daily standup meeting, being on time in a work environment shows that you respect everyone's schedule. If punctuality isn't something you've prioritized in the past, brush up on some time management tips to keep yourself organized and aware of your to-do list. There are nuances to being on time—some cultures operate on a system of being slightly late to everything. But when in doubt, show up on time and adjust from there if necessary.

2. Recognize your team

Acknowledging others is proper business etiquette for both casual and formal work environments. When someone walks in the room at a business dinner or meeting, greet them and say hello appropriately—whether by shaking hands or following some other cultural custom. The same rule applies if you work from home and attend daily Zoom meetings. You may not be required to get on camera in every business meeting, but speaking up and taking the time to recognize your team members can let everyone know you're listening and make others feel noticed.

3. Dress appropriately

Dressing appropriately is subjective and will depend on whether you work in an office or from home. Some companies that work in the office every day will expect everyone to dress in business casual attire because much of the work involves face time with stakeholders or clients. Other companies who work in a hybrid environment may encourage team members to dress casually in order to promote comfort and productivity.

If you are unsure about appropriate business attire, ask your manager or supervisor for tips. It's especially common to feel unsure if you just started a new job, but don't be afraid to send a quick email before your first day to get a feel of the office policy. Alternatively, think back to your interview and try to remember what everyone was wearing so you can dress accordingly.



4. Respect shared spaces

Even if you work remotely, you may go into the office on occasion or share virtual spaces with your team members. Office spaces you may share with team members include a kitchen, bathroom, printer and copy room, and lounge area. Virtual spaces you may share include Google Drive folders. The way you treat shared spaces will reflect on you as a professional, so it's important that you label things correctly, stay organized, and respect others who also use these spaces. Business etiquette applies to shared spaces whether you're cleaning up after yourself physically or following company processes online.

5. Build emotional intelligence

Emotional intelligence is the ability to recognize, regulate, and understand emotions in yourself and in others. Effective emotional intelligence skills can help you empathize with team members and overcome challenges. While emotional intelligence isn't a direct rule of business etiquette, it will help you in the workplace, no matter what conflicts arise.

At the end of the session students learned that no matter what type of business one is in, proper business etiquette is not optional; it is something that should be used every day. In fact, using proper business etiquette will help individuals appear polished and professional, causing clients to view them as knowledgeable and confident.

ADDRESS BY PROF. G.S KARKARA SIR

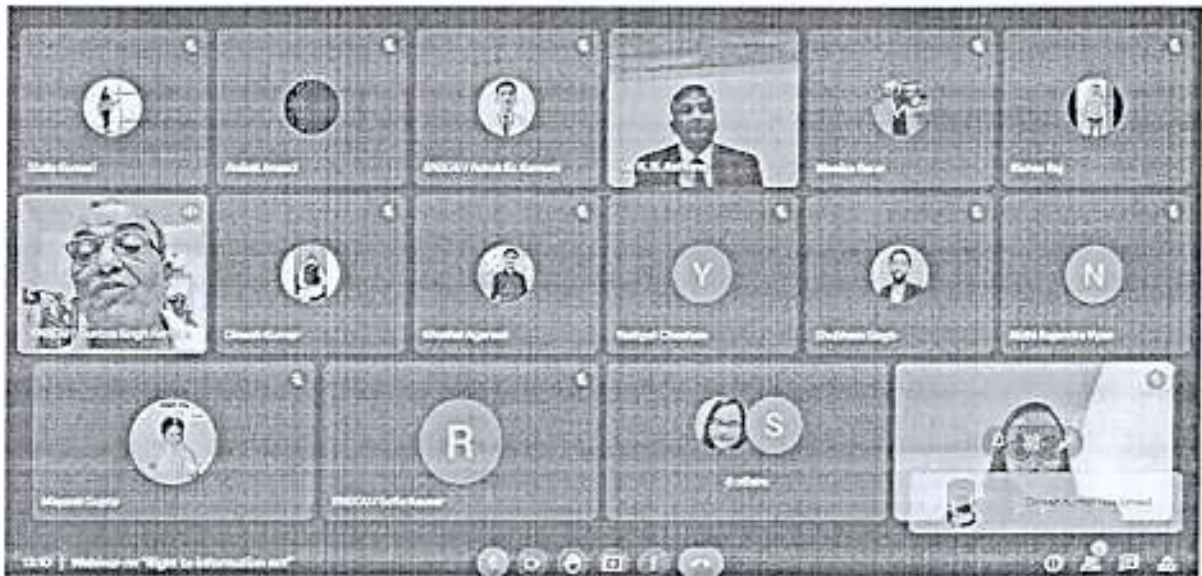

ADDRESS BY PROF. K.B. ASTHANA SIR

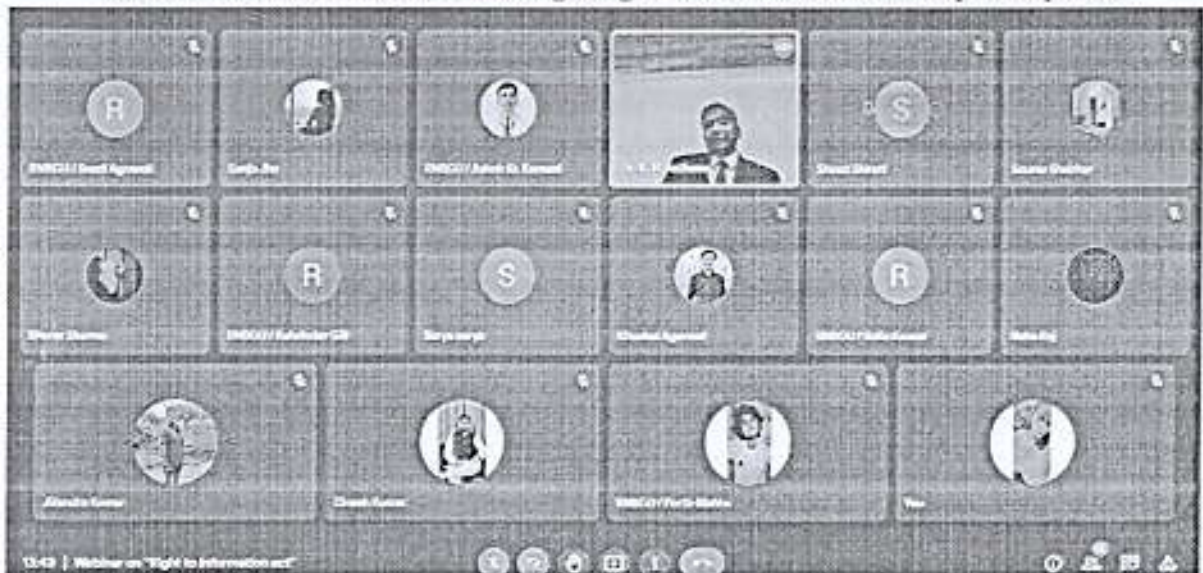

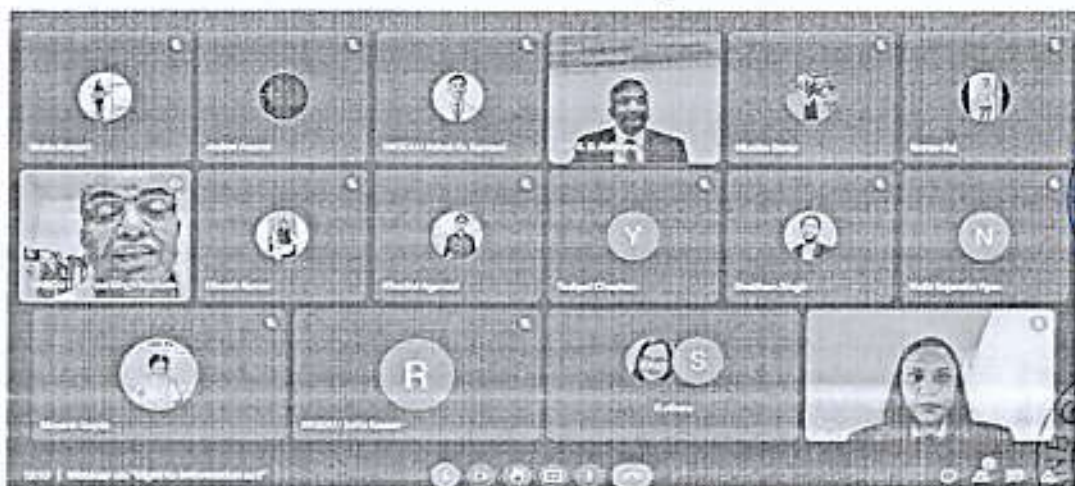

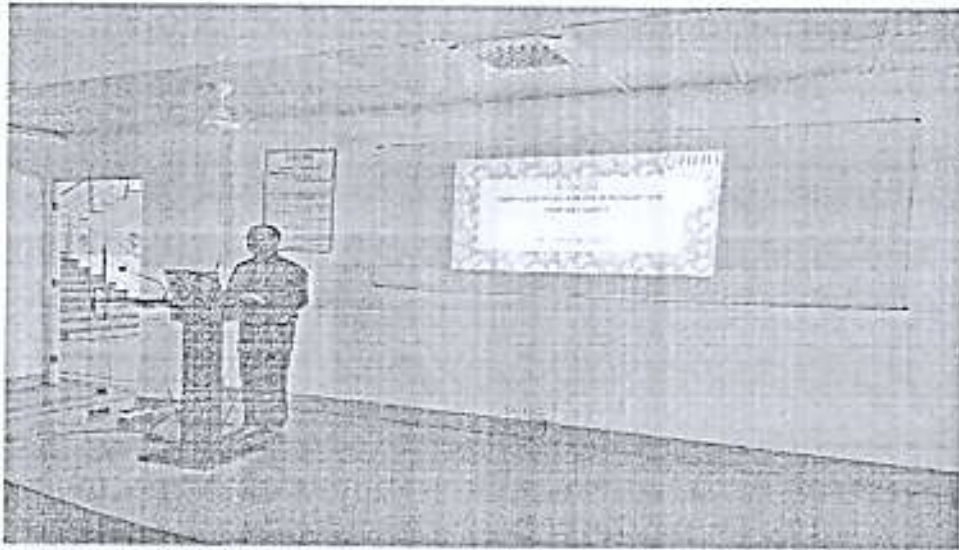
Day 01: This lecture was presented by Mr. Sandeep Saxena, initiated by indicating the connotation of the terminologies - IP and IPR. The legal basis of IPR and then various forms were discussed. The ethos and process vs product patents, trade secrete protection, designs, copyrights etc., and the basis of the expectance of various IPR. Problems were discussed the types of patents such as biotech patent, plant patent, utility patent, software patent, business method patent, nano-tech patent, design pattern were elaborated. The wealth of patents in developed countries like USA, Japan and Europe are projected and compared with Indian status indicating poorness with the wealth of IP in India, a focus of the important of commercialization of patents was projected.

Day 02: This lecture was presented by Dr. Meenakshi Sharma and started with the need of IP in copyrights and related rights. The rights for reproduction and the ethics in handling these assets were presented. The legal basis of copyright infringement and plagiarism were elaborated with respect to the rights for reproduction/copy. The emerging concept of creative commons and the existence of various data bases academic and plagiarism platforms were discussed. UGC 2018 regulations of promotion and academic strategy and presentation of plagiarism in higher education institutions was presented. Thus, the concepts involved in copyrights and plagiarisms were outlined. Finally, very good discussions are made to clarify many aspects regarding IPR related doubts by faculty and students.

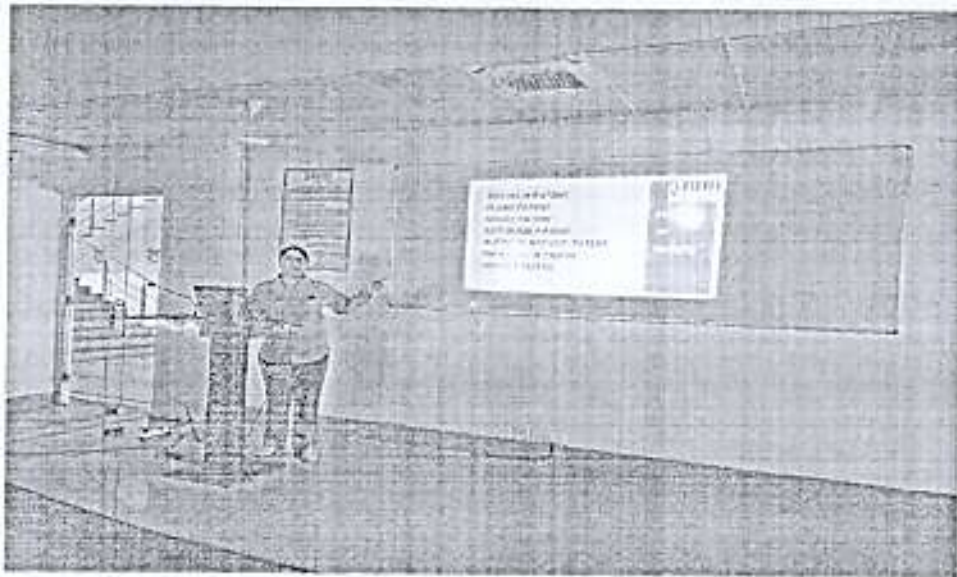

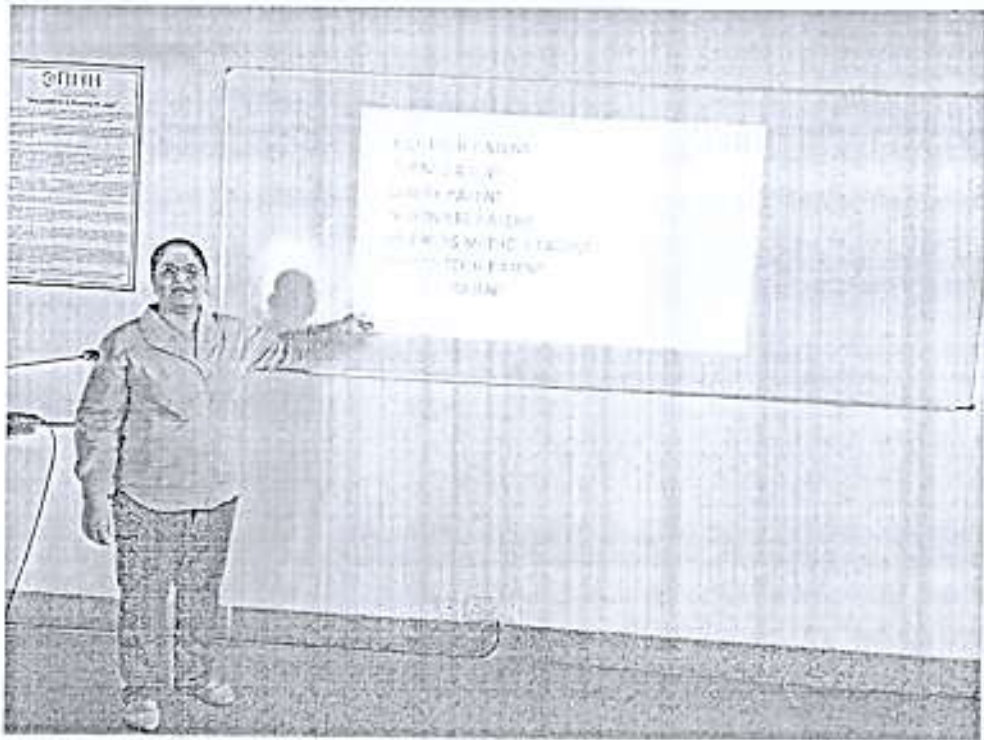

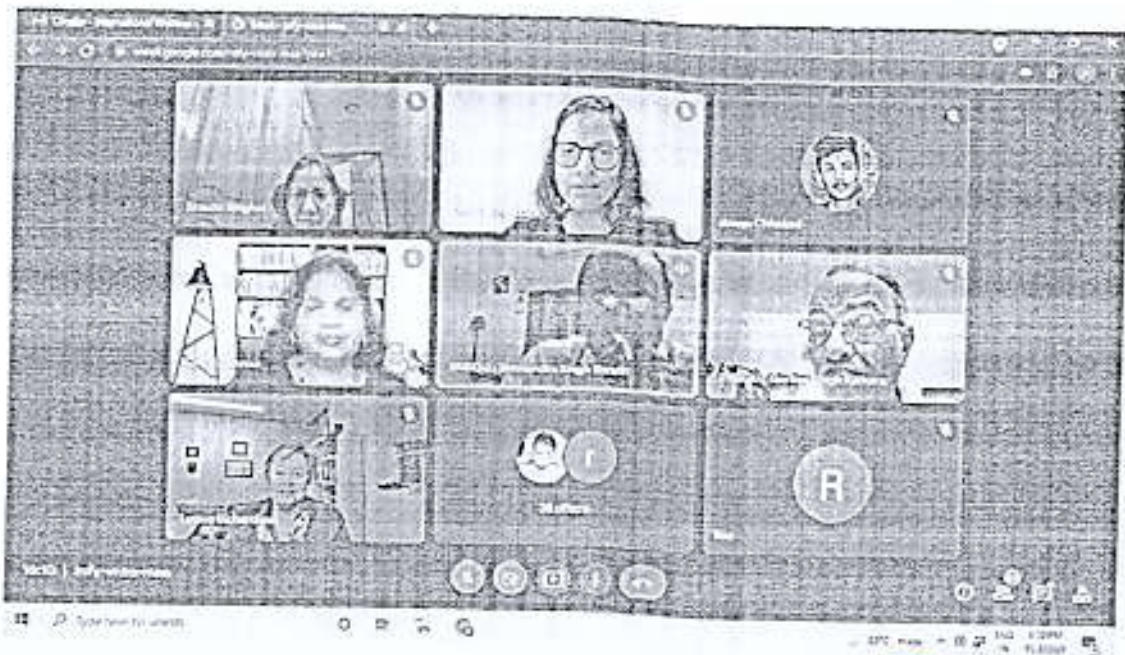
Paris, France & Dr. Celia Shaznaz-Professor, Chair, IEEE WIE History Committee, Bangladesh.

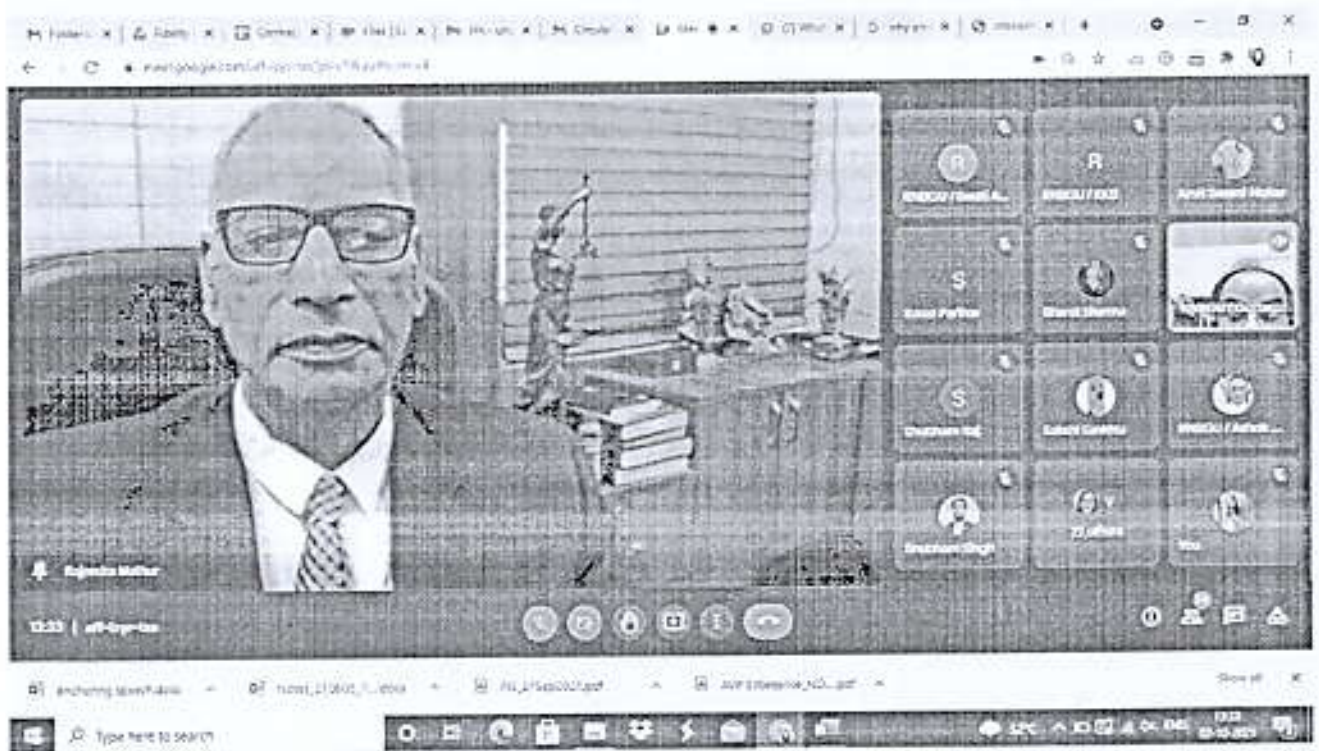

Introduction

The National Seminar is organized by the SOL, RNBGU on the topic "*Constitutional Values in the Contemporary Indian Politics*". A Constitution may be written or unwritten, but it contains fundamental laws of the land. It is the supreme and ultimate authority. Any decision or action which is not in accordance with it will be unconstitutional and unlawful. A Constitution also lays down limits on the power of the government to avoid abuse of authority. Moreover, it is not a static but a living document, because it needs to be amended as and when required to keep it updated. Its flexibility enables it to change according to changing aspirations of the people, the needs of the time and the changes taking place in society. The Constitution of any country serves several purposes. It lays down certain ideals that form the basis of the kind of country that we as citizens aspire to live in. A country is usually made up of different communities of people who share certain beliefs, but may not necessarily agree on all issues. A Constitution helps serve as a set of principles, rules and procedures on which there is a consensus. These form the basis according to which the people want the country to be governed and the society to move on. This includes not only an agreement on the type of government but also on certain ideals that the country should uphold. The Indian Constitution has certain core constitutional values that constitute its spirit and are expressed in various articles and provisions. But do you know what is the meaning of the word, 'value'? You may immediately say that truth, non-violence, peace, cooperation, honesty, respect and kindness are values, and you may continue to count many such values. In fact, in a layman's understanding, value is that which is very essential or 'worth having and observing' for the existence of human society as an entity. The Indian Constitution contains all such values, the values that are the universal, human and democratic of the modern age.

WORKING SESSION 1 - " Constitution and Judiciary "

Speaker 1 – Mrs. S.P. Vidyassri

Assistant Professor, Saveetha School of Law, SIMATS Topic

- Empirical study on frequent promulgation of ordinance is a threat to parliament democracy

Mrs. S.P. Vidyassri said that Re-proclamation of ordinance is a misrepresentation on the Constitution and, the Supreme Court has put aside a lot of ordinances passed by the Bihar government somewhere in the year of 1989 and 1992. Re-promulgation of ordinance is a



force on the Constitution and a disruption of majority rule administrative procedures, Re-promulgation proposes that notwithstanding with the session of the governing authorities, a new exercise is to proclaim the ordinance is being turned to exercise of the way that the legislative assembly which was in ownership of a recently declared ordinance has not changed over its arrangements into a consistently sanctioned ordinance.

Speaker 2- Aashish Taank

JRF, Department of Law, Panjab University

Topic - Rule of Law – Developments and Perspective in Indian Context

Aashish Taank stated that the Concept of Rule of law has attained different meanings in different Legal Systems due to variance in uniquely situated historical, social, traditional, economic, political and demographical factors of each nation. For India, rule of law has been an established pre-requisite for sustenance of a just, humane, tolerant, equitable society. Even our freedom struggle was predominantly at core a resurgence of Indians for attaining for themselves a self-rule opposed to arbitrary and oppressive colonial administration.

Speaker 3 - Dr Vinay Prahaladbhai Solanki

Assistant Professor, Nanavati Law college, Ahmedabad

Topic - Constitution and Constitutionalism

Dr Vinay Prahaladbhai Solanki explained that It is one of the celebrated maxims of political science that there can be no society without a state, and there can be no state without a constitution. The word 'constitution' is used mainly in many senses—constitution of a body, constitution of trade union, constitution of political party etc. In a political sense, it signifies the constitution of the state. Now the term has attained a normative connotation and has become another term for a 'democratic political order.' Every state must have constitution of its own and that its government must be organised and conducted according to the rules of the constitution so that the people must have a rule of law, it constitutes the case of constitutionalism.

Speaker 4 – Dr. Gurmeet Kaur

Assistant Professor, SOL, IGNOU

Topic - Socialism, its Constitutional Value, and Interpretation by Judiciary

Socialism though cannot be defined precisely but as a system seems to emphasis on the welfare and achieving the goal of equality among the people with basic aim is to remove class exploitation and



disparities. It premises on the concept of cooperation to ensure economic and political equality where means of production, wealth, profits are equally distributed, exchanged are owned and regulated by the welfare state for overall development of society negating the concept of individual or competition. The present research paper focuses on the concept of socialism, its constitutional value, its ideology and impact in the context of India. The concept of socialism is also discussed in the light of interpretation by the judiciary.

Assistant Professor, SOL, Allahabad University

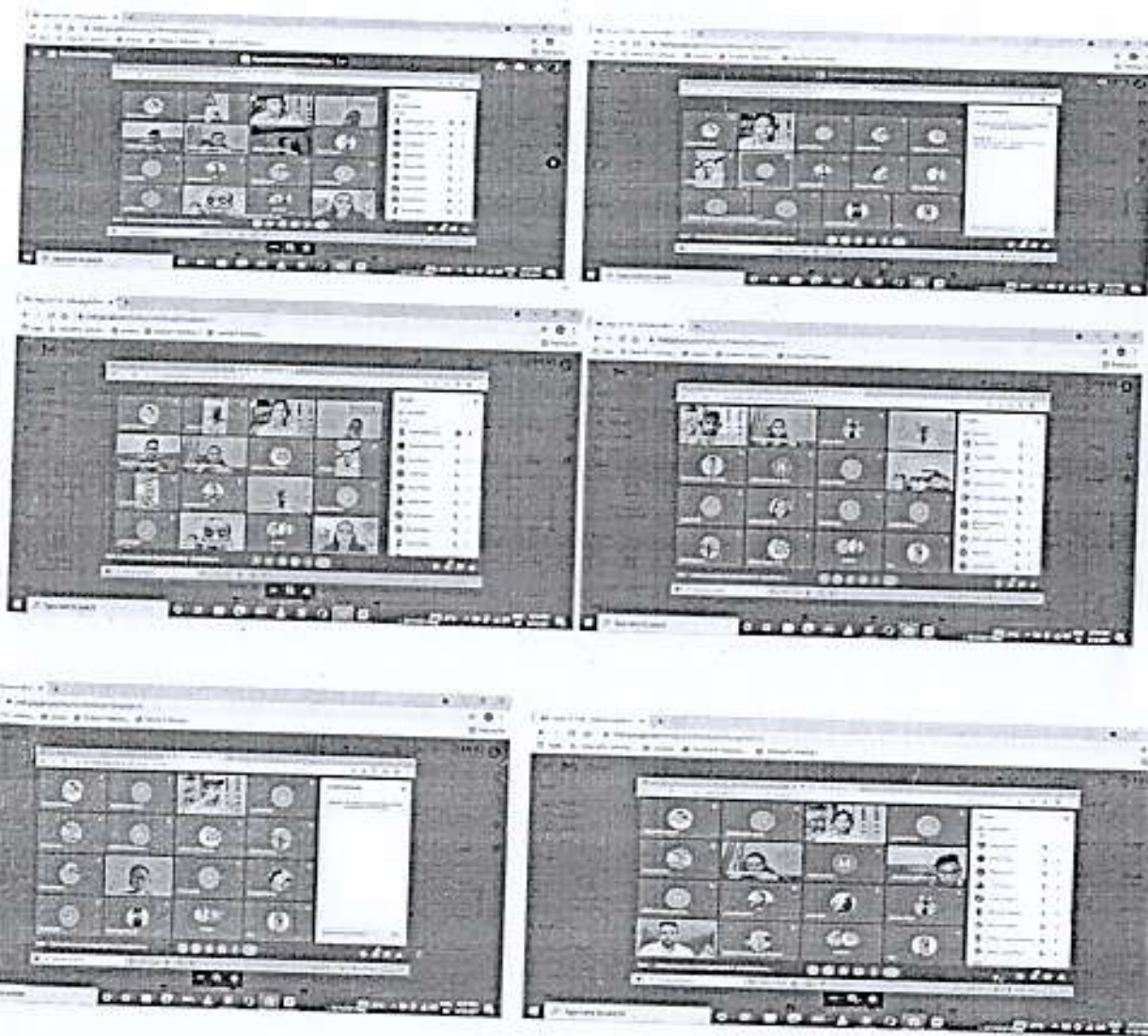
Topic- Role of Indian constitution in contemporary politics: issues and challenges

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Introduction & object of Webinar

The purpose of this POSH Act 2013 is to prevent sexual harassment against women in the workplace and also to protect them. Workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a woman's fundamental right to equality and right to life, guaranteed under Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Constitution of India. 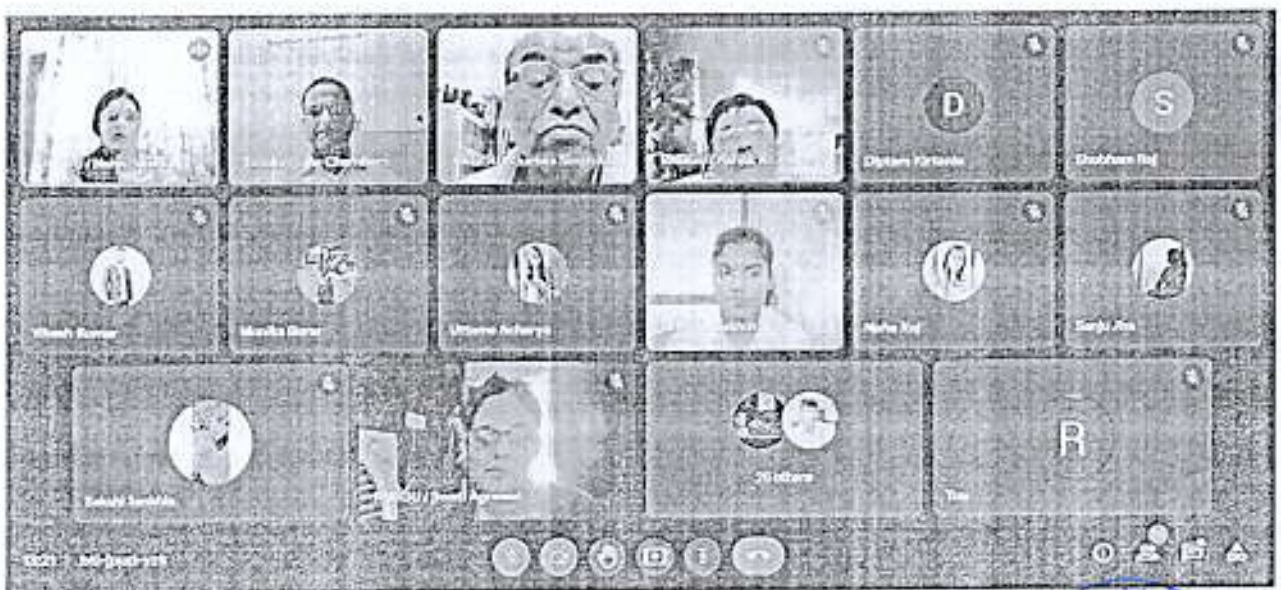
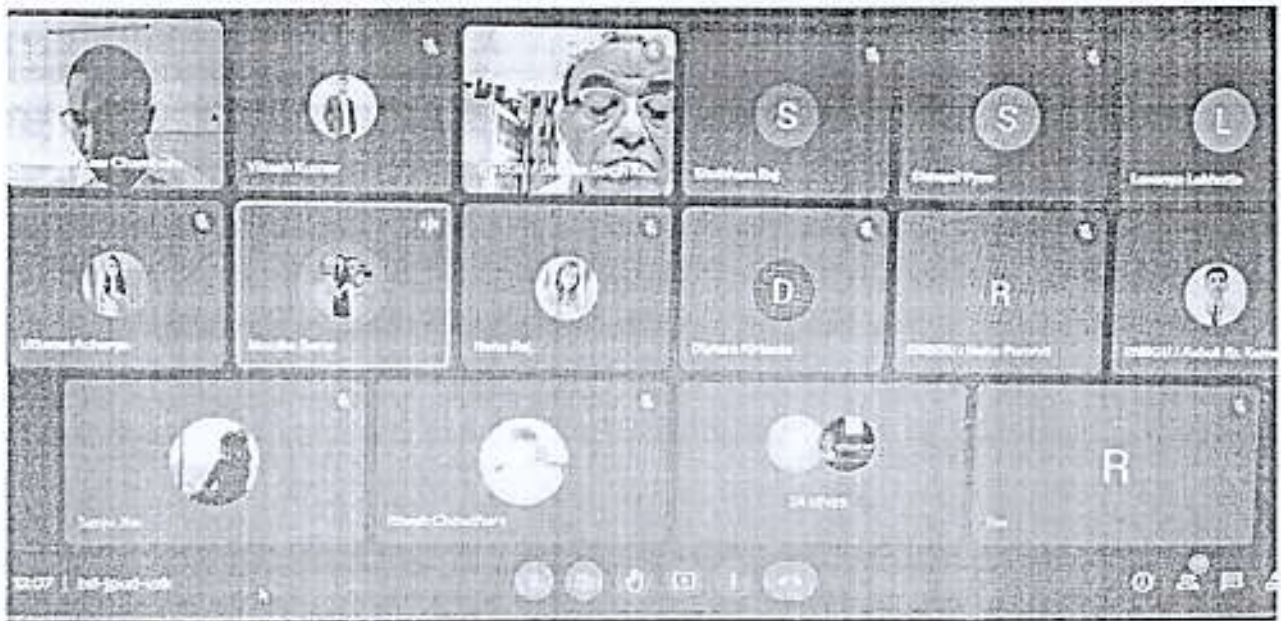

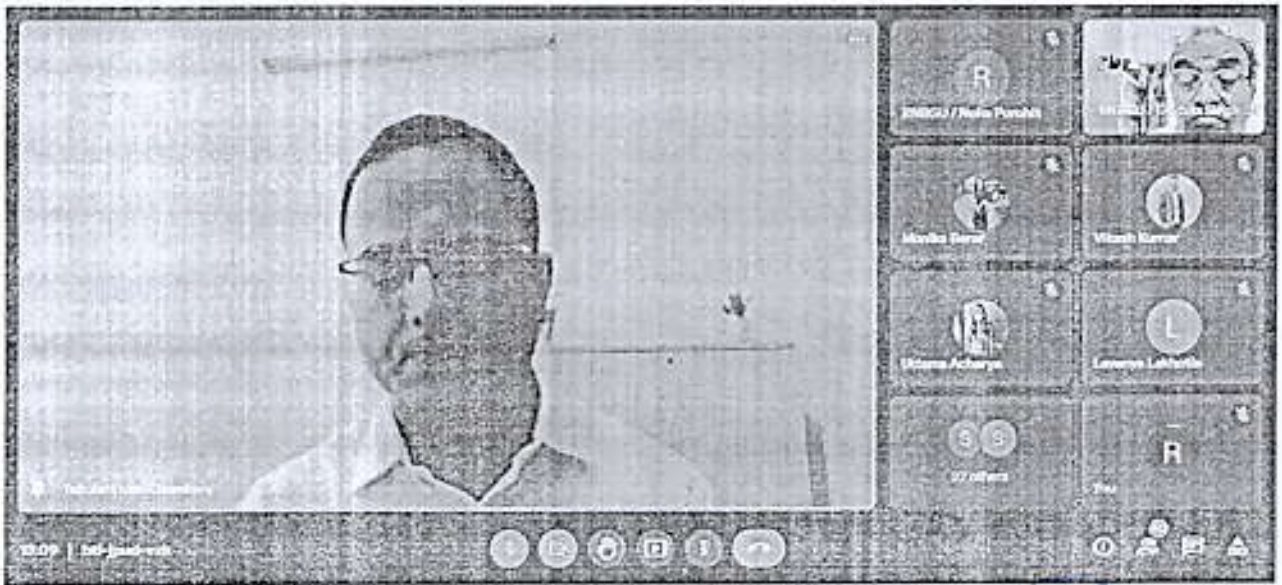

Introduction

Students learned that the GST regime to the tax structure in the country were to rationalize the indirect tax regime of the country to inhibit the "cascading effect" of tax and create a common market for goods and services in the country. The government pitched ease of doing business, investor friendliness and economic growth as the necessary underpinnings for this under the "one nation-one tax" vision. In this era of globalization and international trade and export orientated development, it is a welcome change. In 2018 India jumped to the 77th position in the World Bank's ease of doing business index which has further improved and a big part of the credit for this goes to the introduction of the GST regime among others like the IBC, FDI policy etc. All of this sounds very good on paper but the real test of any reform is its on ground effectiveness in practice. The government's grand vision cannot be realized without a robust dispute settlement system which caters to efficiency in disposal of disputes while keeping litigation costs low. The GST regime has introduced a thorough and extensive framework related to the various kinds of disputes that may arise out of the entire GST regime. These include disputes arising between the centre and state(s) or between centre and state(s) on one side and other states on the other side or between one or more states. The other most important kind of disputes is the grassroots level disputes or "taxman-assessee" disputes arising from issues related to payment of taxes by persons and levy by the authorities. The focus of this paper is the second kind of disputes i.e. grassroots disputes. Although the various issues regarding litigation in general in India are also applicable to tax disputes but tax disputes are also unique in other ways which makes tax dispute settlement even trickier. Firstly, the technical nature of facts as well as law in tax matters makes them especially complex, secondly, the initial adjudication by issuer of notice which is an official of the department or his senior carries an inherent suspicion of bias and thus such matters mostly get appealed leading to a lot of matters continuing. Thus it becomes all the more crucial to have a good system of dispute settlement. Students also learned that the GST regime has some very noble ideas and visions which also included tackling the tricky terrain of tax disputes.

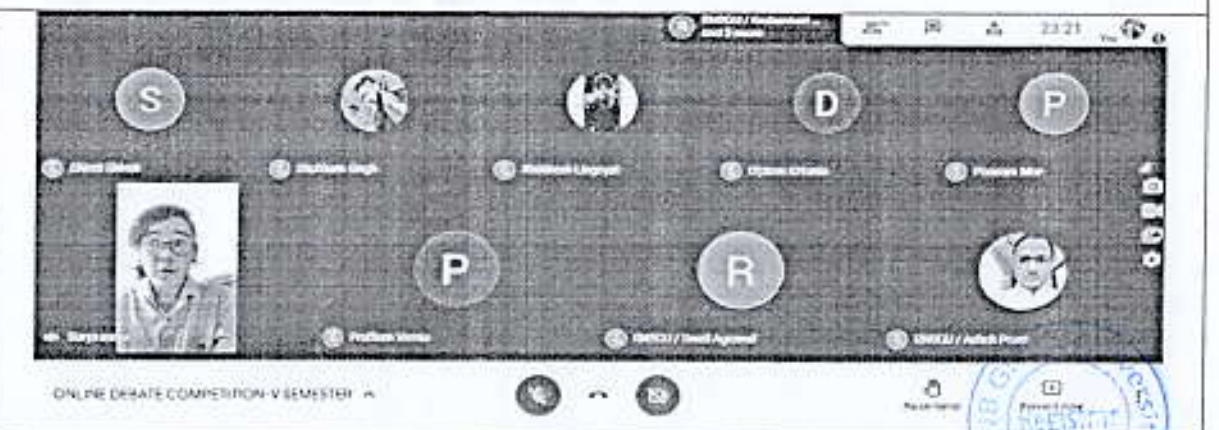
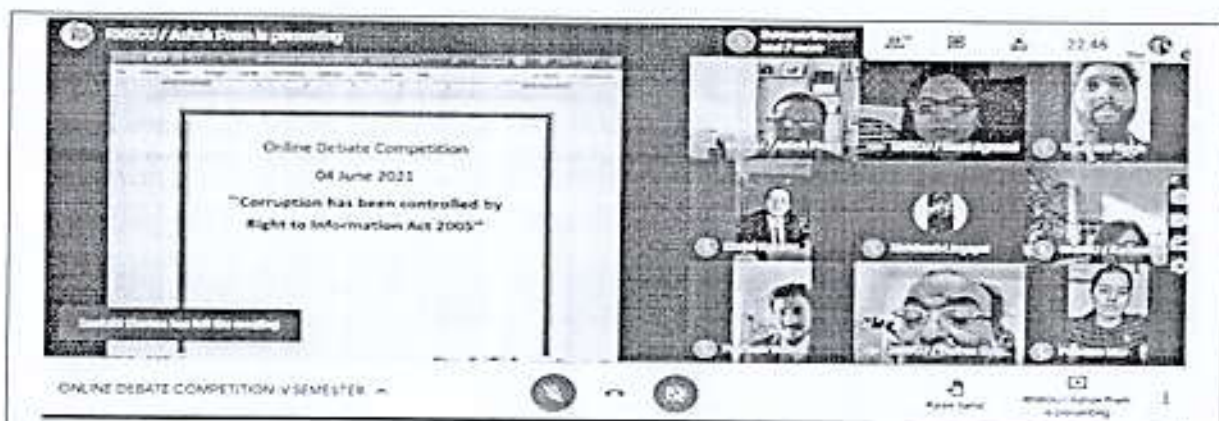

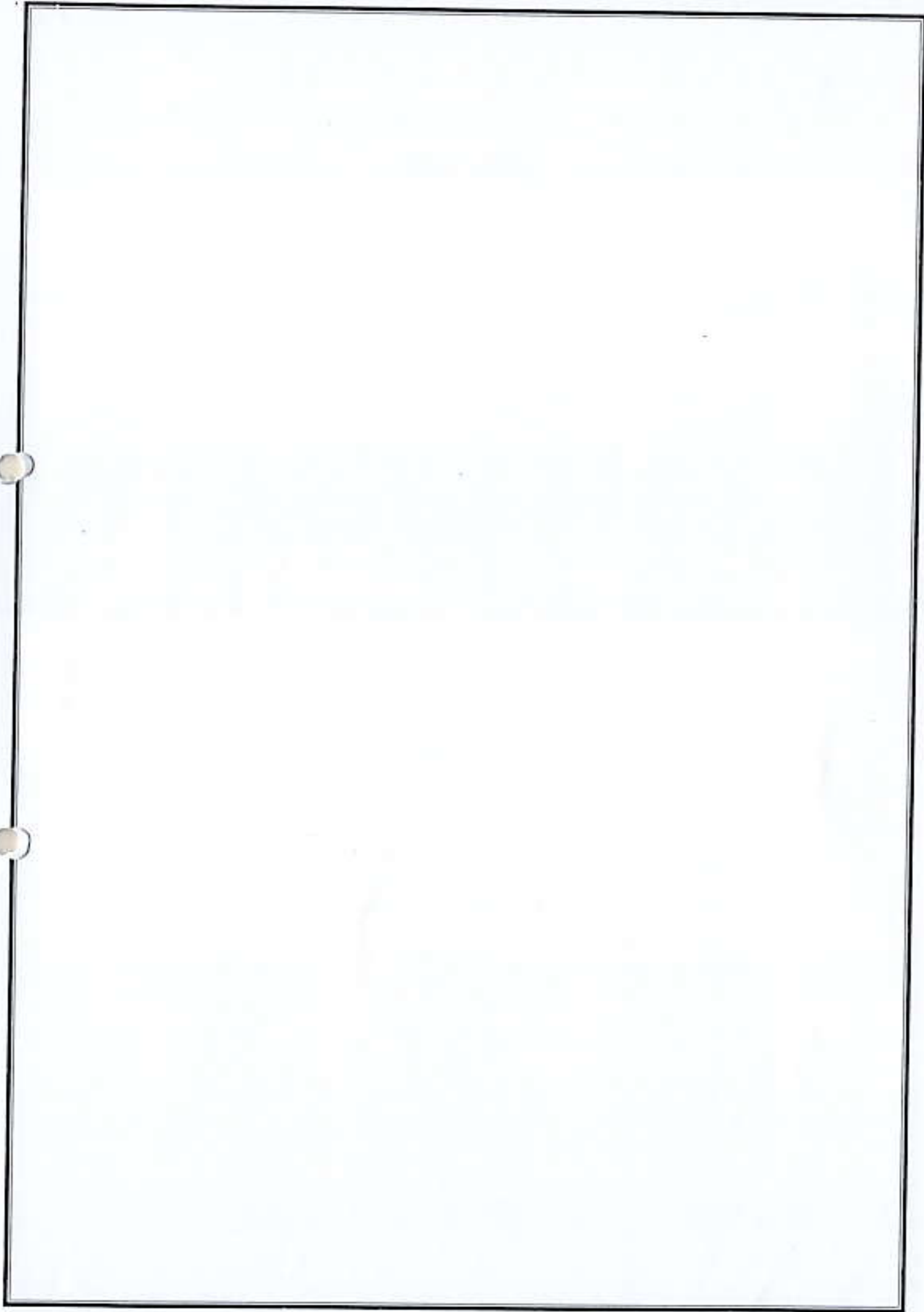

INTRODUCTION

RNB Global University's School of Commerce and Management organized the Webinar titled "Impact of TV Advertisements on Buying Behavior in Modern Age" on 24th May 2021.

The session commenced with the welcome address given to Resource Person -Dr.Rohtash Kumar, faculty members, to all the students and introduction of the topic by Rani Puja-Student-MBA-II semester.

Dr. Shashi Singhal -Dean-SOCM welcomed the guest speaker and spoke about the importance of advertisement. She emphasized that the amount spent for advertising on broadcast, cable TV and radio was 44 per cent, which was marginally higher than newspapers and magazines. This is because of the positive effect of TV commercials and online advertisements on consumers.

Dr. Rohtash Kumar spoke about the importance of Impact of TV Advertisements on Buying Behavior in Modern Age to the students.

He spoke that Marketers invest in various media platforms to influence consumer behaviour. Advertisement on every media platform has a different composition that engages the consumers in a distinct way. Digitalization has led to changes in consumers' media habits. Hence, a deeper understanding of advertisements on different media platforms and its implications on Consumer Behaviour need to be established. He focuses on the effects of television, radio, newspapers, magazines and the Internet advertisements on awareness, interest, conviction, purchase and post-purchase behaviour of consumers.

He also discussed that in a competitive market, it is important for advertising managers to grab consumers' attention through advertisements and sales promotion. A sizable marketing budget is spent on advertising. The trend of using digital media platforms for advertisements is growing. He also intends students to explore the importance of various media advertisements on consumer behaviour stages such as awareness, interest, conviction, purchase and post-purchase. Today, the advertising cost of each media is very high, and any inappropriate media strategies can be a costly decision. Thus, it is essential for advertising managers to understand various media advertisements and its impact on Consumer Behaviour. Further he also stated that Advertisers know that the earlier kids learn about a brand, the more likely they'll be to buy the product later (or request their parents to buy it). Marketing to preschoolers mostly entails commercials on television (or streaming services), since television is still the dominant medium for young children.

Rani Puja-Student-MBA-II Semester gave vote of thanks for the event. The event was successful and it rightly benefited all those who attended it.



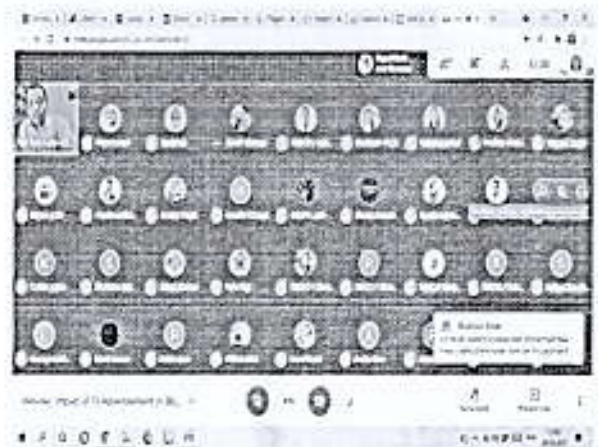
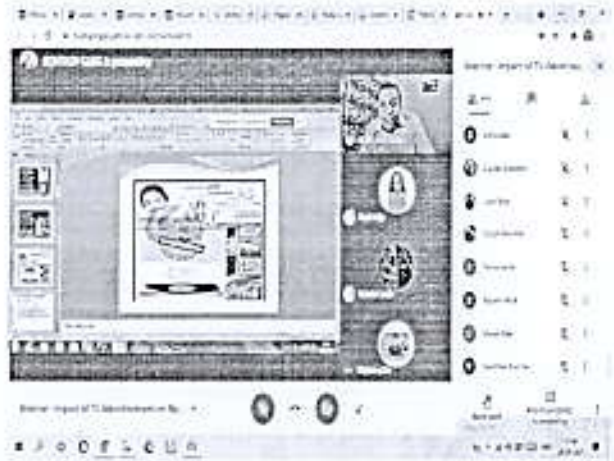

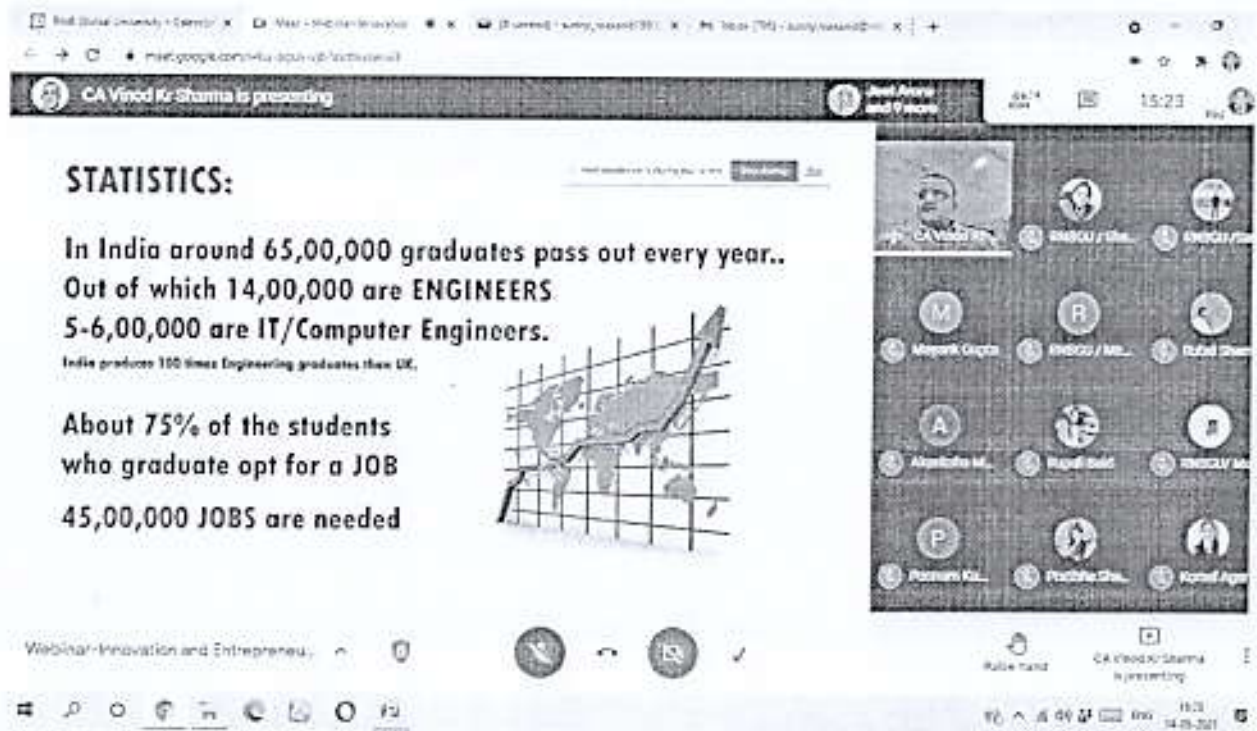

The magnitude of disruption from the Covid-19 pandemic has significantly impacted organizations of all sizes, across all industry sectors. Management and those charged with governance (TCWG) are having to make difficult decisions daily about operational, financial, and strategic matters.

The consequences on financial statement reporting and audit engagements are complex. There is an unprecedented level of uncertainty about the economy, future earnings and many other inputs that represent fundamental elements of financial reporting. There will be multiple financial reporting implications to be considered by preparers of financial statements for the purposes of reporting in the short and potentially medium term.

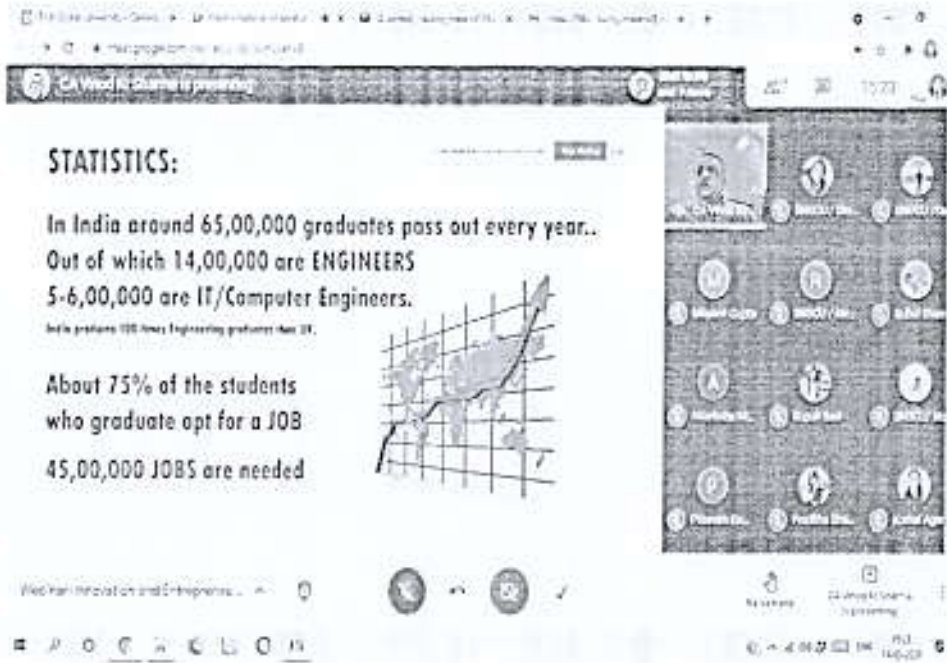
The responsibility for preparing and overseeing financial reporting is with management, with oversight from TCWG. They will have to exercise significant judgment in the current business environment. Of particular importance is:

- Balancing the timeliness of reporting against the reliability and integrity of reported information that appropriately incorporates managements best judgments and estimates.
- Appropriately assessing going concern and disclosures of substantial doubt/ material uncertainty when it exists.
- Providing a fair view and presentation of the performance and position of the entity, which is likely to require comprehensive disclosure of forward-looking information and cash flow impacts.
- Maintaining an environment of integrity and transparency as the basis for trustworthy and ethical decision-making across the organization
- Ensuring effective internal controls over financial reporting and emerging risks and taking advantage of extended reporting deadlines, as needed.

Students learned that Professional accountants will be asked to produce, analyze, and deliver the information upon which critical decisions will be made. The Code requires that in preparing or presenting information, professional accountants do so in a manner that is intended neither to mislead nor to influence contractual or regulatory outcomes inappropriately. The Code also requires professional accountants to exercise professional judgment to represent the facts accurately and completely in all material respects; describe clearly the true nature of business transactions or activities; and classify and record information in a timely and proper manner.

2. Speaker explained what happiness is and how to win difficulties and challenges by staying calm and composed.



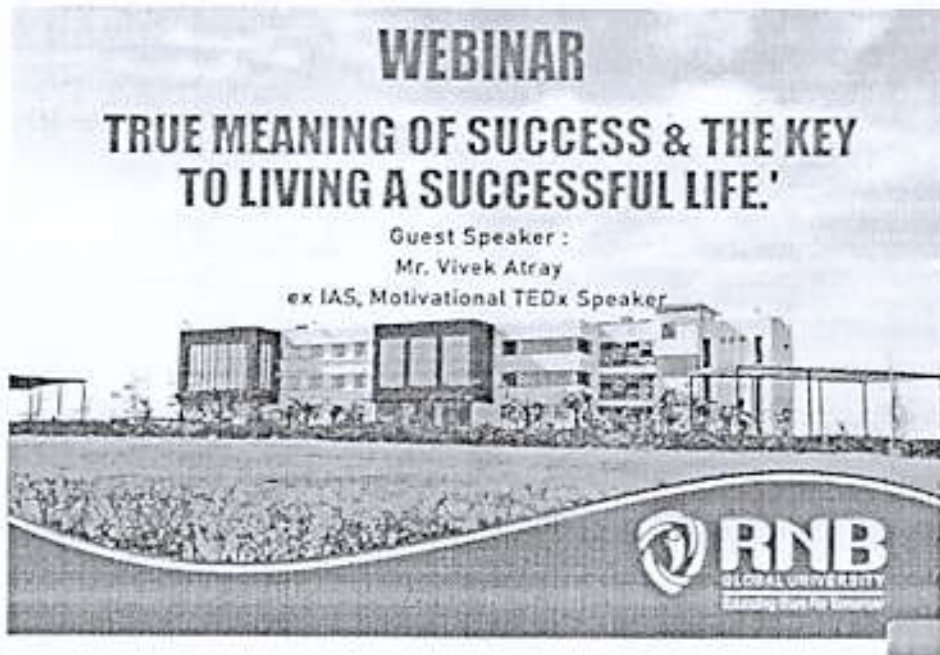

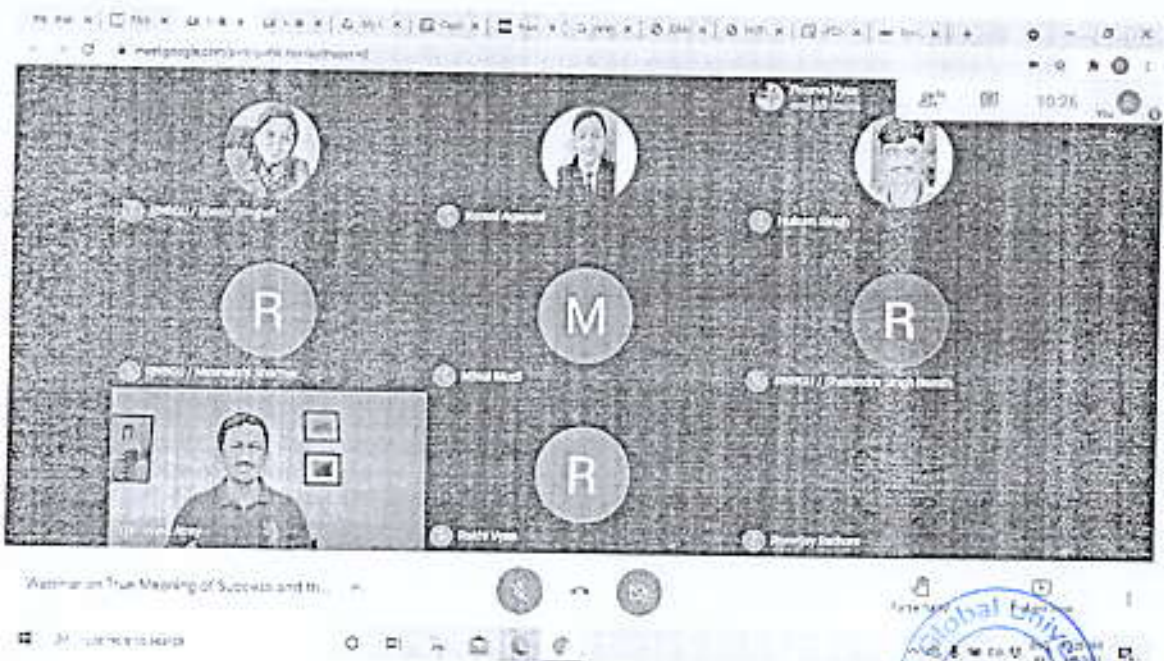
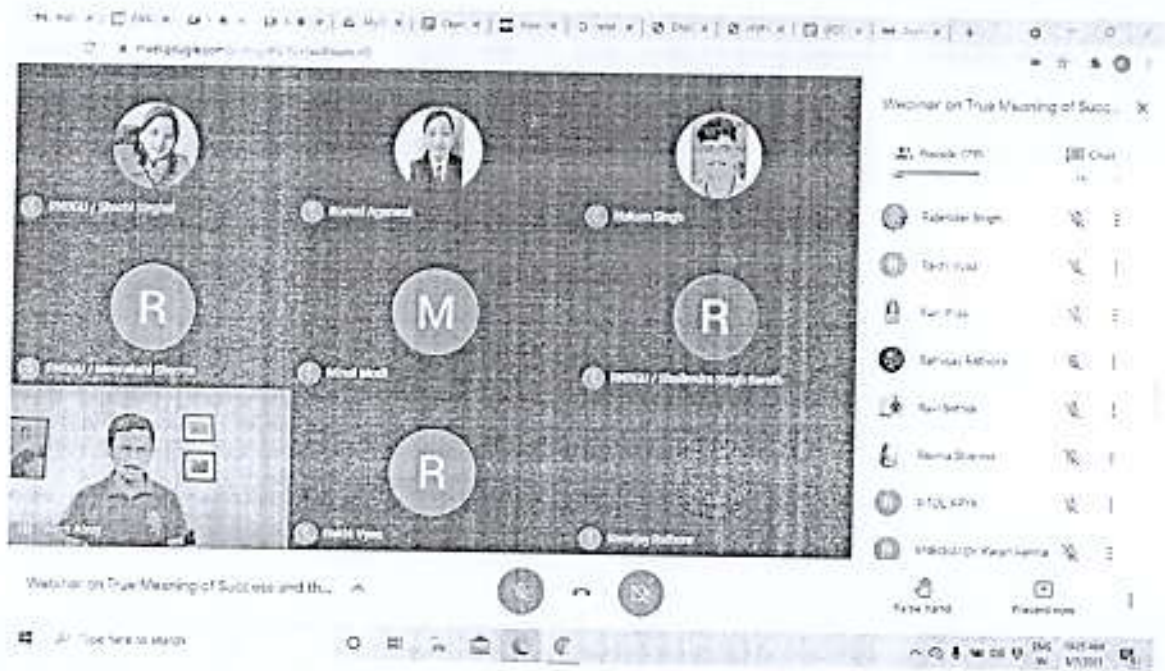

As her baby turned 2 years, she thought of starting a food chain specialize in toddler munchies. She made dry porridge using dal rice and started selling it. We just need to mix in warm water and home-made baby food is ready! Later she explored many more items like instant and healthy munchies which were kids friendly. This is how she started the business. Today she had served more than 35,000 people across Pune. She provides more than 100 types of snacks and fresh food.

Ms. Gupta talked about the challenges that she faced while doing the business like diversity of tastes, accepting the food, ensuring the trust, etc. The biggest difficulty she faced was in the initial days she used to deliver the food to the customers and later she hired few staff persons.

The second speaker Ms. Priyanka Guglani Shanghari, she is from Delhi, she is owns & manages PS Capital.

Ms. Guglani, talked about how she decided to start her own business. She shared in the initial time, sometimes it was a little hard to attract the customer's interest as well as to raise the fund for the business. They identified new ways of marketing the services which initially not adopted by many service providers in the city.

She discussed with students, how challenging it was as a female to be a business head and manage the things around. She shared what kept her going always what motivated her. She also shared what students may do for developing a career in their respective field and may start their own entrepreneurial venture. Students were very keen to ask the questions and Ms. Guglani was answering each questions with equal anticipation.

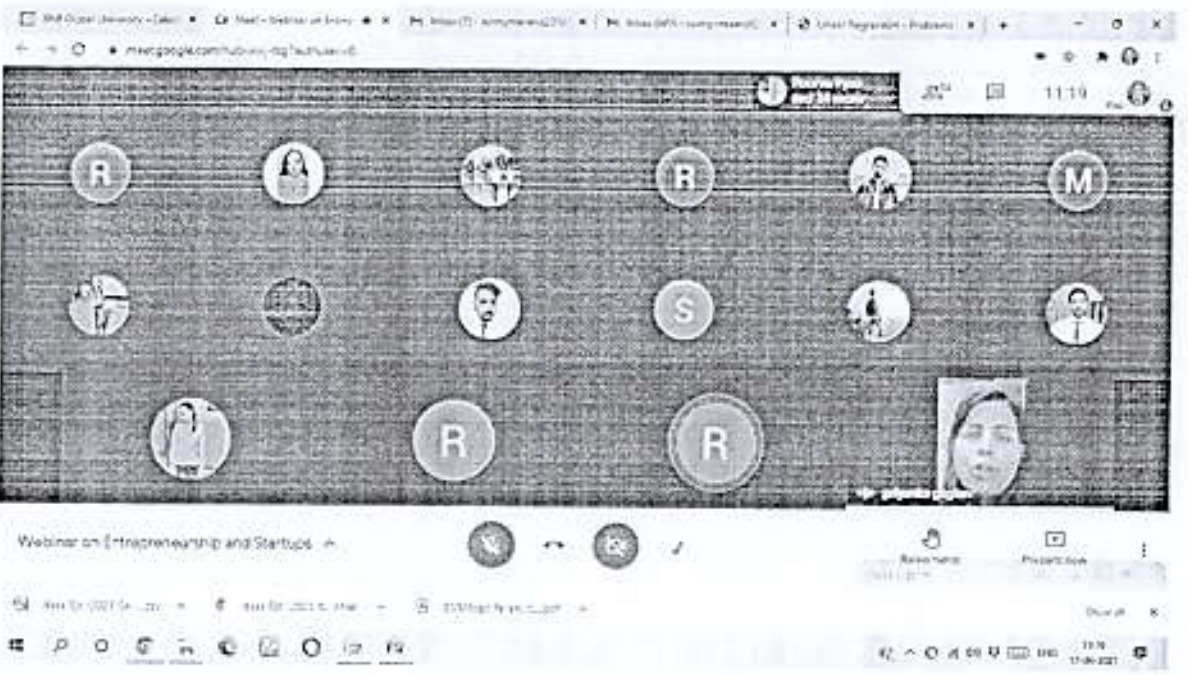
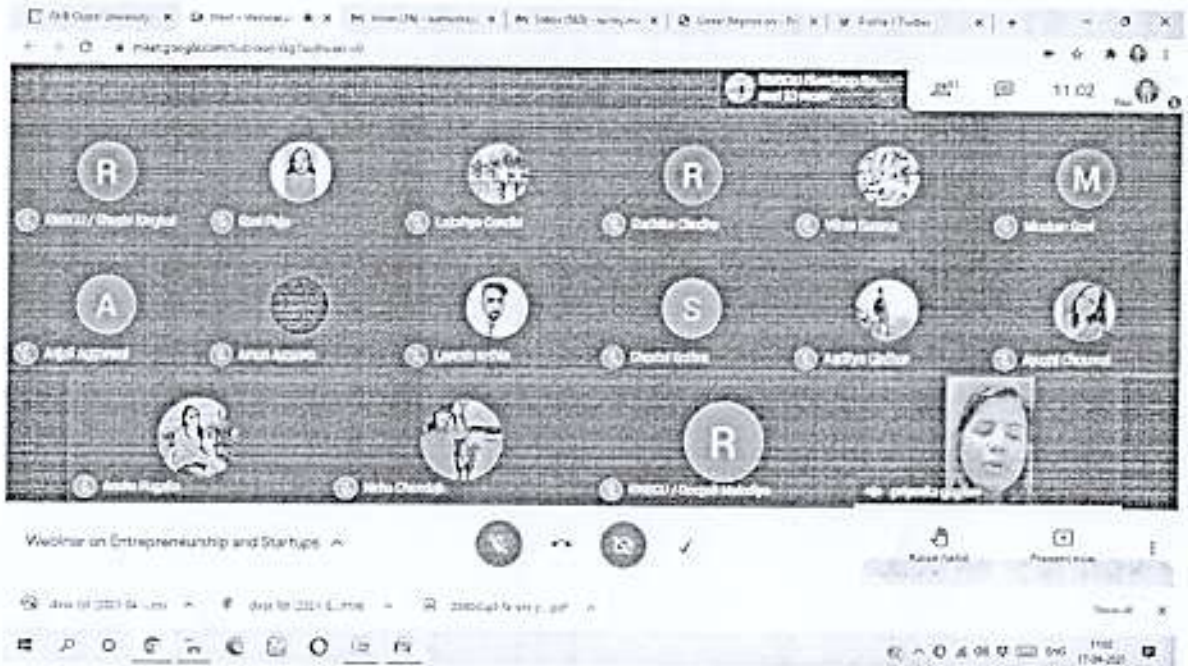

Introduction

RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY (RNBGU) School of Law, organized a one-day seminar on "Dealing with Frauds in Companies Act 2013" on March 5th 2021 in Room 213. The seminar focused on various provisions related to corporate Frauds & the several clauses present in the companies Act 2013 related to/dealing with frauds in the Companies Act 2013. The program started at 01.00 PM with the Introduction by Ms. Tisha Sharma. Seminars provide attendees with large amounts of information on specific topics over the course of the session and with the introduction of the topic Ms. Tisha Sharma gave a brief about the topic, she discussed various E-financial/ corporate frauds and scams which have taken place in India and the need of attention to be required by the law makers & time to evaluate the high standards in corporate governance and implementation of stringent provisions to tackle corporate Fraud.

She further emphasis on The Companies Act, 2013 ("new Act") which contains stringent provisions to contain corporate frauds. A new "investigation" procedure has been provided under Sections 210 to 229 in the new act in order to deal with the high rates of fraud. She also mentioned in her speech that the new Act also provides whistle blowing provisions and ensures anonymity of the whistle blower. She concluded her speech by explaining the meaning of the corporate fraud as well as stated there can be several reasons cited for which companies commit such frauds like making more falsified money, creating a false image of the company for the market scenario and misleading Governmental authorities for tax evasion. Lastly, she focused & gave emphasis on the fact "The advancement of technological and scientific development is contributing to the emergence of mass society with a large rank in file and small controlling elite, encouraging the growth of monopolies, the rise of a managerial class and intricate institutional mechanisms.

Why the Seminar was organised for students?

- Forgiving the insight to the students about provisions related to fraud in Companies Act 2013 and why it is important in today's life.

Insight of the Seminar

Our 1st speaker Ms. Uttama Acharya gave a "Comparative study of Satyam scam and Vijay Mallya case dealing with fraud". She presented a brief study of both the scandals and their core points. She pins pointed her main focus on the main key aspects of both the scams. All the Facts of both the cases were explained precisely by her. Beside this she also mentioned the key difference between both the scandals and their operation and the results of both the scams on the economy as well as on the society. Lastly, she concluded by stating that the introduction of stringent provisions in the new Act, to tackle the problem of Fraud indicates how serious the problem has been & mentioned Section 211 which empowers the Central Government to establish an office called Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO) to investigate frauds relating to companies.

Our 2nd presenter for the day was Ms. Anmol Parakh Jain, while presenting her paper she started with defining the meaning of the term 'Fraud' and explaining the various types of Fraud like Fraudulent

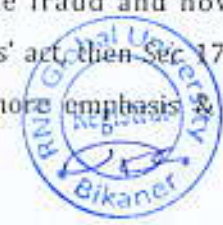
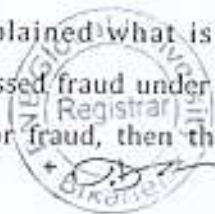


Financial Statements, Employee Fraud, Vendor Fraud, Customer Fraud, Investment Scams, Bankruptcy frauds and miscellaneous. The core focus of the paper was on the new provisions inserted in the new companies act 2013 related to tackling the problems frauds in the corporate sector. Later she discussed several huge scams that happened in India such as Satyam scam, Harshad Mehta Scandal, 2-G Spectrum Case, Vijay Mallya case, IRCTC Case and many more. Lastly, she concluded by stating various provisions related with tacking of fraud mentioned in the Companies Act 2013.

3rd speakers for the day were Ms. Sakshi Sankhla & Mr. Piyush Tripathi who together under author & co-authorship presented their paper on "STATUTORY PROVISIONS OF FRAUD AND FRAUD REPORTING UNDER THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013". Both the speakers started presenting their paper with giving an introduction of how important is to have and good governance and what role does the same plays in dealing with fraud and also stated a brief comparison between the old Companies Act 1956 & the new Companies Act 2013 in relations to the provisions related to fraud.

First and foremost, they defined the term "fraud" in detailed & the sections related to fraud as well as the clauses related to punishment for committing fraud. They also stated the essential ingredient required for to fall within the ambit of action causing fraud. Beside just stating section 447 of the companies act which deals with the provisions of fraud they also discussed Section 17 of Indian Contract Act, 1872 which also provides with the clause of fraud. While discussing several corporate Frauds, such as the 5000 crore rupees Harshad Mehta scam in 1992, 7000 crore rupees Satyam fiasco in 2009, and the 27000 crore rupees Sahara fraud case which started in 2010 and is sub-judice in Supreme Court, till date they also gave emphasis on the white color crimes.

Reports of the Vivian Bose Commission of Inquiry into the affairs of Dalmia-Jain group of companies in 1963, observations of Justice M. C. Chagla were also mentioned by the students. While concluding their paper they stated the provision related to the punishment of fraud and the fine or imprisonment imposed. Beside this they also stated provisions related to reporting of frauds & statutory auditor/cost auditor/secretarial auditor mentioned under the new Companies Act 2013. Lastly, they emphasized on the fact that how the new law has also bestowed legal status on the Serious Fraud Investigation Office, a probe agency under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs which is established by Central Government to investigate frauds relating to a company and stated several sections such as 2(5), 2(56) 7(5), 7(6), 8(11), 34, 36, 38(1), 46(5), 56(7), 66(10), 75, 140(5), 206(4), 213, 229, 251(1), 266(1), 339(3), 448 etc. The 4th Speaker for the day was Mr. Yashpal Chouhan & Mr. Rishikesh Lingayat, who together under author & co-authorship they presented their paper on "Fraud under the Companies Act, 2013". In the beginning of their paper, they explained what is corporate fraud and how does it occur & what are the means. They discussed fraud under companies' act, then Sec 17 of Indian Contract Act, 1872, after that punishment for fraud, then they gave more emphasis & discussed



corporate fraud, after that fraud reporting, then fraud reporting procedure, and at last mechanisms. While discussing the provisions related to fraud and its punishments, they also explained types of fraud in their paper for more better understanding. Lastly while concluding they gave the reference of serious Fraud Investigation Office, Secretarial Audit, auditors and audit committee & independent directors.

The last & 5th speaker for the day was Mr. Mayank Gupta who spoke on "**Frauds in Companies Act 2013**". In his paper his main focus of area was the provisions in the Companies Act 2013 related to the definition of fraud, Punishment of fraud, false statement, false evidence, and repeated default. While discussing he also explained about the provisions of adjudication of penalties and stated how offense of fraud are non-compoundable. After stating all the provisions related to punishment and penalties, he focused on fraud reporting and its sections under Companies Act 2013. While concluding his paper he talked about Serious Fraud Investigation Office and Secretarial Audit. Overall, his paper focused on the provisions related to fraud and the punishment.



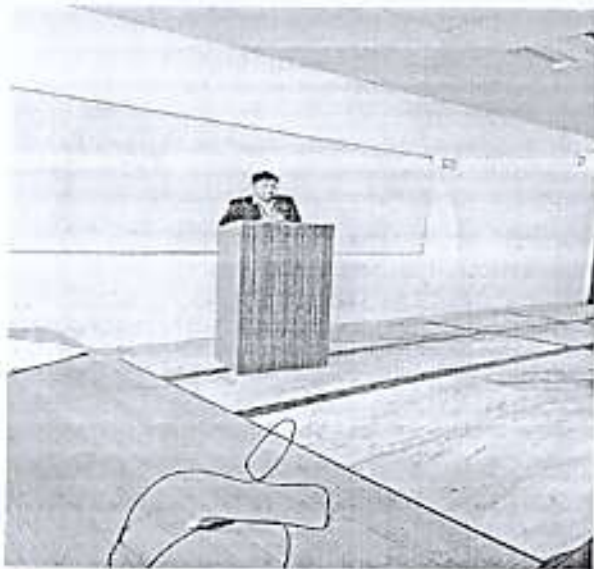

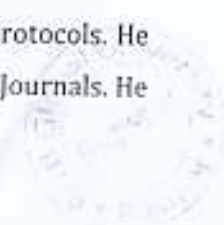
on "Sustainable Innovations in Biotechnology" ended with the vote of thanks from Dr. Dipali Gupta.

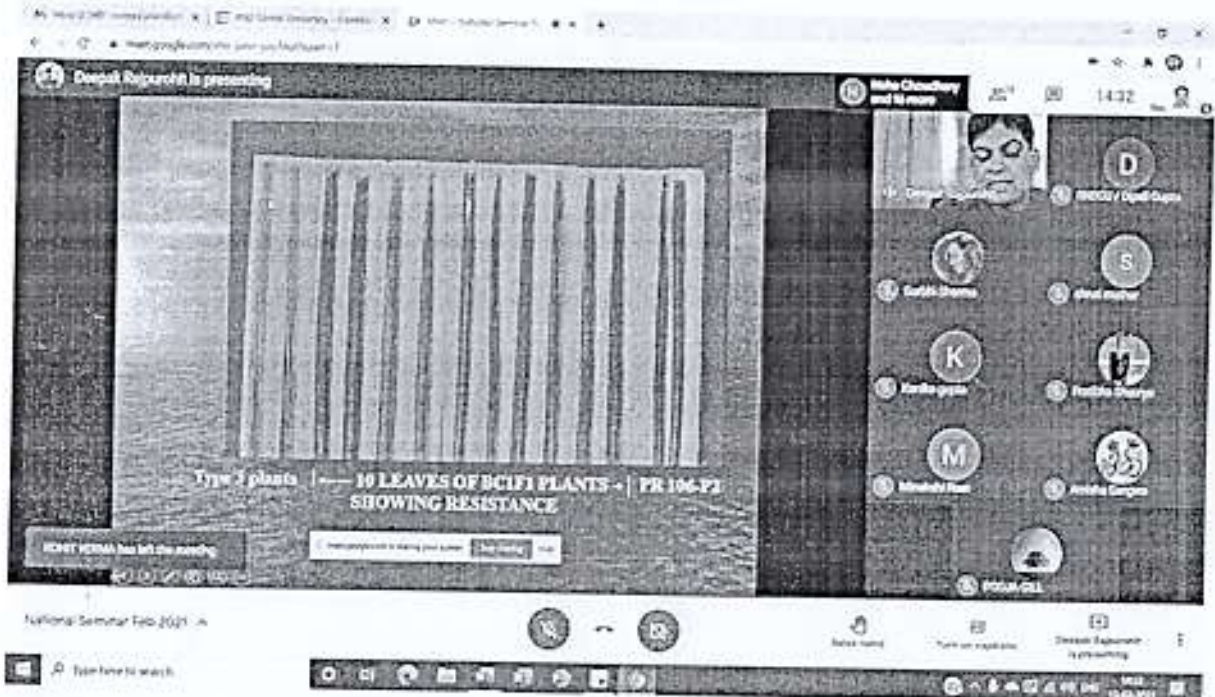
Algae Based Fuel Process

The lecture was organised with an objective to familiarize students about the basic's aspects of the most important reform in the field of Indian Taxation, that is, Goods and Services Tax Law. In the session the speaker covered features of G.S.T., its need, its functioning, difference between G.S.T. and existing tax structure, G.S.T. at international level, forms and returns to be filed under G.S.T and the impact of implementation of G.S.T. on Indian economy.

He talked about what is GST, when it would be implemented, what Rates would be applicable, what are the advantages & Disadvantages of GST. He added GST will remove cascading effect of taxes imbedded in cost of production of goods and services and will provide seamless credit throughout value chain. He also said GST will facilitate ease of doing business in India. Integration of existing multiple taxes into single GST will significantly reduce cost of tax compliance and transaction cost. Adding more to the topic he said Stable, transparent and predictable tax regime will encourage local and foreign investment in India creating significant job opportunities.

Objective -

1. GST aims to put at rest the controversy by defining what will constitute a works contract (applicable for immovable property only), by stating that a works contract will constitute a supply of service and specifying a uniform rate of tax applicable on same value across India.
2. GST Impact on Construction Industry.

Learning outcome

- Students were able to understand all aspects related to GST & its effect on construction and real estates.

Benefits of GST

1. GST provide comprehensive and wider coverage of input credit setoff; you can use service tax credit for the payment of tax on sale of goods etc.
2. CST is removed and need not pay. At present there is no input tax credit available for CST.
3. Many indirect taxes in state and central level included by GST, you need to pay a single GST instead of all other taxes.
4. Uniformity of tax rates across the states
5. Ensure better compliance due to aggregate tax rate reduces

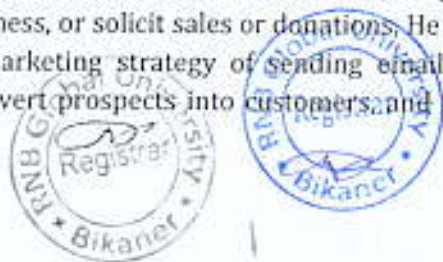
Introduction of the resource persons was delivered by Suhani Gilotra-Student- B.Com(H)-VI semester.

A brief introduction about the Marketing Seminar was delivered by Poorva Vyas and Rani puja-Student-MBA-I semester.

Speaker 1-Dr.Vinod Kumar, spoke about **Social Media Marketing Opportunities in Today's Era**. He said that the Social media is an essential piece of your business marketing strategy. Social platforms help you connect with your customers, increase awareness about your brand, and boost your leads and sales. 52 percent of social media marketers believe social media positively influences their company's revenue and sales. The biggest effect of social media marketing is that you can reach to your targeted audience; stay engaged with them and responds to their queries quickly. Social media is a great way to evaluate your competition by monitoring their social media pages. He briefed the benefits of social Media by elaborating that the internet and social media provide young people with a range of benefits, and opportunities to empower themselves in a variety of ways. Young people can maintain social connections and support networks that otherwise wouldn't be possible, and can access more information than ever before.

Speaker 2- Ms.Leena Singh, spoke about **Effective Communication on Social Media**. She emphasized on that Social media has become an effective and efficient way to communicate and stay connected with key stakeholders and customers. However, coordinating the messages being sent by your organization and following up on the feedback you receive can be challenging. She also said that Effective communication requires the social worker to be capable and knowledgeable in a range of ways: Committed to key principles of communication. Aware of the kinds of underpinning knowledge which inform how best to communicate.

Speaker 3- Dr.Saurabh Saxena-spoke about **e-Mail Marketing** i.e., it is the act of sending a commercial message, typically to a group of people, using email. In its broadest sense, every email sent to a potential or current customer could be considered email marketing. It involves using email to send advertisements, request business, or solicit sales or donations. He said that **Email marketing** is the highly effective digital marketing strategy of sending emails to prospects and customers. Effective marketing emails convert prospects into customers and turn one-time buyers into loyal, raving fans.



Speaker 4- Mr.Dikshit Allawadhi- spoke about **Whatsapp and Facebook marketing tools**. He said that it allows businesses to easily interact with customers by using tools to automate, sort, and quickly respond to messages. For example, you can save and reuse messages you frequently send, and use these "quick replies" to answer common questions more effectively. He said that Businesses focus a lot of their marketing activities on various social media platforms. One of the reasons is that there are a huge number of active users in those platforms. It can be a great platform for businesses to communicate with their prospective customers as well as existing customers.

Speaker 5-Mr. Avinash Sadum- spoke about **Development of the Social Media Marketing**. He said it began with search marketing, prompting brands to create websites to establish an online presence. Eventually, businesses picked up on the positive effects of a social media site presence on e-commerce and started creating their own profiles on the popular networking sites. Social media marketing first started with publishing. Businesses were sharing their content on social media to generate traffic to their websites and, hopefully, sales. A business that wants to reach a specific set of audience at scale would run highly-targeted social media ads (social media advertising).

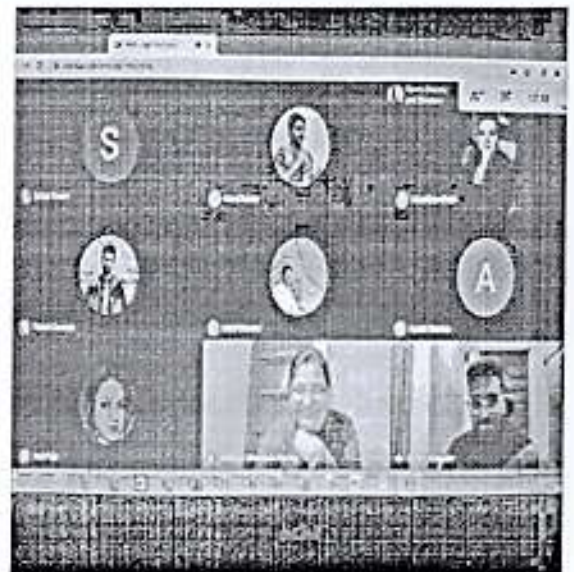

About the Proceeding of Online workshop

1. This workshop started from the speech of Dean, School of Law Prof. G.S. Karkara. He explained the students about the brief facts of Prashant Bhushan's decision of the Supreme Court of India. He also explained the law and relevant legal provisions involved in this case. This case is a landmark case in the history of contempt of court and was already circulated to all students. Dr. Karkara explained the students about the process of finding out the ratio of a particular case. He stated that in this case 6 to 7 ratio can be drawn up. After a process of finding out two *ratio decidendi*, he assigned a task to all students to find out some more ratio in this judgment.
2. After that Mr. Ashok Karnani, Assistant Professor at School of Law presented his presentation. He told the various definitions of *ratio decidendi* and *obiter dicta* and explained the importance of ratio and the various theories and principles related to the *ratio decidendi*.
3. Then Mr. Ashok Prem, Assistant Professor at School of Law, presented his views through presentation and focused on the importance of *ratio decidendi*. He explained the doctrine of *stare decisis* and doctrine of judicial precedent, since the Supreme Court and High Courts of India are Court of Record the decisions of these courts are binding over all lower courts in India. As in Prashant Bhushan's case the Supreme Court imposed a fine of rupee 1, the reasons of such a penalty are to be curled out as ratio. He explained that Supreme Court expressed that no one is beyond law. If Supreme Court will not punish the person who is already involved in the system of the judicial administration, it will spread a wrong message to the society.

Mr. Ashok Prem expressed his gratitude to all faculty members and all trainee students at the workshop of the School of Law.

Learning Outcome:

1. It is essential for every law student to be thorough with statutory laws and the relevant case laws under those statutes. A law professional should cultivate the ability to analyse laws and find out the ratio of decisions of higher courts. Finding ratios is not difficult, but then not so easy tasks, since the 400-500-page judgment needs to be combed for the ratio. Student shall be able to find out of *ratio decidendi* as a matter of course.
2. The ratio is not the entire judgment. It is the reasoning behind the decision that matters the most. The method of finding of *ratio decidendi* is basic to law students but perfecting it is the needs of the time. In my opinion, it is very important for students to not restrict themselves to domestic law. Studying similar cases in other jurisdictions expands their understanding.
