“RIGHTS OF WOMEN”

19 January, 2019

RNB Global University has organised a One day Training programme “**RIGHTS OF WOMEN**” in collaboration with *National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi*, at its campus at RNB Global City, Near Khara, Bikaner-Sri Ganganagar Highway, Bikaner on 19th January, 2019. This Training programme provided a platform to learn Rights of Women for Research Scholars, Faculty members and women in general from experts on the intricacies and solutions of various difficulties faced by women. The details of the programme are as follows:

1. There were four Sessions from 10 am to 5.30 pm. The participants registered were 112.
2. Details of the Training programme has been as follows:
 - (a) Mr. Shreshth Bhatnagar, the Convener, of the programme introduced the Resource Persons and invited all the participants to take together by standing with right arm raised, **The Human Rights Pledge**”. It gave necessary sanctity to the programme.
 - (b) The First Session, started at exact 10.00 am, concentrated on **‘Origin & Development of Human Rights Movement’**.

The Resource Person was Prof. M. Afzal Wani, Dean Department of Law, GGSIP University, Delhi & Former Member Indian Law Commission, Government of India, New Delhi.

His speech on the topic has been scholarly, elaborate, well prepared, easy to understand and brought forward the development of Human Rights even before Magna Carta, generally referred in European Countries as the beginning of the idea of Human Rights.

- (c) A High Tea after Session one was a need of the hour. The participants enjoyed it, due to cold weather and a long but educative lecture.
- (d) The Second Session was on **‘Working of Female foeticide and Pre-conception and Prenatal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 2003’**.

The Resource Person was Prof. K.B. Asthana, Principal, CPJ-CHS & School of Law, GGS-IP University, Delhi.

He expressed the causes of the enactment particularly the craving of Hindus for a son and practice of female foeticide. The desire of a male child and malpractices of medical professions was elaborately discussed along with the technical details of the Act of 2003. As he was requested to deliver only two days back only due to sudden emergency of Prof. KPS Mehlwar, National Law University, Delhi; Formerly, Head & Dean, Department of Law, M.D. University Rohtak who was to attend the Training Programme, the organizers are highly thankful for such a beautiful power point presentation on the topic.

- (e) The Lunch after the Second Session was quite good. All Resource Persons and participants enjoyed it and especially the sweets served in the lunch.
- (f) The Third Session was on **‘Violence against Women & Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005’**. Prof. S.S. Lal, Former Head & Dean, Department of Law, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur was the Resource Person.

The Concept of Violence and Violence on women and jurisprudential aspects of the Act was explained to the participant with the help of LED presentations. He has also dealt



with Law, morality and Ethics. The impact of legislation at different places and the status of women after divorce was discussed with participants.

- (g) Tea after Third Session was a blessing to already mentally and physically exhausted participants. It was taken as a sweet gesture at good time by all.
- (h) Lastly the Fourth Session was on **"Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace and Judicial Activism in India"**.

The Resource Person was **Prof. U.C. Sankhla**, Former Vice Chancellor, Dr B R Ambedkar Law University, Jaipur and Head and Dean, Department of Law, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

The Vishakha case, was discussed along with conditions of women in prevailing patriarchal society at least in northern India. The causes of enactment of the Legislature along with its effectiveness were explained by him. He also discussed the *"Me Too"* campaigns and its impact on the contemporary society.

- 3. At about 5.15 pm, Prof. G.S. Karkara, Dean Law, RNBGU, thanked all the Resource Persons, Participants, law students and other faculty members of RNBGU.
- 4. National Anthem at the end of the Programme was sung with great enthusiasm.
- 5. An amount of Rs. 50,000 has sanctioned by the NHRC and a minimum Rs. 10,000/- was to be spent by the RNB Global University to organize the Training programme.
- 6. Photostat copies of articles distributed to the participants (about 52 pages in each 120 kits = 6000 pages approximately), Videography, Sound systems, and Photography has been possible out of present resources of the RNBGU itself and so no separate expenses have been shown on these accounts. The expenses if incurred from outside service providers would not be less than 20,000/- on these items, put together.
- 7. As all the four Resource Persons were from out of Bikaner, minor variations had occurred in various heads of expenses of resource persons than what was proposed, but due to able professional financial acumen of the persons dealing with expenditures on the Training Programme, an amount of Rs. 62,228 has actually been spent by the School of Law, RNBGU in organising the Training Programme. A detailed verified expenditure account alongwith original vouchers 26 in number (Marked as Ann. 1 to Ann. 26) are being sent.

The Training Programme has been useful for the participants especially the women participants. The participants are explained legal issues involved problems of women in contemporary society and possible legal solutions by the expert Resource Persons.

Rs. 25,000 (Twenty five thousands) has already been received from the NHRC out of its total sanctioned amount of Rs. 50,000. Looking into the expenses incurred by the RNB Global University out of its own resources, the remaining part of the sanctioned amount is to be reimbursed by the NHRC.

- **Violence against Women & Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005**'. Prof. S.S. Lal, Former Head & Dean, Department of Law, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur was the Resource Person.

Seminar on 'Medical & Health Awareness and Lifestyle Mantras for
Today's Youth'**

A Seminar on 'Medical & Health Awareness and Lifestyle Mantras for Today's Youth' was conducted at RNB Global University by eminent Medical Practitioners from the city of Bikaner.

The 1st session was taken by Dr. Shaifali Dadheech, M.S. (Gynecologist and Obstetrician), and Consultant from Shri Krishna Neurospine Hospital, Bikaner. Her session was based on optimal health and healthcare of adolescent girls and women, with focus on the prevention, diagnosis and management of fertility disorders and diseases of gynecological origin. She explained the various Preventive Measures for PCOD and other lifestyle disorders among ladies.

The second session was taken by Prof. (Dr) R.V. Barar, Sr. Faculty - Dept. of Preventive & Social Medicine, SP Medical College, Bikaner. During his address, Dr. Barar focused on role and importance of immunization, stress management, better food habits, avoidance of smoking & alcohol. He focused on various Cognitive, behavioral and pharmacological procedures used to help people to stop smoking and other substance abuse. He said that maintaining a good and healthy diet and proper exercise and lifestyle habits help to solve stress and other psychological disorders. The third session was taken by Dr. S.L. Bishnoi, MD-Medicine (City Hospital, Bikaner). He explained the various preventive measures to be taken care of, during the time of emergency, Community Medicine.

Students were very enthusiastic during the entire Seminar. Students were motivated regarding good habits, and how to deal with emergency conditions.
