Thirst for revenge led him to cause man's downfall by turning into a serpent and tempting Eve to eat the forbidden fruit.

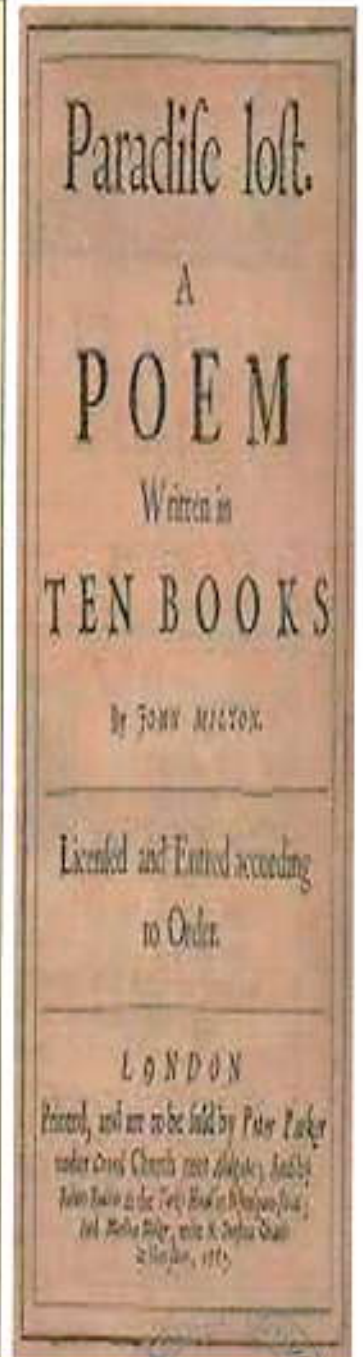
SUMMARY

The story opens in hell, where Satan and his followers are recovering from defeat in a war they waged against God. They build a palace, called Pandemonium, where they hold council to determine whether or not to return to battle. Instead they decide to explore a new world prophesied to be created, where a safer course of revenge can be planned. Satan undertakes the mission alone. At the gate of hell, he meets his offspring, Sin and Death, who unbar the gates for him. He journeys across chaos till he sees the new universe floating near the larger globe which is heaven. God sees Satan flying towards this world and foretells the fall of man. His Son, who sits at his right hand, offers to sacrifice himself for man's salvation. Meanwhile, Satan enters the new universe. He flies to the sun, where he tricks an angel, Uriel, into showing him the way to man's home.

Satan gains entrance into the Garden of Eden, where he finds Adam and Eve and becomes jealous of them. He overhears them speak of God's commandment that they should not eat the forbidden fruit. Uriel warns Gabriel and his angels, who are guarding the gate of Paradise, of Satan's presence. Satan is apprehended by them and banished from Eden. God sends Raphael to warn Adam and Eve about Satan. Raphael recounts to them how jealousy against the Son of God led a once favored angel to wage war against God in heaven, and how the Son, Messiah, cast him and his followers into hell. He relates how the world was created so mankind could one day replace the fallen angels in heaven.

Satan returns to earth and enters a serpent. Finding Eve alone he induces her to eat the fruit of the forbidden tree. Adam, resigned to join in her fate, eats also. Their innocence is lost and they become aware of their nakedness. In shame and despair, they become hostile to each other.

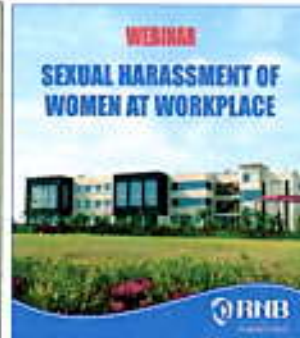
The Son of God descends to earth to judge the sinners, mercifully delaying their sentence of death. Sin and Death, sensing Satan's success, build a highway to earth, their new home. Upon his return to hell, instead of a celebration of victory, Satan and his crew are turned into serpents as punishment. Adam reconciles with Eve. God sends Michael to expel the pair from Paradise, but first to reveal to Adam future events resulting from his sin. Adam is saddened by these visions, but ultimately revived by revelations of the future coming of the Savior of mankind. The celebration was trying to bring sensitivity & awareness among the students towards the environment. The events like poster making, quiz competitions, essay writing, extempore competition, etc.



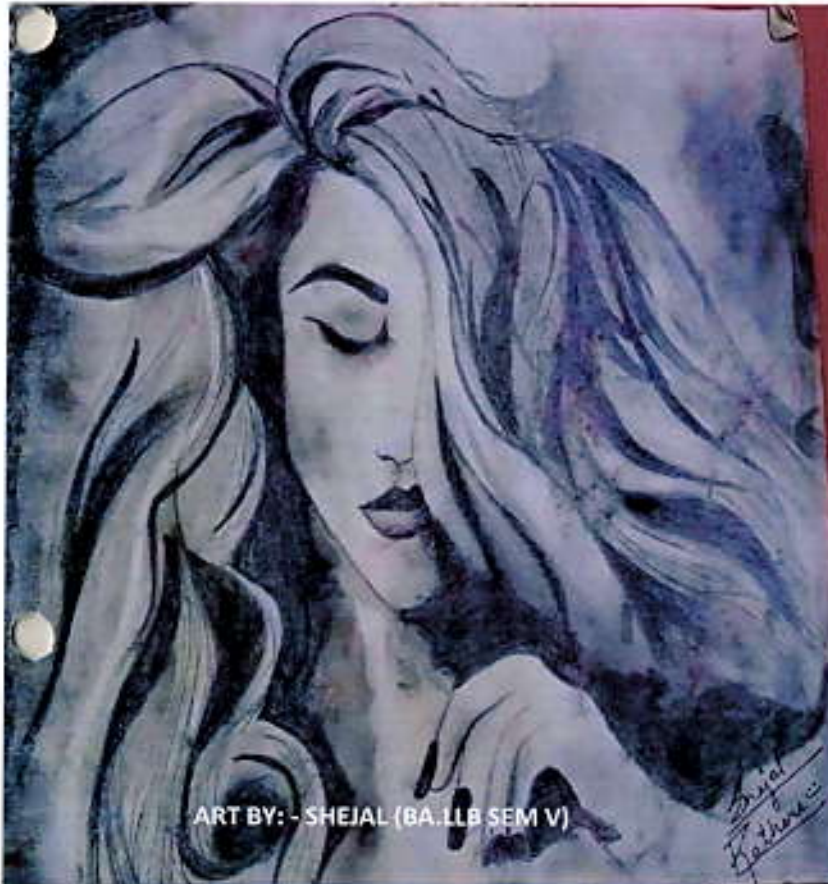
10 Ways to Prepare for Exams

Advocates (Protection) Bill, 2021

A seven-member committee had been constituted to frame the bill keeping in mind the problem and adversities faced by advocates and their families. **The main reasons for the bill are stated to be the protection of advocates and to remove obstructions in the discharge of their duties.** There are various reasons mentioned in the bill that cause obstruction in the performance of duties.

Protection Against

Suits No suit is to be instituted against a lawyer who has been working in good faith. *Communications between the advocates and their clients must be respected; confidentiality must be protected.* The Bill came up also to implement the 8th United Nations Congress on Prevention of Crime and Treatment of Offenders (1990) to which India was a party. It was in this congress that the '**Basic Principles on Role of Lawyers**' was also adopted. In this declaration, there are clauses that guarantee the functioning of lawyers. It sought to make sure that Governments protect lawyers and they are able to perform their duties.

The recent high rise in incidents of assault, kidnappings, intimidations, and regular threats caused to advocates is a major reason. Where the security of lawyers is threatened as a result of their duty, they shall be adequately safeguarded by the authorities. **To protect advocates, such an act is necessary. It also states to ensure social security and the minimum necessity for life for advocates.**

Social Security

Another huge provision made in the act is that of Social Security. The act proposes that the State and Central government have to make *provisions to provide financial assistance to all needy Advocates of the country in unforeseen situations such as natural disasters or epidemics. A minimum of Rs.15,000 every month shall be provided.*



Legal Consequences of Underage Driving

As per Section 4 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, no person below 18 years of age shall drive motor vehicles in any public place. Also, a person, after attaining 16 years of age, can drive a motorcycle with engine capacity not exceeding 50cc only after attaining a learner's license.

Therefore, if your child is below 18 years of age and is caught driving a motor vehicle without any learner's license, in that case, you will be penalised under Section 199A of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, the guardian will be penalised with a maximum of three years of imprisonment and a fine of Rs.25,000/-.

The vehicle registration for the commission of offence will be cancelled for 12 months. And the child who committed the offence will be eligible for a learner's license or driving license only after attaining the age of twenty-five years.

Note: The child's guardian will not be penalised if the offence was committed without his knowledge or he exercised all due diligence required to prevent the commission of the offence. The vehicle owner who permitted the juvenile for driving their motor vehicle will also be punished with imprisonment for a maximum of 3 months or Rs. 5000/- fine or both.

Due to an increase in underage driving offenders, the **Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2019** was enforced, making rules more stringent and increasing imprisonment to three years for the guardian of juveniles committing offences under the Act.

Also, along with a valid Driving License, the driver needs to have the vehicle's insurance papers, Registration Certificate and Pollution under Control Certificate to drive on Indian roads.

THE 42nd CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ACT, 1976

The 42nd Amendment Act, 1976 is one of the most important amendments to the Indian Constitution. It was enacted by the Indian National Congress headed by Indira Gandhi then. Due to the large number of amendments this act has brought to the Indian Constitution, it is also known as 'Mini-Constitution.' Some of the amendments that happened here were as:

1. Added three new words (i.e., socialist, secular and integrity) in the Preamble.
2. Added Fundamental Duties by the citizens (new Part IV A).
3. Made the president bound by the advice of the cabinet.
4. Provided for administrative tribunals and tribunals for other matters (Added Part XIV A).
5. Froze the seats in the Lok Sabha and state legislative assemblies on the basis of 1971 census till 2001 - Population Controlling Measure
6. Made the constitutional amendments beyond judicial scrutiny.
7. Curtailed the power of judicial review and writ jurisdiction of the Supreme Court and high courts.
8. Raised the tenure of Lok Sabha and state legislative assemblies from 5 to 6 years.
9. Provided that the laws made for the implementation of Directive Principles cannot be declared invalid by the courts on the ground of violation of some Fundamental Rights.
10. Empowered the Parliament to make laws to deal with anti-national activities and such laws are to take precedence over Fundamental Rights.
11. Added three new Directive Principles viz., equal justice and free legal aid, the participation of workers in the management of industries and protection of the environment, forests, and wildlife.
12. Facilitated the proclamation of national emergency in a part of the territory of India.
13. Extended the one-time duration of the President's rule in a state from 6 months to one year.
14. Empowered the Centre to deploy its armed forces in any state to deal with a grave situation of law and order.
15. Shifted five subjects from the state list to the concurrent list, viz, education, forests, protection of wild animals and birds, weights and measures and administration of justice, constitution and organisation of all courts except the Supreme Court and the high courts.
16. Did away with the requirement of quorum in the Parliament and the state legislatures.
17. Empowered the Parliament to decide from time to time the rights and privileges of its members and committees.
18. Provided for the creation of the All-India Judicial Service.
19. Shortened the procedure for disciplinary action by taking away the right of a civil servant to make representation at the second stage after the inquiry (i.e., on the penalty proposed).

First Patent for RNBGU

Dr. Ambuj Kumar Agarwal, Associate Professor, SOET, published the patent for RNB Global University titled "Intelligent Earthquake – Resistant Wall" or the IER-Wall.



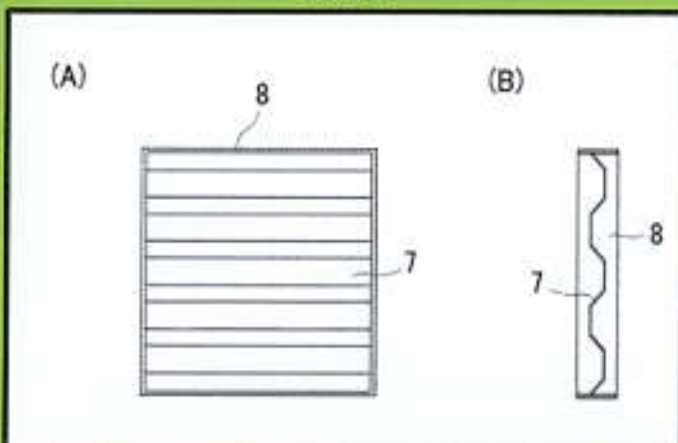
The "Invention" IER-Wall " is A method for constructing a seismic wall in which corrugated steel sheets are incorporated in a horizontal direction in the plane of a column / beam frame or a column / slab frame that generates interlayer deformation by horizontal force. Pre-cast concrete pillars / beams or columns / slabs are pre-installed with studs and plates joined to the studs in advance.

A frame for joining is attached to the outer periphery of the corrugated steel sheet, and the corrugated steel sheet is incorporated in the plane of the column / beam frame or the column / slab frame in such an arrangement that the folding line is in the horizontal direction.

The invention "IER-Wall" relates to building construction and construction methods that are resistant to damage caused by earthquakes.

The patent has been approved by the Government of India. It is a remarkable achievement for RNBGU.

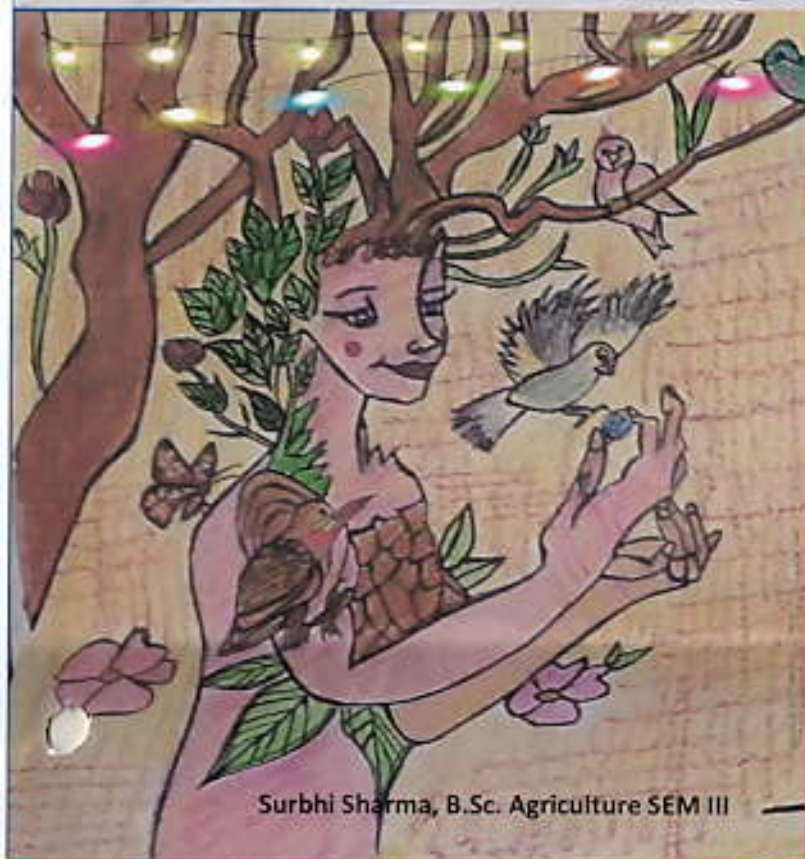

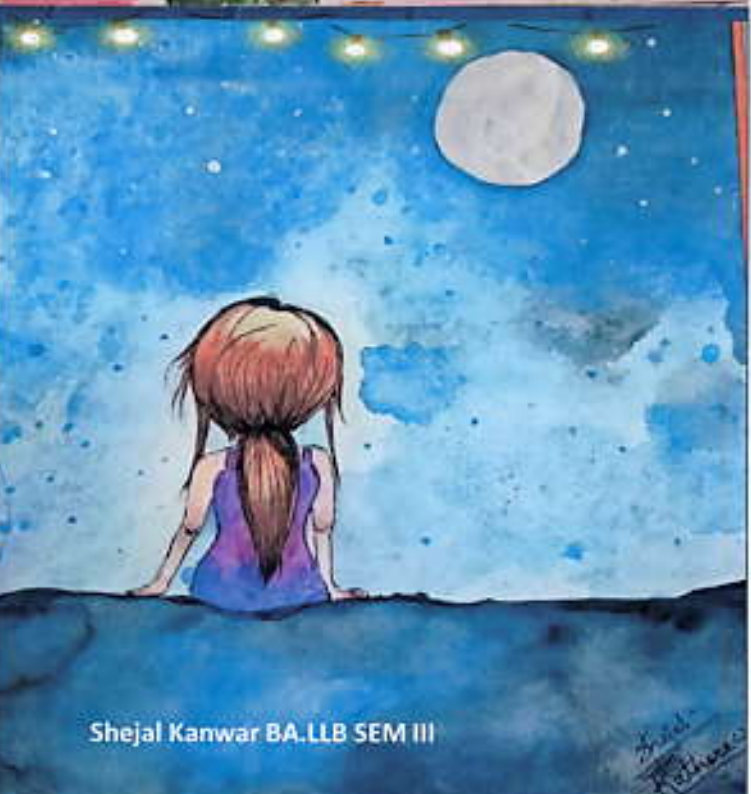

CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT

The Consumer Protection Act, implemented in 1986, gives easy and fast compensation to consumer grievances. It safeguards and encourages consumers to speak against insufficiency and flaws in goods and services. If traders and manufacturers practice any illegal trade, this act protects their rights as a consumer. The primary motivation of this forum is to bestow aid to both the parties and eliminate lengthy lawsuits.

Some of its features are:

- i. This Act is applicable on all the products and services, until or unless any product or service is especially debarred out of the scope of this Act by the Central Government. This Act is applicable to all the areas whether private, public or cooperative.
- ii. Many Acts have been passed for the help of consumers.
- iii. Consumers enjoy the benefits of these Acts but if a consumer wishes the Consumer Protection Act can provide extra help. As a result, the nature of provisions of this Act is compensating for the loss or providing extra help.
- iv. The consumer is totally free to enjoy the benefits provided in the Act.
- v. This Act provides many rights to consumers.
- vi. These rights are related to safety, information, choice, representation, redressal, education etc. This Act provides safety to consumers regarding defective products, dissatisfactory services, and unfair trade practices. So under the purview of this Act, there is a provision to ban all those activities which can cause a risk for the consumer. Consumer courts have been established so that consumers can enjoy their rights.
- vii. This Act presents a three-tier grievances redressal machinery: At District Level-District Forum; At State Level -State Commission; At National Level – National Commission.

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS:

Those who cannot afford a lawyer, free legal aid from the government shall be provided to precede their case.
-Legal Service Authorities Act, 1987.

LEGAL MAXIMS:

Actus curiae neminem gravabit – An Act of the Court shall prejudice no man.
Assentio mentium- the meeting of minds

LANDMARK JUDGEMENTS

Daughter's right to property in HUF

LANDMARK JUDGEMENTS

Daughter's right to property in HUF

A landmark decision supporting women's rights, the Supreme court ruled that that daughter has equal rights in her father's property. The three-judge bench held that daughters and sons have equal coparcenary rights in a Hindu undivided family (HUF). In its decision, the Supreme Court clarified two points:

Fathers need not have been alive when the 2005 amendment to the Hindu Succession Act of 1956.

Coparcenary rights are acquired by the daughter.

Allowing Cryptocurrency, quashing RBI restriction

The Supreme court ruled that the RBI curb on cryptocurrency and the use of bitcoins from 2018 was illegal. This move allowed many Indians to jump on and cash in on Bitcoin's stellar rally this year.

No fundamental right to reservation

The Supreme court ruled that there is no fundamental right to claim reservation in public jobs. It added that no court could ask a state government to provide reservation and explained that the constitutional mandate on providing reservation is within the absolute discretion of a state government to decide, however, there is no obligation on the states to mandatorily do so

She shouted and used harsh words to me, I felt quite bad and insulted that day. The next day I went to the library and brought two English story books to learn, but when I started reading those books, I found that I could not understand anything. I found another way of improving my language skills, I thought how a small child starts speaking any language just by continuously listening to it from his childhood. I started listening to English news which used to come on National television channel - BBC news on short wave channel. I then made my habit to sit on the chair near the radio and listen to the BBC news. I was determined to learn the language. I had a bicycle which I used to take for riding daily in the playground present at the back side of my house and used to speak loudly to myself. The practice continued till I completed my graduation. My continual efforts made me improve my language skills. At this age I realised that the potential was with in me, only waiting for a specific situation or a "Positive stimuli", that could initiate it. We all have tremendous abilities in ourselves, the only thing is that we are not aware of these. We all get some benefits or drawbacks according to the families in which we take birth. But instead crying over the drawbacks, we should develop our inner potential by putting our continuous efforts, so that we can walk in parallel with the world.

ART OF BUDDHA



The Buddha is seated in the attitude of Meditation. There is a Prominent *urna* on his forehead and a large nimbus behind. The raised hair line is prominent and the Wavy hair is swept back over the *ushnisha*. The loose garment covers both his shoulders. The pedestal contains the scene of worship of the bowl. The image in every aspect is a typical example of the Gandharan Idiom. The figure of the Buddha displays *Dharmachakra Mudra* with his two hands. This Mudra shows the tip of the finger on one hand, touching the tips of the thumb and index finger of another hand, forming the mystic circle near the heart. This gesture represents setting the wheel of Dharma into Motion. After the Buddha achieved enlightenment, he gave his first teaching to a companion in the Deer Park of Sarnath, and therefore it represents teachings.

The Half-closed dropping eyes impart an absorbed and inward vision. This blissful expression on the face is to be compared with the Gupta period classical idiom. The *Chakra* symbols on the inner edge is crowned by a *chakra* over the parasol shading the head of the Buddha.

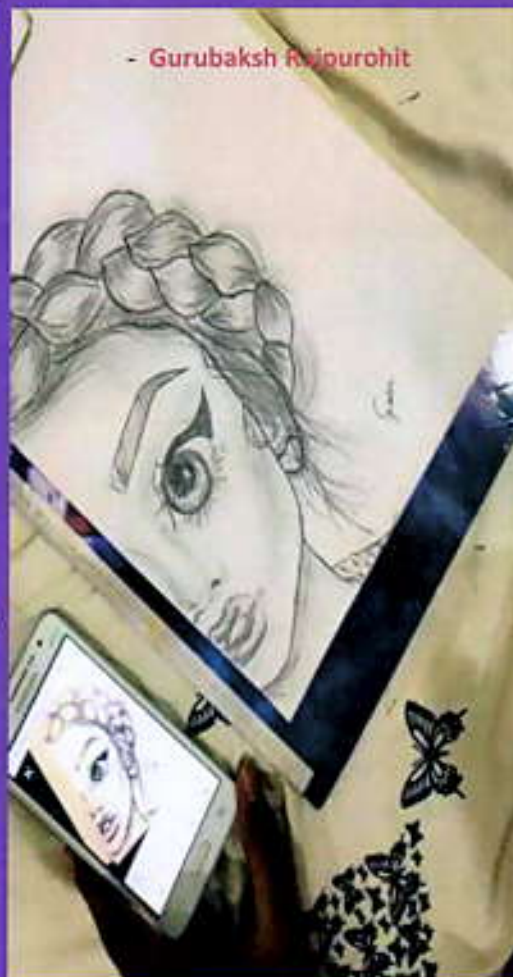

Government may announce a new 'outcome-oriented' industrial policy by October

NEW DELHI: Government will announce the new industrial policy in October this year, seeking to make India a manufacturing hub by promoting 'Make in India' and addressing the issue of slower job creation. Commerce and industry minister Nirmala Sitharaman will hold talks with stakeholders, including industry captains, think tanks and state governments in Chennai, Guwahati and Mumbai to finalise the policy.

In a press statement, Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) said the government wants to formulate "an outcome oriented actionable industrial policy that provides direction and charts a course of action for a globally competitive Indian industry which leverages skill, scale and technology."

DIPP has floated a discussion paper to have a "future ready new industrial policy" to seek comments while flagging jobs concerns. It warned of projected upward trends in automation leading to job losses and disproportionately slower growth in creation of job as compared to growth in output.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi likely to attend World Economic Forum meet in Davos next year

Prime minister Narendra Modi is likely to go to Davos next January to speak at the World Economic Forum's (WEF) annual meeting of global policy makers and top executives, becoming the first Indian premier in about two decades to do so.

WEF organisers have offered Modi top billing and he will be treated at par with Chinese president Xi Jinping, who was the star attraction at Davos this year.

If Modi goes, he will address a plenary session on January 23, the first day of the four-day long annual summit, which will be attended by the world's business elite.

The Prime Minister's visit is expected to be a short one as he has to be back for the Republic Day celebrations on January 26.

As the chief minister of Gujarat, Modi had attended the regional summit of the World Economic Forum in China in 2007. Subsequently, there had been a controversy over an invitation for him to attend the Davos meet in 2008, which had soured his relations with the WEF.

Reliance Cap to be removed from 11 S&P BSE indices

The BSE on Tuesday said Reliance Capital will be dropped from 11 S&P BSE indices with effect from September 5 as the company is demerging its real estate lending business.

"Reliance Capital is demerging its real estate lending business, which will be later merged with Reliance Home Finance, an unlisted subsidiary of Reliance Capital," the exchange said.

Reliance Capital will be dropped from S&P BSE AllCap, S&P BSE Finance, S&P BSE LargeMidCap, S&P BSE MidCap, S&P BSE MidSmallCap, S&P BSE CARBONEX, S&P BSE Enhanced Value Index, S&P BSE 100, S&P BSE 200, S&P BSE 500, S&P BSE Sensex Next 50.

Reliance Capital on Monday had said that its shareholders will get a free share of Reliance Home Finance for each share of Reliance Capital held as on September 6.

"Triple Talaq" Divorce Banned in India

On Aug. 22, the Supreme Court of India rules that the "triple talaq," a method of divorced practiced in some Islamic cultures, is unconstitutional. The traditional talaq observes a waiting period, for the couple to perhaps reconcile or confirm if the wife is pregnant. Wives are expected to receive financial support during this time. The triple talaq does not recognize this waiting period, allowing for immediate and arbitrary divorce. Women's rights advocates claim that this permitted widespread domestic abuse, as wives had no means of contesting the divorce, and that the status of divorcees could expose them to further exploitation.

Same-Sex Marriage and Adoption Bill Sent to Congress in Chile

On Aug. 28, quickly following up on her successful public campaign to legalize select abortion, Chilean President Michelle Bachelet makes good on her campaign promise to send a same-sex marriage bill to Congress. Chile recognized civil unions two years prior, but the current bill would extend the full rights and privileges of marriage and adoption to same-sex marriage in Chile. While many are uncertain about her ability to pass the bill through before her term ends in March, many more celebrate this key step to marriage equality.

Rohingya Refugees Detained at Borders of Myanmar

On Aug. 27, Bangladeshi authorities capture and detain several dozen Rohingya refugees attempting to cross the border from Myanmar. The group was headed to the Kutupalong Refugee Camp, which has been accepting huge numbers of Rohingya Muslims since the onset of the violence in 2016. Regional authorities are uncertain how to handle the influx of thousands of Rohingya, who are fleeing widespread persecution and potential genocide.

India and China Reach Agreement Over Border

On Aug. 28, authorities in New Delhi and Beijing reach an agreement to deescalate tensions over the disputed Sino-Bhutanese border region of Doklam. After a two month-long standoff, India withdraws its troops, and the two countries agree to resume regular relations. India and China have gone to war over Bhutanese landholdings before, and many feared that the current crisis would lead to another war between the world's two largest countries.

North Korea Fires Missile Over Japan

On Aug. 29, in the latest of many ballistic missile tests, the North Korean military launches a Hwasong-12 missile nearly two thousand miles over the northern Japanese island of Hokkaido. Japan immediately goes on high alert, and key Japanese allies are quick to condemn the provocation. China similarly speaks out against the launch, but many are skeptical about Beijing's ability to rein in their aggressive neighbor.

Ganesh Chaturthi is a ten-day Hindu festival celebrated to the elephant-headed God Ganesha's birthday. He is the younger son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati.

Ganesha is known by 108 different names and is the Lord of arts and sciences and the deva of wisdom. He is honoured at the start of rituals and ceremonies as he's considered the God of beginnings. He's widely and dearly referred to as Ganapati or Vinayaka.

There are two different versions about Ganesha's birth. One has it that Goddess Parvati created Ganesha out of dirt off her body while having a bath and set him to guard her door while she finishes her bath. Shiva who has gone out, returned at that time, but as Ganesha didn't know of him, stopped him from entering. An angry Shiva severed the head of Ganesha after a combat between the two. Parvati was enraged and Shiva promised Ganesha will live again. The devas who went in search of a head facing north of a dead person could manage only the head of an elephant. Shiva fixed the elephant's head on the child and brought him back to life.

The other legend has it that Ganesha was created by Shiva and Parvati on request of the Devas, to be a vighnakartaa (obstacle-creator) in the path of rakshasas (demonic beings), and a vighnahartaa.

Dandia



Dandiya Raas is the most popular dance of Gujarat. The dance is so popular that it is performed not only in the state, but throughout India. Infact , it is a special feature of the Navratri festival. The festival is celebrated to pay homage to the nine incarnations of Mata Amba, the Mother Goddess. People observe fasts on all nine days of the festival and pay regular visits to temples. While the days are filled with devotion towards the deity, the nights are vibrant, reflecting the festive spirit at its peak. Special arrangements are made for Dandia dance performances. Even the state government organizes special event for the enjoyment of the people.

Dandia is usually done in a group, by both men and women. The special feature of the dance is the colorful attire worn by the dancers and the colorful sticks carried by them. The sticks are used as prop and are beautifully decorated. It is for this reason the dance is also called the 'Stick Dance'. These sticks are usually made of bamboo, painted in different colors to make them look attractive. The performers hold sticks in both their hands and strike them together on the beats of the musical instruments. Dandiya Ras involves a huge number of people at a time. According to the dance setting, two circles are formed by the dancers.

One of the circles revolves clockwise, while the other revolves anti clockwise. The dance is a very energetic and fast paced activity, which leaves no scope for lethargy. The dancers are accompanied by an instrumentalist, playing a 'meddale' drum. The person stands in the center of the two circles and leads the dancers with his beats. The site of hundreds of people swaying on the beats of folk music is awe-inspiring. The sticks or the Dandiya, when struck together in a rhythm, produce foot tapping musical waves. The best Raas dancers of the region are the Kathiawari Ras dancers from Saurashtra.

Actuarial Science

Actuarial Science is the discipline that applies mathematical and statistical methods to assess risks in insurance and finance industries. Actuaries are experts in analyzing financial impacts of tomorrow's uncertain events. Actuaries add value by enabling businesses and individuals to make informed decisions with a clearer view of the likely range of financial outcomes from different future events.

Actuaries decide as to what amount of money a policy holder should pay as premium or what sum should be given as pension amount or returns by the company. They calculate insurance risks and premiums.

An actuary has to combine the skills of a statistician, economist and financier and employ techniques of probability, compound interest, law, marketing and management to predict the outcome of future contingencies and design solutions to lessen the financial severity of such events.

What to do to become an Actuary?

Eligibility:

- The eligibility criteria to appear for Actuarial papers are subjective.
- 10+2 passed students having attained 85% marks in Mathematics/Statistics
 - Graduate or post-graduate students with 55% aggregate or more on Mathematics, Statistics, Econometrics, Computer Science, and Physics papers
 - CA, MCA, ICWA, CFA, MBA (Finance), Engineers

Course & Subjects:

The study course of ASI is divided into four stages: Core Technical Stage, Core Application Stage, Specialist Technical Stage and Specialist Application Stage.

There are total 15 papers. Subjects include Financial Mathematics, Finance and Financial Reporting, Probability and Mathematical Statistics, General Insurance, Life and Health Contingencies, Statistical Methods, Business Economics, Financial Economics, Health and Care, Life Insurance, Pension and other employee benefits, Finance and Investment, General Insurance and Enterprise Risk Management. There is no fixed duration of the course.

Prospects

The course is globally recognized with mutual exemptions with a lot of other international actuarial institutes.

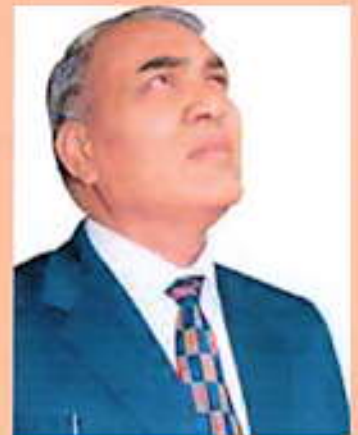

Educational Visit to CSIR Labs

School of Basic and Applied Sciences, RNBGU organized an educational visit to CSIR Laboratory, New Delhi on 27th September 2016. The visit was organized for the students of SOBAS with an aim to give first-hand knowledge of laboratory's work and its significance. During the visit at National Physics Laboratory we learnt that it is established for applying important physics principles on the instruments, which are used in industries for manufacturing various goods. All instruments were highly advanced and huge in size. The main aim of the laboratory is to strengthen and advance physics based research for the overall development of science and technology in our country.



There were divisions of labs in which particular measurement or calibrations are done. First we went to the division in which length is measured. The standard unit of length meter is realized by employing a stabilized Helium-Neon laser as a source of a light.

Thereafter we visited some other divisions of lab in which applications for torque and hardness are applied. There was a division in which hydraulic mechanics is used. The IST i.e. Indian Standard Time is also controlled here. Some models were also displayed which were based on the phenomenon of frequency and reflection. Next we went to the Biosensor lab where we learnt that by giving different intensity of light in an infrared region one can detect various parts of the DNA. Finally, we saw a documentary based on how NPL works on different principles of physics to improve the tools of the industries.

The importance of this laboratory is to oversee the specific areas of physics, which are aligned to the needs of the nation and aimed towards the advancement of the field. Such labs support national and other industries in their developmental tasks by precision measurements, calibration, and development of devices and processes related to physics. In conclusion this tour turned out to be a real learning experience for the students.
