



Introduction:

Legal Aid Committee, School of Law organized a Legal Aid Camp in the Village of Dandusar (Rajasthan). The main aim of the camp was to enlighten the people of Village about free legal services to the poor and needy who cannot afford the services of a lawyer for the conduct of a case or a legal proceeding in any court.

Mr. Shubham Singh, Student of BBA-LLB-V semester, discussed about rights of a detained person, right to know the grounds of detention, right to be taken before a magistrate without delay; Rights of speedy trial and right to consult a legal practitioner. Ms. Sakshi

Sharma, Student of BBA-LLB-V semester gave idea to them about the Dowry Prohibition Act in which she discussed that How giving and taking dowry has been made prohibited by law and what remedies are open to a person in case of getting compelled to pay dowry. Ms. Harshita, Student of LLB-IV semester gave an idea about the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 in which she discussed about what remedies are open to a person belonging to scheduled caste or scheduled tribe in case they are facing any type of atrocities, whom to approach for such remedy, and how to realise these remedies.

Objectives:

To make them aware about the legal aid services.

To increase law awareness among the society.

Brief About the Visit:

Legal Aid Cell of RNB Global University School of Law organised a Legal Aid Camp at Village Dandusar on 23.12.2022, where they dealt with issues which a child, goes through in a daily course of life. In an interactive session, the students briefed them about various topics such as Fundamental Rights, Consumer Protection Rights, Traffic Rules and Duties, Cyber Crimes, Child Abuse, Human Rights and some other topics related to daily lives. The students made them aware about Rights of Children, Child Labour Act, Right of Children to free and compulsory education and other legislations made for the care,

protection and development of children and different schemes launched by NALSA and RSLSA for the benefit of people.

The program was concluded by Mr. Ashok Karnani, Convener of the program. After this, he paid thanks to the Village head and all the villagers for their support.







The manager said that they will pay salary to the lower level employees.

Mr. Rajan Sinha acted as the moderator in the panel discussion. All challenges which business organizations are facing were discussed. The employees have to balance between online working and household activities. Women have faced challenges in Hybrid working.



Conclusion:


With the collective effort of the students of RNB Global University and the villagers, the camp turned out to be fruitful and successful.


The winners were awarded by Dr. Dipali Gupta & Dr. Shashi Shinghal. The awards were arranged by Senior Student.

- The event was ended with the lunch arranged by the senior batch students.







Introduction:

RNB Global University has started a Campaign with a hashtag #I WILL DO MY CITY CLEAN". Students were told to do many activities like inspection, cleanliness near the surrounding areas etc.

Dengue Symptoms

Disease occurs more frequently in the rainy season and immediately afterwards (July to-November) in India..

Fever: continuous for 3 to 7 days, Severe headache, Joint pain, muscle pain, pain behind eyeballs Nausea, vomiting, and rashes on skin.

In very rare cases, the condition may worsen into dengue hemorrhagic fever, leads to bleeding from nose, gums, in urine and from internal organs.

Suggestions for People:

- Don't allow water to remain stagnant in and around your house.
- · Fill the ditches.
- · Clean the blocked drains.
- Empty the room air coolers and flower vases completely at least once in seven days and then refill them.
- Tray below the fridge also to be cleaned regularly.
- Dispose off old containers tins and tyres etc. Properly.
- Keep the water tanks and water containers tightly covered so that the mosquitoes can not enter them and start breeding.
- · Keep the surroundings of your house clean.
- Don't litter garbage.
- · Don't allow wild herbs etc. to grow around your house.
- Spray insecticidal sprays behind the photo frames, curtains, calendars, corners of house and stores. Use insecticidal sprays in all areas within the house at-least once a week.

Conclusions:

RNB GLOBAL University took initiative in Dengue Awareness and Precaution activities in the campus as well as outside the campus. Efforts were taken to control breeding of mosquitoes by removing stagnant water and sprinkling disinfectant in the areas.





The literacy is a universal boon of the forefathers in the ancient period. The education revolution transforms traditional education into digital education for human as well as society growth. It develops and transforms behaviour, creating comphrension and discipline with age interval in the human. It develops stable resource and community with incorporation of the education. It generates wisdom and skills in the human for presenting welfare in the society. It improves and thrives standard of the living and per capita income of the family, generation after generation.

The literacy day was declared by UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, Paris & France headquarters) on 26 Oct 1966 and was first celebrated in 1967. The aim of the programme was to aware about education to individual, communities and societies. In 2021 year, the developed country literacy rate is 99.2% in that Russia, Finland, South Korea, USA, Canada, Australia, United Kingdom, New Zealand, Japan and Israel accounted highest literacy rate in the world. In India, The literacy rate was 77.7% in 2020 year inthat Kerala has the highest literacy rate followed by New Delhi. The male literacy rate of 84.7% and female literacy rate of 70.3% were reported in 2020 year. The literacy rate of Rajasthan state was 69.7% in that 80.8% male literacy rate and 57.6% female literacy rate in 2020.

Dr. Jacob Joseph, Associate Professor, School of Business and Management delivered the lecture on empathy and active listening which is in current scenario is very important concern for the students as part from hard working everyone need to have emotional intelligence too.

Significance of session

Empathic listening is the practice of being attentive and responsive to others' input during conversation. Listening empathically entails making an emotional connection with the other person and finding similarities between their experience and your own so you can give a more heartfelt response.

Insight on session

Dr, Garg wound up the lecture by explaining listening has always been an essential, yet underrated, workplace skill. It's something that leaders often spend little time thinking about, even less actively cultivating. As we head towards a new kind of hybrid workplace, it's imperative that leaders start not only listening, but listening well. Listening to what people are experiencing, to what they need, their aspirations, and their concerns. Those are going to be moving targets. Leaders will need to hone their virtual interactions as well as brushing off their face-to-face skills in the hybrid workplace.

Great listening is a central part of a broader human skillset including emotional awareness, empathy and compassion. That skillset is vital for safeguarding wellbeing, fostering engagement, and building productivity in the post-pandemic workplace. It's not a skillset many people have by default.

Methodology-

The event started with some ice- breaking fun activities followed by a series of competitions which culminated into deciding the Best Manager from among the participants

Events Conducted-

The following events were organised as apart of Management Day celebration-

Ice Breaking Activity- the activity was to make the participants learn some important lessons on team building and leadership through fun – filled ways.

Toggle Competition- This was to judge the spontaneity and articulation skills of participants.

Ad Mad Competition- Students showcased their skills in making advertisements for the given products.

Business Quiz- It included the rounds like current affairs, tagline identification, famous personality identification etc.

Collage Competition- Students showcased their creative skills by preparing Collage from the given material.

Role Play Competition-Participants were given various roles to play in a given situation.

Event SOP's

Ice Breaking Activity-Ice Breaker Games for Small Groups.

An icebreaker is an activity or game designed to welcome attendees and warm up the conversation among participants in a meeting, training class, team building session, or other activity. Any event that requires people to comfortably interact with each other and a facilitator is an opportunity to use an icebreaker.

Objectives-icebreakers are one of the most basic tools that can be used at any training event. These team-building games help foster interaction, trust and learning. These types of activities can be extremely valuable when applied to management training. The skills acquired during management icebreakers reinforce important leadership techniques with executives to help them reconnect with their teams, foster growth in their group and enhance individual performance.

2. Toggle Competition-

In this activity the students were assigned a topic in which they had to speak both in favour and against the topic within one minute. He was required to change his stand for the topic whenever the MC said toggle during that one minute.

This activity was real fun and challenge both, for the students as they had to prepare themselves to speak from both the angles regarding the same theme.




