
World Class Infrastructure




The camp was initiated with dental awareness talk, educating

RNBian's Visited Suratgarh Thermal Power Station

On 14.03.2019, RNBGU organized an Industrial visit to Suratgarh Thermal Power Station (STPS), Suratgarh for B. Tech-Mechanical Engineering (VI Sem) and B.Sc. (VI Sem) students on March 14, 2019. STPS is the first super thermal plant of Rajasthan with having an installed capacity of 1500 MW, which is highest in the state. The main purpose of the industrial visit is to provide practical exposure of power generation process which helps them to understand their courses.



During the visit students were guided by Mr. Manoj Kaushik, Assistant Engineer at STPS Suratgarh. Students were escorted towards different sections of the plant such as Coal handling, ash handling, cooling tower, turbines, boiler, draught system, electrostatic precipitator etc. The super-heated steam is sent to the turbine of 3 types: high pressure turbine, medium pressure turbine and low-pressure turbine. Students got an idea of working of boilers for the generation of steam and its maintenance by physical and chemical means and finally the use of superheated steam which drives an electric generator. Students were also given a peep into the activities of the control room which uses PLC software.

It was good learning to see that all equipment can be controlled and monitored by a computerized system away from all the action. Students were really excited and inquisitive during the visit and learnt a lot by the interaction with experts present at the plant.

1. Dr. G.S. Karkara has emphasized on the enrichment of academic quality.
2. Dr. Yuvraj Bhatnagar (Dean Academics) has discussed about how to use an outcome based pedagogy to enrich the students as well. Outcome-based teaching and learning emphasizes the explicit declaration of learning outcomes which identify the tasks students are expected to be able to perform after completing the course, and to what standard. OBTL also requires the teaching, learning and assessment activities to align with the stated learning outcomes. We interviewed fifteen university instructors about their experience of teaching outcome-based computer science courses and how OBTL has affected students and themselves. Academic departments had not adjusted their teaching load to account for the added effort required for the migration to OBTL. Most instructors continue to use time-saving norm referenced assessment. Students did not seem to perform better under OBTL. With the way OBTL is being implemented, it is doubtful that the full benefits of OBTL will ever be realized.
3. Dr. Manjoo Sarswat shared her views about how to maintain class room etiquettes as well.
4. Dr. Dipali Gupta, Dr. Dipali Malodiya, Dr. Pallav Goswami, Dr. Ram pandey, Dr. Vikas Sharma were also present during the all sessions & discussed about the importance of different domain.



One day I was asked by our English teacher to read out certain chapter in English and answer few questions then, But I couldn't even understand the meaning of the sentences written and therefore couldn't answer anything. She shouted and used harsh words to me, I felt quite bad and insulted that day. The next day I went to the library and brought two English story books to learn, but when I started reading those books, I found that I could not understand anything. I found another way of improving my language skills. I thought how a small child starts speaking any language just by continuously listening to it from his childhood. I started listening to English news which used to come on National television channel - BBC news on short wave channel. I then made my habit to sit on the chair near the radio and listen to the BBC news. I was determined to learn the language. I had a bicycle which I used to take for riding daily in the playground present at the back side of my house and used to speak loudly to myself. The practice continued till I completed my graduation. My continual efforts made me improve my language skills. At this age I realized that the potential was with me, only waiting for a specific situation or a "Positive Stimulus", that could initiate it. We all have tremendous abilities in ourselves, the only thing is that we are not aware of these. We all get some benefits or drawbacks according to the families in which we take birth. But instead crying over the drawbacks, we should develop our inner potential by putting our continuous efforts, so that we can walk in parallel with the world.

Changing Roles of the Human Resources Professional

Within the rapidly changing global economy, the HR professional, who is considered necessary by managers and executives, is a strategic partner, an employee sponsor or advocate and a change mentor. The HR professionals who understand these roles are leading their organizations in areas such as organization development, strategic utilization of employees to serve business goals, and talent management and development. Let's take a look at each of these roles and their impact on HR functions and practices.

Strategic Partner In today's organizations, to guarantee their viability and ability to contribute, HR managers need to think of themselves as strategic partners. In this role, the HR person contributes to the development of and the accomplishment of the organization-wide business plan and objectives. The HR business objectives are established to support the attainment of the overall strategic business plan and objectives. The HR professional is deeply knowledgeable about the design of work systems in which people succeed and contribute. This strategic partnership impacts HR services such as the design of work positions, hiring, reward, recognition and strategic pay, performance development and appraisal systems, career and succession planning and employee development. When HR professionals are aligned with the business, the personnel management component of the organization is thought about as a strategic contributor to business success.

Employee Advocate As an employee sponsor or advocate, the HR manager plays an integral role in organizational success via his knowledge about and advocacy of people. This advocacy includes expertise in how to create a work environment in which people will choose to be motivated, contributing, and happy. Fostering effectiveness through goal setting, concentration and improvement through responsibility builds employee ownership of the organization. The HR professional helps establish the organizational culture and climate in which people have the competency, concern, and commitment to serve customer as well. In this role, the HR manager provides overall talent management strategies, employee development opportunities, employee assistance programs, gain sharing and profit sharing strategies, organization development interventions, due process approaches employee complaints and problem-solving, and regularly scheduled communication opportunities.

Change Champion The constant evaluation of the effectiveness of the organization results in the need for the HR professional to frequently change change. Both knowledge about and the ability to execute successful change strategies make the HR professional exceptionally relevant. Knowing how to link change to the strategic needs of the organization will minimize employee dissatisfaction and resistance to change. Organization development, the overarching discipline for change management strategies, gives the HR professional additional challenges. Consistently helping to create the right organizational culture, monitoring employee satisfaction, and measuring the results of organization initiatives fall here as well as in the role of employee advocacy. The HR professional contributes to the organization by constantly assessing the effectiveness of the HR function. He also sponsors change in other departments and in work practices.

Administrative Functions and Executive Agenda In this role, the HR professional served executive agendas well but was frequently viewed as a roadblock by much of the rest of the organization. Some need for this role remains - you wouldn't want every manager putting his own spin on a sexual harassment policy. In this role, employees regarded HR as the enemy and going to HR was the kiss of death for your ongoing relationship with your own manager. Employees looked and were often correct, that the HR function was in place solely to serve the needs of management.

Transformation If the HR function in your organization is not transforming itself to align with forward-thinking practices, executive leadership must ask HR leaders some tough questions. Today's organizations cannot afford to have an HR department that fails to contribute to lead modern thinking and contribute to enhancing company profitability. In this environment, much of the HR role is transforming.

The role of the HR manager, director, or executive must parallel the needs of his or her changing organization. Successful organizations are becoming more adaptive, resilient, quick to change direction and customer-centered.

BIKANER CITY



Bikaner is a city in Rajasthan, India's northwest province. It is situated northwest of the state capital, Jaipur, 330 kilometres (205 mi). Bikaner City is the Bikaner District and Bikaner Division's administrative headquarters. Formerly the capital of Bikaner's princely state, the city was founded in 1486 by Rao Bika and has developed into Rajasthan's fourth largest city from its small origins. The 1928 Ganges Canal and the 1987 Indira Gandhi Canal facilitated its development. The city celebrates its founding day on Akshaya Tritiya by flying kites and eating special Rajasthani food which includes BajreKa Khichda and Imlika Paani. The celebration, called Chhoti AkhaTeej and Badi Akha Teej, lasts two days. The city is best known for its savoury Bhujia snack, which is sold throughout the world. It is also known for a wide range of namkeens and the spicy papad that is another specialty. that manufacture glass, pottery, felts, chemicals, shoes, and cigarettes. The city's colleges (including a medical school and a teachers' training institute) are affiliated with the University of Rajasthan in Jaipur.
