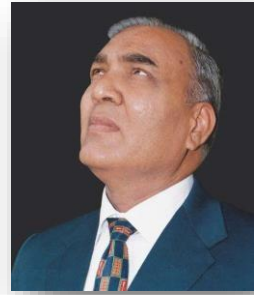

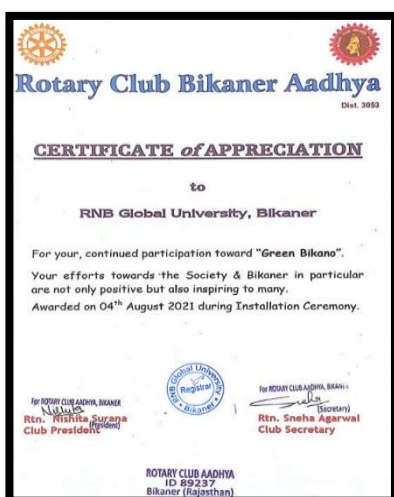

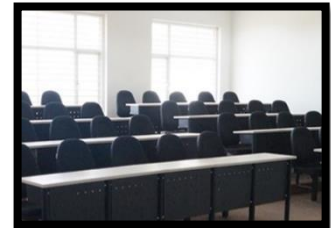
## **World Class Infrastructure**

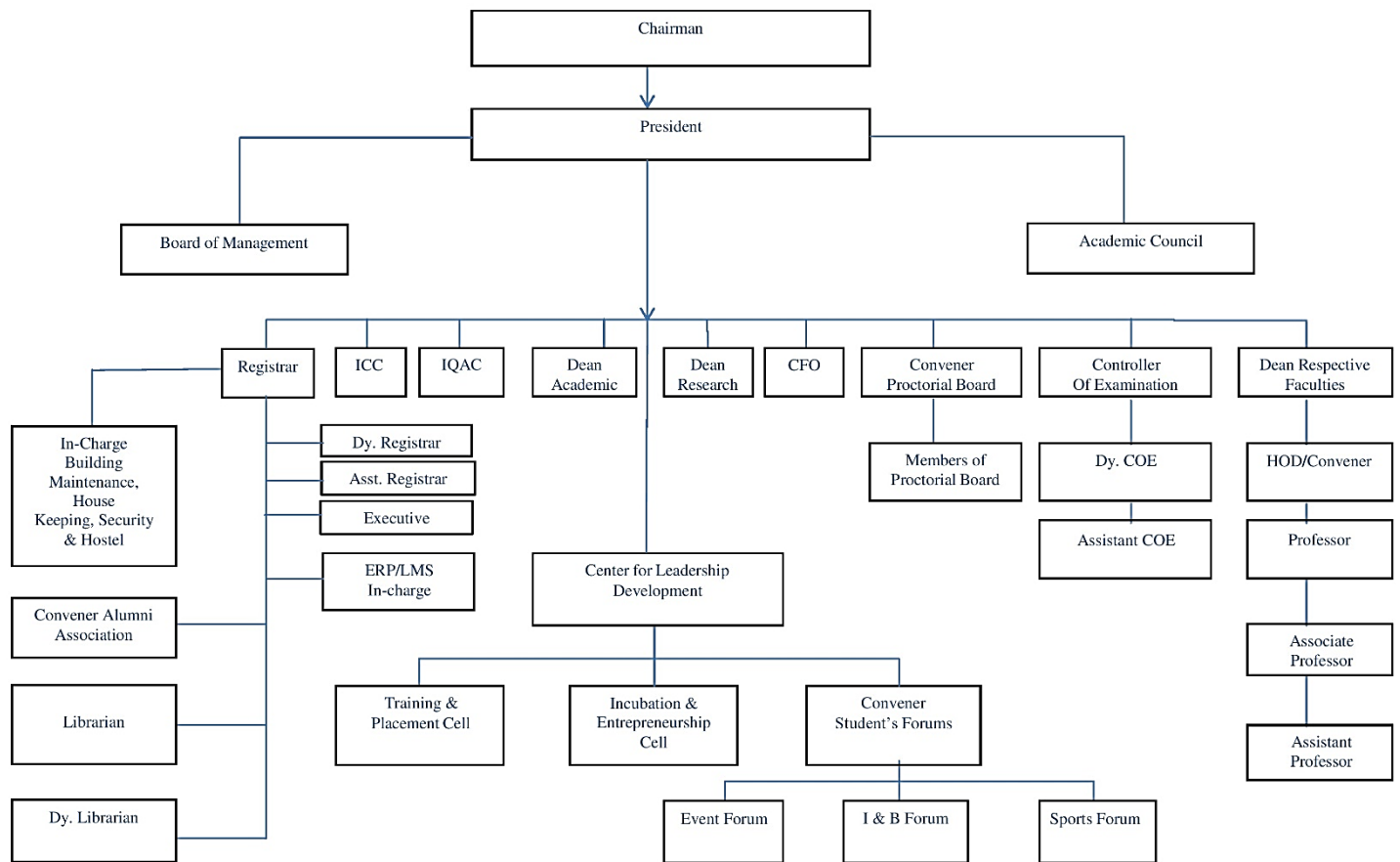

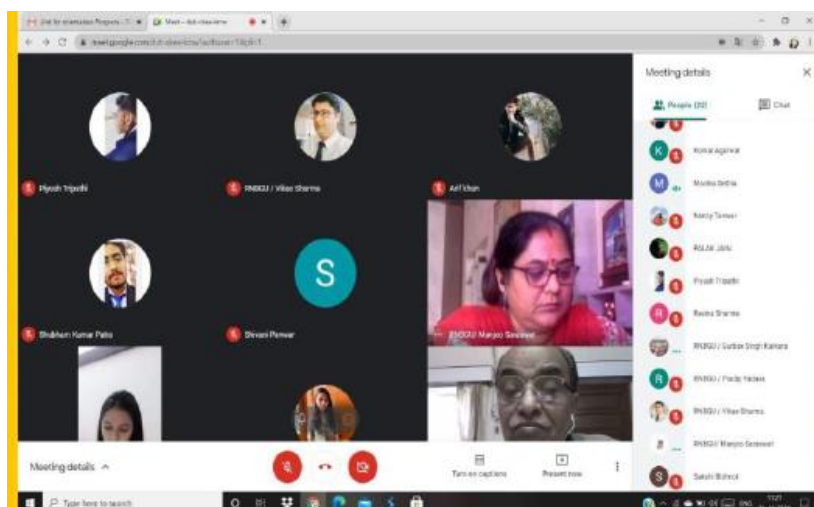
# **GENDER SENSITIZATION PLAN**

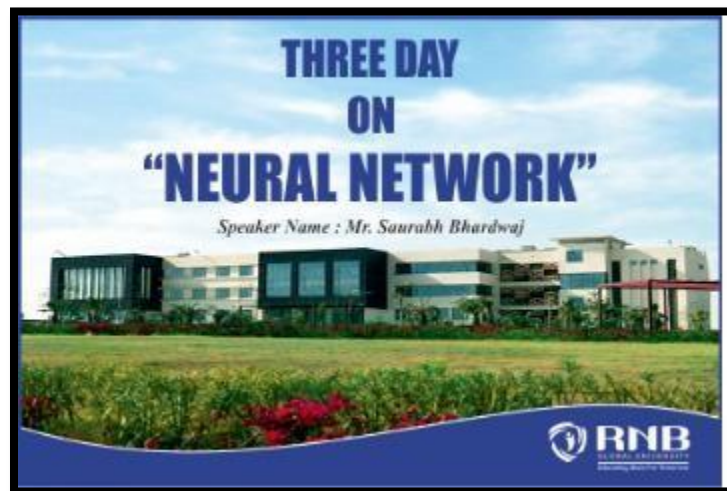
## **Live and Practical Workshop on “Neural Networks”**

Date: 02.06.2021 to 18.06.2021.

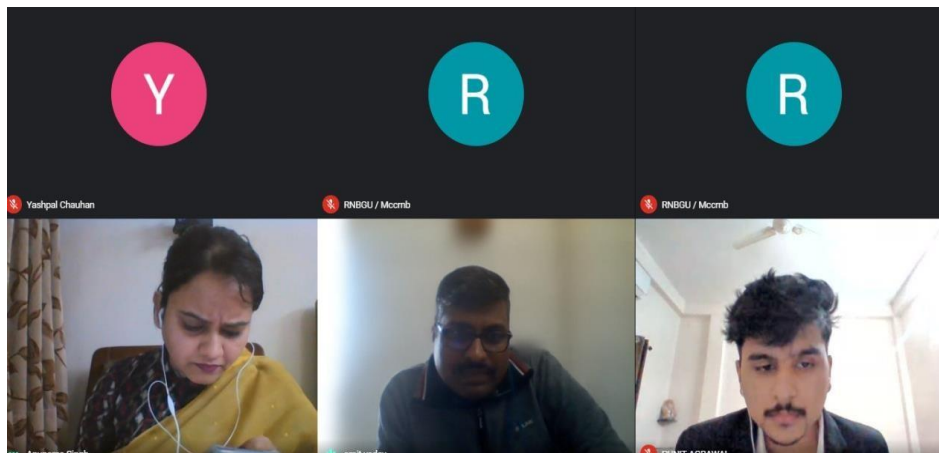

# BIKANER CITY



Bikaner is a city in Rajasthan, India's northwest province. It is situated northwest of the state capital, Jaipur, 330 kilometres (205 mi). Bikaner City is the Bikaner District and Bikaner Division's administrative headquarters.
