- Puts considerable efforts in the promotion and awareness campaign, yet at times desirable results erode due to locational disadvantage.
- Since the city is 20 kilometres away, there are limited public transportation options.
- Extreme environmental conditions don't suit some faculty members belonging to other cities of India.
- Limited aircraft connectivity with other cities of India, restricts the physical visits of subject experts for Conferences and Seminars

Institutional Opportunity :

- Support to the faculty members and constantly encouraging them to pursue Ph.D, and Research, for their professional accomplishment and enhancement of their qualifications and academic prodigies
- Encourage more entrepreneurial development skills amongst the students and regular sensitization sessions for them to pursue it
- Welcome each year many reputed corporate and industrial houses willing to provide placement to our students. In future also university looks forward to adding on this number in many folds owing to strong connection and relationship with industry
- Strong alumni base to help with employment opportunities and career development of junior student as referrals
- Opportunities to establish collaboration with reputable international and national institutes to transfer knowledge on sharing basis
- Explore faculty-student exchange programme with prestigious domestic and international universities
- Explore opportunities in research activities and partnerships with industry and corporate. Establish local NPTEL chapter.

- Opportunities in the programmes for the students preparing for competitive exams and conducts personality development sessions such as soft skills, aptitude, GD for GATE, MAT, CAT, SSC etc. and other competitive exams for the students.
- Opportunities for the development of vocational and advanced skills, research centers, incubation centers amongst other things for the professional development of the students.

Institutional Challenge :

- Students coming from different language and cultural origins, takes time for their improvement and adjustments which becomes impediments in the teaching and learning process of the university.
- At times it is realized that keeping pace with rapid changing technological development difficult.
- At times female / girl student marriage during the middle of the academic session or for higher studies, jeopardy their professional academic progression
- Quite often than not, family Business is a forced attraction for the local Student which also mars the professional development of the students.

Criteria wise Summary

Curricular Aspects :

The curricula of RNB Global University are in tune with its vision and mission. University has well-structured curricula incorporating contemporary knowledge, multi- and inter-disciplinary learning, many of them are as per the NEP guidelines. The university follows systematic process of curriculum design and development superintended by BoS, Academic Council and BOM, keeping clear focus on learning, based on local, national and global needs that are comprehensively represented in COs, PSOs and POs.

The curricula is updated and new courses are introduced on the basis of advancements in the concerned stream on regular basis. The feedback of stakeholders is considered while updating curricula.

During the last five years syllabus revision were carried out in all programmes offered by the university. The University has 373 courses focusing on employability/ entrepreneurship/skill development. During last five years, the University has offered 697 courses in 15 programmes. University offers elective courses across all the programmes to ensure the academic flexibility.

The curriculum is delivered through class room teaching along with regular workshops, seminars, projects, assignments, summer internships, field visits etc. having industry relevance. Due credits are given to courses of workshops/seminars to make it an integral part of curriculum. Ability and Skill Enhancement and Centre for Leadership Development courses are offered to enhance students' communication, innovation and entrepreneurial skills.

The curriculum includes content on human values in every semester which signifies the importance of moral values in human life, how an individual be grateful to the society and should spare time to contribute towards the benefit of society along with sense of environment protection, sustainability, conservation of energy besides catering the gender issues promoting gender equality.

The university offers various VACs like Proficiency in English, French, Tally, Advance Excel, Event Management, Human Rights etc. which offer ample opportunities for diverse knowledge.

The summer internship helps students to experience real working environment and better industry knowledge. As per the curriculum of the university, summer internship is the mandatory requirement for completion of degree for both UG and PG programmes, which is in tune with the NEP – 2020.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation :

RNBGU has diverse academic programs in different disciplines which leads to award of UG, PG and Ph.D. degree. The academic program includes two Sessional examinations, continuous assessment and end semester examination. In continuous assessment, the students attempt assignments, quizzes and presentations. From the beginning, the students are offered Ability and Skill development program which improve their written and communication skills.

To ensure outcome based education, the University has clearly stated all PO's, PSO's and CO's. These were framed based on the inputs from various stake holders includes latest technological needs, job prospects and social requirement. The attainment of these are calculated which are used in improve the academic processes at University

The diversity of students are judged by their performance in the first Sessional Examination and based on this, the students are classified as slow, average and fast learners. Various activities are conducted to upgrade the slow learners. The fast learners are encouraged to take part in competitions, preparations for advanced studies, take part in research work, etc.

The University adopts Mentor-mentee program in which students are helped both academically, emotionally and other activities.

The University have many student centric activities which gives a holistic development of the students. The students across all streams are given exposure to problem solving, participative and experiential learning, through project work, internship, educational visits, industry visit/ field visit/ Research Institutes, Court visit, organization of moot court, Webinar, guest lectures, quiz competitions, etc. for the overall development of the students.

The student teacher ratio is 6:1 and the majority of teachers are well qualified having doctoral qualification.

The university adopts the annual calendar of events which includes academic and various cultural and sports activities. The students are encouraged to show their talent in these activities.

Primary endeavour of the University is transparency, to conduct examinations in time and declare the result in the shortest possible period. During the last five years the duration of last examination and result declaration was between 15-23 days. The examination system of the University is completely computerized and Strong TCS-ion ERP is used for all academic, administrative and examination processes.

Research, Innovations and Extension :

The University in line with its Vision & Mission fosters an encouraging environment for research to match the requirements of professional and the social evolution. As a fast multidisciplinary growing University, the Research Policy has been formulated which defines committees like Research Advisory Committee, Ethical Committee and Plagiarism check policy, etc.

RNBGU promotes Research Culture by organizing National Conferences, Research incentives for Publishing paper, Filing Patents, Seminars and Guest lectures, Book Writing, encouraging faculties and students for the Industrial Consultancies, conducting MDP's. University has Research led facilities like laboratories, Shade-Net Green House, Business Lab, Moot Court and Statistical database, etc.

University has signed over 30 MOU's with the industries, Foreign and National Universities / Institutes and agriculture nurseries to conduct research activities. Approx. 100 collaborative activities have been carried out for research led seminars and association with industry. The faculties are awarded and recognized every year 03rd Sept on the occasion of University "Founder's Day".

University has established 2 centers namely, Center for Leadership & Development (CLD) and Center for Political and Social Research (CPSR). The University's Incubation & Entrepreneurship Cell has 07 student-led start-ups. The University conducts sessions on Intellectual Property Right (IPR), Business Plan competitions, seminars for start-ups, and Skill development. More than 10 awareness programs were organized on IPR during the last 5 years.

University started its Ph.D program in 2018; currently 11 PhD Scholars are enrolled. Faculties have been granted one patent and published two Patents. Faculties have published books, Chapters and research papers in the national, international journals and conference proceedings as per the code of ethics for publication and many of them are indexed in Scopus/WoS/UGC Care listed journals.

More than 60 extension and Outreach activities have been carried out in collaboration with Rotary Club-Bikaner, Rotary Club Bikaner Aadhya, Anurag Kala Kendra and Villages Gram Panchayats. The University have also adopted 03 villages.

Various other outreach programs and social activities like Legal Aid Camps, Blood donation camp, Tree plantation drives "You Plant : We grow", Education for all, Nukad Nataks, Woollen clothes distribution, visiting Old age homes etc. have been organized in the last 5 years.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources :

RNB global university spread in 86 acres with modern infrastructure for academics, teaching learning and other activities. All the departments of our university are supported with required facilities and thereby to achieve its desired mission and to provide better learning platform to all its stake holders.

University provides all necessary equipment, apparatus, books, teaching aids, furniture and fixtures, ICT facilities, and other consumables.

With fully centralized air-conditioned and well-equipped eighteen classrooms with ICT facilities, Central Library, seminar hall, three Conference Halls, twelve high Laboratories, including computer labs, management lab, language lab, Moot Court Hall and field laboratories (Shed Net House, Crop Cafeteria, Neem Farm, DatePalm Farm Herbal Garden) for agriculture students.

A fully centralized air-conditioned digital library function with -

- 1364 Journals
- Multiple Magazines
- Daily newspaper

- Periodicals, E-Journals and E-books

- Digitalization Facility

The university thus contributes to a resourceful infrastructure which provides adequate facilities for cultural activities, indoor and outdoor sports (TT, Carom-board, Chess, and LAN game, Air Hockey, Billiards, Lawn Tennis, Badminton, Cricket, Basket Ball, and Volleyball) and facilities like OAT, Dance and Yoga Zone, Cafeteria, and Gymnasium with ultra-modern facilities.

The main campus is knotted up with divine fervour and sacred academic ambience for teaching learning process. The general facilities include: RO drinking water, toiletries, lifts, medical facilities, green learning environment, separate common rooms, wellness centre, Solar panel, CCTV surveillance, UPS Supply, Power Generator,

hostels, and faculty residence.

The regular infrastructural development is an ongoing process, university has clear policy regarding the adoption of latest Information technology and maintenance services. The university is having 100 mbps bandwidth of internet connection with ERP system, Wi-Fi, LAN, Server rooms in both blocks. In addition to it we provide facilities for E-content like- Media Centre, Audio-Visual centre, Lecture capturing system and mixing equipment software for editing. All these facilities are highly useful to students eager for their career pursuit and job prospects.

Student Support and Progression :

University provides students with an inexpensive education through numerous scholarship programmes, such as Girl Child Scholarship to promote girl child education, Need Based Scholarships for students who are financially less fortunate, Merit Based, Area Specific, Defense Personnel, Sports Based, Competitive Exam Based, etc. The percentage of students that receive financial support each year is around 40%.

Every year, University organizes a wide range of events for students, such as seminars and workshops, that can improve their possibilities in their chosen careers in accordance with the establish career counselling policy. University provides placement assistance through its T&P cell

continuously striving to help students in pursuing their career goals by acquiring employment-seeking skills and ultimately to attain desired employment, entrepreneurship or proceeding towards higher studies.

University also conducts several soft skill-building compulsory classes such as Ability Skill Enhancement (ASE), Centre for Leadership Development (CLD) and Summer Internship Programs (SIP) in its curriculum and several events to increase social awareness of the latest technological breakthroughs in various streams, etc. Class representatives and mentors are nominated for each year of every programme of the University.

Every year, we provide a wide range of programmes to improve our students' capabilities, including assistance with competitive exams, career counselling, remedial coaching sessions for slow learners' students, and bridge courses for lateral entrance students.

The university has a well-established process for handling student complaints, including a student grievance committee, an anti-ragging committee, ST/SC/OBC committee and an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC).

Student Council made up of Event Forum, Sport Forum, and I&B Forum comprise of secretary and council of members. A few examples include "INSPIRE", an annual cultural event, and "SPREE" an annual sporting occasion by Sport Forum with a number of other Indoor Sports Club and Outdoor Sports Club, NCC/Social Club, and I&B Forum clubs managing the monthly "RNB Times" and "RNB Voice", respectively.

The university has registered Alumni Society. The RNBGU frequently welcomes its alumni to its yearly events, such as Orientation programme, "INSPIRE", "SPREE", etc.

Governance, Leadership and Management :

The University has its clear vision, Mission, core values & well defined Strategic Plan to address the global issues like environmental conservation & upholding the highest standards of transparency, accountability, and efficiency to provide quality education & future opportunities to all its students.

The President, Registrar, COE, Deans and all other stakeholders support the Chairman, in academic and administrative concerns of the University. The governing bodies are BOM & Academic Council. The administrative system is well-coordinated, and different tasks are decentralised to the Registrar, Deputy & Assistant Registrar, HR Personnel & Executives. The COE, Deputy & Assistant COE and the support personnel, perform all functions of examination department.

All levels operate under a participatory management culture. Effective policy implementation uses both top-down and bottom-up strategies. All faculty recommendations in weekly faculty review meetings are considered for curriculum creation, teaching-learning, assessment process, and general administration. Representatives from all schools and outside participate in the curricular aspects at the faculty level. Various committees are in place for Proctorial matters, anti-ragging, & prevention of sexual harassment etc.

Since its inception, University ensures e-governance at all its levels starting from admissions, student's support, examination and in all aspects of teaching & non-teaching matters through TCS-ion (ERP)

University has taken various steps for faculty empowerment like; Monetary benefits such as annual appraisal, increment, research publication incentives etc. & Non-monetary benefits such as leaves, skill development through FDP, staff orientation programmes & various other facilities.

External financial audit from qualified CA and internal audit is the regular phenomenon.

The IQAC reviews the progress and develops the programmes, policies, and recommendations to raise standards in teaching and research. IQAC promotes regular communication among all stakeholders to facilitate internal quality analysis and the implementation of corrective actions. To improve the quality of academics and administration IQAC conducts Academic & Administrative Audits, Participates in NIRF, AISHE and organise various collaborative and orientation activities.

Institutional Values and Best Practices :

Ensuring gender equality & safe environment for female faculty members, staff and girl students has been one of prime concern of RNB Global University. All steps has been taken for the safety & security of women at the University, which includes annual gender sensitization plan, infrastructural facilities & establishment of women cell .

For energy conservation, university has installed power efficient equipments, sensor based conservation and a solar energy power plant of 50 KW.

University supplies its solid waste and e-waste to vendors for proper disposal. Organic waste is converted into compost. A STP of 55 KLD has been installed in the University.

Water conservation is ensured by using Drip & Sprinkler irrigation. Rain water harvesting system has been constructed for storage & ground water recharge.

For preventing pollution in campus, University has restricted entry of automobiles, ban on use of plastic and battery operated vehicle is used in campus for transportation. University campus is clean & green.

Green, Energy and Environmental Audit are conducted in university by 3rd party. University has received many awards for environment conservation, which includes an award from Rajasthan state government.

For Divyangjan, university has provisions of special washrooms, lifts & tactile pathways. University has taken various efforts/initiatives for providing an inclusive environment wherein tolerance and harmony is build towards various cultural, regional, linguistic, communal and other socio-economic groups.

Activities like celebration of Constitution day, Republic day, Independence day sensitize students towards our constitutional values.

RNBGU has a Code of Conduct prescribed for its members. Which is build on the principles of transparency, integrity and honesty.

University celebrates all major national and international commemorative days, events and festivals. Students and faculty members celebrate all such events with full enthusiasm and zeal.

The best practices of university include, Transparency in Administration and Academics using Enterprise Resource Planning, and the Efforts on Environment Conservation & Sustainability.

Empowerment of women has been the Institutional Distinctiveness of RNB Global University. The girl student ratio for last five years has been above 42%, female faculty ratio is above 40% in year 2020-21. The placement ratio of girl students is above 44%.

Institutional preparedness for NEP



1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:

The hallmark principles of NEP 2020 are Access, Equity, Quality, Affordability, and Accountability. According to the Policy, education should produce decent people who possess logical thought, empathy, courage, resilience, a scientific temperament, a creative imagination, and moral principles. NEP 2020 envisions an education system rooted in Indian ethos that contributes directly to transforming India that is Bharat, sustainably into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society. The Vision of National Education Policy, to provide high quality education to develop human resources in our nation as global citizens, is well taken by the University. RNBGU has also already started taking appropriate steps and constituted a core committee of senior professors, headed by the President of the University "NEP Committee", for Effective Implementation of NEP-2020. The committee has prepared a detailed road map for phased implementation of NEP. An extensive schedule of FDPs, Interdisciplinary Refresher Courses and workshops for current academic year has been prepared for professional Development of teaching and non-teaching staff. A few programs (Faculty Induction Program, Workshop on Vision of Higher Education and FDP on Leadership Traits), on road map of NEP education have already been organized by the university, in the very beginning of this academic year. University has been and will continue to organise sessions with experts on NEP awareness and process amongst its faculty & students. RNBGU being multidisciplinary University offering programmes in various disciplines (Basic & Applied Sciences, Commerce & Management and Law & Arts) has a unique academic governance structure for programmes and course creation. The structure being organized around various disciplines makes it conducive for ensuring multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary. The University has taken the initiative of ensuring a minimum desired level of multidisciplinary

curriculum across all its programmes. In addition to the existing inter/multidisciplinary research and academics, new language courses have been introduced which are open for all. French language course to meet Global standards and Hindi language to meet Local needs. Moreover, Academic programmes are redesigned to include Multidisciplinary /Interdisciplinary courses as electives. All programmes are designed in such a way that students get maximum flexibility to choose elective courses offered by other Departments.

2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is a virtual/digital repository that houses data on the credits that certain students have accrued over the course of their academic careers. Students will be able to create an account and have a variety of alternatives for enrolling and exiting institutions or universities. Throughout the period of higher education, there will be "multiple exits" and "multiple entries," and credits will be easily transferred through the ABC. ABC is a trustworthy source that can be used to verify any student's credit history at any given moment. Therefore, the ABC idea serves as fuel to increase teacher productivity and encourage students to embrace a multidisciplinary educational approach. Making pupils "skilled professionals" and fostering their whole development are the goals. RNBGU is a registered member of the National Academic Depository which is a government endeavour to offer an online repository for all academic awards under the Digital India Programme. The ABC will allow students to tailor their degrees or make specific modifications and specifications rather than undergoing the rigid, regularly prescribed degree or courses of a single university or autonomous college. It can be achieved through multiple entries and exits for the students to complete their degree to suit their time preferences by providing mobility across various higher education institutions. The Academic Bank of Credit concept is being discussed and to be implemented by the university. For this purpose, the university has constituted a committee to prepare a path for effective integration of ABC in its academic programs Action Plan for further implementation under NEP 2020: 1. RNBGU proposes to update its program's scheme and syllabus with more Electives, Interdisciplinary courses & Multiple Entry –exit options 2. To implement ABC on annual basis as per NEP 2020 3. To identify partner universities for ABC transfer amongst each other 4. Seminars will be conducted at every six months, for awareness among

	students and Faculty members about the objectives and significance of ABC. 5. The University will provide more research facilities to students and Faculty members.
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3. Skill development:

According to the NEP 2020, a nation that is educated, intelligent, and talented can conceive and carry out effective solutions to its own issues. This will be accomplished through making improvements to higher education, particularly by emphasising the combination of talent and education. Education that emphasises skills is crucial because knowledge will be useless if we lack the necessary skills. At Higher education, combination of knowledge and skills is highly required to make graduates employable. RNBGU has created an eco-system to hone career relevant skills of the students by establishing Centre for Leadership Development (CLD), since its inception. Skill enhancement in students is ensured through various methodologies. Like 1. The CLD conducts various career oriented activities, in association with various industries and organisations 2. The schools & departments identify the requisite skills essential to achieve the graduate attributes. 3. Every programme has skill based experiential learning as a core component. 4. RNBGU organises workshops etc. which are specifically aimed at imparting precise skill sets to the students; for example, 5. The university is making sincere efforts for providing value-based education to the learners and make them responsible citizens and ensuring social justice and empowering the underprivileged and vulnerable sections of the society 6. Skill based projects, field visits & internships are regularly conducted across all disciplines. 7. Effective curriculum delivery is attained through well planned and documented process. Based on feedback from various stakeholders, Academic Council and Board of Studies work in coordination to strengthen curricular, co-and extracurricular activities.

RNB Global University use standard taxonomy for curriculum. The curriculum is planned in advance to accomplish vision and mission of the University. University offers as many as **eight** academic programmes under different schools. University follows the **Elective System** in academic programmes which offers **more academic flexibility** to enhance employability skills of the students by integrating discipline specific, **interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary electives** in curricula to meet student's interests and aspirations. The curricula inculcate soft skills, personality development and life skills to keep students conversant with current global scenario.

The programmes offered at RNB Global University are **outcome based** and these predetermined outcomes are evaluated at the end. For the attainment of the aforesaid objective, the **Program Educational Objectives (PEOs), Program Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs)** of all the programs and courses are well defined, articulated and **mapped** in alignment with University's **vision, mission** and the learning requirements of the students.

University contains majority of courses as per the innate requirements of concerned programmes, so **global** and **national needs** are taken care of. Apart from this, local needs and relevance is also identified and courses are added to cater the requirements of **local industry**, society and stakeholders as course of B.Sc. Agriculture is being offered by university to cater the local farming needs and Law course as BBA LLB and BA LLB to provide the quality professionals to the judiciary system of country. By offering Management education like MBA and BBA, the global requirements are fulfilled by providing competitive curriculum as per the global and national needs. All the programs at the university have **mandatory internship** requirements to develop the required skill-set to provide practical exposure and real working environment of the industry.

As the University is situated in rural area, the English and communication skills of local students are also improved by the university curriculum. To improve communication skills, one course in every semester is introduced with the name of '**Ability & Skill Enhancement**' or '**Center for Leadership Development**'. Further, the **foreign languages** are also part of the curriculum to develop the required communication skills of the students in addition to English language.

The course **“Human values and social services”** is added in every semester in all the programmes to create sense of belongingness and responsibility towards humans and surrounding society. This subject is made part of all the programs in all the semesters and is offered with **two credits**. This course contains various **field activities** which includes tree plantation, blood donation camps, visit to rural and other backward areas in addition to conducting Nukkad - Naatak and other social awareness campaigns.

To create awareness about environment, the course **‘Environmental Studies’** is added. It deals with conservation strategies and problems with environment, environmental education and ecosystem, biodiversity, its threats and its conservation.

2.2 Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Answer:

The students of diverse background take admission in the academic program of the University. Accordingly, the University is having program to assess the students during admission, post-admission- during course of study, class lectures, practical, quiz, assignments which are part of the curriculum. Based on this, the students are classified into three categories viz.

Slow learners (20% of those scoring less than grade7)

Average learners (scoring grade between 7- 8.5) and

Fast learners (Twenty percent of students scoring grade point more than 8.5)

The Classification of the students are based on marks obtained in semester end examination or sessional examination.

Learning Level Assessment during Course of Study: During the progress of semester, the university lays strong emphasis on internal assessment which apart from regular classroom interaction helps the faculty in identifying slow as well as advanced learners. Apart from this assignments & quizzes are also used to assess the performance of the students and their transformation. Participation in tutorials, assignments, debates, quizzes, presentations, case-studies, projects, practical test, viva-voice and many more modern tools are used for continuous assessment of students. Each method has a specific learning purpose. Tutorials help the students to ask questions freely, case study methods enhance the real business problem understanding of the students. In real life business situation the employees have to extensively use presentation techniques. This method helps the students to prepare for future.

Measures for Slow Learners: University defined specific criteria for slow learner students. For slow learners, clarification classes, Remedial classes are organized to improve the understanding of subjects. Joint learning groups of equal number of slow as well as advanced learners are formed to help in sharing of learning and experiences for various assignments, class activities, student club activities etc. In addition to this Class Mentors are also appointed to help slow learners. The Fast/Average learners nurture the slow learners, by direct methods of problem solving or indirect impact of their practices and procedures. Proper counseling and mentoring is done for slow learning students by their respective mentors. Summer semester is conducted in the month of June/July each year to make the students competent to join the mainstream students during regular semesters. Project training and special workshops for improving practical skills is an integral part of most of the courses.

Measure for Average Learners: A mentor mentee system-Mentoring programs are conducted for all kind of students to address the specific needs of the students and help in their academic and personal progress, average learners also get regular assignments and minor projects to enhance their knowledge and skills.

Measures for Fast Learners: University defined specific criteria for advance learner students. Advanced learners are encouraged to take part in competitions, quiz, and present paper in seminar, write review/research papers and Internships in reputed industries/institutes for deserving students.

2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Answer:

The Syllabus is designed in a form which maintains the proper balance between conceptual and practical aspects of learning. Students are encouraged to apply the concepts in practical circumstances, analyze the outcomes of such practical application to strengthen the experiential learning. Assignment are part of continuous assessment across all the schools in the university. Accordingly, the University has formulated Assignment guidelines which are adopted for each course taken by the students.

Experiential Learning:

- Mandatory industrial training/Internship for students as per the demand of program/course
- Law students are given experience of real situations by organizing Moot Court, Mock Parliament, Mock U.N., Legal Aid camps, etc. in the University.
- Law students are also given experience of real situations by arranging their visits to district court, Hon'ble High Court, Hon'ble Supreme Court, President House, etc.
- Internship programs in collaboration with various industries are arranged for increasing the practical knowledge.
- During the period of study Internship is compulsory for all students of Agriculture, B. Tech. (CSE), B.Sc. (Biotechnology), BBA and MBA final year students and they are guided by both faculty and Industry/Research personnel.
- Science Students are required to perform the experiments in the laboratory to learn the concepts better by doing themselves.
- The university has various student forum in which the students gets chance to learn and show their talent in different fields.

Problem solving learning:

- During the period of study Internship is compulsory for all students of and project work is given to students of Agriculture, B. Tech. (CSE), B.Sc. (Biotechnology), BBA and MBA final year students.
- In order to explain the concepts of management, the students solve the cases and case lets to learn the finer details of the concepts. In such a way, the students are trained to analyze the problem and learn the skills of communication, critical thinking and presentation. The students are offered courses of Skill and Ability development in each semester.
- The students are encouraged to participate in competitions such as HR quiz, Financial Quiz, debate competition, slogan writing competition, group discussions and related activities to improve their competence.

Participative Learning:

- Invited talks by experts from academia and industries, Workshops, seminars, webinars are arranged periodically, so that students can get enough inputs from the experts so as to prepare themselves to meet the expectations of the industry or to plan for higher studies.
- The students across all schools are taken to the field visit, research Institutes, adjoining nursery, cottage industries, industrial visit, etc depending on their field of study, to give them experience of real life situation which they will face in years to come.
- Students are encouraged to do mini projects, prepare documentaries, videos by interviewing prominent leaders& entrepreneurs, through which they can apply the theoretical concepts practically and understand how to interact with people from industry and society.

To enhance English language and soft skills , Ability & Skill Enhancement courses-ASE are offered at the UG level and ASE and Centre for Leadership Development course at PG level.

Through this process, teachers can identify slow learners among the students and therefore they can improve or change their teaching methods to enrich students with more information.

- Continuous Assessments (CA) process

- The examination cell compile the result which takes minimum possible days to declare result.

The introduction of ERP system for tabulation has reduced human errors to minimum and hence accuracy is very high.

The positive impact of the examination management system in the university is as Follows:

- Online entry of Students, attendance and assessment marks help to reduce the errors and saves lot of time.
- Online filling of examination /revaluation forms helps the students and university in saving time and in generating admission tickets.
- The answers scripts are coded to prevent disclosure of identity of students; thereby bias/malpractice of any kind is prevented.
- Scheme of evaluation along with solutions are made available to the examiners prior to the commencement of evaluation. Thus uniformity is maintained.

2.6 Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

2.6.1 The institution has stated learning outcomes (generic and programme specific)/graduate attributes which are integrated into the assessment process and widely publicized through the website and other documents

Answer:

The university address the issue of Outcome based Education (OBE) since the university believes that students should learn the required skills to implement the objectives of the Program in which he/she has taken admission. In view of this all schools across the University has clearly mentioned their Vision and Mission.

The program outcome (PO's), Course outcome (CO's) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSO's) are prepared in consultation with the faculty, invited experts, students and employers in respective field. These are then vetted by the Board of Studies. Regular monitoring of mapping of the program outcome (PO's), Course outcome (CO's) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSO's) are done every year and based on the gaps identified, they are again mapped with the view to neutralize the gaps.

The Course Outcome (CO's) and Program outcomes (PO's) are made available to the students through Website of university and Syllabus. Outcomes of the course are discussed with the students at the end of each topic of the study by the faculty leading to its technical applications for the subject/profession. The learning outcomes are stated using active verbs using Bloom's taxonomy and expressed as complete declarative sentences that clearly describe the knowledge, skills, and competencies expected from the students to acquire as a result of completing their program of study.

The faculty prepare their lesson plans by incorporating the blooms levels and learning outcome. The faculty design the assignment, discussions, practical presentation, project work based on the program outcome (PO's), Course outcome (CO's) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSO's) in such a way that students acquire skills and generate confidence to do better.

The feedback is collected from different stakeholders which are used to calculate attainment. This aids in identifying various methods of teaching and learning to improve the understanding of the students.

The Program outcome (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course outcome (COs) are displayed on the university website and can be accessed by all the stakeholders i.e. faculty, students, Industry and Alumni.

They are also available in Faculty Files. All the faculty members prepare a faculty file for each semester covering all necessary details.

The Dean(s)/ HOD's/ Faculty explain the importance of Program outcome (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course outcome (COs) along with the evaluation pattern for course outcomes to all the students on day one.

2.6.2 Attainment of Programme outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution

Answer:

The evaluation of attainment starts from 1st Semester and continues until the final semester of each program. A correlation is established between course outcomes (CO's) and Program outcomes (PO's) to meet the

requirement of industry, social contribution, skill development and to inculcate appropriate outcome value systems as well as internationalization among students.

All faculties design the course outcomes (CO's) of his / her respective courses. All designed course outcomes (CO's) are mapped with program outcomes (PO's). The mapping of course outcomes (CO's) with program (PO's) is also followed in elective courses. University mapped program outcomes (PO's) with course outcomes (CO's) with three scales that is Low, Medium and High. The course outcomes (CO's) mapping along with their Program outcomes (PO's) are reviewed by the competent authority's viz. IQAC, Registrar and President.

The course level assessment process:

The assessment of Course level includes the method which can be direct and indirect for the calculation of course outcome (CO's) attainment. The direct method includes continuous internal assessment with a relative weightage of 50% and End semester examination with 50% weightage. Various components for continuous assessment are two sessional examinations, assignments, quiz, presentations and attendance, the indirect method includes the participation of learners in the form of feedback. These methods vary according to the type of course. Overall attainment of course outcomes is calculated by inculcating both direct attainment and indirect attainment.

The pre-requisite for computation of Course outcome-Program Outcome (CO-PO) attainment are:

Defining of Course outcomes (CO's) and Program Outcome (PO's) for each program.

Mapping of Course outcome (CO's) and Program Outcome (PO's)

Calculation of Course outcome (CO's) for each course after taking 60% marks as threshold level of marks secured by students.

Calculation of attainment using student's examination data and feedback data of students. For this, the weightage of 90% is given to student's examination data and 10% to feedback data.

The program level assessment process:

The assessment of program level learning outcomes includes:

1. Mapping of Course Outcome- Program outcome (CO-PO's).
2. The course outcome (CO's) is multiplied by Program outcome (PO's) mean and
3. Divided by the attainment levels.

University regularly update curriculum as industry demand. More and more skill development, Entrepreneur ship based courses are added in curriculum so students attain maximum outcomes from their respective

programs.

- The University has **Legal Aid Centre** seeks to impart Clinical Legal Education and social-legal services to the needy and poor segments of the community. It is necessary to expose law students to the practical aspects of the legal field as study of law is a professional

course; the Legal Aid Centre aims at fulfilling this purpose and alongside provides a platform to serve the poor and needy.

- During the **COVID-19 pandemic**, the University students conduct the cleanliness drive. The students feel a sense of responsibility and believe that they need to give back to society and the environment what they have taken.
- General awareness campaign –“**STOP DENGUE NOW**” by creating awareness to fight against **DENGUE** and distributing medicinal herbs and leaves like Tulsi and Giloy.
- University students participate in association with **NGO-Rotary Club** activities such as street cause, i.e, activities like walkathon, Nukad Natak, tree plantation drives. Large numbers of saplings have been planted and natural vegetation is preserved, blood donation camps have been organized, faculty and staff donating blood, Legal aid cell which provides legal aid to the underprivileged people.
- **Blood Donation camps** are organized in the University for the benefit of society as part of social forum. The students organize various awareness campaigns, workshops and road shows with themes like health awareness, cleanliness, green environment & tree plantation.
- A detailed and systematic approach followed towards extension activities thus ensures that the **students are exposed to real-life challenges**; are given opportunities towards personality development and for inculcating qualities of **leadership, responsibility, empathy, passion and gender sensitization**.
- Through the extension activities of Social Campaigns, General awareness drives impacts the students in **enhancing social service and inculcating human values** through an innovative approach to learning that endeavours to make education relevant to practical situations, by empowering students to act as **catalysts for social change**.

Since inception, all the classrooms, laboratories, library, seminar hall, etc., are well-equipped with ICT facilities. Also university possess ERP and LMS system powered by TCS-ion. Faculty members used ICT tools for delivering the lectures and uploading the study materials. The university also possess Lecture Capturing System (LCS).

Classrooms:

University has eighteen classrooms and five tutorial rooms equipped with ICT facilities, Centralized ACs with proper sitting capacity and electrification. Whiteboards are available in all the classrooms along with the projector. All rooms are under surveillance of CCTV cameras to maintain proper security & discipline and decorum of the classroom.

Seminar Hall & Conference Room:

For organizing various programs like seminar, conferences, webinar, guest lectures, motivational speech, symposium, conclaves, workshops, training sessions, etc., university has a very spacious seminar hall and 3 conference rooms for meetings, group discussions with centralized AC.

Moot Court Hall:

University is having a spacious, well-furnished moot court hall which is used for national moot court competitions, training and competitions, mock UN sessions of General Assembly, Security Council, ECOSOC sessions, mock parliaments and for trial advocacy.

Laboratories:

Laboratory is one of the most useful features of any educational institute for the practical learning point of view for students and researchers.

Computer labs have many software's, such as-MS-office, Turbo C, Dream Wear/Notepad++, Xampp/Wamp, Workbench, Jupiter, JS-Lab, Jet Bins, .Net, Python, Tally and Wordsworth, etc.

In **Language lab**, Wordsworth software is used for learning the language for the fast communication and latest information.

In **Management lab**, for the development of students, university organizes budgetary sessions & various other activities.

For Agriculture students, university possess **Field laboratories**, such as Crop cafeteria, Shed-Net House, Neem Farm, Herbal Garden, Date Palm Farm, Mushroom Product Unit, etc.

Central Library:

University library is fully automated on ERP by TCS-ion, well-equipped and well-stacked digital library with reading room and centralized AC. Procedures for maintaining and utilization of facilities

- A separate budget is planned for the repair, maintenance for facilities of the campus.
- Any issue is directly reported to maintenance team for repair.
- Each laboratory has one teacher as lab in- charge, a lab assistant and attendant.
- Lab assistants and other service personnel are given responsibility to maintain the equipment under their purview.
- Stock registers, asset registers, log books, tools & plant registers are maintained by the respective laboratories to report entrie and defects arising for rectification.
- Librarian with supporting staff has been appointed to maintain the library. They focus on the supply and utilization of instructional material within the teaching and learning process.
- The sports equipment is issued to the scholars as per the schedule of the events or issued to the hostel students at the beginning of session.
- Classrooms are allocated to all schools alongside necessary ICT tools. The classrooms are utilized as per the schedules of the schools. The classrooms are cleaned on daily basis and monitored by supervisor.
- Facility for cleaning of classrooms, blocks, laboratories, library, etc. with automatic cleaning machine is there in the campus.
- All schools within the university campus are having essential software, and peripherals. The laboratory technicians and system administrators maintain the IT facilities within the campus. Just in case of major problems with maintenance, vendors are hired for maintenance of IT facilities.
- Generators are available for power backup.
- The maintenance of equipment's for RO plant, sewage, etc. are undertaken.
- Solar is installed and sensor-based lights are installed in the places of maximum utilization.
- UPS power is also given.
- Wellness center, sports facilities, transportation, etc. are maintained by the team.
- Data center provides all IT support & related operations like CCTVs, maintenance of LCD projectors, laptops, desktops, printers, & Wi-Fi and the classrooms.
- Firefighting equipment in both blocks, laboratories, etc. are fixed and maintained by the team.
- AMC are given to various vendors for AC/ Firefighting equipment/Lifts/RO/Generator/ UPS/Transformer/STP/etc.

- University has employed technicians (electrician and plumber) for keeping up and maintenance of electrical and drinking water facility.
- University has also appointed housekeeping staff to take care of the building.
- Maintenance of internet connectivity and CCTV security system, network is executed with the help of system administration team.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1 Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

Answer:

The university keeps an eye on resource mobilization and financial management. The allocation and planning of financial resources follow established protocols and processes. The organization has created plans for allocating funds and making sure that its financial administration is transparent. Regular internal and external audits are performed on the institution's revenue and expenses. The university's finance committee meets at least twice a year to discuss the university's financial condition

and planning. The university's strategic plan, which includes developing endowment assets, employing financial best practices in resource deployment, and utilizing a highly functional information technology infrastructure, supports the management of financial resources.

The goal of the resource mobilization policy is to direct the university's efforts in creating a solid financial foundation for its programmes. It examines the university's funding pattern, offers recommendations for raising money to support the strategic plan's implementation and, ultimately, the accomplishment of the university's vision and mission. The plan creates a crucial connection between the difficulties in obtaining outside funding and the ongoing internal improvements required to meet the goals. In general, resources are needed for different things, including administration, academic affiliation, infrastructure, development, and maintenance, as well as other things. In general, resources are needed for many different things, including administration, academic affiliation, infrastructure, development, and maintenance, as well as other things.

The funds required for infrastructure development are mobilized by way of term loans from the Commercial banks. The borrowing is kept limited to the extent of debt servicing capacity as per the terms and conditions of the banks. Funds for the above purpose are also provided by the members of the society by way of unsecured non-interest-bearing loans in case of need.

Being a self-financed University, the resource mobilization is mainly through the fee deposited by students. Other sources of financial revenue include:

1. Research Project Funding / Grants
2. Consultancy
3. Sponsorships for various events, conferences, seminars, etc.
4. Participation fee in various conferences, seminars organized by the University.
5. Grants & donations from external bodies
6. Endowments

The finance committee prepares the annual estimates of income and expenditure based on inputs from Academic Council and IQAC and its recommendations along with annual budget is put up to Board of Management for consideration and approval.

The financial planning and budgeting (operational expenses and capital investments) is an integral part of annual academic planning at University level.

The University has adequate Accounting Policy and Financial Procedure so as to undertake following actions:

1. The Budget estimates for the forthcoming year shall be prepared by the Chief Finance and Accounts Officer and submitted to the Board of Management through the Finance Committee.
2. The annual report and the annual accounts and balance sheets are to be prepared by the Chief Finance and Account Officer and submitted to the Board of Management through the Finance Committee.

3. There shall be an annual detailed audit by a registered chartered Accountant.

6.4.4 Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Answer:

Since its inception, the University has a well-established system of both internal and external audits.

External audit:

University has appointed CA as an external audit agency.

The CA firm regularly does account audit every financial year. The auditors' team visits the office for audits. After the audit, the Audit Report is delivered to the Management for evaluation. The auditor makes sure that all payments and expenditures are lawfully allowed. Any questions or problems that come up during the audit are addressed with the pertinent supporting vouchers and documentation, and within the set time frames.

The main object of the system is to ensure transparency with all stakeholders.

Auditor follow audit processes to ensure that the financial statements are free of individual discretions and present a genuine and fair picture of the condition of things at the end of financial year. The audit compares revenue from fees, grants, gifts, and other sources against expenses incurred and assets acquired or written off.

Internal Audit:

All the expenses are being checked by the CFO. There is a regular check on income & expenditure & audit of all important processes such as payroll, procurement, fixed assets management and financial accounting, revenue recognition and statutory compliance.

Transaction processing at the accounts department is the initial step of control where all aspects of validating a transaction are checked.

A system of pre-audit is the second step of control before processing any payment. Each payment and its attached documents are examined by the accounts department. To ensure that payments are made properly, the auditor verifies every aspect of control, such as

- Approval
- Authorization,
- Paperwork and
- Appropriateness of the demand,

In third stage Payments are approved by CFO Before issuing funds, he also does a random check, who oversees the internal audit.

The important aspects covered in Audit Process are:

Admission - Verification of the Data of the students admitted, fees collected and scholarship amount disbursed.

Payroll- Payroll processing and settlements.

Movable & Immovable assets- The audit process covers the audit of all movables and immovable assets. Any items purchased are entered with entire detail in a stock register. That stock register is maintained regularly by the store in charge. All inflow and outflow of movables and immovable items are entered simultaneously. On any point of time the position of stock can be traced from that register. Store in charge regularly revisit the position of stock and inform the purchase manager on time .Audit of movables & immovable is done on a regular basis.

Financial Accounting — Review of accounts payable, receivable, general ledger, cash and bank balances, and year-end financial statements.

All external audits are also provided to the BOM for advice and evaluation .Any concerns from either agency are dealt with promptly, and remedial action is done at every level to ensure that all stakeholders in the system are financially included. Procedures are updated in accordance with changed rule in a smooth and timely manner, with strong emphasis on the integrity of processes and system.

Answer:

Environment conservation & sustainability has been one of the key priorities of RNBGU. University has not only adapted green practices, but it has also tried to encourage the community for conserving environment. RNBGU encourages its members to adopt the Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Re-Purpose & Recycle practices in campus. For transportation within campus, E- Cart is used. Tree plantation activities are conducted every year. Campus is build in such a way that natural light is available in every class & rooms.

1. Solid waste management:

Waste Management and Recycling are the tools used for reducing waste and protect environment.

Around 50 (large & small) waste bins are placed in university campus for proper collection & disposal of waste.

The University has banned plastic use in its campus.

The solid waste collected in form of Food, Cafeteria waste & plant leaves (Bio degradable) is disposed in a place where it is converted into compost/manure naturally. This manure is used to feed the plants and trees grown in University campus.

Paper and plastic waste (minimal), is supplied to a local vendor which further recycles or disposes it.

University has developed ERP system, where in minimal use of papers & study material in form of e-content is ensured. Publication of result, attendance all are conducted on ERP, hence less paper is used. All

communication is done through emails.

Digital library & access to online journals is ensuring conversion over conventional printed books.

2. Liquid Waste Management:

Being located in the desert city of Bikaner, RNB Global University is committed to minimize the wastage of water.

Timely inspection is conducted for detecting leakages from taps. Sensor based urinals & Pressmatic Taps are installed in all rest rooms for saving water.

Sprinkler is used for watering the lawns.

Drip irrigation is used for watering trees & plants.

University encourages the staff and students to develop the habit of saving water & installed signage for the same.

The sewerage waste is treated with the help of a Sewerage Treatment Plant, installed in the university campus. The capacity of the STP is 55 KLD.

3. Bio Medical Waste-

The Bio Medical waste in form of any blood stained gauze & bandage or the used sanitary pads are decomposed with the help of incinerator.

4. E-waste management: E waste generated at University campus is collected at the IT department and then supplied to vendor for proper disposal or recycling. University has a MOU with an authorized agency for e- waste disposal.

Students and staff members are encouraged to develop a habit of disposing their personal e waste properly.

5. Waste recycling system:

The organic waste is converted into compost manure in compost unit at university campus.

The waste water from RO plants is used for floor cleaning and in fountains in Admin building

6. Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management-

There is no radioactive waste produced in RNB Global University.

The acids or alkaline produced, if any during any chemical reaction, in chemistry laboratory is first neutralized before disposing.

Mock Parliament- This activity develops democratic values among students. Also their skills of debate, raising an issue of public & national importance are developed.

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual.

Answer:

Best Practice - 1

1. Title of the Practice

Transparency in Administration and Academics using Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP)

2. Objectives of the Practice-

- To ensure transparency and control in the academic, administrative and assessment activities of University
- To ensure that students can access study material, results & information from anywhere and anytime.
- To ensure anytime & anywhere access of information to faculty & staff members for academic & administrative purpose and efficient utilization of their time.

- To ensure on time and hands-on information regarding examination, time table, continuous evaluation to students and parents
- Reduce use of paper by implementing ERP.

The overall objective of being a centre of excellence has been facilitated by implementing ERP

3. The Context-

In the effort to provide world class education & equip students with necessary skill and knowledge which will make them capable enough to compete at global level, university have chosen **Learning Management System (LMS)** as a mode of delivering education.

This system not only ensures effective and interactive delivery of education but it also helps the student to be competitive at global level.

The use of ICT enabled tools for imparting education in western Rajasthan is very less. As the result students, mainly the students of rural areas are not exposed to modern pedagogy tools.

University believes that the time of faculty members should be devoted more in teaching and research; hence there was a need of system for them where they have easy access to all information.

ERP provides better support for planning, analysis, assessment, compliance & reporting. **It also ensures better control over the organization & simplify the decision making process.**

4. The Practice

University have a MOU with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS-ion), one of the world's leading software solution provider as a service provider of its ERP & LMS.

University has the subscription of Gmail and separate mail id is made for each students & faculty members. All communication is done via Gmail only. All information & circulars are issued via Gmail, along with ERP (TCS-ion)

University also has a dynamic website www.rnbglobal.edu.in

The web link of University's is <http://rnbconnect.rnbglobal.edu.in/>

LMS provides a dynamic platform for delivering & planning effective and interactive teaching.

Classes are mapped on LMS, the attendance of students is marked on this system. Lesson plan is shared. The class notes in form of PPT, are uploaded on LMS along with additional material.

Audio and Video inputs can also be uploaded, which further makes the delivery effective. All the assignments, class tests, are mapped on this system and evaluation is done on the same.

Students can access the uploaded material anywhere and at any time. The summary of attendance provides students a clear idea about their attendance in respective subjects.

The faculty & staff members "Leaves" are managed through this system, they can apply for leaves online, this reduces paper work and is time saving as well. Information about holiday list can be accessed & their salary slip can be also be generated.

The library of the university is integrated through the library module of TCS ion, all accession & issuing of books is done through ERP. It ensures proper record keeping and safety of books.

The faculty and students can search for books on the system, which provides information about the availability of a particular book and its copies available in library at given point of time. **Students can also reserve the book on their name.**

The students **can raise their tickets on Student Help Desk** service available on dash board, this service is provided by university to its students for timely solution of their problems and issues. This ensures transparency in the procedure and also useful in monitoring the progress.

Admission process of university is also integrated with ERP. Interested students can apply online for admission and can fix the day of campus visit.

Examination process is also managed by ERP which includes hall ticket generation to display of exam results. The examination process on ERP be used to manage both regular and backlog examinations.

Subject Selection Rules can be applied at the point of registration/enrolment to the semester/session, and similarly exam eligibility rules can be applied prior to examinations based on the criteria for the required examination.

This also works as a screening mechanism and only students meeting all required criteria, such as attendance, internal marks, assignments, etc. are permitted to appear for the main examination for the level/program.

This system ensures secrecy and improves the efficiency. Students can access the results online.

University believes that use of such systems exposes the students to the modern teaching systems which have been adapted in leading educational institutes worldwide.

A university student needs are much more to be fulfilled by traditional teaching pedagogy. LMS is an interface where faculty members can complement their teaching with latest information & can make it interesting.

5. Evidence of Success

Owing to the breakdown of COVID-19, from 15th March 2020, the offline classes were suspended as a precautionary measure all over the country. **RNBGU was one of first educational institute which was able to start online classes within 3 days i.e 18th March 2020.**

Our students didn't faced any problem in entire online mode of education. Not only classes but other pedagogy tools were effectively used, in a situation where students of education institutes from across the country suffered where traditional system of teaching existed.

- Admission process is transparent and accessible.
- Regular Follow up is done for attendance and thus students are regular and maintain good attendance.
- Parents can also monitor the progress & attendances of their wards.
- Interesting, latest and anywhere accessible study material, help student in learning better and thus results of University are 90% and above most of the time
- Academic activities are well coordinated and student satisfaction is quite high
- Library is better managed.

- The ERP system eventually has helped in improving the output of Students, faculty & University at large.

Students have become very much comfortable in working on digital platforms.

This system has helped to bridge the capability gap, since almost all business organizations today are functioning with the help of ERP.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

RNB Global University understands that many students who come from tier-III or rural background might take some time to be comfortable on this practice. Therefore university conducts extensive orientation session on LMS before the beginning of first semester of all programs.

Any problem faced by students regarding LMS is resolved at the earliest by the Student Help Desk and IT Cell.

For those students who do not have personal computers, university has developed a Mobile App as well.

New Faculty members are compulsorily given training for working on LMS by IT Cell during their orientation session, held after

their joining, as they may not have the past experience of delivering lectures ICT enabled system

The supporting hardware needed are also provided by university. All class rooms of university are equipped with ICT tools. The complete networking is undertaken by Hewlett-Packard(HP).

The ERP system gets updated every session/year; as per the updates made by TCS-ion on the feedback of various educational institutes, including RNB Global University.

7. Notes (Optional)

University believes that all higher education institutes should implement modern education delivery system in their campus. The needs of university students are different, which consists of access to latest updated information of their subjects.

Also the students should be equipped with employability skills, for which experience of working /studying on such systems develops these skills.

The service provider for such system should be wisely selected on the basic of their expertise. Any interruption in the service can derail the process. Proper training should be provided to the students and faculty members to work effectively on such system.

The practice of using webinar, seminars and video conferencing via Google meet / Zoom meet widely became popular during COVID- 19, however **RNBGU, since its inception in year 2015, has been conducting online webinars & seminars from experts present at different locations.**

1. Title of the Practice

Efforts on Environment Conservation & Sustainability

2. Objectives of the Practice-

RNB Global University is located at village Khara, Bikaner district which is a part of Thar Desert, in western Rajasthan

The Major objectives of this practice are, to

- Be an active partner in ensuring environment Conservation & sustainability at regional level by involving and sensitizing students, faculty, staff & community.
- Maximize green practices, optimal use of fossil fuel based energy & to reduce carbon footprints.
- Harvest rain water & to tap solar energy.
- Reduce waste & ensure proper waste management.
- Maintain a pollution free, healthy and

eco friendly green campus.

- Encourage plantation by motivating all stakeholders.

3. The Context -

As mentioned in our constitution, it shall be the duty of every citizen to protect and improve the natural environment”.

University since its inception has kept environment conservation & sustainability a focus area in its functioning and believes that this can only be achieved if all stakeholders work in this direction.

Khara area observes the extreme variations in temperature. Ground water is below 450 feet and that too is hard in nature, Annual rainfall is around 220 mm, which is very low. Sand storms are common in the summer season. The flora of this area consists majorly of xerophytes.

But this area has abundant sunlight which can be tapped. Rain water, whatever received, if can be harvested & conserved can supplement the water needed.

For encouraging a positive mindset for adapting green practices among all stakeholders, an example was to be presented. University by all its efforts tried to set an example.

4. The Practice

The concern towards environment conservations has been since the laying of foundation stone for building of this University.

The **layout of roads and buildings** has been kept in such a way that **no existing trees were harmed.**

The building of university has been constructed with bricks **made up of Fly Ash.** This shows the commitment of university from the very 1st day.

Use of Drip & Sprinkler irrigation & extensive plantation done at the time of construction of campus reflects the current green ecosystem , **where rich variety of birds can be spotted which are not common to Thar dessert.**

Community outreach- University has **adopted three nearby villages(Khara, Dandusar, & Husansar)** and students regularly conducts activities which educate and motivates the residents to preserve the environment in form of Nukkad Natak, & rallies for environment conservation, educate farmers on use of modern agriculture practices ,etc.

Under **“You Plant We Grow”** campaign, university invites school students from nearby areas, to visit its campus and plant trees, so as to develop & inculcate a habit & sensitize them towards environment.

Environment related commemorative days such as Water Day, World Environment, etc day are celebrated at the university.

Since its Inception University has been both encouraging & participating with the community for plantation drives every year.

Under the campaign “**Plant a Tree & Dedicate to Someone You Love**” a toll free number has been provided by the university.

In the year 2019, 5000 saplings were sponsored by university to Rotary club for plantation. 2000 plants were given to Khara Gram Panchyat for the same & planted with the efforts of students.

Flora & Fauna- **University conducts plantation drives every year.** The barren land of university is today lush green with a wide variety of trees & plants. University has established **Neem Farm, Date Palm Farm, Crop cafeteria & Herbal garden** in the campus.

Energy- LED lights, **Motion sensors & timer based devices** for energy conservation are installed. Air conditioners are centrally monitored. A **solar power plant** of 50 KW capacity has been installed and wheeled to grid.

Water– efficient use of water & sensitization of all members for using water in a responsible way is ensured. **Sensor based urinals & pressmatic taps** has been installed. Rain water recharge & harvesting system is constructed in the campus. **The rain water from roof is collected in a tank which is of 5 lakh litre capacity.** Open well collects flowing water at the time of rains. For irrigation, **drip & sprinkler system** is installed.

Waste Management- University has a **STP** for treating the sewerage. The waste water from RO plant is collected and used for floor cleaning. The organic waste is converted into **compost manure**. The university has an **MOU** for e-waste management.

Controlling Pollution- **Ban on use of plastic & restricted entry of automobiles.** **E-cart** & bicycles are used for movement within campus. Staff is encouraged to pool their vehicles for saving fuel. The bio medical waste is destroyed in the **incinerator**. There is zero tolerance for tobacco.

Evidence of Success-

University has received following awards for this practice-

1. Award from **Forest Department- Bikaner(Raj)** for its significant contribution in planting trees on **22.04.2018**
2. Award from Rotary Club Bikaner for Plantation activities & for participation in “**Green & Clean Bikaner**” followed by students participation in **Walkathon** on 28-09-2019.
3. Award from Rotary Club for participation in “**Green Bikano**” dated 04-08-2021.
4. Appreciation certificate from Bikaner District Agarwal Association (Youth) dated 07-04-2021
5. Rotary Club Bikaner award for Environment Efforts in year 2019-20

University has following certifications-

1. ISO 50001:2011 Energy Management System dated 16-02-2021
2. ISO 14001:2015 Environmental Management System dated 16-02-2021

More than 30 schools have been involved in the “You Plant We Grow” campaign so far.

The green cover at university has improved the quality of air.

As the result of rain water recharge system, **the TDS of underground water in this area, which was earlier 9730 has significantly reduced to approx 3250.**

The power generated from the solar plant is wheeled to the grid.

Reduction in carbon footprints because of the above mentioned practices.

The students and other staff members have been sensitized towards the noble cause of environment conservation & voluntarily participate in plantation drives.

The adopted villages has been sensitized on environment conservation.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Being in desert area, university is facing the problem of fresh water for its requirements. The only source of fresh water in this area is Indira Gandhi canal, which is 8-10 KM away.

The University purchases water from the suppliers for its requirement. The management and finance department provided necessary support.

Greater initial cost and investment in shifting to renewable sources of energy, but university, keeping the long term approach decided to invest the funds required.

The Community participation was an area where university faced some hurdles in the early period, University approached the Village Panchyats and took them in confidence and in due course of time the people of those villages were also involved.

For outreach activities, university collaborated with “Rotary Clubs” at Bikaner and “Bikaner Theatre Festival” organizing committee for addressing community.

Because of high temperature, wilting of plants takes place. University has installed protective cover over the young plants and ensured proper irrigation.

Contribution to Women Empowerment

The term women empowerment refers to the emancipation of women from socio-economic restraints of dependence, and to take decisions on her own..

Western Rajasthan, the region in which university is situated has a traditional society. Still in many aspects discrimination between siblings is observed, whether in upbringing or access to education.

Girl Childs are deprived of their basic right to education, married at a young age, forced not to go for vocational or professional courses and if anyhow, they take admission and complete their courses then restricting them from moving out of Bikaner to pursue their careers

Without empowering the half of world's population, we cannot imagine of a stable and prosperous world.

Education is the most powerful tool for ensuring women empowerment. Education not only empowers women but it can also help them to **gain financial independence & strengthen their self-esteem.**

Also the governments in India have been talking of increasing Gross enrolment ratio in higher education, which has been 25-28% since 2010.

In HEI of Rajasthan, the enrollment of girls is comparatively less in the streams of Commerce & Management, Law and Agricultural science.

University believes that it is the duty of all responsible sections of society to contribute for empowering women.

Hence, University have an objective of not only encouraging more and more female students in its all programs but also to encourage female faculties to join its campus.

RNBGU thus acts as a platform where our women can learn, grow, develop & showcase their talent.

From 23.8 % female faculty members in year 2016-17 to 43.1% female faculty members in year 2020-2021, around 30% of the Admin staff at university are females. This provide them a platform where they get an opportunity to show case their caliber.

One of the core objective of RNBGU since its inception, has been to actively participate in the process of women empowerment.

University offers a wide range of Scholarship. Any girl students, not falling in such categories are offered a 10% scholarship irrespective of class & creed.

The university campus has all amenities and facilities which are required for the safety of girls students, which includes-

24*7 CCTV surveillance.

Guarded high walled campus.

Medical facilities with ambulance.

Separate hostel & Common room for girls.

The Internal Complaint Committee-**ICC** ensures zero tolerance for any incident of sexual harassment.

Through its **state of craft ERP & LMS**, the delivery of education has been made very interactive & interesting. By using these systems, girl's students also develops skills needed to work on digital platform.

The women cell of the university plans an annual gender sensitization plan which includes those activities which encourages, educates and develop girl students to grow, and have access to vital information. These activities

include, self-defense workshops, medical checkups, knowledge on hygiene, seminars on legal and constitutional rights.

For faculty and staff members, university not only believes in simply providing employment, but also motivated the female faculty members to occupy the leadership positions at University.

Also University has a vision that in coming five years **50%** of its leadership positions should be occupied by women.

University has also worked in the nearby community to encourage girl students to dream big and try to show them a way to fulfill that dream.

University through its **Young Achiever Award campaign** has rewarded best performing girl students of nearby schools. **Young girls from various schools are invited at university's expense. Training workshops are conducted for them**, plantation activities are done & they also interact with students & faculty members.

The university also conducts legal aid camps in nearby villages on the legal rights of women.

For expanding its outreach activities, University has tied up with Rotary Aadhya, which is an all women club of Rotary Club Bikaner.

University has also been awarded by Rotary Club, Bikaner for its exemplary service to society.

For encouraging the girl students in decision making process, University motivates girl students to join various students forum. All co-curricular activities are planned & executed by these clubs.

The percentage of female students at RNB Global University is very promising.

The percentage of female students among all programs in last five years has been above 43%.

In **PG courses** the percentage of female students has been **above 54 %** in last five years.

The percentage of girl students in professional courses clearly depicts that university has been able to attract more girls at its campus.

The placement data of University is also very promising. **Out of total placements more than 44.4% placement is of girl students.** This is significant achievement which will empower them in their life by gaining financial independence.

Out of total Startup's initiated by the university students, 45 % are of females. The Incubation & Entrepreneurship Cell has provided Industry & Academia Mentorship to these girl students along with the seed money.

This gives them an exposure of working culture of various organizations. Placement assistance provided to female students has helped them to receive good placement offers.

The various practices & policies which has contributed in achieving this status are-

1. Three Stage security check posts, zero tolerance for female harassment.
2. Hostel for female students is very safe place to reside.
3. Free transportation facility for girl students of hostel for visiting city.
4. Sanitary Pad Dispenser machine.
5. Sanitary Pad destroyer machine.
6. Interaction of students and staff with the eminent female personalities, which insists the feeling of pride and motivation.
7. Celebrations of various events like Women's Day celebrations, Garba Festival, Navratra Celebrations, Basant Panchmi in which female students participate with enthusiasm and joy.
8. Day Care Centre for children of female faculties & Staff.
