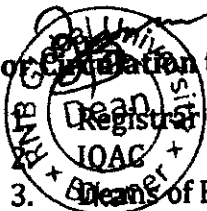



## **Report on**

### **“Awareness Programme on the Eradication of Dowry System”**

#### **Introduction:**

On 9th April 2024, our team, comprising eight classmates, undertook an outreach activity at Govt. Sr. Secondary School, Khara, Bikaner, aiming to address the issue of the dowry system prevalent in the community. ## **C. Objectives:**

## INTRODUCTION

RNB Global University conducted an enlightening awareness campaign on Cervical and Breast Cancer in association with Rotary Club of Bikaner Aadhya and Rotaract Club of the University. Dr. Khushboo Joshi, In charge Gynae, Satellite Hospital, Bikaner was the Expert. The event aimed at spreading awareness about the above diseases and bursting myths relating to them.

**About the Session:**

The University strongly encourages gender parity and is constantly working towards providing a conducive environment for efficient and effective communications between the employees and students. 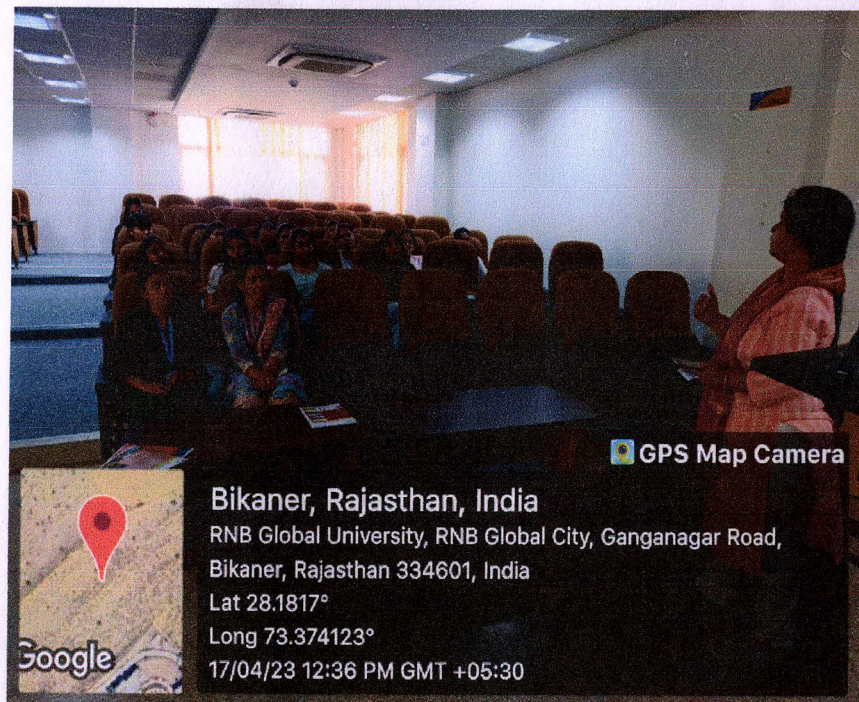

Around 18 participants from various departments of the University attended this session. It is hoped that every department also conduct such workshops in future.

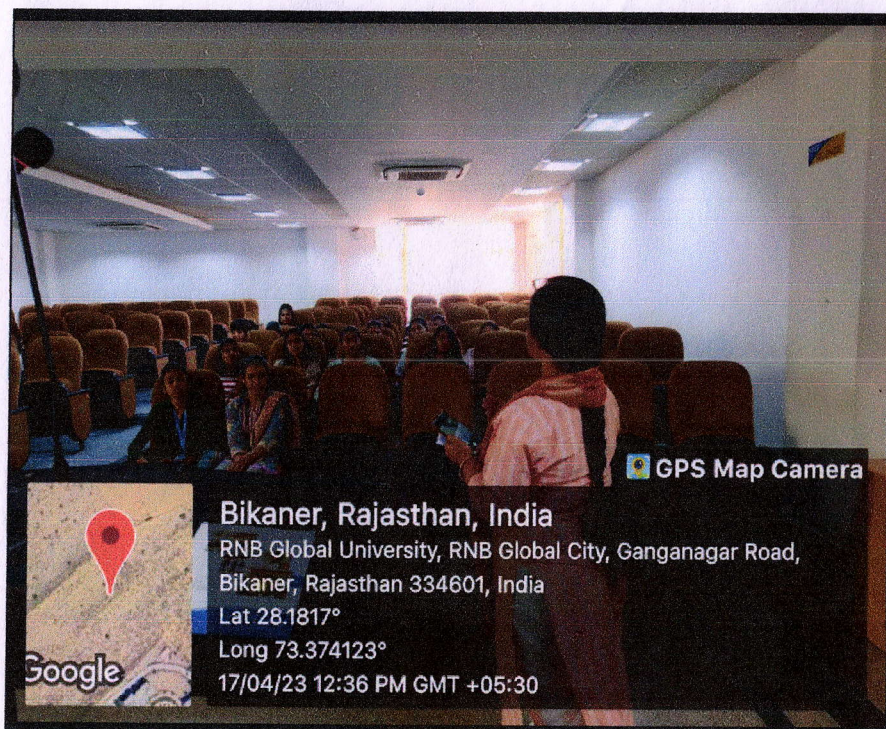

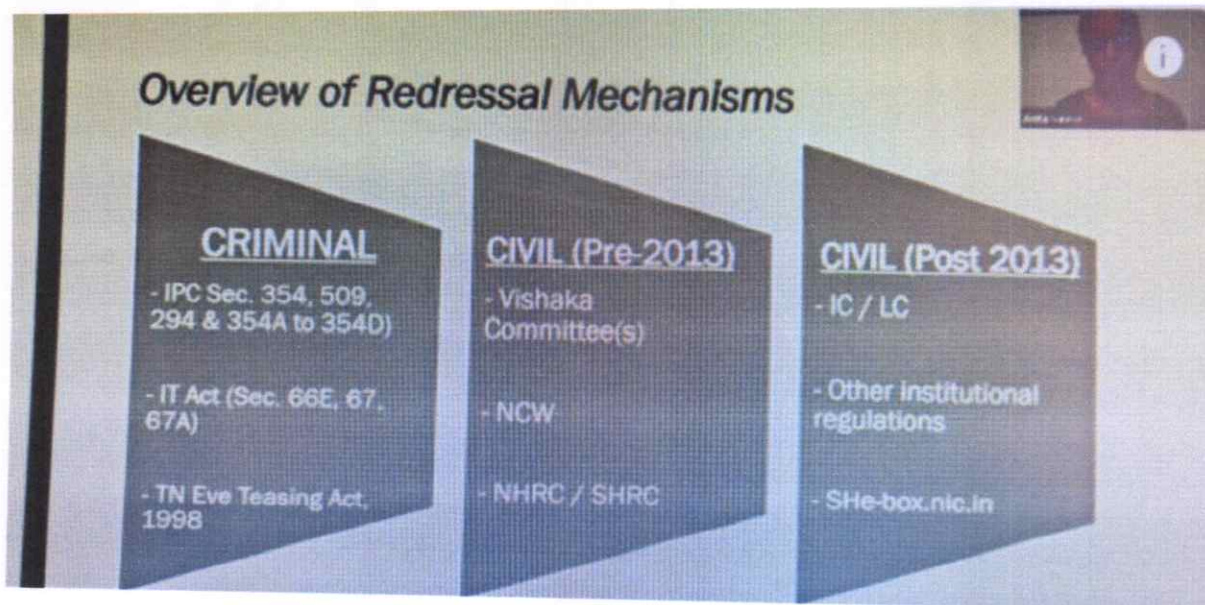
## Sexual harassment – Sec. 2 (n)

"Sexual harassment" includes any one or more of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (whether directly or by implication) namely: (i) Physical contact and advances; (ii) A demand or request for sexual favours; or (iii) Making sexually coloured remarks; or (iv) Showing pornography; or (v) Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

The following circumstances (if occurring in relation to or connected with any act or behaviour of sexual harassment) may also be considered as "sexual harassment": (i) Implied or explicit promise of preferential treatment in her employment; (ii) Implied or explicit threat of detrimental treatment in her employment; (iii) Implied or explicit threat about her present or future employment; (iv) Interference with her work or creating an intimidating or offensive or hostile work environment for her; (v) Humiliating treatment likely to affect her health or safety.

## Introduction & object of Webinar

The purpose of this POSH Act 2013 is to prevent sexual harassment against women in the workplace and also to protect them. Workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a woman's fundamental right to equality and right to life, guaranteed under Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Constitution of India. This Act also ensures effective redressal of complaints of sexual harassment of women.

### About the Seminar :

School of Law RNB Global University organized a webinar on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace: Understanding and Analyzing the Prohibition and Redressal Mechanisms under the POSH Act 2013" (Prevention of Sexual harassment at workplace ACT 2013)". the main aim of the seminar was to enhance the knowledge and make the student understand the pragmatic application of the provisions relating to the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013. The seminar embarked with a introduction on what actually is sexual harassment at workplace and how such complaints by any aggrieved woman are redressed by an Internal Complaint Committee. The Webinar was joined by Prof G.S. Karkara (Dean School of Law), the Faculty of School of Law and students of School of Law .

The welcome address was given by Lavanya Lakhotia, who welcomed the Respected Guest Speaker for the webinar, Adv Jai Parkash Tahalani (Adv Supreme Court of India) and the Dean Sir, Faculty School of Law, and the students. In her welcome address she outlined the details of the seminar, and a brief Introduction of the Guest Speaker.

The Guest Speaker Adv Jai Prakash, for the webinar dealt with various intrinsic and extrinsic aspects of the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act 2013. In the later part of webinar, the procedure for redressal of complaints of Sexual Harassment at workplace by an aggrieved woman and compounding of offence was discussed by the Guest Speaker. While Concluding the Webinar the Respected speaker discussed the landmark Judgements Of the Hon'ble Supreme Court relating to Sexual Harassment and also critically analyzed the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013.

In the Concluding part of the webinar the Guest Speaker addressed the questions of the students about the practical applicability of the provisions of the said Act. Finally a Vote of Thanks was addressed by Prof G.S. Karkara, Dean School of Law to the Special Guest Adv. Jai Prakash Tahalani for his valuable opinions and Knowledge on the Subject.

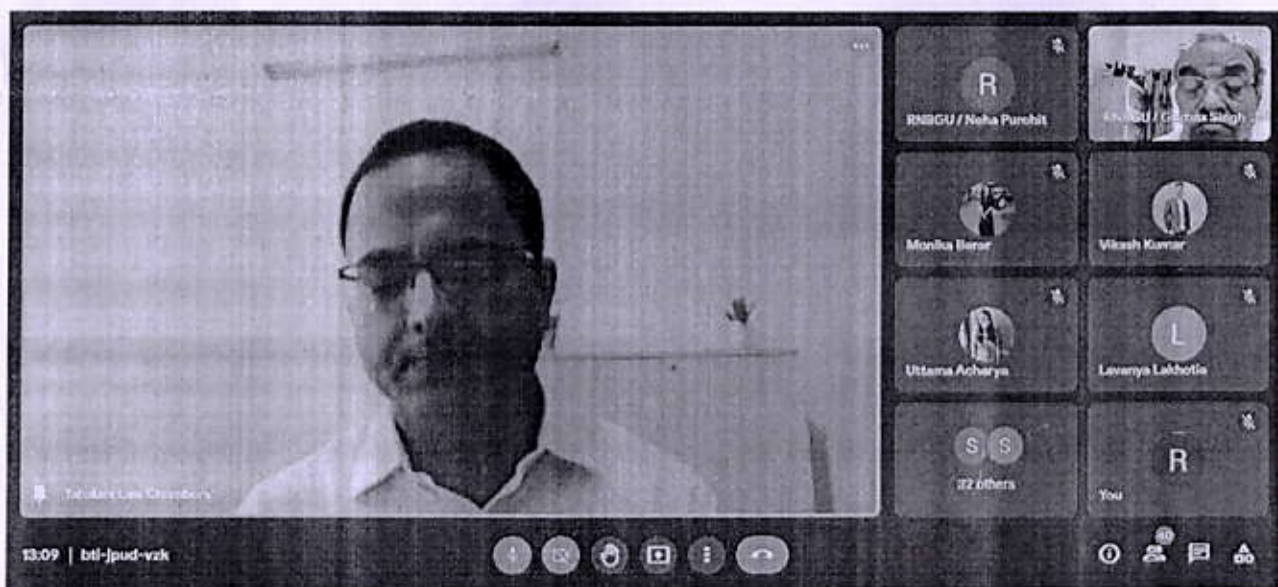



## ABOUT THE SESSION

It is important for a woman when she work outside that she is safeguarded by the organization in which she is working. The Session on "Sexual Harassment at Workplace" is taken just to aware all the faculties whether they are male or female to make them aware about the harassment of the women at workplace. In this session the detailed discussion was held for what is harassment, kinds of harassment at the workplace and legalities of sexual harassment at the workplace .

Ms. Zaiba khan Assistant Professor of Computer Science initiate the session by telling the harassment and its kind, she said Harassment may be mentally or physically of a woman so we should not make any kind of gesture posture which harasses a woman even sending text messages, whatsapp, e-mails which makes a woman uncomfortable is called harassment. Then she talked about the range of harassing behavior she said :- physical conduct, verbal conduct and non-verbal conduct if harassing a woman is considered as harassment , there may be psychological harassment , internet harassment lastly she concluded by telling that what impact it does to the woman who is working outside her home.

Then Ms. Bindiya Tater Associate Professor of School of Commerce & Management talk about the preventive measure what precautionary measures should be taken by the organization to cease these kind of harassment at the work place , like the CCTV cameras at every place , Creating an atmosphere conducive to increased participation of women, positively encouraging and supporting them, Identification documents (driving license, photo ID, address proof, Fingerprints) to be collected from drivers, security guards and all casual staff, regular reminders of the ethical values of the company , through email, posters, sessions , etc. Provide training to all women employees and educate them about the rights and facilities and awareness of the company policies on harassment , on gender discrimination or gender biased approach and the complaint process.

Ms. Sofia Kausar Assistant Professor of Law tell the legalities of the Sexual Harassment and its punishment. She said :- Sexual Harassment at workplace is a crime under section 354 IPC and it is also a non-bailable offence. It is must for every organization for have a Committee which can look after these matters as given under Sexual Harassment Act, 2013. The Punishment under the IPC is from one to two three years . She also told the procedure how and where a woman can complaint. She also discussed the very important case on this aspect i.e Vishaka v. State of Rajasthan, this case was the first case before the Indian Judiciary regarding Sexual Harassment at Workplace.

The discussion is all about the general awareness among the staff of the organization regarding harassment at workplace. It is mandatory for every organization to have a committee for the protection of women so that she will feel secure and can have inclusive growth of her.
