Copyright

- Academic publications and other unique creative works are protected by copyright, a sort of intellectual property protection.
- A copyright owner is granted certain exclusive rights for a predetermined period of time under copyright rules.
- This covers the only authority to distribute, copy, and make modifications to a work.



Licensing

- Copyright does not have to be an all or nothing game.
- The author could transfer copyright to a journal but the journal could elect to license back to the author certain rights (e.g. right to post the article on a personal website, the right to re-use images in future publications etc.).

Creative Common Licenses



| Condition | Icon | Definition |
|--------------------|------------|---|
| Attribution | (i) | You must give appropriate credit, provide a link to the license, and indicate if changes were made. You may do so in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that suggests the licensor endorses you or your use. |
| Non- Commercial | \$ | You may not use the material for commercial purposes. |
| Share Alike | (2) | You must distribute your contributions under the same license as the original. |
| No Derivatives | (=) | You may not modify the work (e.g. translations, edited edition etc.) |

- Sherpa Fact **checks if compliance with funder open access policies** can be achieved with a particular journal.











Publishers by Country
