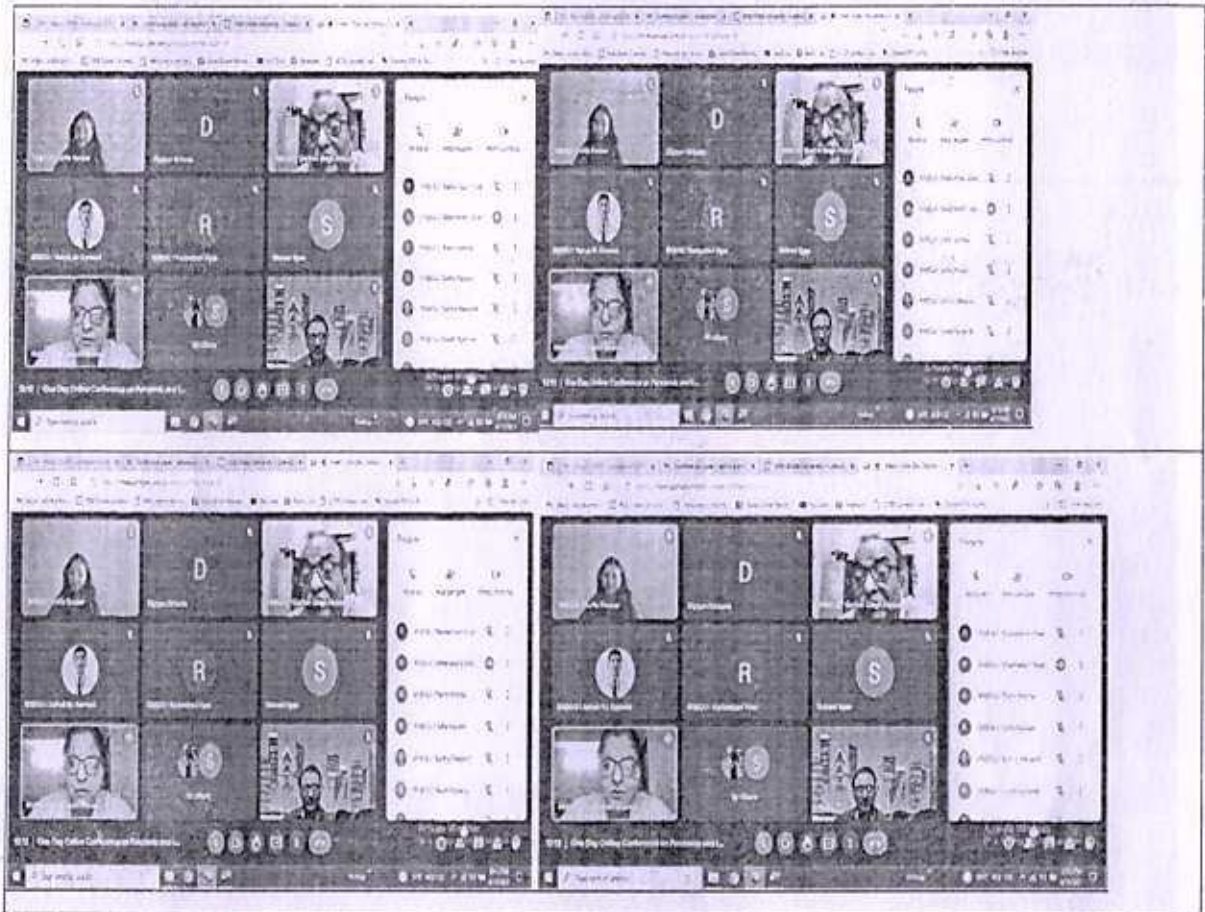

Introduction & object of Webinar

The purpose of this POSH Act 2013 is to prevent sexual harassment against women in the workplace and also to protect them. Workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a woman's fundamental right to equality and right to life, guaranteed under Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Constitution of India. This Act also ensures effective redressal of complaints of sexual harassment of women.

About the Seminar :

School of Law RNB Global University organized a webinar on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace: Understanding and Analyzing the Prohibition and Redressal Mechanisms under the POSH Act 2013" (Prevention of Sexual harassment at workplace ACT 2013)". the main aim of the seminar was to enhance the knowledge and make the student understand the pragmatic application of the provisions relating to the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013. The seminar embarked with a introduction on what actually is sexual harassment at workplace and how such complaints by any aggrieved woman are redressed by an Internal Complaint Committee. The Webinar was joined by Prof G.S. Karkara (Dean School of Law), the Faculty of School of Law and students of School of Law .

The welcome address was given by Lavanya Lakhotia, who welcomed the Respected Guest Speaker for the webinar, Adv Jai Parkash Tahalani (Adv Supreme Court of India) and the Dean Sir, Faculty School of Law, and the students. In her welcome address she outlined the details of the seminar, and a brief Introduction of the Guest Speaker.

The Guest Speaker Adv Jai Prakash, for the webinar dealt with various intrinsic and extrinsic aspects of the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act 2013. In the beginning of the session, he explained about what kind of acts amount to Sexual Harassment of a woman at workplace, which was a very interactive as it included practical examples of such incidents. Further the Respected Speaker elaborated about who is an aggrieved woman under the prevention of sexual harassment Act 2013, it included all the women from organized and unorganized sector whether employed temporarily or permanently. In the later part of webinar, the procedure for redressal of complaints of Sexual Harassment at workplace by an aggrieved woman and compounding of offence was discussed by the Guest Speaker. While Concluding the Webinar the Respected speaker discussed the landmark Judgements Of the Hon'ble Supreme Court relating to Sexual Harassment and also critically analyzed the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013.

In the Concluding part of the webinar the Guest Speaker addressed the questions of the students about the practical applicability of the provisions of the said Act. Finally a Vote of Thanks was addressed by Prof G.S. Karkara, Dean School of Law to the Special Guest Adv. Jai Prakash Tahalani for his valuable opinions and Knowledge on the Subject.



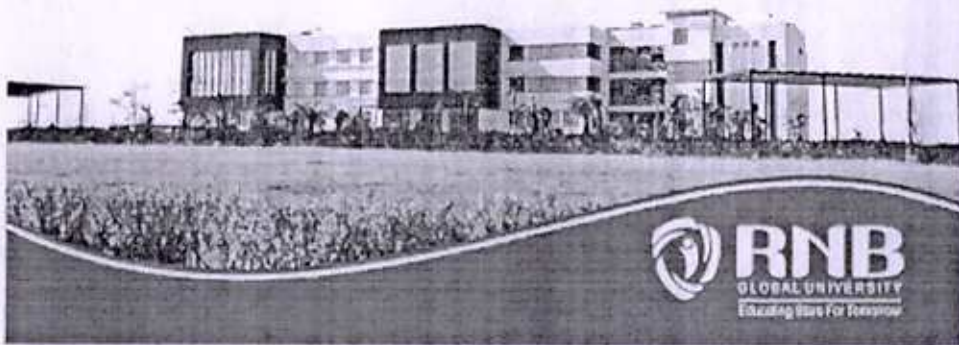

After Result Announcements, at the end of this program Dr Dipali Gupta-Registrar, RNB Golbal University given vote of the thanks.

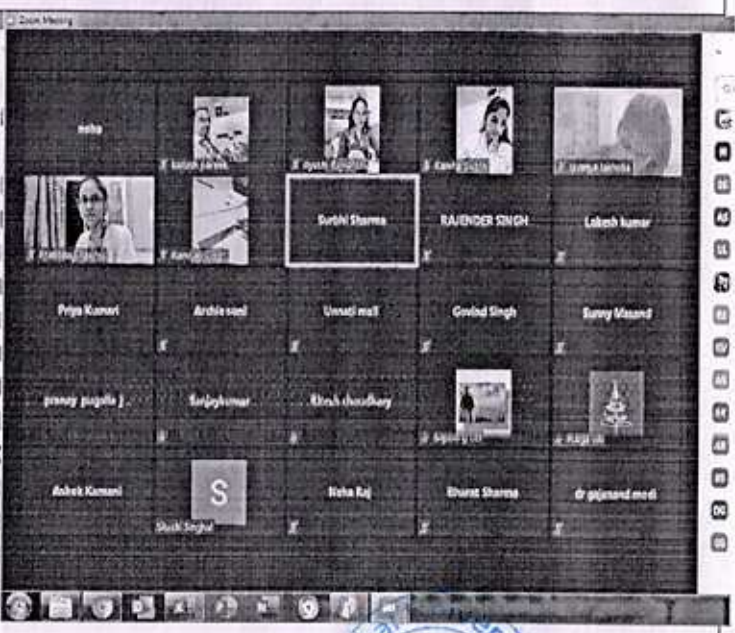
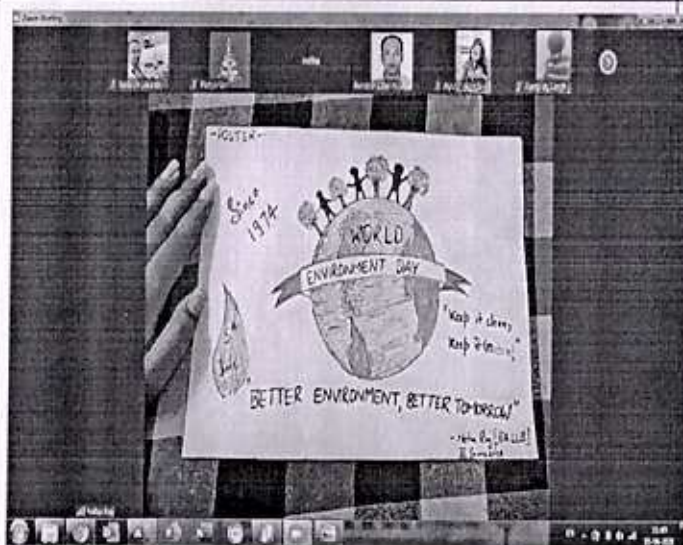
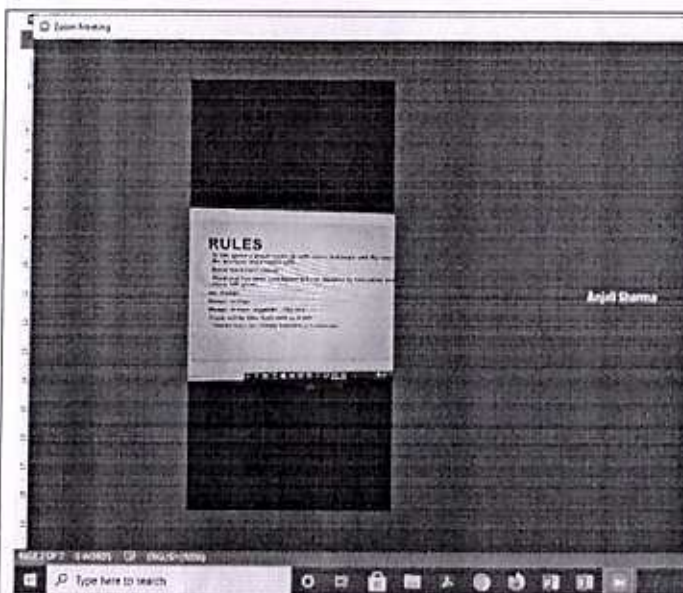

Minutes of the program

The Online Debate Competition has been started with the welcome address and a brief introduction of the topic i.e., "Corruption has been controlled by RTI", by Ms. Surya. Mr. Shubham Sharma described the rules of the debate competition.

At first Mr. Pratham presented his views in favour of the motion. He discussed the background of RTI Act and gave a brief of what RTI means, then presented his points about the positive effect of RTI in controlling the Corruption in India.

Then Shubham came with his strong points and spoke in against the motion. He countered the points of other opponent and discussed some loopholes of RTI Act.

Ms. Poonam Mor began her discussion with a quotation, she discussed some characteristics of RTI which helped in bringing transparency in the system.

Then Mr. Diptam Kirtania came to counter the points of his opponents and he discussed some sections of RTI Act and also gave a brief about the loopholes present in RTI Act. He also suggested some changes must be brought in RTI Act to ensure the transparency in the system & to tackle the problem of corruption.

Ms. Shirsti brought some light on the implementation of RTI Act and said that to ensure the right to information to citizens ,strict implementation of laws is needed. She talked about the vacant seats in CIC and SIC.

Ms. Surya began her discussion by putting some light on the corruption and its bad effects on the society and she talked about how RTI helped in controlling the corruption rate in India. She discussed some major cases of corruption which were discovered when RTI was filed by some citizens. By this way she presented her views in favour of the motion.

Then Ms. Shejal spoke about how the RTI helped in controlling the corruption rate. She discussed some major corruption cases like 2G scam etc.

After this another student named Nikhilesh presented his views against the motion and he countered the points of other students who spoke in favour of the motion.



Ms. Harshita gave a broad overview about the loopholes of RTI Act and she also suggested some solutions to deal with corruption. She also discussed the black marketing of oxygen cylinders during the Pandemic. 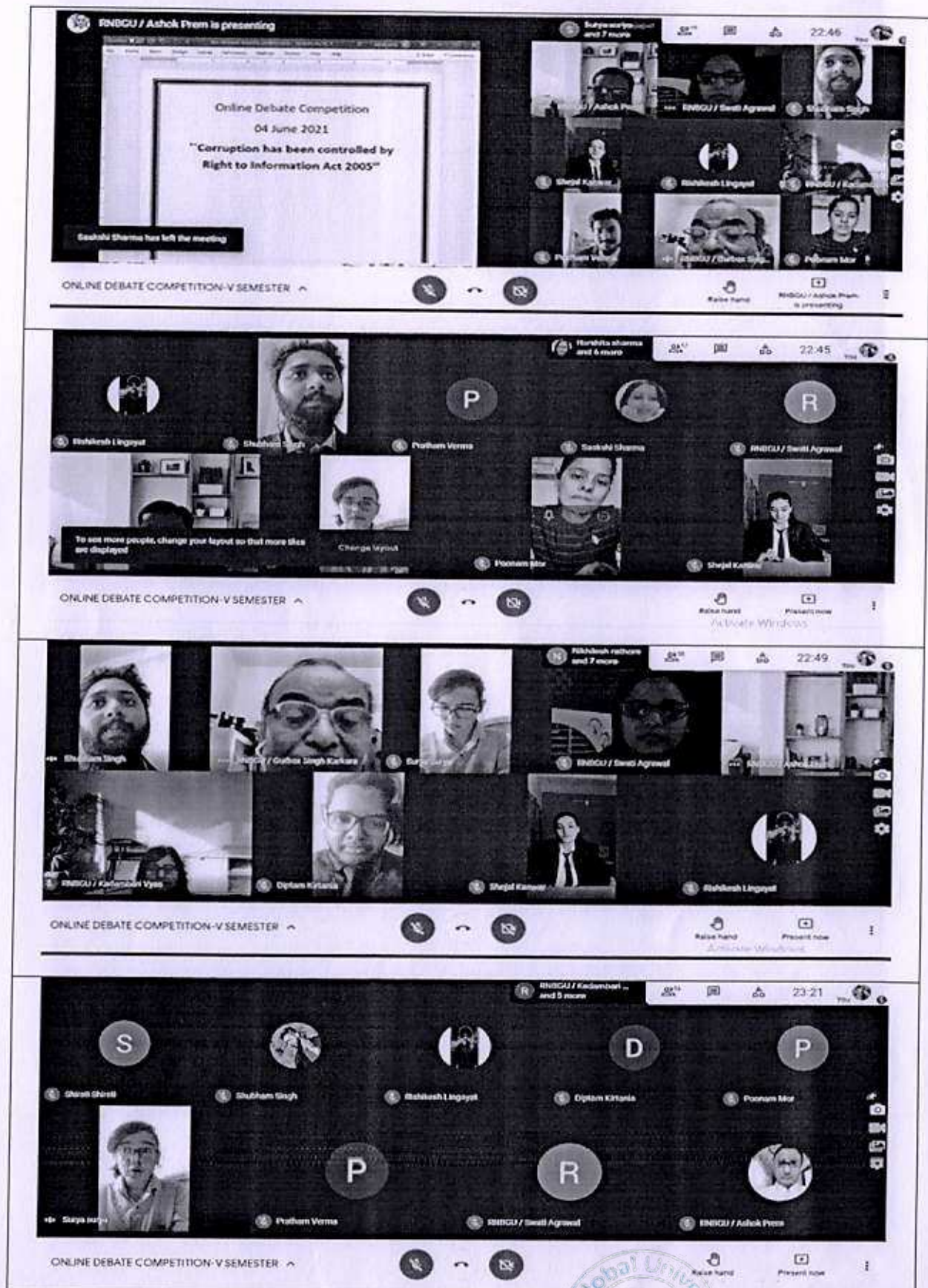

Why Debate competition was organised for students?

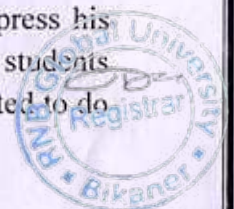



RNB Global University's Training and Placement Cell organized a Session on "**Communication Skills**" on 15th May 21.



Hence, life is full of up and down. 1 wrong step can take away all your fame, power and richness.



He then discussed about positive attitude by saying, always try to look Positive side of the things that are happening around you. It depends on your choice to look at positive or negative.

Don't be careless but be happy and optimistic. Never start thinking about the problem that may happen in future and start worrying about it but have a positive approach of solving it or to overcome it when that problem will arise. He quoted, "**Life is not about MARKS, but it's about making a MARK.**"

Mr. Atray then discussed about the 7 C's to Happiness & Success

1. **Courage:** "*Take the Plunge*" Fearlessness
2. **Character:** Nobody is perfect, we all make mistake and learn from those mistakes and try to improve ourselves.
3. **Creativity:** It gives you happiness. Follow your hobby passion it makes you physically and mentally fit.
4. **Calmness:** Always be calm while making decisions, it will you success by making a correct decision.
5. **Cheerfulness:** Be cheerful as they are liked and respected by people. Don't be dukhiatama.(Sad soul)
6. **Compassion:** Always think of other and try to be more Emphatic.
7. **Contentment:** Be happy with what you have. Have gratitude. Be ambitious with contentment.

During the Webinar, he also emphasized on good communication skills, have balance among them and nourish your soul through meditation and prayers & Ended with the story of Albert Einstein and his driver where the driver pretended to be Einstein and delivered a lecture in the college and everyone over there claps for him. 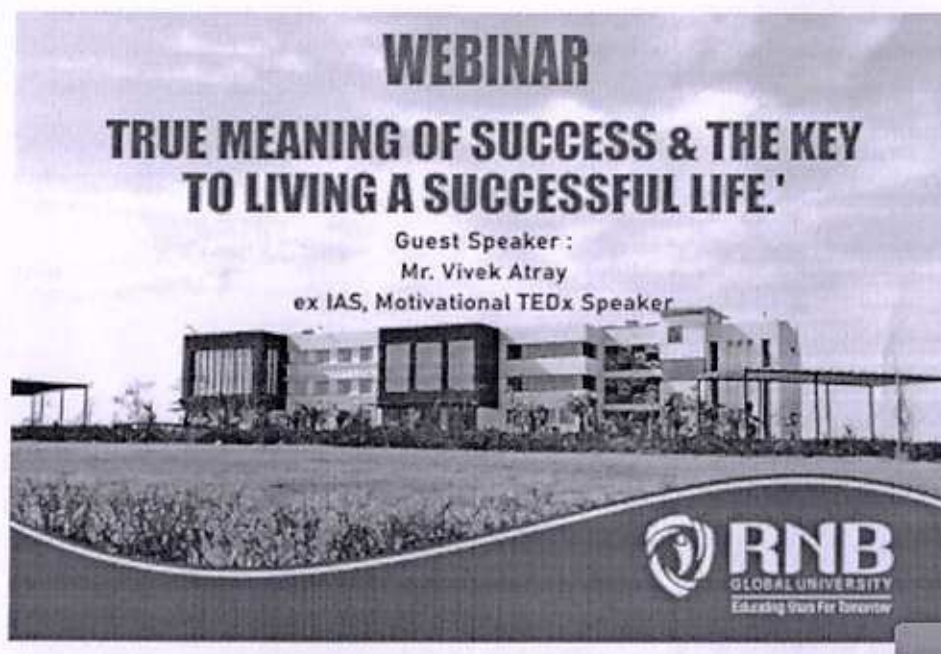

He has inspired thousands of youngsters to adopt a cheerful, positive & multidimensional approach in their lives.

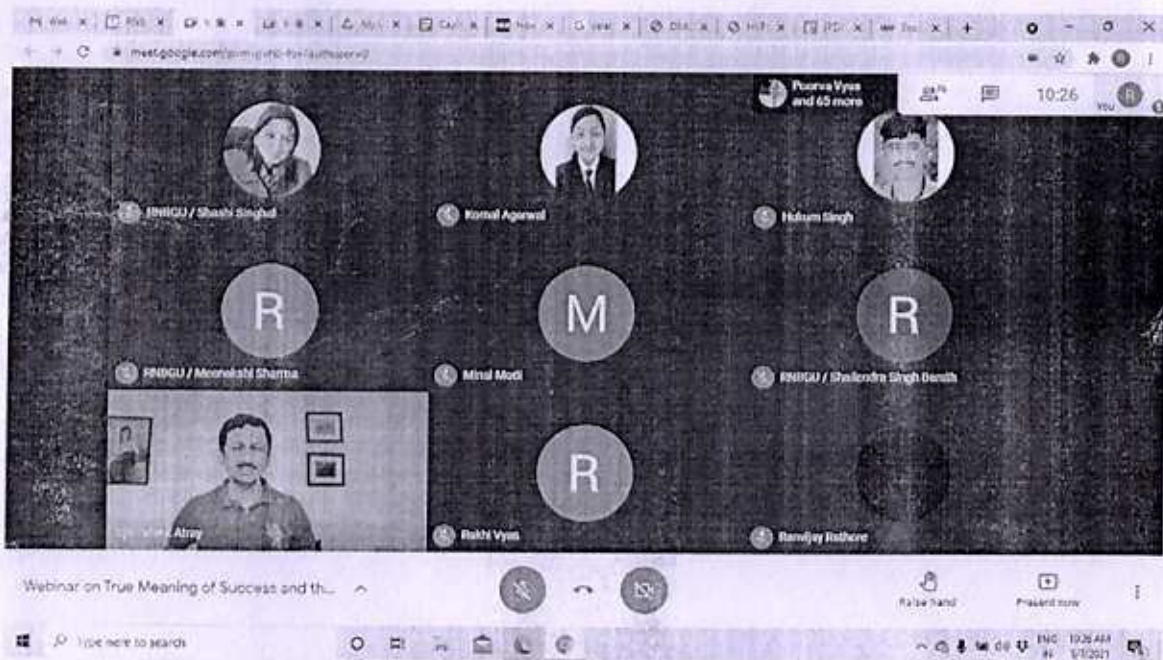
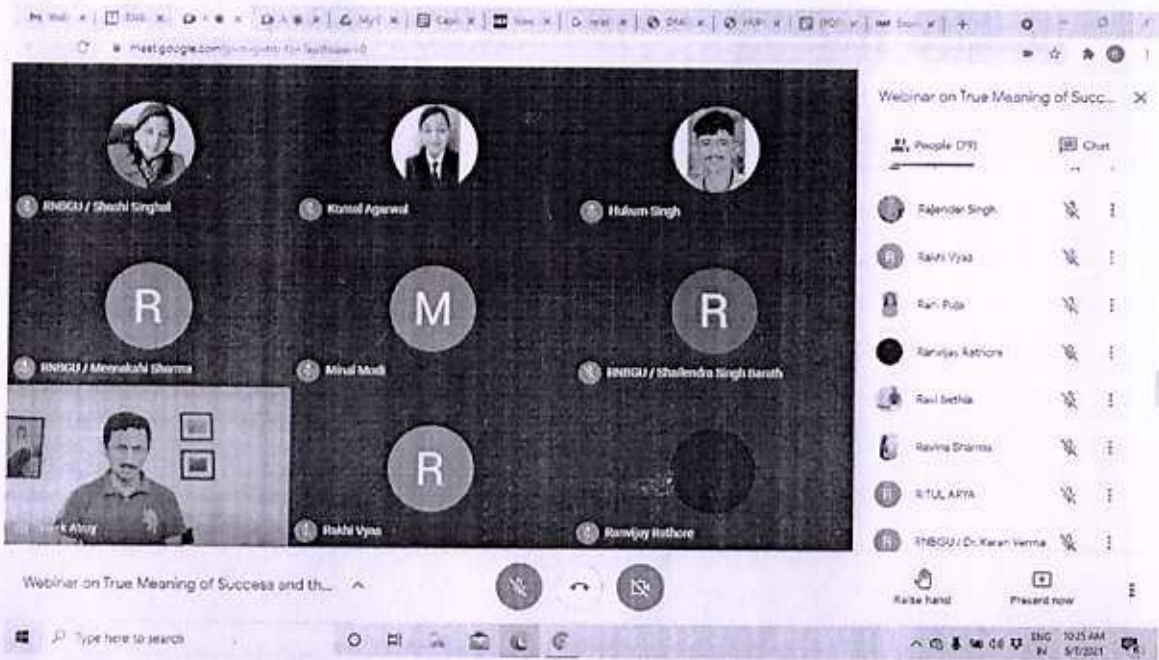

Origin of alloys, synthetic materials, plastics has although intensified the social skill of fabrication of materials for domestic and industrial applications, has imposed the accelerated hazards over ecosystem. This has bound the scientists and technocrats to develop the greener processes that may deliver the materials with stringent control over environmental hazards. In coherence, pollutions through disposal of waste materials by society and industries have imposed the need of their strategic waste management. The present webinar demonstrates the historical development of material science & its impact on environment. Emphasis will be made on greener methods in fabrication & characterization of materials for potential applications in structural engineering, defense, aerospace, dying, founning, particle sizing, nanobiotechnology, antimicrobial coatings,



sustained delivery, bio-sensing, energy storage, impact on agricultural crops, viral persistence, strategic waste management into value added products and their biodegradation. Collaborative approach and joint ventures among the experts of physical, biological, agricultural sciences, engineering and biotechnology will be emphasized to harness the potential of material science in development of healthy and prosperous society of nation.

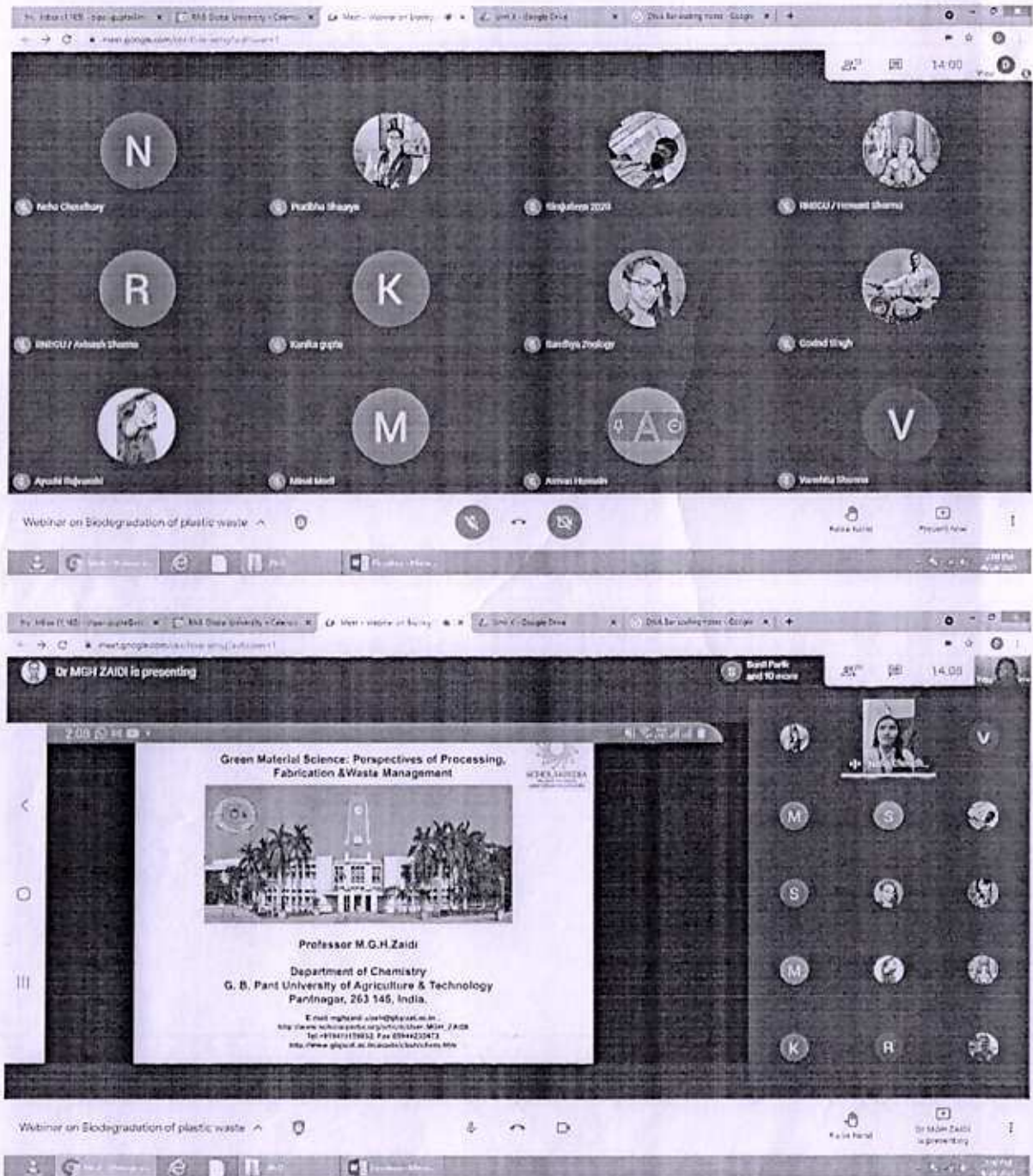

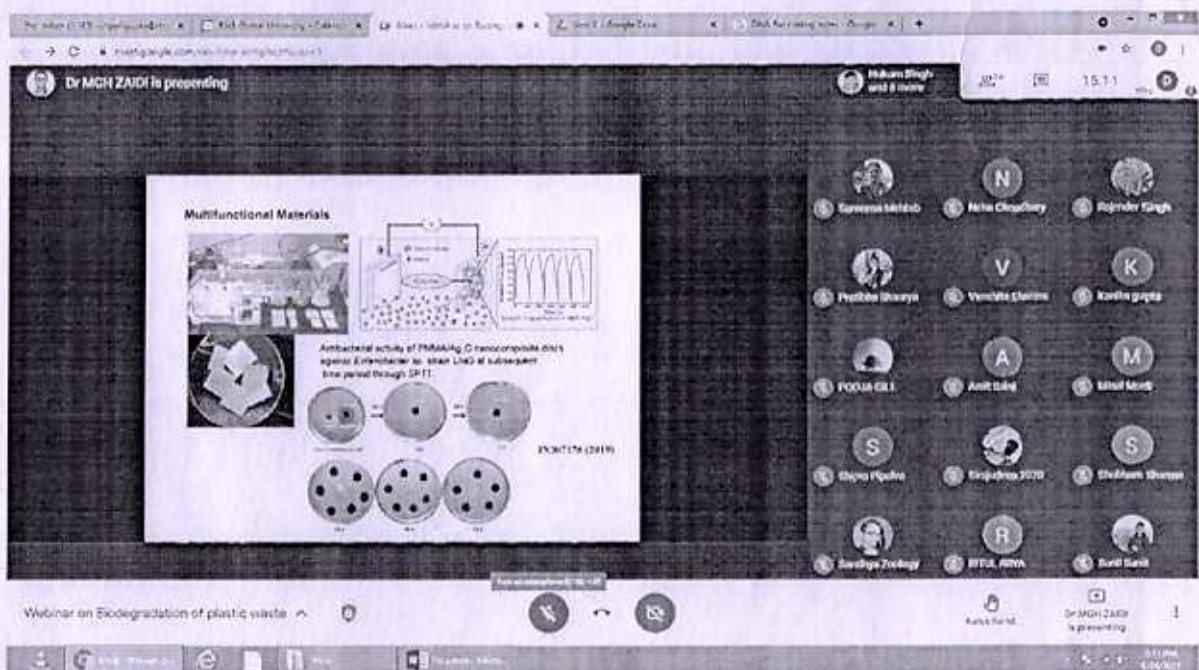
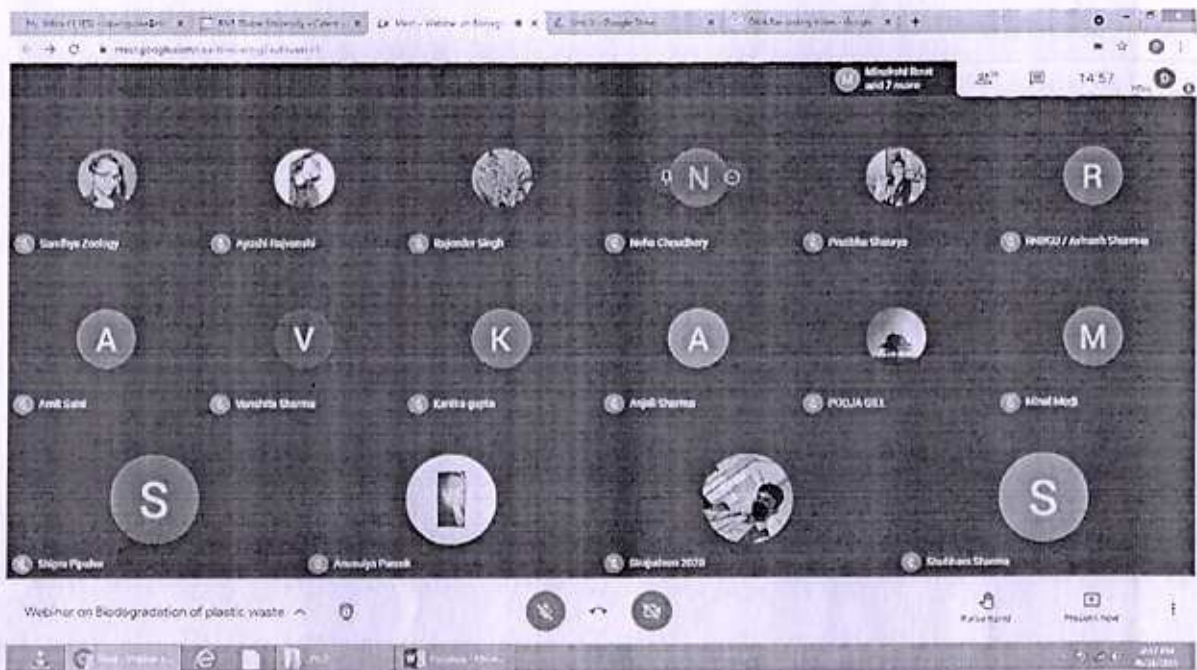

An excellent technique to help one connect cognitively is called "active listening" whereby you repeat back to the person what you think she or he said to make certain you understand.

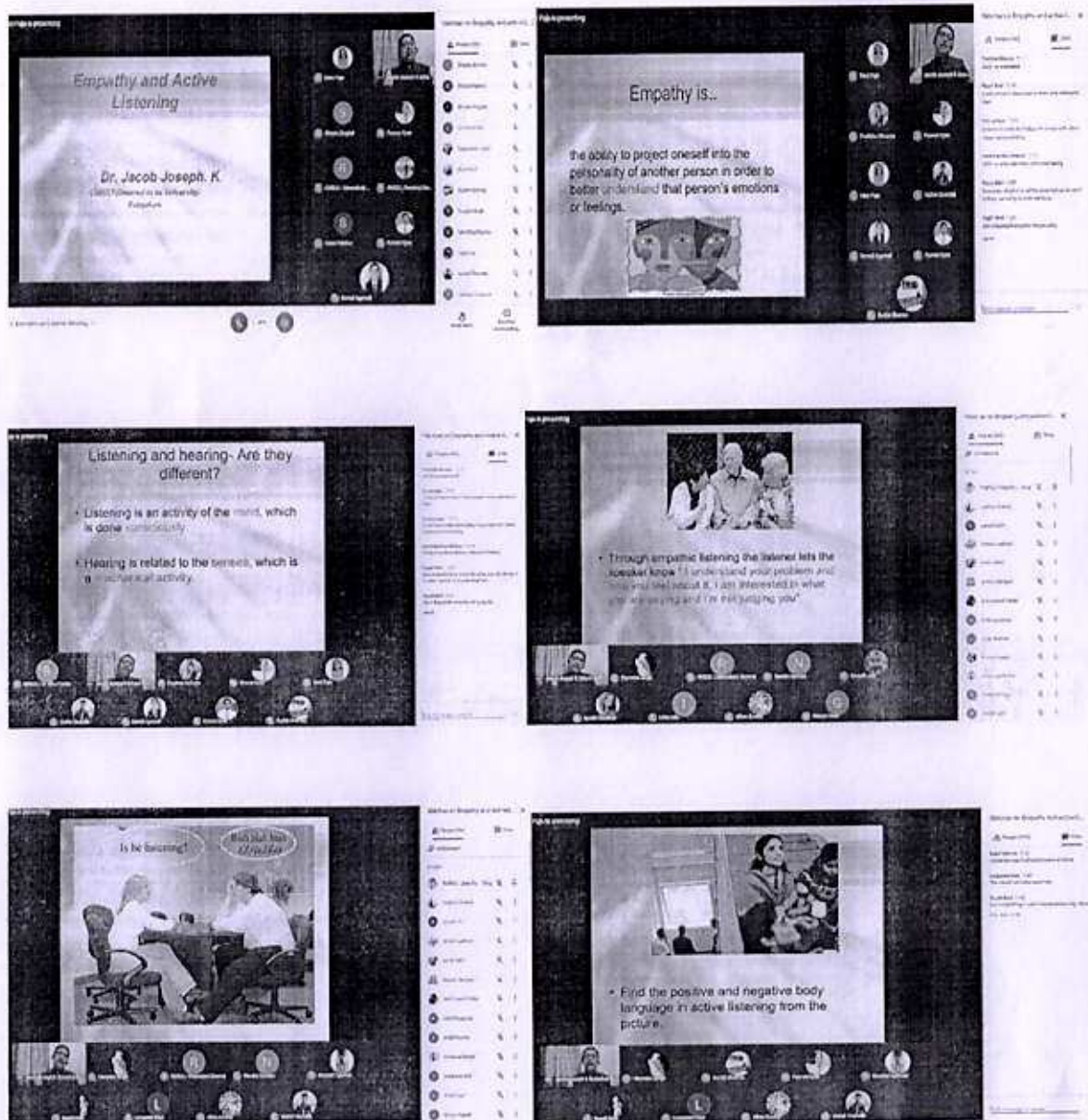

Event SOP's

1. Ice Breaking Activity-Ice Breaker Games for Small Groups.

An icebreaker is an activity or game designed to welcome attendees and warm up the conversation among participants in a meeting, training class, team building session, or other activity. Any event that requires people to comfortably interact with each other and a facilitator is an opportunity to use an icebreaker.

Objectives-icebreakers are one of the most basic tools that can be used at any training event. These team-building games help foster interaction, trust and learning. These types of activities can be extremely valuable when applied to management training. The skills acquired during management icebreakers reinforce important leadership techniques with executives to help them reconnect with their teams, foster growth in their group and enhance individual performance.

2. Toggle Competition-

In this activity the students were assigned a topic in which they had to speak both in favour and against the topic within one minute. He was required to change his stand for the topic whenever the MC said toggle during that one minute.

This activity was real fun and challenge both, for the students as they had to prepare themselves to speak from both the angles regarding the same theme.

Objectives:To develop spontaneity in the students and allow them to express their ideas regarding simple topics with confidence and humour.

3. Buss Quiz

- Teams are allowed to use scissors or craft knife/blade and advised to bring their own glue, newspaper, magazines or any other material needed. Only chart papers will be provided.
- Preparation time will be 30 minutes.
- Each team will be required to make a presentation about their Collage for about 5 -7 minutes.
- Collage will be collected and awarded team wise.
- Give any Topic/Proper Name to Collage on the top of Chart paper.
- Please don't write your name or course or semester on Collage anywhere.
- Separate Code No. will be given on submission of Collage for judgment.

Objective
