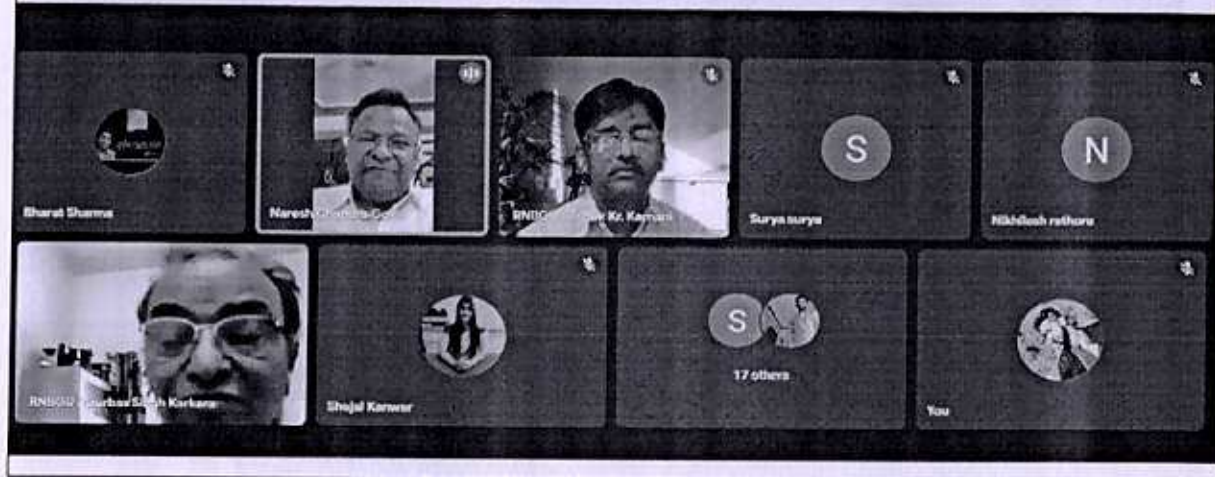

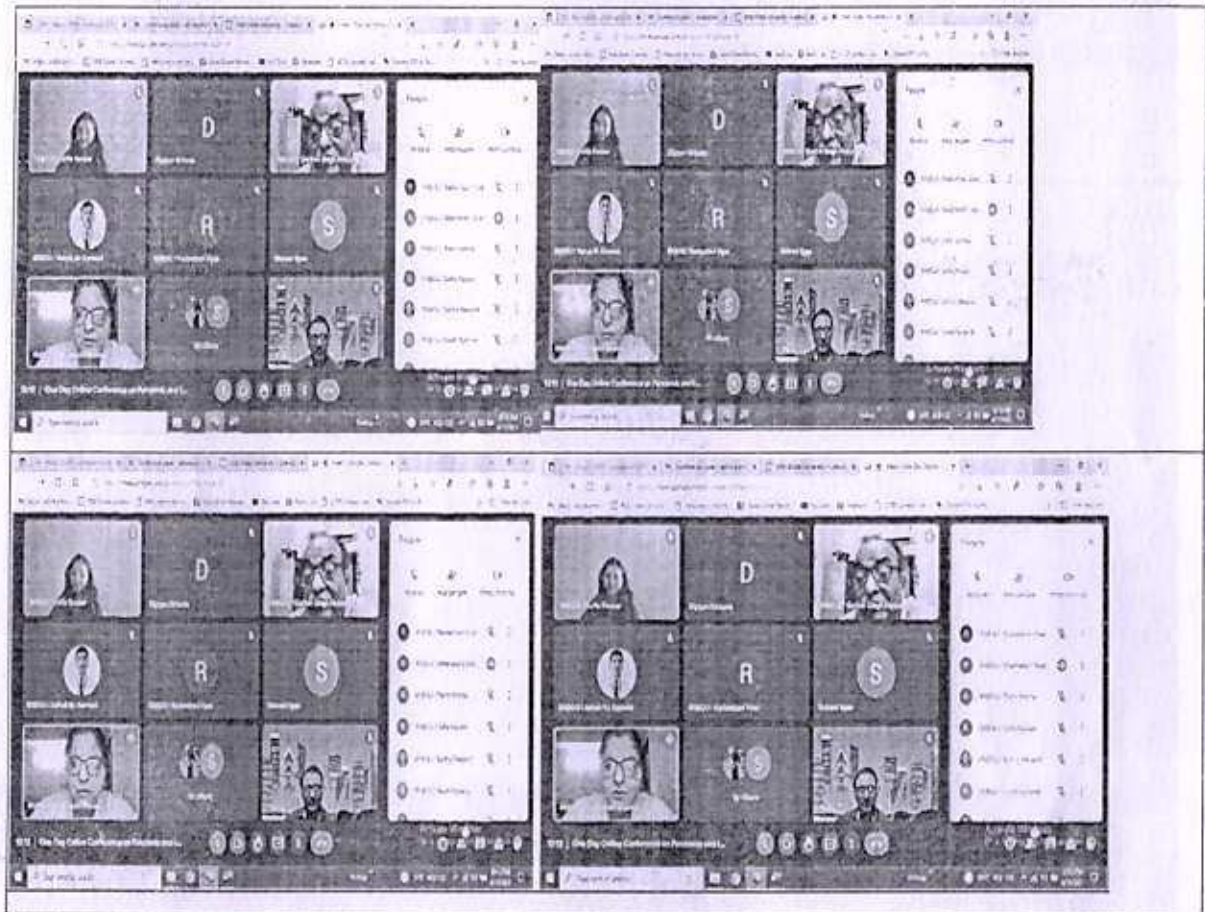

Introduction & object of Webinar

The purpose of this POSH Act 2013 is to prevent sexual harassment against women in the workplace and also to protect them. Workplace sexual harassment is a form of gender discrimination which violates a woman's fundamental right to equality and right to life, guaranteed under Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Constitution of India. This Act also ensures effective redressal of complaints of sexual harassment of women.

About the Seminar :

School of Law RNB Global University organized a webinar on Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace: Understanding and Analyzing the Prohibition and Redressal Mechanisms under the POSH Act 2013" (Prevention of Sexual harassment at workplace ACT 2013)". the main aim of the seminar was to enhance the knowledge and make the student understand the pragmatic application of the provisions relating to the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013. The seminar embarked with a introduction on what actually is sexual harassment at workplace and how such complaints by any aggrieved woman are redressed by an Internal Complaint Committee. The Webinar was joined by Prof G.S. Karkara (Dean School of Law), the Faculty of School of Law and students of School of Law .

The welcome address was given by Lavanya Lakhotia, who welcomed the Respected Guest Speaker for the webinar, Adv Jai Parkash Tahalani (Adv Supreme Court of India) and the Dean Sir, Faculty School of Law, and the students. In her welcome address she outlined the details of the seminar, and a brief Introduction of the Guest Speaker.

The Guest Speaker Adv Jai Prakash, for the webinar dealt with various intrinsic and extrinsic aspects of the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act 2013. In the beginning of the session, he explained about what kind of acts amount to Sexual Harassment of a woman at workplace, which was a very interactive as it included practical examples of such incidents. Further the Respected Speaker elaborated about who is an aggrieved woman under the prevention of sexual harassment Act 2013, it included all the women from organized and unorganized sector whether employed temporarily or permanently. In the later part of webinar, the procedure for redressal of complaints of Sexual Harassment at workplace by an aggrieved woman and compounding of offence was discussed by the Guest Speaker. While Concluding the Webinar the Respected speaker discussed the landmark Judgements Of the Hon'ble Supreme Court relating to Sexual Harassment and also critically analyzed the Prevention of Sexual harassment Act 2013.

In the Concluding part of the webinar the Guest Speaker addressed the questions of the students about the practical applicability of the provisions of the said Act. Finally a Vote of Thanks was addressed by Prof G.S. Karkara, Dean School of Law to the Special Guest Adv. Jai Prakash Tahalani for his valuable opinions and Knowledge on the Subject.

Minutes of the program

The Online Debate Competition has been started with the welcome address and a brief introduction of the topic i.e., "Corruption has been controlled by RTI", by Ms. Surya. Mr. Shubham Sharma described the rules of the debate competition.

At first Mr. Pratham presented his views in favour of the motion. He discussed the background of RTI Act and gave a brief of what RTI means, then presented his points about the positive effect of RTI in controlling the Corruption in India.

Then Shubham came with his strong points and spoke in against the motion. He countered the points of other opponent and discussed some loopholes of RTI Act.

Ms. Poonam Mor began her discussion with a quotation, she discussed some characteristics of RTI which helped in bringing transparency in the system.

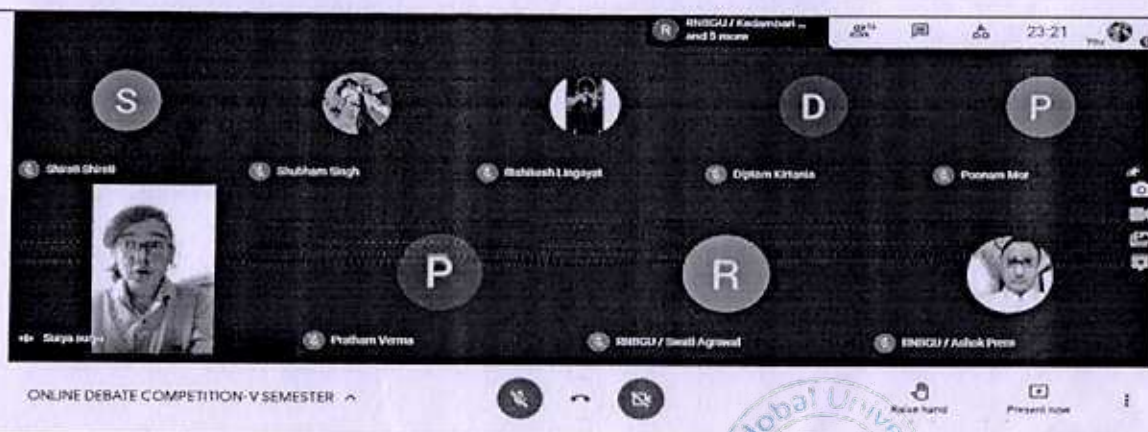
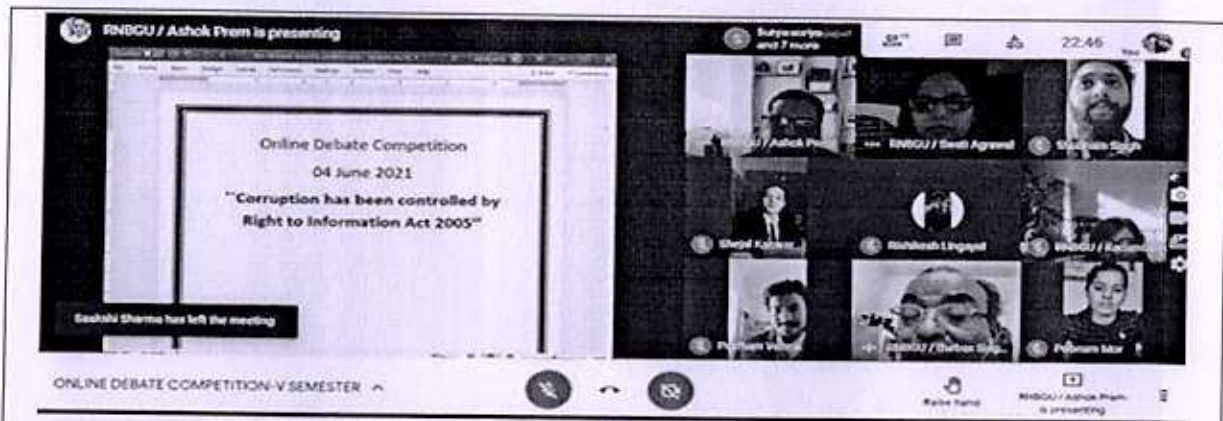



After Result Announcements, at the end of this program Dr Dipali Gupta-Registrar, RNB Golbal University given vote of the thanks.

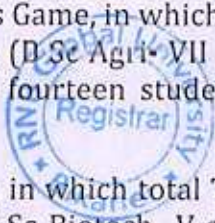
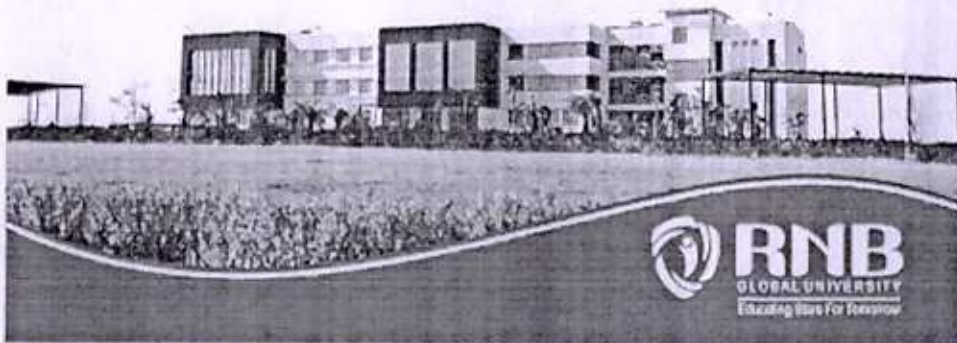


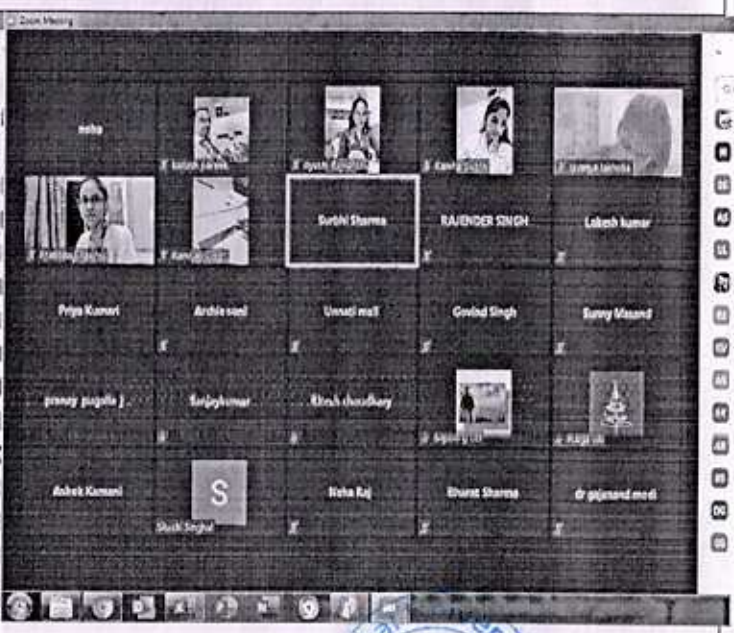
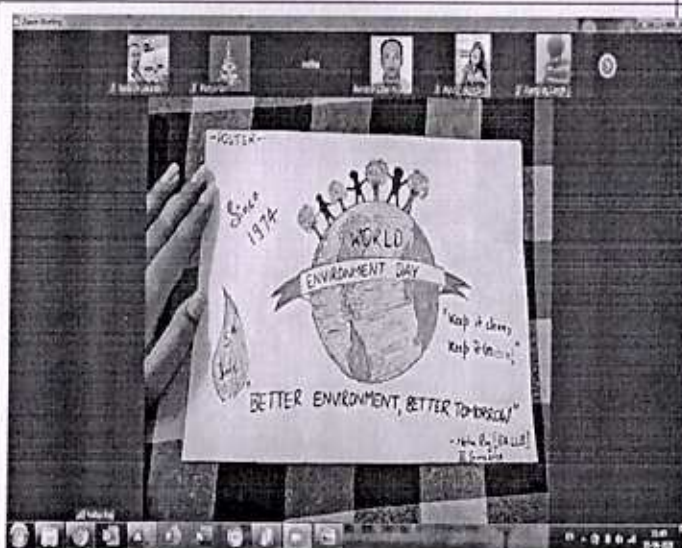
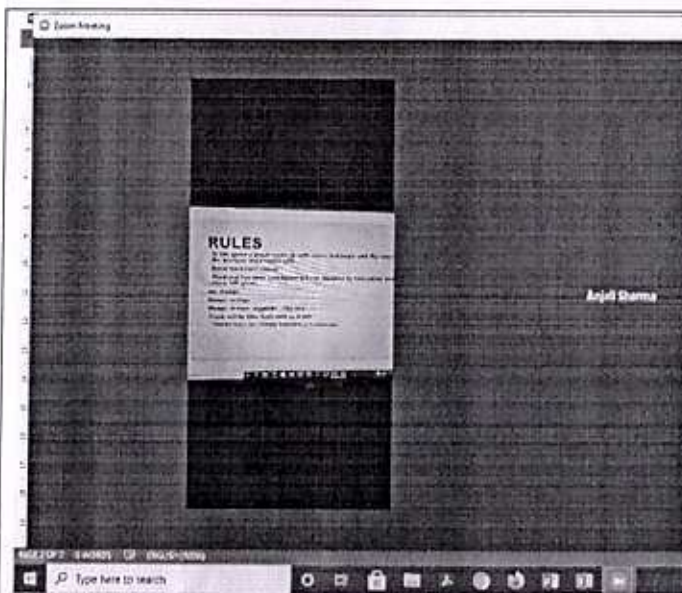

A Report on Online & Offline Seminar

On 5th March 2021 [Friday], School of Law, RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY arranged an Online & Offline Seminar on the topic: **“Dealing with Frauds in Companies Act 2013”** between 01.00 P.M to 2.30 P.M. The students from Semester-VI to Semester-VIII of the School of Law were guided by Asst. Prof. Mr. Ashok Kamani and Ms. Sofia Kausar.

Theme – “Dealing with Frauds in Companies Act 2013”

Objective of event was to enhance students’ knowledge with their creative, participating in the seminars not only helps the students to improve their public speaking but also develop their intellect; the students are expected to do research work in order to frame logical Statements and content regarding the topic, which helps the students to increase their ideas as well as their legal prowess.

INTRODUCTION TO THE SEMINAR

RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY (RNBGU) School of Law, organized a one-day seminar on “Dealing with Frauds in Companies Act 2013” on March 5th 2021 in Room 213. The seminar focused on various provisions related to corporate Frauds & the several clauses present in the companies Act 2013 related to/dealing with frauds in the Companies Act 2013. The program started at 01.00 PM with the Introduction by Ms. Tisha Sharma. Seminars provide attendees with large amounts of information on specific topics over the course of the session and with the introduction of the topic Ms. Tisha Sharma gave a brief about the topic, she discussed various E-financial/ corporate frauds and scams which have taken place in India and the need of attention to be required by the law makers & time to evaluate the high standards in corporate governance and implementation of stringent provisions to tackle corporate Fraud.

She further emphasis on The Companies Act, 2013 ("new Act") which contains stringent provisions to contain corporate frauds. A new "investigation" procedure has been provided under Sections 210 to 229 in the new act in order to deal with the high rates of fraud. She also mentioned in her speech that the new Act also provides whistle blowing provisions and ensures anonymity of the whistle blower. She concluded her speech by explaining the meaning of the corporate fraud as well as stated there can be several reasons cited for which companies commit such frauds like making more falsified money, creating a false image of the company for the market scenario and misguiding Governmental authorities for tax evasion. Lastly, she focused & gave emphasis on the fact "The advancement of technological and scientific development is contributing to the emergence of mass society with a large rank in file and small controlling elite, encouraging the growth of monopolies, the rise of a managerial class and intricate institutional mechanisms.

MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS

Our 1st speaker Ms. Uttama Acharya gave a **"Comparative study of Satyam scam and Vijay Mallya case dealing with fraud"**. She presented a brief study of both the scandals and their core points. She pins pointed her main focus on the main key aspects of both the scams. All the Facts of both the cases were explained precisely by her. Beside this she also mentioned the key difference between both the scandals and their operation and the results of both the scams on the economy as well as on the society. Lastly, she concluded by stating that the introduction of stringent provisions in the new Act, to tackle the problem of Fraud indicates how serious the problem has been & mentioned Section 211 which empowers the Central Government to establish an office called Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO) to investigate frauds relating to companies.

Our 2nd presenter for the day was Ms. Anmol Parakh Jain, while presenting her paper she started with **defining the meaning of the term 'Fraud' and explaining the various types of Fraud** like Fraudulent Financial Statements, Employee Fraud, Vendor Fraud, Customer Fraud, Investment Scams, Bankruptcy frauds and miscellaneous. The core focus of the paper was on the new provisions inserted in the new companies act 2013 related to tackling the problems frauds in the corporate sector. Later she discussed several huge scams that happened in India such as Satyam scam, Harshad Mehta Scandal, 2-G Spectrum Case, Vijay Mallya case, IRCTC Case and many more. Lastly, she concluded by stating various provisions related with tacking of fraud mentioned in the Companies Act 2013.



3rd speakers for the day were Ms. Sakshi Sankhla & Mr. Piyush Tripathi who together under author & co-authorship presented their paper on **"STATUTORY PROVISIONS OF FRAUD AND FRAUD REPORTING UNDER THE COMPANIES ACT, 2013"**. Both the speakers started presenting their paper with giving an introduction of how important is to have and good governance and what role does the same plays in dealing with fraud and also stated a brief comparison between the old Companies Act 1956 & the new Companies Act 2013 in relations to the provisions related to fraud.

First and foremost, they defined the term "fraud" in detailed & the sections related to fraud as well as the clauses related to punishment for committing fraud. They also stated the essential ingredient required for to fall within the ambit of action causing fraud. Beside just stating section 447 of the companies act which deals with the provisions of fraud they also discussed Section 17 of Indian Contract Act, 1872 which also provides with the clause of fraud. While discussing several corporate Frauds, such as the 5000 crore rupees Harshad Mehta scam in 1992, 7000 crore rupees Satyam fiasco in 2009, and the 27000 crore rupees Sahara fraud case which started in 2010 and is sub-judice in Supreme Court, till date they also gave emphasis on the white color crimes.

Reports of the Vivian Bose Commission of Inquiry into the affairs of Dalmia-Jain group of companies in 1963, observations of Justice M. C. Chagla were also mentioned by the students. While concluding their paper they stated the provision related to the punishment of fraud and the fine or imprisonment imposed. Beside this they also stated provisions related to reporting of frauds & statutory auditor/cost auditor/secretarial auditor mentioned under the new Companies Act 2013. Lastly, they emphasized on the fact that how the new law has also bestowed legal status on the Serious Fraud Investigation Office, a probe agency under the Ministry of Corporate Affairs which is established by Central Government to investigate frauds relating to a company and stated several sections such as 2(5), 2(56) 7(5), 7(6), 8(11), 34, 36, 38(1), 46(5), 56(7), 66(10), 75, 140(5), 206(4), 213, 229, 251(1), 266(1), 339(3), 448 etc.

The 4th Speaker for the day was Mr. Yashpal Chouhan & Mr. Rishikesh Lingayat, who together under author & co-authorship they presented their paper on **"Fraud under the Companies Act, 2013"**. In the beginning of their paper, they explained what is corporate fraud and how does it occur & what are the means. They discussed fraud under companies' act, then Sec 17 of Indian Contract Act, 1872, after that punishment for fraud, then they gave more emphasis & discussed corporate fraud, after that fraud reporting, then fraud reporting procedure, and at last mechanisms. While discussing the provisions related to fraud and its punishments, they also explained types of fraud in their paper for more better understanding. Lastly while concluding they gave the reference of serious Fraud Investigation Office, Secretarial Audit, auditors and audit committee & independent directors.

The last & 5th speaker for the day was Mr. Mayank Gupta who spoke on “**Frauds in Companies Act 2013**”. In his paper his main focus of area was the provisions in the Companies Act 2013 related to the definition of fraud, Punishment of fraud, false statement, false evidence, and repeated default. While discussing he also explained about the provisions of adjudication of penalties and stated how offense of fraud are non-compoundable. After stating all the provisions related to punishment and penalties, he focused on fraud reporting and its sections under Companies Act 2013. While concluding his paper he talked about Serious Fraud Investigation Office and Secretarial Audit. Overall, his paper focused on the provisions related to fraud and the punishment.

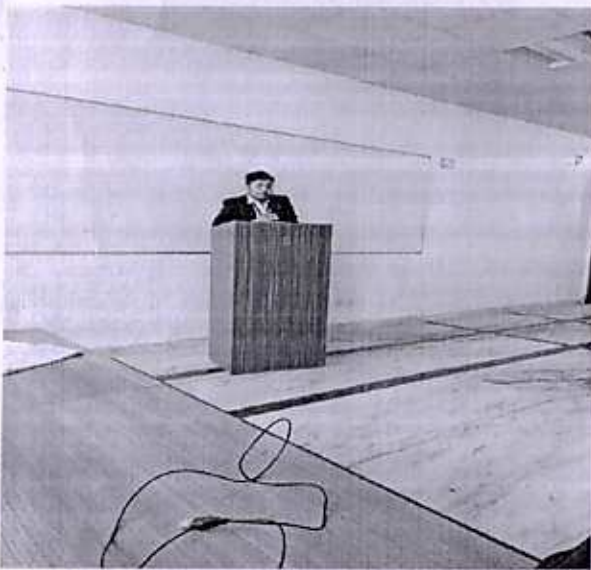

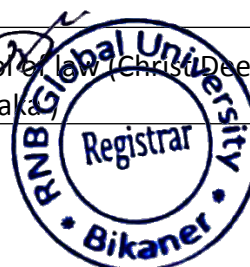

Learning Outcomes:

1. A moot court competition simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.
2. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.
3. The procedure imitates that followed in real courts: the judge enters, the mooters and the judge bow to each other, the clerk announces the matter, the mooters give their appearances and are then called on in turn to present their submissions, the judge asks questions of the mooters, the court adjourns, and the judge then returns to deliver a brief judgment and some feedback.
4. Mooting is not the same as public speaking or debating, although it shares some common elements with these activities. It is a specialized application of the art of persuasive advocacy. It has been part of the process of training lawyers for centuries and plays an important role in legal education.
5. Student become aware about the mooting techniques, memorial formation methods and art of argument before court.
6. Student came to know that how to find a case applicable on a given moot problem.
7. Students became aware that how to
 - Choose their competition.
 - Secure faculty coaching
 - Work out internal selection procedures to select the team.
 - Do the research, writing, and practice necessary to prepare professional solutions to the problems posed for the contests.





Conclusion:

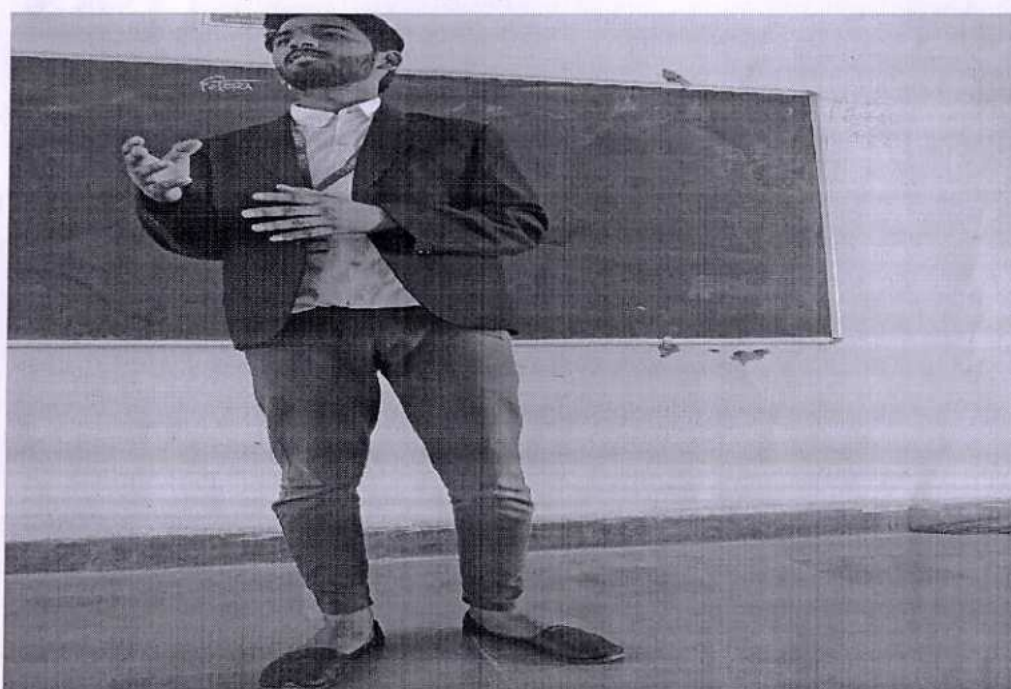

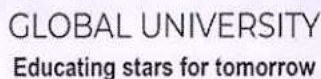



Introduction

The National Seminar is organized by the SOL, RNBGU on the topic "*Constitutional Values in the Contemporary Indian Politics*". A Constitution may be written or unwritten, but it contains fundamental laws of the land. It is the supreme and ultimate authority. Any decision or action which is not in accordance with it will be unconstitutional and unlawful. A Constitution also lays down limits on the power of the government to avoid abuse of authority. Moreover, it is not a static but a living document, because it needs to be amended as and when required to keep it updated. Its flexibility enables it to change according to changing aspirations of the people, the needs of the time and the changes taking place in society. The Constitution of any country serves several purposes. It lays down certain ideals that form the basis of the kind of country that we as citizens aspire to live in. A country is usually made up of different communities of people who share certain beliefs, but may not necessarily agree on all issues. A Constitution helps serve as a set of principles, rules and procedures on which there is a consensus. These form the basis according to which the people want the country to be governed and the society to move on. This includes not only an agreement on the type of government but also on certain ideals that the country should uphold. The Indian Constitution has certain core constitutional values that constitute its spirit and are expressed in various articles and provisions. But do you know what is the meaning of the word, 'value'? You may immediately say that truth, non-violence, peace, cooperation, honesty, respect and kindness are values, and you may continue to count many such values. In fact, in a layman's understanding, value is that which is very essential or 'worth having and observing' for the existence of human society as an entity. The Indian Constitution contains all such values, the values that are the universal, human and democratic of the modern age.

Speaker 1 – Mrs. S.P. Vidyassri

- Empirical study on frequent promulgation of ordinance is a threat to parliament democracy

Mrs. S.P. Vidyassri said that Re-proclamation of ordinance is a misrepresentation on the Constitution and, the Supreme Court has put aside a lot of ordinances passed by the Bihar government somewhere in the year of 1989 and 1992. Re- promulgation of ordinance is a



force on the Constitution and a disruption of majority rule administrative procedures, Re-promulgation proposes that notwithstanding with the session of the governing authorities, a new exercise is to proclaim the ordinance is being turned to exercise of the way that the legislative assembly which was in ownership of a recently declared ordinance has not changed over its arrangements into a consistently sanctioned ordinance.

Speaker 2- Aashish Taank

JRF, Department of Law, Panjab University

Topic - Rule of Law – Developments and Perspective in Indian Context

Aashish Taank stated that the Concept of Rule of law has attained different meanings in different Legal Systems due to variance in uniquely situated historical, social, traditional, economic, political and demographical factors of each nation. For India, rule of law has been an established pre-requisite for sustenance of a just, humane, tolerant, equitable society. Even our freedom struggle was predominantly at core a resurgence of Indians for attaining for themselves a self-rule opposed to arbitrary and oppressive colonial administration.

Speaker 3 - Dr Vinay Prahaladbhai Solanki

Assistant Professor, Nanavati Law college, Ahmedabad

Topic - Constitution and Constitutionalism

Dr Vinay Prahaladbhai Solanki explained that It is one of the celebrated maxims of political science that there can be no society without a state, and there can be no state without a constitution. The word 'constitution' is used mainly in many senses—constitution of a body, constitution of trade union, constitution of political party etc. In a political sense, it signifies the constitution of the state. Now the term has attained a normative connotation and has become another term for a 'democratic political order.' Every state must have constitution of its own and that its government must be organised and conducted according to the rules of the constitution so that the people must have a rule of law, it constitutes the case of constitutionalism.

Speaker 4 – Dr. Gurmeet Kaur

Assistant Professor, SOL, IGNOU

Topic - Socialism, its Constitutional Value, and Interpretation by Judiciary

Socialism though cannot be defined precisely but as a system seems to emphasis on the welfare and achieving the goal of equality among the people with basic aim is to remove class exploitation and



disparities. It premises on the concept of cooperation to ensure economic and political equality where means of production, wealth, profits are equally distributed, exchanged are owned and regulated by the welfare state for overall development of society negating the concept of individual or competition. The present research paper focuses on the concept of socialism, its constitutional value, its ideology and impact in the context of India. The concept of socialism is also discussed in the light of interpretation by the judiciary.

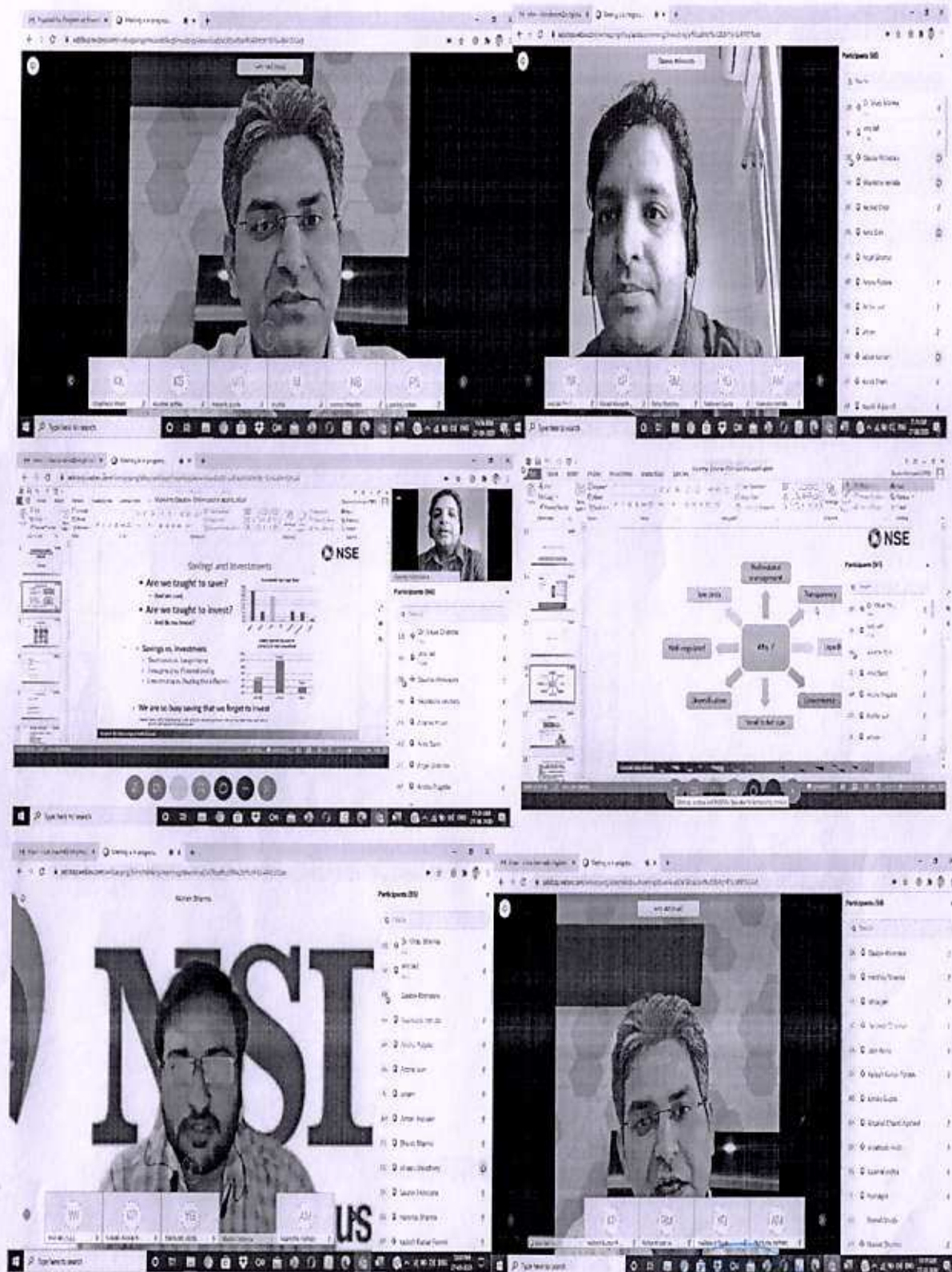

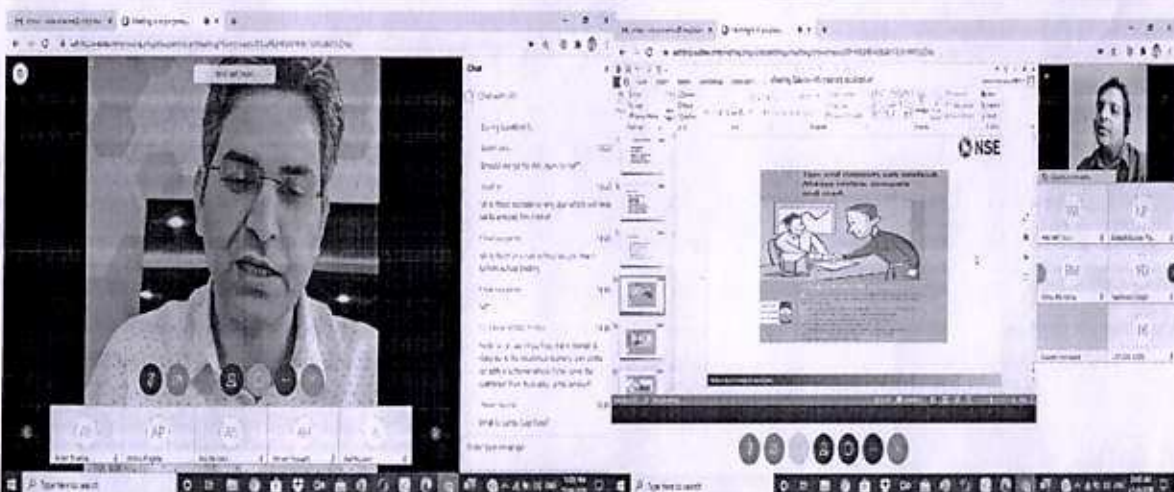
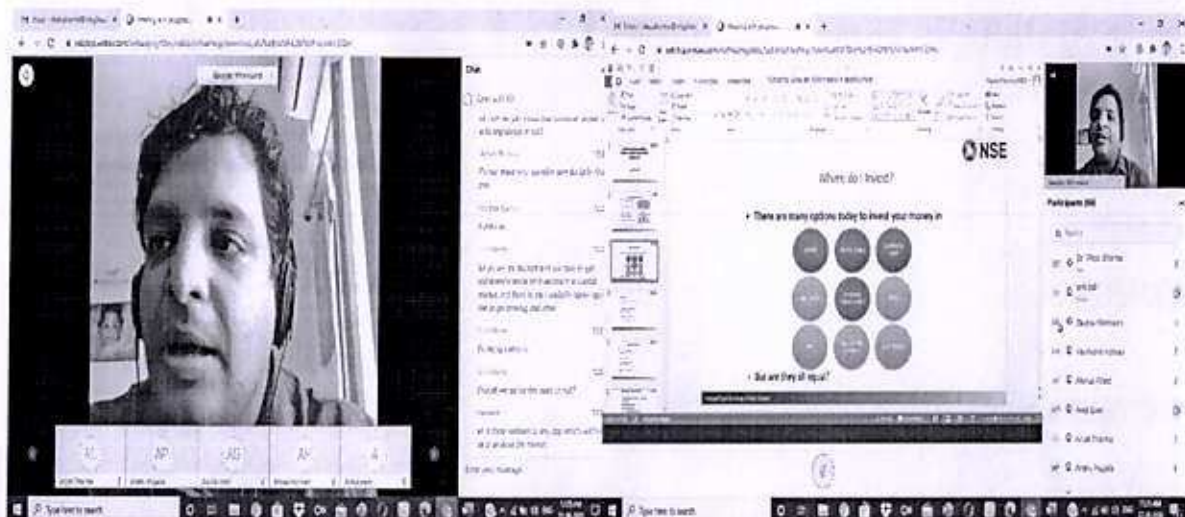
