Introduction

The students of the 2nd Semester of RNB Global University visited the District Legal Service Authority on 13 May 2023 A court is a tribunal, often a governmental institution, with the authority to adjudicate legal disputes between parties and carry out the administration of justice in civil, criminal, and administrative matters in accordance with the rule of law. District Legal Service Authority of India is presided over by an Additional district judge. These courts are under administrative and judicial control of the High Court of the state to which the district concerned belongs.

Why did the university organize the visit to the Lok Adalat District Legal Service Authority, Bikaner

The Faculty of Law & Arts continuously organizes various extracurricular activities like National level Moot court Competitions, Mock United Sessions, Mock Parliament, Dramatize Moot Court, Webinars, seminars, and conferences on various topics, and visit to various Courts, juvenile courts, etc. These kinds of activities are necessary for the over-development of students. District Court visit is also one of the most essential parts of practical knowledge for Law students.

About the Lok Adalat District Legal Service Authority,

The National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) has been constituted under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 to provide free Legal Services to the weaker sections of the society and to organize Lok Adalats for amicable settlement of disputes. In every State, State Legal Services Authority has been constituted to give effect to the policies and directions of the NALSA and to give free legal services to the people and conduct Lok Adalats in the State. The State Legal Services Authority is headed by Hon'ble the Chief Justice of the respective High Court who is the Patron-in-Chief of the State Legal Services Authority. A Seniormost Judge of High Court is nominated as Executive Chairman, NALSA. In every District, District Legal Services Authority has been constituted to implement Legal Services Programmes in the District. The District Legal Services Authority is situated in the District Courts Complex in every District and chaired by the District Judge of the respective district. A Civil Judge Cadre Judicial Officer is appointed as Secretary on a full-time basis.

The district court of the state governments in India for every district or for one or more districts together taking into account the number of cases and population distribution in the district. They administer justice in India at a district level. The district and session judge judges the civil court district court. This is the principal court of Original Civil Jurisdiction besides the high court of the state and derives its

jurisdiction in civil matters primarily from the Code of Civil Procedure. The district court is also a court of sessions when it exercises its jurisdiction on criminal matters under the Code of Criminal Procedure. The district court is presided over by a district judge who is appointed by the state governor on the advice of the chief justice of that high court. In addition to the district judge, there may be a number of additional district judges and assistant district judges depending on the workload. The additional district judge and the court presided have equivalent jurisdiction as the district judge and their district court.

Objectives of the Visit

The visit provides our students the opportunity to interact with the Additional District Judge, District Legal Service Authority, Bar Association members, Advocates, and AIR Library.

The students also got a chance to interact with the members of the Chairman of Permanent Lok Adalat, Mahesh Kumar Sharma, and ADJ of District Legal Service Authority Raina Sharma. Also, students received a blessing from Vivek Kumar Sharma President, of Bikaner District Bar Association. He explained to students about ins-outs of litigation and the relation between bar and bench and advanced wishes to students for their future endeavors.

The visit started with a brief introduction of the Concept of DLSA & Lok Adalat and its procedure by the faculty in charge Ms. Tripti Paliwal. After getting a brief knowledge of Lok Adalat an interactive session was held with Raina Sharma, ADJ, DLSA.

Additional District Judge Cum secretary of District Legal Services Authority Ms. Raina Sharma told the students that NALSA along with other Legal Service Institutions use to conduct Lok Adalat periodically. Lok Adalat is one of the alternative dispute redressal mechanisms, it is a forum where disputes/cases pending in the court of law or at the pre-litigation stage are settled/compromised amicably.



Learning outcomes of the visit

The experience not only enriched students with working in the district and DLSA but also enlightened them with practical aspects. The visit was full of information for the students of law. Students got live exposure to the judicial process of the court with a bench-bar relationship. It gave practical and theoretical knowledge regarding all those laws written in the law books



About the Session:

The University strongly encourages gender parity and is constantly working towards providing a conducive environment for efficient and effective communications between the employees and students. Men and women need to be sensitized towards gender issues, the boundaries that exist between colleagues and how such boundaries are crossed. The students and faculty of the University also need to be constantly informed about the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace Act, 2013 and the manner in which the Internal Complaints Committee is constituted and how it works towards providing protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the redressal of complaints of sexual harassment. - The Sexual Harassment of Women in Workplace Act, 2013.



Introduction

The students of all the semester of RNB Global University attended theOne Day workshop on "Art of Preparing Moot Memorial" organized by the Faculty of Law and ArtMooting is important part of learning in any law student's life. One should continuously make efforts in order to excel the skills of Memorial Drafting.

Faculty of Law and Artsis continuously organizing various extracurricular activities like national level Moot court Competition, Mock United Session, Mock Parliament, Dramatize Moot Court, Webinars, seminars and conferences on various topics and visit to various Courts. These kinds of activities are necessary for the all over development of students. This workshop was also an essential element in the all-round, holistic development of children.

About the Workshop

The One-day workshop was conducted in two sessions, one sessionduring the first half of day and second sessionsduring the second half of day.

The session began with the welcome address given by Dr Anil Kaushik, Dean Faculty of Law and Arts, he shared his experience and journey of moot courts. He applauded the efforts of the students of the SOL who pro-actively and enthusiastically organized the event along with their internships and studies.

The Expert speaker was Mr.Sandip Singh, Director, University of Rajasthan, whospoke on The technique in every art that has to be learnt by its practitioners. The same is true for the Art of Advocacy. Any law student can become a competent advocate by learning the principles of the art of advocacy by practice and patience. The experience of research is profitable the experiencetold the students how various students act as advocates and argue upon an imaginary or a decided/undecided case, or it could also be on some specific legal issue, civil or criminal (or a petition). They are judged by a person having knowledge of the law, it is not necessary that the person should be a sitting or a retired judge. He Further says that first and foremost, a student should go through the moot proposition, thoroughly. It defines the boundary within which one has to argue and lays out the whole case in detail; the more one reads it, the more one finds out.

The Expert Speaker on first half told about the process should take up most of the time for preparation and is the execution of research planning Considering the most proposition and facts in issue, one has to find out the appropriate laws to be applied. He Further discuss that,

after going through the case many times, you will ultimately isolate the facts which support you and you should counter those which go against you. After collecting all the facts for your case, it is necessary to draw inferences from the primary facts and formulate a hypothesis that will enable. He further discusses about the Bare acts alone may not be able to articulate the law and provide for further information that could be used in the moot court. One should go through a few books, not many, to get a fair idea of the law and also gather certain leading or important cases that can be cited to bolster the case.

The Expert Speaker on second half told the student about the object of a pleading is to facilitate a trial so that the points of the issue might be clarified and also the decision given thereon; it also determines what relief a party is entitled to on the basis of law and fact. Thus, after gathering the required information, it has to be arranged in a certain format, either provided in the rules or the standard that is usually adopted. The memorial is the written submission while arguing orally in the moot court forms the oral submission. It has to be made for both sides by a single team, i.e., for plaintiff/appellant and defendant/respondent. He further said thatrules for its making should be strictly followed as it is to be submitted to the moot court judges and to the adverse team. The teams can bring one themselves, for reference. They can also carry hard copies of judgements, bare acts, sections, various laws and other material that is to be brought

The workshop concluded with the doubt solving session, where the resource person entertained the queries of inquisitive law students and answered them to their satisfaction.

Objectives of The Workshop

The purpose of the workshop on preparing moot court memorial is to introduce law students to court proceedings that arise from a (hypothetical) dispute between parties. Such exercises can allow future lawyers, judges and arbitrators to improve their drafting, research and argumentation skills.








arning Outcomes:

- A moot court competition simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyses a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument.
- 2. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.
- 3. The procedure imitates that followed in real courts: the judge enters, the mooters and the judge bow to each other, the clerk announces the matter, the mooters give their appearances and are then called on in turn to present their submissions, the judge asks questions of the mooters, the court adjourns, and the judge then returns to deliver a brief judgment and some feedback.
- 4. Mooting is not the same as public speaking or debating, although it shares some common elements with these activities. It is a specialized application of the art of persuasive advocacy. It has been part of the process of training lawyers for centuries and plays an important role in legal education.
- 5. Students become aware about the mooting techniques, memorial formation methods and art of argument before court.
- 6. Student came to know that how to find a case applicable on a given moot problem.
- 7. Students became aware that how to
 - Choose their competition.
 - Secure faculty coaching
 - Work out internal selection procedures to select the team.
 - Do the research, writing, and practice necessary to prepare professional solutions to the problems posed for the contests.



RNB GLOBAL UNIVERSITY, BIKANER ORGANIZED LIVE UNION BUDGET 2023 - PARLIAMENTARY SESSION

RNB Global University Bikaner organized a "Live Union Budget 2023 - Parliamentary Session" for all students and faculties of SOCM, on Wednesday, 1st February 2023 in Management Lab (Room Number 103), Academic Block, from 11AM to 12:00 Noon. The students were connected to the live budget session presented by the Finance Minister of India Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman. The event showcased the budget speech as delivered by our honorable Finance Minister of India who presented the budget in a comprehensive manner. The Budget for 2023-24 kept its focus on expanding Capex showing that the Modi government's priorities are building roads, highways, and railway lines. The middle class has been given some relief in terms of tweaks in the new income tax regime clearly pointing out that the government wants a shift towards the new regime from the older one. The anchors for the event were Ashish Sethia and Esha Sethia from BBA VI and the faculty coordinators were Mr. Maulik Chandnani and Mr. Sunny Masand, Assistant Professors at Faculty of Commerce and Management. The key highlights of the budget are as follows:-

Direct Taxes:

- · No changes in the old tax regime.
- New tax regime to become the default tax regime. However, citizens can opt for the old tax regime.
- No tax on income up to Rs 7.5 lakh a year in new tax regime (with inclusion of standard deduction).
- Govt proposes to reduce highest surcharge rate from 37% to 25% in new tax regime.
- New Income Tax Slabs Under New Tax Regimes:

Rs 0-3 lakh: Nil

Rs 3-6 lakhs: 5%

Rs 6-9 lakhs: 10%

Rs 9-12 lakhs: 15%

Rs 12-15 lakhs: 20%

Over Rs 15 lakhs: 30%




- A Rs 50,000 standard deduction to taxpayers has been introduced under the new regime.
- Payment received from Agniveer Corpus Fund by Agniveers to be exempted.
- Tax exemption removed in insurance policies with premium over Rs 5 lakh.
- For online games, govt proposes to provide for TDS and taxability on net winnings at the time of withdrawal or at the end of fiscal.
- Tax exemption on leave encashment on retirement of non-government salaried employees hiked to Rs 25 lakhs.
- A higher limit of Rs 3 crore for TDS on cash withdrawal to be provided to co-operative societies.
- Next-generation Common IT Return Form to be rolled out for tax payer convenience
- Grievance redressal mechanism to be strengthen.
- TDS rate to be reduced from 30 per cent to 20 per cent on taxable portion of EPF withdrawal in non-PAN cases.

Indirect Taxes:

- 16% tax hike on certain cigarettes
- New cooperatives that commence manufacturing till March, 2024 to get lower tax rate of 15%
- Basic customs duty on crude, glycerine reduced to 2.5%.
- Import duty on silver bars hiked to align it with gold, platinum
- · Extend customs duty cut on imports of parts of mobile phones by 1 year
- To promote TV manufacturing, customs duty on open cells of TV panels reduced to 2.5%
- Relief provided on Customs Duty on import of certain parts & inputs like camera lens
- Concessional duty on lithium-ion cells for batteries extended for another year
- Number of basic custom duty rates on goods other than textiles and agriculture reduced from 21 to 13. As a result, there are minor changes in taxes on some items toys, bicycles, automobiles.



On 19th December 2022, A group of 9 students of BBA LLB /BA LLB +BA IV Semester along with 1 faculty members boarded Bikaner HW Express, Train No. 14717 from Bikaner Railway Station, Bikaner for an eventful journey to Chandigarh and Amritsar(Punjab) at 11:25 PM.

Day-1

Journey was started from Ambala cant. Railway Station, Ambala. We left the Ambala Cant. Railway Station on 20th December 2022 at 11:45 AM in the morning to visit the Chandigarh. After Freshen up at Hotel students went to visit Capitol Complex, UNESCO World heritage site and Elante Mall.

Capitol Complex UNESCO World Heritage Site

Chandigarh Capitol Complex, located in the sector-1 of Chandigarh city in India, is a government compound designed by the architect Le Corbusier and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is spread over an area of around 100 acres and is a prime manifestation of Chandigarh's architecture. It comprises three buildings: the Palace of Assembly or Legislative Assembly, Secretariat Building and the High Court plus four monuments (Open Hand Monument, Geometric Hill, Tower of Shadows and the Martyrs Monument) and a lake. It was added to the UNESCO World Heritage Site List in 2016 along with sixteen other works by Le Corbusier for its contribution to the development of modernist architecture. These 'monuments' included the Open Hand, Martyr's Memorial, Geometric hill, Tower of Shades, '24 Solar hours' and have reliefs on raw exposed concrete.

The most prominent and visible of these is the 85 feet high Open Hand soaring in the sky, silhouetted against the resplendent backdrop of the timeless Himalayas. The metal wind vane erected over a concrete platform appears like a flying bird, designed to rotate in the wind. The giant Open hand denotes the message, 'Open to give, Open to receive'. Very often, it is perceived by the onlookers as a hand of peace akin to Buddha's open palm, or a gesture of blessings by our ancient sages. It is now the official emblem of Chandigarh.

Situated close to the Tower of Shades, is another of his sculptural elements called the 'Geometrical Hill' at whose base is an abstract mural masterfully depicting the 24 hours solar movement, charting out its rise and setting every day.

However, the most quizzical of all the Martyrs' Monument, is still incomplete. The monument is designed as a square enclosure formed by sloping concrete walls and a sculptural ensemble depicting the sacrifice and martyrdom of those who lost their lives during the partition. On the walls of the ramp and the concrete enclosure are the symbols of Indian cosmology: a wheel and a Swastika. The wheel denotes 'dharamchakra' and the Swastika represents the revolving sun and the seasons of human life, and their impact on human life.

The building material chosen for the Capitol buildings was concrete that had a raw, brute aesthetic appeal that Corbusier called "molten rock of the 20th century". He embedded on its facades designs ranging from Harappan seals, pastoral animals like bulls, cows and replicas of birds and fish often etched out by village labourers on wet concrete surfaces; that fascinated Corbusier.

Inside the High Court and the Assembly buildings are nine large tapestries. Common to their themes are quizzical symbols of rivers, trees, reptiles, lightning and balance. Corbusier called his tapestries, 'nomadic murals' and was inspired by the durre weaving traditions of Punjab.

About Elante Mall

Elante mall (Nexus Malls) is a shopping mall in the city of Chandigarh in India. With the gross leasable area of 1,000,000 sq ft (93,000 m²), it is the 7th largest shopping mall in Northern India and the 10th largest in India. This mall is partially owned by Ahad family of Bhopal having majority share of Asad Kamal and Arshad Kamal Elante is spread over an area of 20 acres. It is part of a mixed use real estate development project by Larsen & Toubro called Elante. Elante Mall has a retail space area of over 1 million square feet. It has 2 main gates, one is on the big front entry and another one is on the back. It has 3 basement levels, a ground level and three upper levels. In the retail area, Elante Mall hosts retailers of various Indian and international brands, a food court and a courtyard full of cafes. The Mall has an 8-screen Multiplex of PVR Cinemas. On its top floor, the mall has restaurants, fast food joints and a Fun City for kids entertainment. In 2013, the mall was found to be burning 6000 litres of diesel daily due to a lack of electricity connection to the grid. The mall requires a 15MW power supply. In September 2015, Mumbai-based Carnival Group bought Elante Mall, at a price of Rs 1,785 crore (more than US\$ 274 million) making it one of the biggest deal for a single real estate or property in India at the time.On 28 July 2017, Nexus Malls, a subsidiary of US-based global investment firm The Blackstone Group bought Elante Mall for an undisclosed amount. This is the second time Elante Mall is sold in two years.

Day-2

Educational Visit to High court of Punjab and Haryana

The High Court of Punjab and Haryana, is a common institution for the States of Punjab, Haryana and the Union territory of Chandigarh. Located in the capital city of Chandigarh in the foot hills of Shivalik Range, it was designed by the famous French Architect Le Corbusier and thus boasts of being an architectural marvel. The Court Complex, due to it's architectural brilliance, is thronged by students of Architecture from all over the world for the study of its design and facets. It is also a popular tourist destination for people visiting Chandigarh. A museum, with a beautiful display of artifacts, rare documents and depictions showcasing how

the High Court Building came into being, is also a part of the Punjab and Haryana High Court building premises.

Students of BA/BBA LLB IV sem along with one faculty member visited the Punjab and Haryana High Court . Firstly they visited to the Registrar Protocol Office. He explained all the rules and regulations of the visit.

As guided by them Pair of two students went to different court rooms to listen the proceedings. Students choose their court rooms according to their area of interest. Some students went in Criminal bench and some listen civil bench in court rooms.

At last students went to see to Hon'ble Chief Justice Court Room. Although Bench was not working but students had an interaction with the court master. They got the knowledge how the court listen their daily cause list .After gained so much knowledge students headed to Advocate General office.

Educational Visit to Advocate General Office

An advocate general is a legal advisor to a state government. The post is created by the Constitution of India (vide Article 165) and corresponds to that of Attorney General for India at the union government level. The Governor of each state shall appoint a person who is qualified to be appointed as judge of High Court as the Advocate General. 1) The Governor of each State shall appoint a person who is qualified to be appointed a Judge of a High Court to be Advocate-General for the State.(2) It shall be the duty of the Advocate-General to give advice to the Government of the State upon such legal matters, and to perform such other duties of a legal character, as may from time to time be referred or assigned to him by the Governor, and to discharge the functions conferred on him by or under this Constitution or any other law for the time being in force.(3) The Advocate-General shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and shall receive such remuneration as the Governor may determine.

When students reached at Advocate General office , they welcome students with great enthusiasm. They make students comfortable. After that they took them towards conference room in which they explain about the working of the Advocate general office, they told to the students about how they start their proceedings in a criminal and civil case. They explain about the hierarchy of the office staff. They also explain about the appointments of the Advocate General and other staff members.

After explaining all the details about the appointment and working of the office, they took students to meet with Advocate General Shri Baldev Raj Mahajan sir.He enlightened students with his great knowledge of law. He was very happy to meet with the future generation lawyers. After taking great knowledge from the office of Advocate General we headed towards the District legal Service Authority.

Educational Visit to District Legal Service Authority, Chandigarh

District legal Service Authority is:-Providing free, competent, effective and comprehensive legal services to the under-privileged sections of the Society to ensure that opportunities of securing justice are not denied to any citizen by reason of economic and other disabilities. Also Widening the network of Lok Adalats and the Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) fora. And Evolving and implementing schemes and strategies for the downtrodden. With that Organizing camps and seminars for legal literacy and awareness.

We reach at District legal service Authority at 3.30 pm. They welcomed us with great smile. Adv Neil Robert took us to the conference and give a welcome speech they enlightened students with the knowledge of Domestic violence in Covid era and also about the POCSO Act. They explained How domestic Violence increased in Covid period and How District legal service authority was working when the whole world was restrained in walls due to covid-19 infection. They told us how they develop all the facilities online and how they are working wirelessly in this period.

With the great knowledge given by the legends of the law students headed toward to their respective hotel after very tiring day.

Day-3

Visit to Govt Museum and Art Gallery:

Government Museum and Art Gallery, Chandigarh, is a premier museum of North India having collections of Gandharan sculptures, sculptures from ancient and medieval India, Pahari and Rajasthani miniature paintings. It owes its existence to the partition of India in August, 1947. Prior to the partition, much of the collections of art objects, paintings and sculptures present here were housed in the Central Museum, Lahore, the then capital of Punjab. The museum has one of the largest collection of Gandharan artefacts in the world. After the partition, the division of collections took place on April 10, 1948. Sixty per cent of objects were retained by Pakistan and forty per cent collection fell in the share of India. The museum was inaugurated on 6 May 1968 by Dr. M. S. Randhawa, the then Chief Commissioner of Chandigarh. The Government Museum and Art Gallery were built for housing the artefacts received from the Lahore Museum during the partition of India. The building was designed by the Swiss-born French architect, Le Corbusier along with his associate architects namely Manmohan Nath Sharma, Pierre Jeanneret and Shiv Dutt Sharma. The design was completed during 1960-62 and construction took place between 1962 and 1967. It is one of the three museums designed by Le Corbusier, the other two being SanskarKendra, in Ahmedabad, and National Museum of Western Art, in Tokyo.

Visit to Doll Museum:



Dolls play a vital role in developing social, emotional and language skills in children and also train them to interact with others.

It was established in 1985 in complex of Bal Bhawan. It showcases collection of heritage dolls from 25 countries comprising exotic and indigenous dolls with Historical, socio-cultural, geographic artistic, fashion design and costume features. It also has colourful life- size cut-outs of dolls with hollow space for kids.

Major Attraction

- 1. Tribal Dolls- Depicting culture of various tribes of India.
- 2. Bridal Dolls- Showcasing wedding dresses of Indian states.
- 3. International Dolls
- 4. Narrative scenes depicting stories from mythology, history, fairy tales etc.
- 5. Toy Train Model.
- 6. Shadow puppets.

Visit to Rock Garden

The Rock Garden of Chandigarh is a sculpture garden for rock enthusiasts in Chandigarh, India. It is also known as Nek Chand Saini's Rock Garden of Nathupur after its founder Nek Chand Saini, a government official who started building the garden secretly in his spare time in 1957. It has spread over an area of 40 acres (16 ha), and is completely built from industrial, home waste, and discarded items. The Rock Garden sits near Sukhna Lake It consists of man-made interlinked waterfalls and many other sculptures that have been made of scrap and other kinds of waste (bottles, glasses, bangles, tiles, ceramic pots, sinks, electrical waste, broken pipes, etc.) which are placed in walled paths.

In his spare time, Nek Chand started collecting materials from demolition sites around the city. He recycled these materials into his own vision of the divine kingdom of Sukrani, choosing a gorge in a forest near Sukhna Lake for his work. The gorge had been designated as a land conservancy, a forest buffer established in 1902 that nothing could be built on. Chand's work was illegal, but he was able to hide it for 18 years before it was discovered by the authorities in 1976. By this time, it had grown into a 12-acre (4.9 ha) complex of interlinked courtyards, each filled with hundreds of pottery-covered concrete sculptures of dancers, musicians, and animals.

His work was in danger of being demolished, but he was able to get public opinion on his side. In 1976 the park was inaugurated as a public space. Nek Chand was given a salary, a title ("Sub-Divisional Engineer, Rock Garden") and 50 laborers so that he could work full-time. The Rock

Garden appeared on an Indian stamp in 1983. The Rock Garden is still made out of recycled materials. With the government's help, Chand was able to set up collection centers around the city for waste, especially rags and broken ceramics.

When Chand left the country on a lecture tour in 1996, the city withdrew its funding, and vandals attacked the park. The Rock Garden Society took over the administration and upkeep of this unique visionary environment.

The garden is visited by over 5,000 people daily, with more than 12 million visitors since its inception.

Visit to Rose Garden

Zakir Hussain Rose Garden, is a botanical garden in Chandigarh, India and spread over 30 acres (120,000 m²) of land,with 50,000 rose-bushes of 1600 different species. Named after India's former president, Zakir Hussain and created in 1967 under the guidance of Mohinder Singh Randhawa, Chandigarh's first chief commissioner, the garden has the distinction of being Asia's largest. The garden has not only roses, but also trees of medicinal value. Some of the medicinal plants that can be spotted here are bel, bahera, harar, camphor and yellow gulmohar. The rose plants have been planted in carved-out lawns and flower beds.

Apart from serving as a host of other events, the Zakir Rose Garden serves as the venue for hosting an annual rose festival called *Rose Festival*, a major cultural event in Chandigarh during February or March. Celebrated mainly as a tribute to the magnificence of the rose itself, the attractions include food, drinks, joyrides, and contests of varying nature, such as photography, gardening, landscaping, bonsai, and Rose Prince and Princess. The contests are open to the residents or institutions from nearby places.

Visit to Sukahna Lake

At a distance of 5.5 km from Chandigarh Bus Station, Sukhna Lake is a beautiful manmade lake situated at the foothills of Shivalik range in the city of Chandigarh. This is one of the most picturesque man-made lakes in India and also one of the top tourist places in

Chandigarh.

Sukhna Lake is created by Le Corbusier in 1958 by damming the Sukhna Choe, a seasonal stream flowing down from the Shivalik hills. It had a depth of 18 feet originally and was spread across 3 sq. km. The name Sukhna means a wish - fulfilled, the lake is a perfect destination for solitude seekers. At the entrance, there is a Corbusier proclamation 'The creator of this beautiful city of Chandigarh has also created this eye-catching man made Sukhna Lake and also a dam that makes this city even more beautiful. The area around this lake is very calm and peaceful'.

The lake is enclosed by a golf course on the south and the famous Rock Garden on its western

end. The Sukhna Lake is also the habitat of a number of fishes and migratory birds like cranes and Siberian ducks. It has also been declared as a reserved national wetland by the Government of India. The promenade on the shores of the lake is often crowded by a stream of joggers and walkers. The scenic beauty of the lake serves as a true delight for the photographers and artists who love to capture the mesmerizing view. It is the best place to view both Sunrise and the Sunset.

Chandigarh Sukhna Lake serves as a great picnic spot and an apt place for pursuing water sport activities like boating, yachting and water skiing etc. The Sukhna Lake has the longest channel for rowing and yachting in Asia. The lake in the evening sees number of visitors who come to spend some enjoyable time with their families and loved ones.

The lake is also venue for many festive celebrations too. The favorites among the various festivals are the Mango festival where a large variety of Mangoes are exhibited.

Day -3

Visit to Bhaga (Atari Border) At Amritsar

Wagah (Shahmukhi Punjabi) is a village and union council (UC 181) located the Wahga Zone near Lahore City District, Pakistan. The town is famous for the Wagah border ceremony and serves as a goods transit terminal station between Pakistan and India. Wahga is situated 600 metres (2,000 ft) west of the border and lies on the historic GranTrunk Road between Lahore and Amritsar in India. The border is located 24 kilometres (15 mi) from Lahore and 32 kilometres (20 mi) from Amritsar. It is also 3 kilometres (1.9 mi) from the bordering village of Attari, India. The Wagah ceremony takes place every evening. The border crossing draws its name from Wahga village, near which the Radcliffe Line, the boundary demarcation line dividing India and Pakistan upon the Partition of British India, was drawn.[3] At the time of the independence in 1947, migrants from India entered Pakistan through this border crossing and vice versa. The Wagah railway station is 400 metres (1,300 ft) to the south and 100 metres (330 ft) from the border. The Wagah-Attari border ceremony happens at the border gate, two hours before sunset each day.[3] The flag ceremony is conducted by the Pakistan Rangers and Indian Border Security Force (BSF), similar to the retreat ceremonies at Ganda Singh Wala/Hussainiwala border crossing and Mahavir/Sadqi International Parade Ground border crossing. A marching ceremony, known as the "Silly Walk ceremony", is conducted each evening along with the flag ceremony. The ceremony started in 1986 as an agreement of peace, although there was not a conflict at that time. Other Middle Eastern nations have adopted similar ceremonies in recent years.



Visit to Golden Temple

The Golden temple is located in the holy city of the Sikhs, Amritsar. The Golden temple is famous for its full golden dome, it is one of the most sacred pilgrim spots for Sikhs. The Mandir is built on a 67-ft square of marble and is a two storied structure. Maharaja Ranjit Singh had the upper half of the building built with approximately 400 kg of gold leaf. The Golden Temple is surrounded by a number of other famous temples like the Durgiana Temple. The fourth Guru of Sikhs, Guru Ram Das, who had initially constructed a pool here, founded Amritsar, which houses the Golden Temple or Harmandir Sahib. It is here that Sage Valmiki wrote the epic, Ramayana. Rama and Sita are believed to have spent their fourteen-year exile in Amritsar, the epicenter of Sikhism. To the south of the temple is a garden, and the tower of Baba Atal. The Central Sikh Museum is atop the Clock Tower. The 'Guru Ka Langar' offers free food to around 20,000 people everyday. The number shoots up to 100,000 on special occasions. A visitor must cover his / her head before entering the temple premises. The Granth Sahib is kept in the Temple during the day and is kept in the Akal Takht or Eternal Throne in the night. The Akal Takht also houses the ancient weapons used by the Sikh warriors. Guru Hargobind established it. The rugged old Jubi Tree in the north west corner of the compound is believed to possess special powers. It was planted 450 years ago, by the Golden Temple's first high priest, Baba Buddha. Guru-ka-Langar or the communal canteen is towards the eastern entrance of the temple complex, and it provides free food to all visitors, regardless of colour, creed, caste or gender. Visitors to the Golden Temple must remove their shoes and cover their heads before entering the temple. The temple is less crowded in the early mornings on weekends.



Introduction

An educational visit is a vital part of the curriculum. It helps to bridge the gap between classroom and the real working world. The visit also provides first-hand knowledge about the organizational structures and modes of operation in different field. The objective of this visit was to provide real life exposure to BA LLB & BBA LLB VIII semester students about knowledge of court room procedures and their automation by applying it. With this vision in mind, five days educational Visit was planned by Faculty of Law & Arts of RNB Global University-Bikan er at uttarakhand from 17th December 2022 to 22th December2022. On 19th December 2022, we visited Uttarakhand High Court at Nainital and ADR Center and on 21th December2022, we visited FRI & IGNFA at Dehradun. Also we visited nearby places at Nainital High court like-Naiyna devi temple, Gurudwara sindh sabha.

Objective of the visit

The main objective of the visit was to understand the working of a court, the nature of duties of the judicial officers. The visit was to help the student in understanding the role of court in dispensing justice in any case, the role of prosecutors in a case, the way cases proceed in a court, the way judges, prosecutors and defense lawyers handle the case, the relationship of the prosecutors and the police. This gave an opportunity to understand the actual need of coordination in the justice system. The visit included an in-depth study of the day to day functioning of the Civil and Criminal Courts, at different levels and over a vast variety of cases. The aim was to evaluate the resources available and the distribution of power between the judges, the prosecution, and the defense council.

Eight students from, RNB global university Faculty of law & arts, visited the Uttarakhand High Court, at on 19th December, 2022. The students were accompanied by Mr. Dhiraj Sharma Assistant Professor Faculty of Law & Arts. The visit was permitted by the Mr. Vivek bharti sharma, Registrar Uttarakhand High court which was obtained by Dr Anil kaushik, Dean Faculty of law & arts, RNBGU.

About Uttarakhand High Court Visit, at Nainital

The building of the High Court is a very magnificent and was constructed in 1900 A.D. The building of Uttarakhand High Court was constructed by Santoni MacDonald in 1900. There is a park in front of the building and Naina Peak, the highest peak in Nainital, in the background, which makes the building more picturesque. In the beginning five Court rooms were constructed but later on more Court rooms have been added. A huge Chief Justice Court Block and a Block of Lawyers' chambers have also been built up. The sanctioned strength of Judges at the time of creation was 7 which has been increased to 9.

We all reached inside the Nainital High Court Campus at 10.30 Am first we showed the permission of Registrar to Mr. Parveen Sharma, working in SC branch of Uttarakhand HC. He forwarded the letter to protocol Registrar office after that we were met by Registrar of Uttarakhand High Court Mr. Vivek Bharti Sharma. Mr. Bharti appointed Assistant Registrar Protocol Mr. M.S. Sirohi for our High court visit.

The Visit Started with Mr. Sirohi. We first visited in court no.1 Hon'ble Chief Justice court. Present CJ of uttarakhand high court Hon'ble Justice Vipin Sanghi Sir was hearing the court proceedings through VC. At that time proceedings were going on regarding section 25, 26, 22 of company Act. The students tried to know the various provisions of the companies act by the Hon'ble Chief Justice.

After that we went to court No. 10 Hon'ble justice Alok Verma Sir where the proceedings of Tripti jahan vs jay singh 101/2022 this case were going on, at that time advocate Piyush garg

and advocate Rajat Mishra were doing the proceedings in this case. In this case students got information about defense execution and proceeding regarding Under section 100 of c.p.c.

After this we met Mr. J.K. jain, PS Hon'ble J. Alok Verma, who gave us information about senctioned judges courts and court rooms in uttarakhand high court campus.

After that Mr. Sirohi took us to court number 5 of Hon'ble Justice Sanjay kumar mishra sir. Mr. Sirohi told us that recently Hon'ble Justice Sanjay kumar mishra has been appointed as Additional chief justice Jharkhand high court. In the court no. 5 hearing of a case related to SARFAESI ACT,2022 was going on . Hon'ble judge rejected the writ petition explaining the ruling of supreme court's land mark case vinod kumar vs cooperative bank.

After visiting Court No. 5, Mr. Sirohi took us to the Advocate Bar Association where he informed us about the current Bar Association President Senior advocate Mr. Prabhakar Joshi and Genreal Secretary Mr. Vikas Bahuguna. When we requested to Mr. Sirohi to meet them, he came to know that both of them had gone for some proceedings in the District and Sessions Court. Then he made us meet Advocate Tyagi there who gave very important information to the students about Bar association of Uttarakhand High Court.

After that Sirohi sir made us visit the Lok Adalat conference hall. After that they took us to the institution sections. Where he gave us information about the roster system .They told us about the assistant registrar Mr. Digvijay Pant sir in institution section.

After all this, Sirohi sir made us visit the judge's library section. Where the librarian sir provided us important information, he provided us interesting information about ATI center, Raj Bhavan and ISPCS and Observatory Center in Nainital. At the same time, he provided us information about the uttarakhand Council for Biotechnology and the many famous boarding schools there.

About ADR CENTER visit at Nainital

Alternative dispute resolution ("ADR") refers to any method of resolving dispute without litigation. ADR regroups all processes and techniques of conflict resolution that occur outside of any governmental authority.

The most famous ADR methods are the following: mediation arbitration conciliation negotiation and transaction. ADR is an important subject in the semester 8th syllabus of our RNBGU and we fortunately got the opportunity to visit the ADR center there.

Mr. Sirohi talked to the ADR Center with the permission of Registrar Sir Vivek Bharti Sharma. He took permission from Ramakant Chowdhary Administrative Officer in ADR Center.

First of all the Administrative Officer of ADR CENTER Mr. Ramakant chaudhary sir welcomed us and introduced his P.S.Mr. Shailendra Singh Rawat and appointed him for vist with Mr. Sirohi.

Mr. Rawat first of all took us to the desk of inquiry center which is considered as the first link of ADR and told that any aggrieved person application will first tell about his dispute here and that application will be filed there.

After that Mr. Rawat introduced us to ADR Center head assistance Mr. Chetan Singh . They gave us important information about the formation of NLSA, SLSA & DLSA.

After that Mr. Rawat made us visit the accounts section. Where Puneet Sir and Lalit Sir gave us important information.

Mr. Rawat then made us visit the three main blocks of ADR- legal assistance establishment and meditation and conciliating chamber and legal service committee and provided important information

He got us to meet Legal service Committee with Mr Punit Singh Adhikari who told that a panel of lawyers who want to provide free legal aid are appointed in Legal Service Committee.



He told that at present 23 lawyers are appointed in Uttarakhand High Court for this work. To whom 25 thousand rupees are provided by the government for free legal aid. The panel is appointed by the SLSA's chairman and secretary. Presently the chairman there is Hon'ble Justice Sanjay K Mishra sir.

About F.R.I. Visit at Dehradun

Dehradun is truly wonderful place to be associated with. It has friendly and helpful people, an abundance of recreational opportunities and places to see and visit. The open countryside, hills and mountains of Dehradun has a reputation being the educational capital of the country. Dehradun has a sub-tropical climate with cool winters, warm and crisp springs, hot summers and a strong monsoon. With over 200 years of history, Dehradun's proudest moment came in Novembers 2000, when the town become the capital of Uttarakhand, understandably termed as Dev Bhoomi (abode of the Gods).

Forest Research Institute (FRI), Dehra Dun made a humble beginning as Forest School established in 1878. Initially named as Imperial Forest Research Institute, FRI came into being in 1906. Later renamed as Forest Research Institute and Colleges, with a number of centres located at different places all over the country administering research as well as training of Forest Officers and Forest Rangers. After reorganization of Forestry Research in the country and creation of Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) in 1988, the training and research centres were given an independent status of institutes. Forest Research Institute, now one of the institutes under ICFRE, was conferred the status of Deemed University in December 1991 on the recommendations of the UGC, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. To impart education in such branches of forestry and environment as it may deem fit.

To provide for research and for the advancement of and dissemination of knowledge in the forestry and environment. The disciplines pursued in the Institute are Silviculture, Resource Survey and Management, Social forestry, Minor forest produce, Ecology and conversation, Genetics and tree propagation, Forest protection, Forest Botany, Forest products and Forest Operations. The thrust areas are bio-diversity, tree improvement & quality seed production, non-wood forest products, social forestry & wasteland afforestation, design development of modern forestry tools, etc.

To create consciousness about forest and environment among the people through extension programs. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the safeguarding of environment and protection of forest & wildlife.

We got permission to visit five museum in FRI. First of all we visited the forest pathology museum. After that we visited Silviculture museum and Timber museum. Then we visited NTFP museum. End in the last we visited Forest Entomology museum.

Students also saw Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy (IGNFA) just in front of FRI where IFS training take place.

About near by places Nainital & Dehradun

Apart from all this we visited Nayna devi temple and gurudwara sindh sabha & Statue of Govind ballabh pant in Nainital and Visited whole Campus of FRI.

Personal Observation

There is a general saying "I hear and I forget, I see and I remember, I do and I understand," it describes the theory of retaining more information when visually experiencing the activities in a chosen environment. Students gain a better perspective of the world around them by going on



educational tours as they are brought in direct contact with new situations which prepare the m for facing challenges in their upcoming professional lives. The importance of taking the students out of the classroom to absorb, interact and be immersed in history and educational tours have several learning benefits for students to obtain practical information within the brain.

Learning Outcome of the Visit

Below are some of the Learning outcome and key benefits of educational tours and reasons why getting students on these trips are good for them.

Interactive Learning: Field trips help students to interact with what they are learning. The experience goes beyond reading about a concept; students are able to see it, manipulate it or participate in it physically. Students are able to see elements with their eyes rather than reading about it and believing what they are told in books or by educators. These tours provide the students with the opportunity of learning through travel, especially to places that they may not otherwise get to visit. Educational trips provide valuable educational opportunities away from the classroom, without using textbooks and other tools which are used in a normal school setting. Students on educational trips can often learn while having fun in a more informal environment. If the educational trip destination has a professional guide who do hands-on teaching to visiting students such as at a science centre or historical museum, the learners will be excited to learn from someone new.

Entertainment: The learning trips also provide entertainment for students. They often act as a powerful motivator for students. Breaking away from the routine provides students refreshment that might make them more focused back in the studies. Learning and fun always make a great combination. Field trips are considered as a fun, but the students learn as well, whether they realize it or not. No matter how much students learn during an educational trip, their favourite memories may be based on their enjoyment of the day. Getting away from the Institute for a day or even half a day is always exciting for students and educational trips are always highly anticipated. Students will have fun with their friends or classmates and they also may return to the classroom with a renewed focus.

Social Interaction: Getting away from the routine atmosphere of the university gives students an opportunity to spend time with each other in a new environment. They may be able to connect on more of a personal level without the structure of the normal school day. Students may be able to spend much of the educational trip day in small groups, observing, chatting and learning about each other. Having a trip in the early part of the term or semester is wise since it will allow the students to make a bond with whom they may not know very well. Also, leaving the classroom for an educational tour places the students in a different social environment. They encounter a new set of folks during the course of the average field trip. These interactions teach them how to behave in different environments. They learn more self-control and communication etiquettes. It creates a sense of teamwork and community among the students as they experience a field trip together. Furthermore, students can interact with other people from all sections of society. It gives them a chance to gain new perspectives, and learn from complete strangers with unbiased opinions.

New Experiences: Many students do not get to experience the typical trip locations with their families. Because of money constraints or lack of resources, not all parents are able to take their kids to courts, tribunals, museums and other field trip destinations. An educational trip gives the opportunity for students to experience new venues or places. While field trips take a great deal of work and energy, broadening the horizons of the students is worth it. Moreover, when students and teachers are together going on a trip, new educational environments and



experiences are possible. Students may have the opportunity to observe many things that are not available at school or college, including exotic wildlife, rare plants, mechanism of industries etc. Discussing the educational trip beforehand is wise because it allows students to know what they will experience during their time away from school.

Better Exposure: Better exposure is yet another benefit of educational tours in a student's life. Students get to visit new places and this is a great opportunity for students who do not get many opportunities to go on trips. Especially for curious students who have the constant urge for learning new things, these educational tours are a great way of putting their knowledge as well as experiences to test. They can learn new things and this practical knowledge will help them in going a long way in their careers.

Passion for Travel: An educational tour can be a safe way to experience the world outside of one's home. On the tour, students are surrounded by other people they know and they are guided throughout the experience by their teacher and other guides. Further, they often pay much less than they would if they went by themselves. When students realize how much they enjoy travelling, it can open new doors for them. They might decide to study abroad to more thoroughly immerse themselves in different cultures. They may also be more likely to travel independently in the future, continuing to broaden their understanding of the world. Some students might even realize their passion for learning about other cultures and turn it into a career.

Cultural Observation: On a good educational tour, students experience a different culture through their eyes. Nowadays, many travel agencies organize the tours which are offering volunteering opportunities and other chances to see how people of varying socioeconomic levels in a variety of local people live. Such experiences can help students develop more compassion for people from different styles of life. It can also help them to reflect on how these issues affect people near their home, inspiring them to work toward change.

Independent: While away from home and the ease of a regular support system, students have opportunities to see what they are capable of accomplishing by themselves. Travelling allows students to develop themselves in ways that cannot be achieved without stepping outside of their comfort zone, becoming more mature, independent and self-aware.

Better Academic Performance: On an educational tour, students get to experience different styles of teaching and see a new side to their subject of study. When able to see, touch and smell the very things they have learned about in books, students return to the classroom with a deeper connection and greater motivation for their studies.







Introduction





The legal awareness should start at an early stage, and providing information to the younger students gives them an inquisitive edge over other students.





Introduction

The students of all the semester of RNB Global University attended the Two-Days workshop on "Art of Preparing Moot Memorial" organized by the Faculty of Law and Art Mooting is important part of learning in any law student's life. One should continuously make efforts in order to excel the skills of Memorial Drafting.

Introduction

Faculty of Law and Arts is continuously organizing various extracurricular activities like national level Moot court Competition, Mock United Session, Mock Parliament, Dramatize Moot Court, Webinars, seminars and conferences on various topics and visit to various Courts. These kinds of activities are necessary for the all over development of students. This workshop was also an essential element in the all-round, holistic development of children.

About the Workshop

The two-day workshop was conducted in three sessions, one session on the first day and two sessions on the second day.

The session began with the welcome address given by Dr Anil Kaushik, Dean Faculty of Law and Arts and Dr Ashok Prem, Head of the Department Faculty of Law and Arts shared his experience and journey of moot courts. He applauded the efforts of the students of the final year who proactively and enthusiastically organized the event along with their internships and studies. They also said that the pandemic didn't restrain their zest and process of learning and working on it.

The Expert speaker for the First day Mr Rahul Yadav, Assistant professor Maharaja Ganga Singh University spoke on There is a technique in every art that has to be learnt by its practitioners. The same is true for the Art of Advocacy Any law student can become a competent advocate by learning the principles of the art of advocacy by practice and patience. The experience of research is profitable the experience told the students how various students act as advocates and argue

upon an imaginary or a decided/undecided case, or it could also be on some specific legal issue, civil or criminal (or a petition). They are judged by a person having knowledge of the law, it is not necessary that the person should be a sitting or a retired judge. He Further says that first and foremost, a student should go through the moot proposition, thoroughly. It defines the boundary within which one has to argue and lays out the whole case in detail; the more one reads it, the more one finds out.

The Expert Speaker on first half was Mr Atul Jain Associate Professor Amity University, Gurgaon he told about the process should take up most of the time for preparation and is the execution of research planning. Considering the moot proposition and facts in issue, one has to find out the appropriate laws to be applied. He Further discuss that, after going through the case many times, you will ultimately isolate the facts which support you and you should counter those which go against you. After collecting all the facts for your case, it is necessary to draw inferences from the primary facts and formulate a hypothesis that will enable. He further discusses about the Bare acts alone may not be able to articulate the law and provide for further information that could be used in the moot court. One should go through a few books, not many, to get a fair idea of the law and also gather certain leading or important cases that can be cited to bolster the case.

The Expert Speaker on second half Mr. Rahul Yadav, Assistant professor Maharaja Ganga Singh University he told the student about the object of a pleading is to facilitate a trial so that the points of the issue might be clarified and also the decision given thereon; it also determines what relief a party is entitled to on the basis of law and fact. Thus, after gathering the required information, it has to be arranged in a certain format, either provided in the rules or the standard that is usually adopted. The memorial is the written submission while arguing orally in the moot court forms the oral submission. It has to be made for both sides by a single team, i.e., for plaintiff/appellant and defendant/respondent. He further said that rules for its making should be strictly followed as it is to be submitted to the moot court judges and to the adverse team. The teams can bring one themselves, for reference. They can also carry hard copies of judgements, bare acts, sections, various laws and other material that is to be brought

On the second day the resource person asked the students to form 5 groups and gave each group a case on which they were asked to form their own issues and argue. This practical learning made students understand the entire procedure of memorial drafting in a better way.

The workshop concluded with the doubt solving session, where the resource person entertained the queries of inquisitive law students and answered them to their satisfaction.

Objectives of The Workshop

The purpose of the workshop on preparing moot court memorial is to introduce law students to court proceedings that arise from a (hypothetical) dispute between parties. Such exercises can allow future lawyers, judges and arbitrators to improve their drafting, research and argumentation skills.





The event ended up with the singing of National Anthem.


The exhibition was inaugurated by the Registrar RNBGU (Dr. Dipali Gupta) The Deans of respective Faculties were also present .

The Faculties along with the students later on visited the exhibition and their knowledge regarding the contribution of Steel Man India was enriched.





Introduction

The students of 5th Semesters of RNB Global University visited District Court on 13 October, 2022. A court is a tribunal, often a governmental institution, with the authority to adjudicate legal dispute between parties and carry out the administration of justice in civil, criminal, and administrative matters in accordance with the rule of law. District courts of India are presided over by a district judge. These courts are under administrative and judicial control of the High court of the state to which the district concerned belongs.

Why did the university organize the visit to District Court, Bikaner

Faculty of Law & Arts continuously organizes various extracurricular activities like National level Moot court Competition, Mock United Session, Mock Parliament, Dramatize Moot Court, Webinars, seminars and conferences on various topics and visit to various Courts, juvenile courts etc. These kinds of activities are necessary for the all over development of students. District Court visit is also one of the most essential parts for practical knowledge of the Law students.

About the District & Session courts

The district courts of India are the district court of the state governments in India for every district or for one or more districts together taking into account of the number of cases, population distribution in the district. They administer justice in India at a district level. The civil court district court is judged by the district and sessions judge. This is the principal court of Original Civil Jurisdiction besides the high court of the state and which derives its jurisdiction in civil matters primarily from the Code of Civil Procedure. The district court is also a court of sessions when it exercises its jurisdiction on criminal matters under the Code of Criminal Procedure. The district court is presided over by a district judge who is appointed by the state governor on the advice of chief justice of that high court. In addition to the district judge there may be a number of additional district judges and assistant district judges depending on the workload. The additional district judge and the court presided have equivalent jurisdiction as the district judge and their district court.

Objectives of the Visit

The visit provides our students the opportunity to interact with the judges, District Legal Service Authority, Bar Association members, Advocates, AIR Library.

The students also got a chance to interact with the members of Bar Association Mr. Kuldeeep Sharma, Chairman of Permanent Lok Adalat, Mahesh Kumar Sharma, ADJ of District Legal Service Authority Manoj Kumar Goyal, Jitendra Riya ADJ civil court and Sushil Kumar Jain, ADJ Family court judge.

Also students received blessing from Vivek Kumar Sharma President, Bikaner District Bar-Association. He explained students about ins-outs of litigation and relation between bar and bench and advanced wishes to students for their future endeavours.

The visit started with a brief introduction of Concept of DLSA & Lok Adalat and its procedure by the faculty in charge Mr. Ashok Karnani. After getting a brief knowledge of Lok Adalat an interactive session was held with Manoj Kumar Goyal, ADJ, DLSA.

Additional District Judge Cum secretary of District Legal Services Authority Mr. Manoj Kumar Goyal told the students that NALSA along with other Legal Service Institutions use to conduct Lok Adalat periodically. Lok Adalat is one of the alternative dispute redressal mechanisms, it is a forum where disputes/cases pending in the court of law or at pre-litigation stage are settled/compromised amicably.

Learning outcomes of visit

The experience not only enriched students with working of district and DLSA, but also enlightened then with practical aspects. The visit was full of information for the students of law. Students got the live exposure to the judicial process of the court with a bench-bar relationship. It gave a practical and theoretical knowledge regarding all those laws written in the law books







Introduction

The students of all the semester of RNB Global University attended the webinar on New Wage Code, conducted by the Training and Placement Cell, on 22nd August 2022. The speaker for this webinar was Mr. Birender Sigh Nain, a well-known advocate and labour laws specialist, JOSA Labour Laws Institute, Gurgaon.

Why Did The University A Webinar on "New Wage Code 2022"?

The Training and Placement Cell is continuously working in holistic development of RNB ians. The Cell works at ensuring that the students of RNB Global University are ready for the corporate world even before majoring in their subjects. One such aspect at which the Cell works at is ensuring that the students are updated with the changes happening across India which impacts the corporate world. To make the students aware of the New Wage Code 2022, this webinar was organized by the Training and Placement Cell.

About The Webinar

The session began with a brief introduction of the speaker of the event, which was then followed by a welcome address by Dr. Anil Kaushik Sir, Dean, Faculty of Law and Arts. The speaker began the session soon after this welcome address and began the session by giving an introduction to the New Wage Code and talking of the four newly introduced codes, namely, he Industrial Relations Code, Code On Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, and the New Wage Code. These new labour laws cane into effect on July 1st 2022. The speaker explained the current scenario and the scenario that which will be applicable after implementing the code. Currently, the basic salary is in the range of 30-40% of the gross. The allowances make up the balance. But the new code specifies that the basic salary should be a minimum of 50% of the gross salary. Furthermore, companies must pay overtime to the employees and any time over 15 minutes of working is the subject of employee overtime payments after the shift of 8 hours is completed. The speaker also shared insight on the number of leaves in the new wage code, i.e., the employees now get an hour of leave for every 20 days of working instead of 45 and the new employees will now be eligible to take leave after the first 180 days of employment contract. It won't be 240 working days like the current system.

At the end of the session, the house was open for questions and the lecturer solved all the queries of the students.

Objectives of The Webinar

The purpose of the lecture is to spread knowledge about the New Wage Code in India. The New Wage Code aims to regulate the wages and bonus payments in all types of employment and replaces four major laws, i.e., the Payment of Wages Act, 1936, the Minimum Wages Act, 1948, the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965, and the Equal Remuneration Act, 1976. In order to make the students understand the lacunas in the previously existing laws and the issues that were resolved by the new code, this webinar was organized by the Training and Placement Cell.





The invitation of experts as guest lecturers offers students the opportunity to meet passionate, committed people in their respective fields thus, giving the students the opportunity to learn from them in various ways. Guest lecturers provide an important educational experience for students based on their real-world life experiences. Students get to see the insight and perspective of the guest lecturers' specific field. The format can enable students to interact with professionals in formal and informal settings.

About Guest Lecture

The purpose of the lecture was to undertake an intellectual engagement with the students and spread knowledge giving our students an opportunity to understand the contemporary political scenario and political turmoil in which South Asia is embroiled today.

Dr Verma spoke enlightened the students on the constitution of South Asia as a region explicating its history of violence and political turmoil ranging from colonialism to partition, demarcation of territorial boundaries of national states and varied insurgencies challenging the territorial sovereignty of states constituting the South Asian region.

Dr Verma argued that the Political Turmoil in South Asia, can be broadly understood in four categories, namely (i) those imposed and escalated by the global political, strategic and developmental dynamics, including the role of great powers; (ii) those inherited and Strategically induced in inter-state engagements; (iii) those precipitated and nurtured by the internal political turbulence, overloaded population, socio-cultural fault-lines and developmental distortions; and (iv) those that are caused and covered by the non-state actors. He also focused on the South Asian countries confronting the problem of the bureaucracy turmoil and Political instability and the absence of strong and stable political parties.

He also discussed the case of Sri Lanka which is a demonstration of how the economic crisis in the state has culminated in political instability in the island state due to mismanagement of the economic realm and misuse of political power for narrow personal interests. He also underlined how Sri Lanka is facing a clear 'Arab Spring' moment triggered to overthrow the autocratic rule, highlighting the rampant corruption and rising poverty. He also highlighted the eventful spring for South Asia: a change in government in Pakistan, protests demanding regime change in Sri Lanka, and a slow-moving economic disaster unfolding in Taliban-ruled Afghanistan.

He culminated his lecture explicating that presently, South Asia lacks Charismatic Leadership with the prime thrust on vote bank politics and electoral victories. This has reduced popular leadership to vote managers in a practical trend of Electioneering.

Dr Verma also highlighted the disastrous political consequences of Freebie culture gaining popularity in India and also the harmful outcomes of familial and dynastic rule in a democratic country like Sri Lanka. Nepal, he emphasised is also reeling under a mounting debt crisis along with Bangladesh shifting towards Islamic democracy instead of secular democracy.



President of the RNB Global University Professor Dr. G.S. Karkara, highlighting the various aspects of the political and social Development of the nation states constituting South Asian region enriched the understanding of the students. It enabled them to articulate and comprehend the contemporary issues facing South Asian countries in a more holistic manner while correlating the same with their respective disciplines as well.







Back Ground

RNB Global University is poised to organize its "Faculty Induction Programme" under the scheme of "Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teachings" (PMMMNMTT), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource -Government of India, for the existing and freshly appointed teachers/ faculty of the Universities/ Colleges/ Institutions of the region/ Pan India to acclimatize them from the teaching and learning techniques in the classrooms.

Prologue

Quite often it is observed that the teachers do not have required and sufficient teaching experience when they join academic institutions to teach. Nevertheless, they do not undergo any type of formal training about teaching, learning process or classroom management as such. Even the present education system does not have any such kind of training criteria which is essential to become eligible for the appointment of a teacher. Therefore, in order to ensure qualitative growth of education and to enhance the professional development of a teacher it becomes prerequisite to provide proper formal training to all newly appointed teachers to make them familiar with the process of teaching and learning responsibilities along with classroom teaching discipline norms. Owing to this aforementioned perennial problem the authorities responsible to uphold the teaching standards at the national level make it mandatory for every higher educational institutions to conduct "Induction Programmes" for the specific period as specified in the statutory guidelines for the newly


